 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix, alter, and abolish the Rates of Postage at any time payable within the Colony for the transmission of letters by post either between places within New Zealand, or to or from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the Postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly: And whereas it is desirable that New Zealand Parliamentary Printed Papers should be exempt from Postage:

Now therefore, in exercise of the said recited power and authority, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim and declare, that New Zealand Parliamentary Printed Papers, posted on public service, shall be allowed to pass through all post offices in New Zealand free of Postage, if enclosed in a paper wrapper open at each end, having written or printed on such wrapper in legible characters, the words following, that is to say, *Exempt from Postage, being Parliamentary Printed Papers, on Public Service only.* And, with the like advice and consent, I do further declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this thirteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

 ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the sixth day of July, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Provincial Compulsory Land Taking Act, 1866," it is enacted that Standing Rules and Orders shall be prepared and adopted by every Provincial Council, regulating the proceedings on Bills authorizing the taking of land compulsorily, but that the same shall have no force or effect until they have been approved of by the Governor in Council, and been published in the *New Zealand Gazette*: And whereas the Standing Rules and Orders contained in the Schedule hereto have been prepared and adopted by the Provincial Council of the Province of Hawke's Bay, and it is expedient that effect should be given to the same:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby approve of the Rules and Orders contained in the Schedule hereto, as adopted by the said Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay, for regulating the proceedings in the said Council on Bills authorizing the taking of land compulsorily.

STANDING RULES and ORDERS of the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay, for regulating Proceedings on Bills authorizing the taking of Land compulsorily under "The Provincial Compulsory Land-Taking Act, 1866."

Notices to be Published.

1. Not less than thirty days before the commencement of the Session in which it is proposed to make application for a Bill intended to authorize the taking of land compulsorily, a notice, headed by a Short Title descriptive of the undertaking, shall be published once at least in the Provincial Government *Gazette*; and such notice shall also be published once a week for two successive weeks in some newspaper published within the Province, the first publication to be not less than thirty days before the commencement of the Session.

## Requisites of Notices.

2. Such notice shall state the objects of the intended Bill, and shall describe the land intended to be taken, and the proposed limits of deviation; and shall state the names of the townships or other territorial division in, through, or into which the work is intended to be made, maintained, varied, extended, or enlarged; and shall state the time and place of deposit of the plans, books of reference, and sections (when required), and copies of the Provincial Government *Gazette* notice, and the time at which a copy of the Bill will be deposited in the Superintendent's office.

## Notices respecting Burial-ground, &amp;c.

3. In cases of Bills respecting any burial-ground, slaughter-house, or gas-works, the notices shall set forth and specify the limits within which such burial ground, slaughter house, or gas works are intended to be erected or made.

## Notice of Diversion of Water from Canals.

4. In all cases where it is proposed to divert into any intended cut, canal, reservoir, aqueduct, or navigation, or into any intended variation, extension, or enlargement thereof respectively, any water from any existing cut, canal, reservoir, aqueduct, or navigation, whether directly or derivatively, and whether under any agreement with the proprietor thereof or otherwise, the notices shall contain the name of every such existing cut, canal, reservoir, aqueduct, or navigation, the water supplying which will either directly or derivatively flow, or proceed into any such intended cut, canal, reservoir, aqueduct, or navigation, or into any intended variation, extension, or enlargement thereof.

## Plan of Tidal Lands with Colonial Secretary.

5. In cases where the work shall be situated on tidal lands, within the ordinary spring tides, a copy of the plans and sections shall, thirty days before the commencement of the Session, be deposited in the Office of the Colonial Secretary.

## Notices and Applications to Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of Lands and Houses.

6. Not less than thirty days before the commencement of the Session in which it is proposed to make application for a Bill by which any lands or houses are intended to be taken, or an extension of the time granted by any former Act for that purpose is sought, application in writing must be made to the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of all lands and houses so intended to be taken, or which may be taken, as being within the limits of deviation defined upon the plan, and such applications shall be as nearly as may be in the form set forth in the Appendix marked A.

