HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Otago Settlements Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to make in any settlement in the Province of Otago, constituted under the said Act, such Reserves as he may think necessary for purposes connected with the public service of the Colony:

And whereas a settlement has been constituted in Martin's Bay, in the said Province:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the power and authority in that behalf vested in him, doth hereby except from sale and reserve to Her Majesty the several parcels of the Waste Lands of the Crown particularly specified and described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule mentioned, and set opposite the descriptions of the said parcels of land respectively.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the thirty-first day of August, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Native

Reserves Amendment Act, 1862," it is amongst other things provided, that where, under the provisions of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants is required to bringing land under the operation of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare such assent to have been ascertained, and thereupon the title of the aboriginal inhabitants in the land to which the same shall relate shall be deemed to be extinguished, and the land shall, from the date of such Order in Council, vest in Her Majesty for the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," as attested by the recited Act, and that as effectually as if the same had been ceded and conveyed by such aboriginal inhabitants to Her Majesty:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants to the bringing the pieces of land described in the Schedule hereunder written under the operation of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," has been ascertained.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land situate at Takaka in the Province of Nelson, and known as a portion of a Native Reserve marked B on the plan of the said district, bounded towards the North by a creek which intersects the said reserve; towards the East partly by section 14, and partly by a road; towards the South by section 16; and towards the West also by a portion of section 16, on the plan of the District of Takaka.

All that piece of land situate at Takaka, in the Province of Nelson, and known as Native Reserves marked I, J, and K on the plan of the said district, bounded towards the North by a portion of section 4; towards the East partly by section 4, partly by a road, and partly by a portion of section 5; towards the South by a portion of section 5; and towards the West partly by section 6, partly by a portion of section 7, partly by a road and partly by a portion of section 4, on the plan of the said district.

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS IN BRITISH
POSSESSIONS ABROAD.

WAGES AND EFFECTS OF DECEASED MERCHANT
SEAMEN.

THE British Government have agreed with the Governments of France, Denmark, Sweden and Norway, and the North German Confederation, to deliver to their respective Consuls-General in London the wages and effects received by the Board of Trade under the provisions of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," of Seamen belonging to those countries who have died on board British merchant vessels; and these Governments have on their part agreed to deliver to the nearest British Consul the property of British Seamen dying on board their merchant vessels, or on shore in their territories.

The Officers are therefore requested to report to the Board of Trade the particulars of the deaths of such British Seamen.

THE following Report by His Honor the Superintendent of Otago, on the Stone Graving Dock in course of construction at the Port of Otago, is published for general information.

SIR,—With a view to its becoming generally known that vessels of Her Majesty's Navy as well as of the mercantile marine, frequenting these seas, can be docked and repaired in New Zealand, I have the honor to request that His Excellency the Governor may be advised to call the attention of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to the stone graving dock now rapidly approaching completion at the Port of Otago, the dimensions of which are as under:—

Depth of water at dock sill, ordinary tides	19 ft. 6 in.
Ditto ditto, spring tides	21 ft.
Ditto ditto, neap tides	17 ft. 6 in.
Length of dock	330 ft.
Width, above	68 ft.
Ditto, below	41 ft.
Ditto, where ship's bilge would be	43 ft.

I may add that the dock will be ready to take in vessels in January, 1871.

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF NEW ZEALAND.

REGULÉ GENERALES, JULY 1870.

BY virtue of the powers vested by law in the Judges of the Supreme Court,—

It is ordered by the Judges of the said Court, that the following General Rules shall come into and be in force on and after the 1st of October, 1870.

Dismissal of Action when Plaintiff does not proceed to Trial.

1. In case the Plaintiff in any action in which issues of fact are to be tried by a Jury shall not proceed to trial at the Circuit Court at which such trial shall have been appointed under Rule 130 to take place, the action may, at the discretion of the Court, on the motion of the Defendant, made within fourteen days after the last sitting day of such Circuit Court, be dismissed for want of prosecution, unless it shall appear to the Court that the delay is in part imputable to the Defendant, or that there is some other reasonable excuse for it.

Interest on Judgment after Verdict.

2. In all cases where Plaintiff or Defendant shall become entitled, by verdict of a Jury, to the recovery of money, the judgment ultimately entered up upon such verdict shall, for the purpose of entitling the successful party to interest, be deemed to relate back to the earliest time at which, but for intermediate proceedings, the judgment could have been entered up after verdict.

3. The like rule shall apply to judgments, in actions for money, upon special cases stated either with or without pleadings, not reversed upon Appeal or Error.

Serving Rule Nisi for New Trial.

4. In all cases of motion for a new trial, or in arrest of judgment, within Rule 185, any rule nisi granted upon such motion shall, in order to operate as a stay of proceedings, be drawn up and served before the period has elapsed at which the party for whom the verdict is found may proceed to tax costs and enter

judgment, or before such further period as the Court, at the time of granting the rule nisi, shall direct.

SUPREME COURT OF NEW ZEALAND.
JULY, 1870.

