WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that, as soon as conveniently may be after the establishment of a Petty Sessions District, and afterwards from time to time as may be deemed expedient, the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, appoint a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident in such district to be yearly held within such district, at some specified time and place, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance : And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, certain Petty Sessions Districts, including amongst others the district hereinafter named, were defined and established :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority in that behalf vested in me, do hereby proclaim and appoint that for the district named in the Schedule hereto, a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident within such district shall be yearly held at the place whereof the name is in the said Schedule set opposite to the name of such district, at twelve o'clock noon, on the last Friday in the month of July, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman and settling a rota of attendance.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The New Zealand Post Office Act, 1855," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time time, by Proclamation to be published in the New Zealand Gazette, to fix, alter, and abolish the Rates of Postage at any time payable within the Colony for the transmission of Letters by post, either between places within New Zealand, or to or from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the Postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly: And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixtyseven, the Governor in Council did, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, fix certain Rates of Postage, and the times at which the same respectively should be paid: And whereas it is desirable to alter the Rates of Postage chargeable under Schedule D, appended to the said Proclamation of the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, on Letters to the Colony of Western Australia:

Now therefore, in exercise of the said recited power and authority, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby alter the present Rates of Postage fixed to be paid within the Colony for the transmission of Letters to the Colony of Western Australia, and do proclaim and declare that the Postage payable within the Colony on Letters for the Colony of Western Australia shall be according to the Schedule hereunder written, and that such Postage shall in all cases be paid at the time such Letters are delivered into the post in New Zealand; and I do further declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the fifteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

WHEREAS by "The Lunatics Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to order and direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary, by the said Act, within any Province or other District of the Colony, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such Province, or by any other person the Governor may think fit:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby direct that the tables numbered I. and II. in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council shall be altered by inserting at the foot of each of the said tables a condition in the words following :—"When the person desiring to insure his life is an officiating minister within the meaning of 'The Marriage Act, 1854,' or any Act for the time being in force amending the said Act, the premium or other payment to be paid thenceforth by such person, whether he shall thereafter cease to be such officiating minister or not, shall be such sum consisting of an integral number of pence as shall be nearest to nineteen-twentieths of the sum which would be required to be paid by such person if not an officiating minister as aforesaid :" And I do hereby, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, declare the said conditions to be a regulation for carrying the said Act into effect, and do make the same a regulation accordingly.

RHEEA OR CHINA GRASS FIBRE. India Office, Revenue Department, 10th February, 1870.

NOTIFICATION.

THE Governor-General in Council is pleased to direct the publication of the following Advertisement :-

Advertisement. 1. The Government of India, after communication with various Agricultural and Horticultural Societies in India, and with persons interested in the subject, has arrived at the conclusion, that the only real obstacle to the development of an extensive trade in the fibre of Rheea, or China grass, is the want of suitable machinery for separating the fibre and bark

of effecting such separation by manual labour being great.

2. The demand for the fibre is now large, and no doubt might be extended with reduced prices, and there is a practically unlimited extent of country in India where the plant could be grown.

3. The requirements of the case appear to be some machinery or process capable of producing, with the aid of animal, water, or steam power, a ton of fibre of a quality which shall average in value not less than £50 per ton in the English market, at a total cost, all processes of manufacture and allowance for wear and tear included, of not more than £15 per The said processes are to be understood ton. to include all the operations performed, after the cutting and transport of the plant to the place of manufac-ture, to the completion of the manufacture of fibre of the quality above described. The machinery must be simple, strong, durable, and cheap; and should be suited for erection at or near the plantations, as the refuse is very useful as manure for continued cultivation.

4. To stimulate the invention, or adaptation, of such machinery or process, the Government of India hereby offers a prize of £5,000 for the machine and process that best fulfils all the requirements named above.

5. Rewards of moderate amount will be given for really meritorious inventions, even though failing to meet entirely all the conditions named.

6. Arrangements will be made by the Government of India for the supply of carefully dried stems, and specimens of fibre separated from the bark, but subjected to no other process, to mechanical firms and others desirous of competing, on application to the Secretary to the Government of India in the Home Department.

7. All machinery, &c., must be brought by the competitors, at their own charge, to a locality which will be notified hereafter, probably in the North-west Provinces or the Punjab, and there worked under the supervision of their own representatives for a sufficient time to enable the judges appointed by Government to determine whether all the conditions named have been complied with. The prize machine is to be transferred, if required, to Government at 5 per cent. above cost price; the patent right in any such machine to be also transferred, if required, to Government, on the latter securing to the patentee a royalty of 5 per cent. on the cost price of all machines

manufactured under the patent during its currency. 8. One year from the date of this advertisement will be allowed for the preparation of the machines, and their transport to the locality named for the competition, and the trials will then be made, and the decision of the judges announced. If no invention of sufficient merit is received in the above-named period to obtain the prize offered, the Government will continue to allow machines to be tendered for trial till the end of two years from the same date, after which, or on the award of the prize, the offers herein made will be withdrawn.

Intent to injure or defraud particular persons need not be stated in any Indictment.

60. It shall be sufficient in any indictment for any offence against this Act, where it shall be necessary to allege an intent to injure or defraud, to allege that the party accused did the act with intent to injure or defraud (as the case may be), without alleging an intent to injure or defraud any particular person, and on the trial of any such offence it shall not be necessary to prove an intent to injure or defraud any particular person; but it shall be sufficient to prove that the party accused did the act charged, with an intent to injure or defraud, (as the case may be).
