G. F. Bowen, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The County of Westland Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, as he may think fit, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, to make regulations for the sale, letting, disposal, occupation, and management of any waste lands of the Crown within the County of Westland, and to sell, let, and dispose thereof at such prices, and in such allotments, and generally in such management and in like such manner as he shall deem expedient, and in like manner to alter, vary, or annul any such regulations, and to make others:

And whereas by a Proclamation issued on the seventeenth day of November last by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-ninth day of November last, certain regulations were made for the sale, letting, disposal, occupation, and management of the waste lands of the Crown in the County of Westland:

And whereas by a certain other Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that any district proclaimed or to be pro-claimed a gold field, shall not be subject to any provisions of any law for the time being in force regulating the sale, disposal, and occupation of Crown Lands within the Province in which such gold field is situate, except (amongst other excep-tions) so far as the provisions of such law may specially authorize the sale or leasing of land within a gold field :

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made, specially authorizing the sale and lease of the waste lands of the Crown within any gold field proclaimed or to be proclaimed within the County of Westland :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the

hereinbefore first recited Act, de hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, make and proclaim the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto, to be read with and as forming part of the said regulations made on the seventeenth day of November last, for the sale, letting, disposal, occupation, and management of the waste lands of the Crown in the County of Westland.

SCHEDULE.

Lands within Gold Fields.

1. The term "the regulations" shall be construed to mean the regulations for the time being in force for the sale, letting, disposal, occupation, and manage-ment of the waste lands of the Crown in the County of Westland.

2. Lands situate within any gold field, now or hereafter proclaimed, shall be sold, leased, or otherwise dealt with under these regulations, in the same manner, by the same persons, and subject to the same conditions as if such lands were not situate within a gold field, and the regulations shall be deemed to specially authorize such sale, lease, or other disposal.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCILA WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Acts Adoption Act, 1869," it is enacted that the various books, instruments, and papers required to be used under the said Act, or the provisions of the Acts thereby adopted, shall be supplied at the Custom Houses or Mercantile Marine Offices in New Zealand, at such moderate prices as the Governor in Council may from time to time fix: And whereas by the said "Merchant Shipping Acts Adoption Act, 1869," it is further enacted that in case any Seaman shall be unable to produce a Certificate of Discharge from his last ship, it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Mercantile Marine Office, or any Officer of Customs, on being satisfied of the fact of such inability, and upon payment of such fee as may be fixed by the Governor in Council, to grant to such Seaman a permit to engage himself in any foreign-going ship; or if any Seaman shall prove to the satisfaction of such Officer that, without any fault of his own, he has lost or been deprived of his Certificate of Discharge, such Officer may grant a permit as aforesaid to ship in any hometrade ship: And whereas it is expedient to fix the prices aforesaid, and the amount of the said fee :--

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the authority in him vested by the said recited Act, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby fix the prices mentioned in the table following as the prices for such books, instruments, and papers as aforesaid, that is to say:

NOTES.
Mongonui.—On the whole, fine weather. Thunder on 7th, 17th, and 18th; prevailing wind N.E.
Auckland.—Generally the weather was wet with high winds, although some pleasant weather occurred. On 14th and 15th there was thunder and rain; from 25th to 31st very wet and disagreeable; 1.613 inches of rain recorded on 31st. Prevailing wind N.E. fourteen days. Waterspout reported in Rangitoto Passage.
Taranaki.—Very wet weather at this station. Very stormy from S.E. from 1st to 3rd, with heavy rain and thunder on 1st, and on 10th strong wind from N.W. Prevailing wind N.E.
Wellington.—Heavy rain during month. On 15th the rain was heavier than it has been for previous sixteen years while it lasted, also the loudest thunder heard; thunder also on 14th and 16th, that on the latter date being very severe, and with most vivid lightning; wind N.W. There were occasional very fine bright days, with light N.W. winds, but usually the weather was very oppressive and threatening. Slight earthquake on 29th, at 3.45 a.m., felt at Wanganui.
Nelson.—Fine weather storm with rain, between 2 and 3 p.m., about same time as that at Wellington on same day. Prevailing wind N.W.
Christchurch.—Very seasonable and pleasant weather at this station during the month. On 18th and 19th there were strong N.E. winds, otherwise the wind was moderate. Fourteen days of E. wind.
Bealey.—With exception of 16th and 29th, when there was a thunder storm and rain on the former date, and thunder, rain, and a gale from N.W. on latter, the weather was very fine with an unusually small rainfall; there were seventeen days of N.W. wind.
Hokitika.—Close sultry weather generally at this station. Thunder on 15th, 16th, 18th, and 29th; hail on 16th; strong wind on 9th weith weather was very fine with with an unusually small rainfall; there were seventeen days of a strong wind a gate from N.W. on latter, the weather was very fine with an unusually small rainfall; there were seventeen da

 Hokitika.—Close sultry weather generally at this station. Thunder on 15th, 16th, 18th, and 29th; hail on 16th; strong wind on 28th and 29th, with rain from N.W. Prevailing wind N.W.
 Dunedin.—Very pleasant calm weather during month. Rather heavy rain from 29th to 31st; foggy on morning of 21st. Thunder on 15th, 16th, 18th, and 29th; hail on 16th; strong wind

Prevailing wind N.E. Southland.—Very fine, dry, warm month. Thunder on 1st, 12th, 17th, and 25th; very severe on 17th; sharp carthquake shock on 25th, about 5 p.m.; twenty days of S.E. wind.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The most remarkable feature in the weather for this month was the occurrence of severe electrical storms throughout almost the whole of the Colony towards the middle of the month, with vivid and dangerous lightning. There was also heavy rain at many of the stations at the same period, but no severe gales are reported.