General Rules under "The Bankruptcy Act, 1867," and "The Bankruptcy Act Amendment Act, 1868."

BY virtue of the provisions of "The Bankruptcy Act, 1867," and "The Bankruptcy Act Amendment Act, 1868," we, the undersigned Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby order that the following General Rules shall come into and be in force on and after the 1st day of October, 1870:—

1. All notices gazetted in any newspaper by any debtor, having filed his declaration of insolvency, or by any bankrupt, their or his Solicitor or Agent in the matter of the insolvency or bankruptcy, shall be headed by the Royal Arms, and by the words "In Bankruptcy," in letters larger than those adopted in the body of the notice so gazetted; but one heading shall be sufficient for a column of notices if they are all in bankruptcy.

2. All bills referred for taxation by a Judge of a District Court to the Registrar or Taxing-Master of the Supreme Court, shall be referred by order signed by such Judge, and sealed with the Seal of such District Court.

3. All taxations and settlements of charges, fees, and disbursements held and made under the provisions of the Acts, shall be by order of Court, for that purpose to be first obtained upon application to a Judge of the Supreme Court, or of the District Court before which the matter of the bankrupt estate shall be under course of administration.

4. A copy of such order shall be served upon such persons and in such manner as the Judge shall in each case direct.

5. An appointment for taxation may be obtained and served, and the taxation shall be conducted in accordance with the general rules of practice and procedure affecting taxation of costs between party and party which shall for the time being be in force in the Supreme Court.

6. The Registrar or Taxing Officer shall in his taxation be guided by the scale of charges, fees, allowances to witnesses and otherwise, and disbursements allowed upon taxation in bankruptcy in England, so far as the same may be suitable to the circumstances of this Colony; and where the same may be unsuitable, by the scale of costs, charges, fees,

and disbursements allowed upon taxation in civil proceedings in the Supreme Court: Provided that the following fees shall be charged and payable:—

7. Any person desiring to appeal in any bankruptcy from the decision of a Judge of a District Court shall, within twenty-one days from the date of the decision or order to be appealed from, deliver to the Clerk a statement in writing signed by himself, his Counsel, Solicitor or Agent, containing the grounds of his objection to such decision, and notice of his intention to appeal against the same; and shall also within three days thereafter, or such other time as the Judge of the District Court may direct, give notice of such appeal to the Trustee and such other person interested as the District Judge shall direct; and shall also give security, to be approved by the Clerk of the Court, for the costs of the appeal, and for the amount, if any, which the Appellant may, by such decision, have been ordered to pay.

8. Such notice of appeal shall be in writing, and shall state the grounds on which the party appeals, and shall be signed by the Appellant, his Solicitor or Agent, and such notice shall be delivered to the Clerk of the District Court, to be by him filed with the proceedings in the bankruptcy, and a duplicate thereof shall be served on the Trustee and such persons as the Judge may direct.

9. Such appeal shall be in the form of a case agreed on by both parties, or their Solicitors; and if they cannot agree, the Judge of the District Court, upon being applied to in that behalf, shall settle the case, and such case shall be transmitted by the Appellant to the Registrar of the Supreme Court. Provided that if the appeal shall be on matter of fact, the case shall contain a duly verified statement of the evidence taken before the District Court Judge, so far as the same shall relate to the matter of fact determined by his decision.

10. All cases on appeal from any District Court shall, unless the Judge shall otherwise order, be presented to him for his approval and signature, on the earliest practicable occasion which shall happen after the grounds of objection to the decision shall have been lodged, and shall then, or as soon afterwards as the case shall be approved, be signed by the Judge, and be sealed with the seal of the District Court; and when signed and sealed, a copy thereof shall be served by the Appellant on the Trustee or Respondent, or both, as the Judge shall direct, within forty-eight hours from such signing and sealing, or as soon thereafter as shall be practicable.

11. The Appellant shall, within forty-eight hours after the case is signed and sealed, or as soon after as shall be practicable, transmit the same to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, and notice of such transmission shall be served on the Respondent and Trustee; in default whereof, the Respondent shall, on application to the Court below, be entitled to such costs as he shall have incurred in consequence of the Appellant's proceedings, which costs shall be added to the amount, if any, which the Appellant may have been ordered to pay.

12. The appeal shall be set down for hearing, and shall be heard and determined before the Supreme Court at such time and in like manner as other appeals from a District Court.

13. When the Supreme Court has pronounced judgment, either party may deposit the original order of such Court, or an office copy thereof, with the Clerk of the District Court, to be by him filed with the proceedings in the said Bankruptcy; and within

forty-eight hours from the time of such deposit shall serve or transmit a notice thereof upon or to the opposite party and the Trustee: and such further proceedings as may be necessary shall thereupon be awarded or taken by the District Court.

14. The Provisional Trustee, upon his becoming possessed as Receiver of any property of a debtor filing his declaration of insolvency, shall forthwith deliver to the Registrar a schedule of such property, to be by the Registrar filed, deposited, and safely kept with such declaration.

