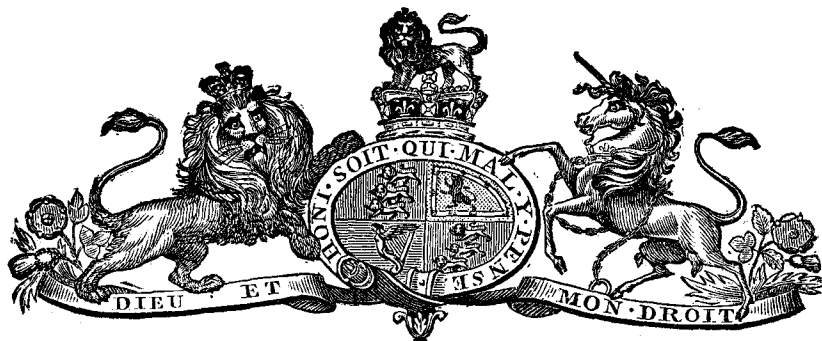

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare that from a day to be in such Proclamation fixed, sections one hundred and five to one hundred and fifteen, both inclusive, having special reference to persons of the Native race, or such of those sections as shall be in such Proclamation specified, shall come into operation in such districts of the Colony as shall be in such Proclamation specified, and until so proclaimed, and in places not included in any such district, such sections shall not be in force, and by like Proclamation to alter or re-define such districts or cancel any Proclamation so declaring such sections or any of them to have come into force:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, sections one hundred and five, one hundred and six, one hundred and seven, one hundred and eight, one hundred and nine, one hundred and ten, one hundred and eleven, one hundred and twelve, and one hundred and thirteen of "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," having special reference to persons of the Maori race, were, from and after a date in the said Proclamation named, brought into operation within certain districts therein defined, and amongst others within so much of the district proclaimed under the said Act by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, as the "New Plymouth District," as lies beyond ten miles from the Court House at New Plymouth: And whereas it is expedient to bring into operation within so much of the said district as lies within the said radius of ten miles from the said Court House the said sections of the said Act, having special reference to persons of the Maori race, numbered from one hundred and five to one hundred and thirteen, both inclusive:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pur-

suance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of October next, the sections numbered from one hundred and five to one hundred and thirteen, both inclusive, of "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," shall come into operation within the whole of the said District of New Plymouth, not only so much as lies beyond the radius of ten miles from the said Court House, but also within so much as lies within the said radius.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, at the Government House, at Wellington, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this twentieth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

 ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventeenth day of September, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867," it is enacted that if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who, or any of whom, shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof, or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by virtue of a Crown Grant bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the parcel of land and hereditaments described in the Schedule hereto became vested in Rahui, Hori Panapa, and Wiremu Apo Te Whakaotinga, of the district of Mahurangi, in the Province of Auckland, aboriginal natives of New Zealand: And whereas the said Wiremu Apo Te Whakaotinga is an infant under the age of twenty-one years:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby order that the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be and remain vested in Arama Karaka, of Kaipara, aboriginal native of New Zealand, and John Sheehan, of Kaipara, as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, for the said Wiremu Apo Te Whakaotinga, his heirs and assigns.

SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land in our Province of Auckland, in our Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement thirty-one thousand four hundred and eight (31,408) acres, more or less, situate at Mahurangi, in the District of Mahurangi, County of Marsden, being called or known by the name of Pakiri, and numbered one thousand four hundred and fifty-six (1,456); bounded towards the North-east by the sea; towards the South-east by the Pakiri River by lines eight thousand four hundred (8,400) links, one thousand eight hundred and five (1,805) links, thirty-six thousand two hundred and thirty (36,230) links, and two thousand four hundred (2,400) links by the Whangaripo Creek and by the Hoteo River; towards the South-west by the Hoteo Block, eight thousand five hundred and thirty-six (8,536) links, and twenty-seven thousand one hundred and thirty-seven (27,137) links; and towards the North-west by the Oruawhoro Block, fourteen thousand three hundred and twenty (14,320) links, sixteen thousand two hundred and fifteen (16,215) links, three thousand one hundred and seventy-eight (3,178) links, and six thousand eight hundred and seventy-four (6,874) links; and by the Arai Block, five thousand five hundred and sixty (5,560) links, fifty-one thousand six hundred and sixty eight (51,668) links, and fourteen thousand seven hundred and eighty (14,780) links.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of September, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereinafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance

and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

LOWTHER BROAD, Esq.,

to be a Warden of all Wardens' Courts now constituted within the Nelson South-west Gold Fields, with power to him to act alone or with assessors, and to exercise all or any of the powers vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.