## Service of Application.

7. Such application shall be made by delivering the same personally to every such party; or by leaving the same at his usual place of abode, or, in his absence from the Colony, with his agent; or by forwarding the same by post, in a registered letter addressed with a sufficient direction to his usual place of abode, and posted before the first of such thirty days at the chief Post Office in the Province, at such hours and according to such regulations as may from time to time be in force for the posting and registration of registered letters.

## Evidence of Application.

8. In all cases a written acknowledgment, signed by the party applied to, of whose handwriting proof shall be given, shall, in the absence of other proof, be sufficient evidence of an application having been made, or notice given; and in case of an application or notice having been forwarded by post, in a registered letter, the production of the Post Office receipt for such letter, duly stamped, shall be sufficient evidence of the due delivery of such letter, provided it shall

appear that the same was properly and sufficiently directed, and that the same was not returned by the Post Office as undelivered.

## List of Owners, &amp;c., assenting, dissenting, and neuter.

9. Separate lists shall be made of the names of such owners, lessees, and occupiers, distinguishing those who have assented, dissented; or are neuter in respect to such application, or who have returned no answer thereto; and where no written acknowledgment has been returned to an application forwarded by post, or where such application has been returned as undelivered, at any time before the making up of such lists, the direction of the letter in which the same was so forwarded shall be inserted therein. (See Schedule.

## Notice to Owners along Highway or Stream proposed to be diverted.

10. Not less than thirty days before the commencement of the Session in which it is intended to make application for a Bill for the diversion or stopping up of any public street, highway, or thoroughfare, or of any river, stream, or creek, notice shall be served upon the owners or reputed owners, and occupiers or reputed occupiers, of all land over or by which such public street, highway, thoroughfare, river, stream, or creek passes, and situated between the point of diversion or stopping up and the point of reunion or recommencement, or if the river, stream, or creek diverted shall not reunite with its original course, then between the point of such diversion and the sea.

## Notice to Owners. Burial-grounds, &amp;c.

11. Not less than thirty days before the commencement of the Session in which it is intended to make application for any Bill for making a burial-ground or slaughter-house, or the erection of works for the manufacture of gas, notice shall be served upon the owners and occupiers of every dwelling-house situate within three hundred yards of the limits within which the proposed burial-ground, slaughter-house, or gas-works are intended to be erected or made.

## Notice to Owners, &amp;c., of relinquishment of Works.

12. Previously to asking leave to bring in a Bill whereby any part of a work authorized by any former Act is intended to be relinquished, notices in writing of such Bill shall be served upon the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of the lands in which the part of such work intended to be thereby relinquished is situate.

## Service and evidence of Application.

13. The notices required by the three preceding orders shall be served, and the service thereof proved, in the same manner as directed in Standing Orders Nos. 7 and 8.

## Service of Notice and Application, when invalid.

14. No notice served or application made on a Sunday, Good Friday, or Christmas Day, shall be deemed valid, except in case of delivery of letters by post.

## Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference, to be deposited with the Superintendent.

15. Plans, books of reference, and sections relating to the work or undertaking, and to the land proposed to be taken, shall be deposited for public inspection at the office of the Superintendent, thirty days at least before the commencement of the Session in which any Bill shall be introduced. Such plans, books of reference, and sections shall be as nearly as may be of the same nature and description as would be required in similar cases by the Standing Orders of the General Assembly of New Zealand relative to Private Bills, and a copy of the Bill shall be deposited in the Superintendent's office seven days before the commencement of the Session.

## Contents of Book of Reference.

16. Such book of reference to every such plan shall contain the names of the owners or reputed

owners, lessees, reputed lessees, and occupiers of all lands or houses in the line of the proposed work, or within the limits of deviation, as defined upon the plan, and shall describe such lands and houses respectively. (See Schedule.)

Superintendent to indorse Memorial on Plans.

