ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twentieth day of July, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Native Reserves Act, 1856," it is enacted that the Commissioners appointed under the said Act may, with the assent of the Governor, set apart any lands which shall have been reserved or set apart for the benefit of the aboriginal inhabitants of the Colony, over which lands the Native title shall have been extinguished, by way of special endowment for schools, hospitals, or other eleemosynary institutions, for the benefit of the said aboriginal inhabitants:

Act, 1862," it is enacted that from and after a certain day all the powers and authorities which by the said first-recited Act are given to, or vested in, or which may be exercised by Commissioners appointed under the said Act, shall vest in and may be exercised by the Governor, and that where, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act are any act is required to be done by Commissioners with the approval or assent of the Governor, it shall be sufficient if such act be done by the Governor with the advice of his Executive Council:

And whereas the piece of land described in the Schedule hereto has been set apart for the benefit of the aboriginal inhabitants of the Colony, and the Native title over the same has been extinguished, and it is expedient that the same should be set apart for the purposes hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of the powers in him vested by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby set apart all the piece of land described in the Schedule hereto as an endowment for schools, for the construction and repair of school

buildings, and other eleemosynary institutions if any, and providing masters and teachers, and payments of salaries of such masters and teachers, and generally for the purpose of founding and maintaining schools for the instruction, education, and benefit of aboriginal inhabitants of New Zealand, being the Ngaitahu and Ngatimamoe Tribes.

Mongonui.—Strong winds on 6th, 7th and 26th, from S.E., N.E., and N.W., heavy rain on 7th; thunder on 18th, and lightning without thunder on 19th; fog on 16th; otherwise the weather was generally fine. Prevailing wind, S.W.
Auckland.—Severe storm on 8th and 9th from N.E., with only slight rain; on morning of 8th the horizontal movement of wind for 24 hours previously was 1°070 miles; on 19th the weather weat and unpleasant, wind S.W.; heavy showers of rain on 27th from S.W. Otherwise the weather was pleasant at this Station; rainfall below average. Prevailing wind from S.W.
Taranaki.—Stormy on 3rd from W., and on 8th strong N.E. wind with rain; again on 19th stormy from N.E. with very heavy rain; on 29th fog; on 15th and 26th the weather was generally were varin; rainfall rather lower than the average, and temperature higher; sky generally clear and bright, and on the whole fine weather. Prevailing wind from S.W.
Wellington.—On the whole the weather has been wet and unpleasant during the month, although at times bright and clear -stormy on 15th from N.W., and on 24th from same quarter; strong S.E. wind on 28th and 29th with rain; fog on 11th. Prevailing winds from N.W. Earthquakes on 3rd at 10 p.m., two very slight shocks; also slight shock on 25th at 8.32 a.m., lasting three seconds. Aurors on evening of 3rd. High tide on 19th.
Nelson.—Very wet weather during the month, but occasionally fine and bright; on 9th, 3.45 inches of rain registered for previous 24 hours, and strong from N.E.; on 16th heavy rain on 19th and 20th from E., 1°600 registered on morning of 20th; on 22nd gale from S.W., and on 28rd strong wind from same quarter. Very weit was always of S.W. wind.
Bealey.—Glae on 37th from N.W., and on 28rd strong wind from same quarter ; very cold and servere weather generally; thunder on 3rd, 15th, 16th, and 28th; yery heavy rain needed on morning of 16th; snow on 2nd, 3rd, and 23rd; fog on 4th, 5th, 6th, and 20th from S.W. and on 28th strong wind from

wind from W.

Southland.--Observer remarks weather generally fine, but at times damp and showery; on 15th barometer fell suddenly from 29.90 to 23.94, followed on 17th by heavy rainfall from S.E. and floods. Thunder on 2nd and 27th; hail on 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 22nd. Prevailing wind from W.
