A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Bridges and Ferries Act 1868 Amendment Act, 1869," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, declare "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," to be in operation in any Province, and on a day to be fixed in such Proclamation "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," shall come into operation in such Province:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said first-mentioned Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that on the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the said "Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," shall be in operation in the County of Westland.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington; and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Bridges and Ferries Act 1868 Amendment Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council,

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by the said "Bridges and Ferries Act 1868 Amendment Act, 1869," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby delegate to

CONRAD HOOS, Esq.,

Chairman of the County Council of Westland, all the powers by "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," vested in the Governor, and exercisable by him within the said County of Westland, except the powers conferred by the second section of the said Act.

And whereas by virtue of a Crown Grant bearing date the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the parcel of land and hereditaments described in the Schedule hereto, became vested in Hori Ngakapa Whanaunga, Eruere Maihi, Hone Tari, and Pita Wata, of the District of Hauraki, in the Province of Auckland, aboriginal natives of New Zealand: And whereas the said Eruera Maihi, Hone Tari, and Pita Wata, are infants under the age of twenty-one years:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby order that the lands described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and remain vested in Hori Ngakapa, Whanaunga, of Hauraki, an aboriginal native of New Zealand, as Trustee within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, for the said Eruera Maihi, Hone Tari, and Pita Wata, their heirs and assigns.

Merchant Shipping Act, 1867.

MEDICAL SCALE FOR MERCHANT SHIPS.

THE annexed Scale of Medicines and Medical Stores for Merchant Ships has been issued and caused to be published by the Board of Trade.

The following portions of section 4 and section 5 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1867," refer to the Scale of Medicines and Medical Stores, viz.:—

By section 4, paragraph 1, it is provided that "The Board of Trade shall from time to time issue and cause to be published Scales of Medicines and Medical Stores, suitable for different ships and voyages." By paragraph 2 of the same section it is further provided that "The Owners of every ship navigating between the United Kingdom and any

place out of the same shall provide and cause to be kept on board such ship a supply of Medicines and Medical Stores in accordance with the Scale appropriate to the said ship." The concluding portion of the same section sets forth that if in any ship as aforesaid such Medicines [and] Medical Stores "as are hereinbefore required, are not provided, packed, and kept on board as hereinbefore required, the Owner or Master shall be deemed to be in fault, and shall for each default incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, unless he can prove that the non-compliance with the above provisions, or any of them, was not caused through any inattention, neglect, or wilful default on his part;" and further, that "if in any case it is proved that some person other than the Master or Owner is in default" . . . "then such other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds."

By section 5 of the Act it is provided that "Any person who manufactures, sells, or keeps or offers for sale, any such Medicines or Medical Stores as aforesaid which are of bad quality, shall for each such offence incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds."