17. The Superintendent shall make or cause to be made, a memorial in writing upon the plans and books of reference so deposited with him, denoting the time at which the same were lodged in his office, and shall at all reasonable hours of the day permit any person to view and examine the same, and to make copies or extracts therefrom; and the plans so deposited shall be retained in the possession of the Superintendent until the Session of the Provincial Council next ensuing shall be about to be held, when they shall be forwarded by the Superintendent to the office of the Clerk of the Provincial Council, so as to be deposited there as nearly as may be within a week of the commencement of the Session.

Form of Bill and Address of Promoters.

18. The Bill shall be introduced with all blanks filled up, and shall not embrace any object which shall be foreign to the import of the notices hereinbefore required; and the Short Title shall correspond with that at the head of the advertisements, and shall not be changed without special leave from the Council; and a copy of the Bill shall be furnished to the Clerk of the Council, with the names of the promoters or some of them, or of their agent, indorsed thereupon, with address in Napier at which notices may be served upon them.

Parties objecting may Petition.

19. Any person whose property or interests may be affected by the Bill, may petition the Council against it, upon the ground of non-compliance with the Standing Orders in some respect to be specifically stated in the petition, or on the ground of the omission of particular provisions from the Bill, or upon the ground that certain parts of the Bill to be specifically pointed out affect their property and interests in certain respects to be specifically stated; and such petition shall have indorsed thereupon an address in Napier at which notices may be served upon the petitioners: Provided that if the objection be on the ground of non-compliance with Standing Orders, in respect of anything specially affecting a particular person, such person shall have signed the petition and shall not have withdrawn his signature.

Petitions to be presented before Second Reading.

20. No petition shall be received against a Bill after the same has been read a second time, except by special leave of the Council.

Petitions to be referred to Select Committee.

21. Every such petition shall be referred to the Select Committee on the Bill for their consideration, and such petitioners may appear and be heard by themselves, their agents and witnesses, before such Committee.

Bills to be printed at the expense of Promoters.

22. Before leave is given to bring in a Private Bill, and at subsequent stages whenever the Council shall order the reprinting thereof, such Bill shall be printed at the expense of the parties applying for it, in the same form as Public Bills, and a sufficient number of copies delivered to the Clerk of the Council for the use of the members thereof.

Constitution of Select Committee.

23. When a Bill shall have been read a first time, it shall be referred to a Select Committee, to consist of the Speaker, who shall act as Chairman, the member in charge of the Bill, and three other members not locally or personally interested, to be appointed by ballot, or, if the Speaker shall be interested, the Chairman of Committees or some member appointed

by the House upon motion, and not locally or personally interested, shall be a member and Chairman of the Committee.

Declaration required from Members.

24. Every member of the Select Committee other than the member in charge of the Bill shall, before he be entitled to vote on such Committee, sign the following declaration:—

I do hereby declare that my constituents have no local interest and that I have no personal interest in (such) Bill, and that I will never vote on any question which may arise without having duly heard and attended to the evidence relating thereto.

And no such Committee shall proceed to business until the said declaration shall have been so signed by each of such members.

Members in charge of the Bill may attend Committee, though interested, but shall not vote.

25. The member in charge of the Bill shall not be entitled to vote in Committee if he be locally or personally interested, or until he shall have subscribed the declaration required by the preceding rule, but may, notwithstanding, attend and take part in the proceedings of the Committee.

Quorum in Committee.

26. In every such Select Committee three shall be a quorum, and all questions shall be decided by a majority of votes including that of the Chairman; and whenever the votes are equal, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

Notice to be given of Meetings of Committee.

27. The Select Committee shall not proceed to business until three clear days after the Bill shall have been read a first time, and the Clerk of the Council shall give one clear day's notice of the day and hour fixed for the first meeting of the Committee, and for every subsequent meeting when the day and hour shall not have been fixed by adjournment to the promoters of the Bill or their agents, and to any petitioners or their agents, whose petition shall not have been considered by the Committee.

Statutory Declarations admitted in Evidence.

28. The Select Committee may admit declarations made under the provisions of "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1866," in proof of the compliance with the Standing Orders, and other facts required to be proved, or may require further evidence.