15. The debtor, immediately after filing in the Court the list required by the 50th section of the Act, shall deliver to the Trustee a copy of the schedule of such debtor's liabilities and assets.

16. The Trustee, in the absence of directions from the creditors in that behalf, shall, at the request in writing of the bankrupt, or any creditor who has proved his debt, call a meeting of creditors, to be holden at such time and place as the Trustee shall deem convenient.

17. Every Provisional and other Trustee shall keep a minute book of his proceedings and transactions in respect of the matter of each bankruptcy, under a special head applicable thereto, and also a book wherein shall be entered a statement of all his receipts and disbursements relating to any estate under his administration; which books shall be open to inspection during office hours by any creditor who has proved his debt, on payment of a fee of one shilling.

18. Before declaring a dividend, the Trustee shall call for vouchers of debts proved, and in case he shall refuse to admit the claim of any creditor to the whole or part of the debt claimed, the Trustee shall forthwith give notice thereof to the creditor. If no appeal against the decision of the Trustee shall by such creditor be delivered to the Trustee within eight days thereafter, or in cases where, by reason of the distance of the creditor's residence from the office of the Trustee, this shall not be practicable, within such time as an exchange of posts will allow, the Trustee shall rank such creditor for the amount found by the Trustee to be due, and no more.

19. The statement of accounts to be filed by the bankrupt in pursuance of the 112th section of the Act shall in all cases comprise, first, a statement of the assets and liabilities of the bankrupt as existing on a day to be named for that purpose by the order appointing the time for the bankrupt's last examination, or by some other order of the Court or a Judge, such day to be not less than six calendar months prior to the filing of the petition for adjudication; secondly, a statement of every receipt, purchase, profit, and acquisition by any means whatsoever, and of every payment, sale, loss, loan, conveyance, mortgage, settlement, execution, and other alienation by act of the party or by act or operation of law, and of every other transaction in anywise affecting the amount or nature of the bankrupt's assets and liabilities, which shall have been made or have taken place during the period intervening between the day so named as aforesaid, and the filing of the said petition: Provided that every order of the Court or a Judge respecting such account may from time to time be varied.

20. In the absence of any special direction of the Court, or a Judge, to the contrary, such statement of accounts shall be filed at least ten clear days before the day appointed for the bankrupt's last examination.

21. No creditor shall, without leave of the Court, to be obtained upon affidavit of the cause of his delay therein, be admitted to oppose the application for the bankrupt's discharge, unless such creditor shall have proved his debt at least one clear day

before the day fixed for the bankrupt's final examination.

22. In the event of no direction being given to any Trustee at a duly constituted meeting of creditors as to the bank in which trust moneys are to be kept or lodged, they shall be kept and lodged in such bank and to such account as shall be directed by the Accountant in Bankruptcy.

23. The first audit under section 234 of the accounts of the Trustee shall take place and commence at the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the order of Court confirming the choice of such Trustee, and thenceforward such audit shall take place quarterly: Provided that if the first, or any such quarterly day, shall fall on a Sunday or holiday, the audit shall take place on the day next following, not being a Sunday or holiday.

24. The audit account of the Trustee shall be made out in the ordinary form of a debtor and creditor account, each item being entered according to its date, and containing a full and specific account of the transactions referred to by such item, and a written voucher shall be produced in support of every disbursement exceeding in amount forty shillings, unless on application to the Court, or a Judge, this requirement shall be dispensed with in any particular case. The Trustee shall also produce to the Auditor his bank pass-book, and shall verify his account by affidavit filed, together with a copy of such account, in the Supreme Court.

25. After every such audit, the Auditor, on passing the account, shall sign a memorandum, duly intitled, in the matter of the bankruptcy, in the following form:—

Memorandum.—I, the undersigned, Supervisor in the estate of A.B., a bankrupt, did, at the time and place under mentioned, audit the account of X.Y., Trustee of the said estate, and I certify that the same appears to be correct, and I find that there is now a balance of £ to the credit of the said estate at the [State the name of the bank in which the balance shall be deposited], and [if the case be so] £ in the hands of the said Trustee. I also find that the unrealized property of the bankrupt consists of [Here state shortly particulars of the property, if any]. Given under my hand at , this day of , 1870.

And such memorandum shall be filed forthwith by the Trustee in the Supreme Court.

26. In all cases where the creditors shall fail to elect a Trustee, the Trustee acting in lieu of such elected Trustee shall receive for his remuneration, together with the costs, charges, and expenses necessarily incurred by him in connection with the estate, a commission on all moneys received by him, after the following scale:—

On his first receipts up to £250 ...	8 p cent.
On his next receipts after the first £250 up to £500 ...	6 p cent.
On his next receipts after the first £500 up to £1,000 ...	4 p cent.
On his next receipts after the first £1,000 up to £3,000 ...	2 p cent.
On all further receipts after the first £3,000 ...	1 p cent.

Provided that the percentage on the proceeds of the sale of property subject to any mortgage shall be calculated only on the surplus payable to the debtor's estate.
