ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Auckland, this fourth day of May, 1870.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**WHEREAS** by "The Government Annuities Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, amend, and revoke regulations for prescribing the mode of proving the age and identity, and the existence or death, of persons, and the mode of paying sums of money payable in respect of Annuities and Payments on Death, and other payments under the said Act, and for dispensing with the production of probate of a will, or letters of administration, either generally or in any particular class of cases :

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do hereby make the following Regulations for the purposes herein appearing :—

*Payments on Death.*

1. On the death of any person whose life is insured under the said Act, notice in writing of such death shall immediately be given to the Government Annuities' Commissioner, hereinafter called the Commissioner.

2. In every case where the age of the insured has not been admitted on the policy, the age shall be proved, either before or after the death, by furnishing to the Commissioner—

(a.) An extract from the register or other official record of the birth, verified by the seal or signature of the officer having the custody of such register, whose official character and signature or seal shall (in the case of registers kept out of New Zealand) be verified by the certificate of some Notary or British Consul, or, if there be none, then by some principal officer of the Government

of the State or Colony where the register is kept; or

(b.) A declaration, affirmation, or affidavit, stating that no register or other official record of the birth is to be found, and stating, with particularity, the belief of the person declaring, affirming, or swearing as to the age of the insured, and the grounds of such belief. Such declaration, affirmation, or affidavit must be made in such form and manner that the person making it would, under the law of the place where it is made (if there be any such law), be criminally responsible if any statement therein be false to his or her knowledge. If it be made out of New Zealand, the officer before whom it is made shall certify shortly thereon what is the law of the place in relation thereto.

3. The death shall be proved by production of the following evidence :—

(c.) A certificate under the hand of the medical attendant of the deceased during the last illness (if any), stating the date, and place, and cause of death.

(d.) An extract from the register or other official record, of the death or burial, verified in the manner herein prescribed with regard to extracts from the register of birth; or, in the absence of such extract

(e.) A declaration, affirmation, or affidavit, stating the time, and place, and circumstances of the death, and that no official record of the death or burial is to be found, and made in the manner herein prescribed with regard to declarations as to age.

4. The identity of the deceased and the insured shall be proved by declaration, affirmation, or affidavit, made in the manner herein prescribed with regard to declarations as to age, and stating the knowledge or belief of the person making the same as to the identity of the deceased and the person insured by the policy, and the number and amount of the policy, and giving, with particularity, the grounds of such knowledge or belief.

5. Probate and letters of administration shall be dispensed with in the following cases:—

- (a.) Where the death has happened beyond the limits of the Colony, and probate or letters of administration, or some equivalent thereto, has been granted by some Court or person of competent authority out of the Colony, and an exemplification or other formal proof thereof is produced.
- (b.) Where the money is received by a Curator of Intestate Estates in New Zealand, duly authorized by law to receive the same.
- (c.) Where the whole legal right to the moneys insured has been assigned to some person still living, in accordance with the provisions of the said Government Annuities Act, and the regulations to be made thereunder.

6. All powers of attorney, probates, letters of administration, exemplifications, or other formal proofs, orders of Courts, and other instruments proving the right of any person to receive any insurance money, shall be produced to the Commissioner, or to such person as he shall in each case appoint.

7. The policy shall be given up when the insurance money is paid.

8. The Commissioner may accept proofs of age and identity or death in any form, provided the same appear to comply substantially with these Regulations.

9. All proofs shall be made at the expense of the applicant.

Now know ye that I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby abolish the above-named polling places for the District of the Thames for the election of Superintendent and Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland, and do appoint in lieu thereof—

For the District of the Thames—The Court House, Shortland; Messrs. Allen and Hall's Store, Tapu Creek (Hastings); Old Court House, Coromandel.

For the District of Coromandel—The Court House, Coromandel.

And I do further appoint the Court House, Shortland, and the Court House, Coromandel, to be the principal polling places for the said districts.

as he shall hold the said office of Commissioner of Customs.

##### *Icebergs in South Atlantic Ocean.*

LARGE numbers of icebergs and detached masses of ice having been fallen in with in the months of September and November, 1869, by vessels homeward bound round Cape Horn, extending in the 42nd meridian of West longitude as far North as the parallel of  $42\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  South latitude, it is recommended that vessels taking this route should sight, or pass a moderate distance eastward of, the Falkland Islands, and should not steer eastward of a N.E. by N. course (true) until northward of the parallel of  $40^{\circ}$ .

By a reference to the Admiralty Ice Chart of the Southern Hemisphere (No. 1241), it will be seen that icebergs and drift ice have been met with in the months of March and April, between the meridians

of  $20^{\circ}$  and  $25^{\circ}$  West, as far North as  $40^{\circ}$ ; and as it appears that exceptionally large quantities of ice are now adrift in the South Atlantic, vessels bound eastward round the Cape of Good Hope are cautioned accordingly.

##### *Dangers in the Bay of Plenty and East Cape Passage.*

**T**HE following Notices to Mariners respecting dangers in Bay of Plenty and East Cape Passage, furnished by Lieut. G. A. Woods, of the Colonial Surveying Schooner "Edith," are published for general information.

#### BAY OF PLENTY.

(1.) A dangerous rocky patch, extending N.W. and S.E. about two hundred (200) feet, with about five (5) feet at low water spring tides, has been discovered off Motiti Island, in the fair-way of vessels bound from the Eastward to Tauranga, when passing between Astrolabe Reef and Motiti.

The following are the bearings and distances:—

Mongonui Hill N.  $60^{\circ} 15'$  E.—distant  $9\frac{1}{4}$  miles.

Northern point of Motiti N.  $78^{\circ} 30'$  W.—distant  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles.

(2.) A dangerous sunken patch, bearing from the Schooner Rock about N. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.—distant about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile—has been seen breaking.

Mariners are therefore cautioned against passing within a mile of this Rock on that line of bearing.

#### EAST CAPE.

The following dangers have been discovered in or near the passage between East Cape and East Island (Whanga Okena):—

(1.) A sunken rock, with only sixteen (16) feet of water, bearing from the northern extreme of East Island W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.—distant five-sixths of a mile.

The extreme of Matakawa Point in conjunction with the extreme of Horoera Point leads on this rock.

(2.) A shoal patch, with twenty (20) feet of water, bearing from the northern extreme of East Island N. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.—distant two (2) miles.

The extreme of Horoera Point in conjunction with Iron Point leads on to this danger.

The bearings are magnetic.