Points on which Committee are to report.

29. The Select Committee shall inquire whether the Standing Orders have been complied with; whether the land which the Bill seeks power to take compulsorily is sufficiently described in the Bill by reference or otherwise, and is land which has been granted by the Crown; whether such land is absolutely required for the proposed work or undertaking, and whether the work or undertaking in respect of which the land is proposed to be taken is of a public nature, and is intended to be carried out within a reasonable time, and whether proper provision has been or can and will be made to meet the expense necessary for the completion of the same; whether the Bill embraces any object not mentioned in the preliminary notice thereof, or any clause inconsistent with the provisions of "The Land Clauses Consolidation Act, 1863;" whether the parties whose interests are affected are generally consenting parties to the Bill; and if the Bill is objectionable in any of these respects shall report to the Council accordingly, and generally as to the merits of the Bill, and the alterations (if any) which are required in it.

Bill to be dealt with as a Public Bill. Stages prescribed.

30. Upon a Private Bill being brought up and reported by the Select Committee, such Bill shall be proceeded with as in the case of Public Bills, a future day being appointed for the second reading: Pro-

vided that no Bill shall be read a second time until the Select Committee shall have reported under the hand of their Chairman, that Standing Orders numbers 1 to 16 inclusive, have been complied with, and that no clause be submitted to form part of the Bill or amendments added which shall be foreign to the import of the notices hereinbefore required: Provided also that there shall always be an interval of not less than two days between such report and the second reading, and not less than two days between the second and third reading.

Agents.

31. No person shall act as Agent for a Bill who is not a Solicitor of the Supreme Court, and neither a member of the Provincial Council nor a partner of a member, and who has not signed a declaration to observe and obey all rules of the Provincial Council, and pay all fees and charges when demanded; and if any Agent shall wilfully act in violation of the rules of the Council, or wilfully misconduct himself in the conduct of proceedings on a Bill before the Council, the Speaker may prohibit him from acting as an Agent either during the duration of the Provincial Council, or for a less time.

Standing Orders not subject to suspension.

32. These Standing Orders shall not be subject to suspension.

Scale of Fees.

33. The scale of fees to be paid by parties promoting Private Bills shall be as follows:—

And any Bill shall be stopped by the Speaker in any stage of its progress, if any fee then due is unpaid. Fees to be applied to the use of the Provincial Council Library.

34. All fees payable under these Standing Orders shall be paid to the Clerk of the Council, who shall account for the same to the Speaker, and the same fees shall be held by the Speaker in trust for the purposes of the Provincial Council Library.

What Bills exempt from Fees.

35. Any Bill promoted by the Superintendent under "The Provincial Compulsory Land Taking Act, 1866," shall be subject to the foregoing Standing Orders, with the exception of those imposing fees, from which it shall be exempt.

APPENDIX A.

SIR,—We beg to inform you that application is intended to be made to the Provincial Legislature, in the ensuing Session, for an Act [*Here insert the title of the Act*], and that the property mentioned in the annexed Schedule or some part thereof, in which we understand you are interested as therein stated, will be required for the purposes of the said undertaking, according to the line thereof as at present laid out, or may be required to be taken under the usual powers of deviation to the extent of yards on either side of the said line, which will be applied for in the said Act.

We also beg to inform you that a plan of the said undertaking, with a book of reference thereto, has been or will be deposited for public inspection in the office of the Superintendent of the Province, thirty days before the commencement of the next Session of the Hawke's Bay Provincial Council, on which plan your property is designated by the numbers set forth in the annexed Schedule.

As we are required to report to the Provincial Council whether you assent to or dissent from the proposed undertaking, or whether you are neuter in respect thereto, you will oblige us by writing your answer of assent, dissent, or neutrality, in the form

left herewith, and returning the same to us with your signature on or before the day of next; and if there should be an error or misdescription in the annexed Schedule, we shall feel obliged by your informing us thereof at your earliest convenience, that we may correct the same without delay.
