ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Wellington, this twenty-ninth day of September, 1870.

Present:

THE HONORABLE DONALD McLEAN, NATIVE AND DEFENCE MINISTER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the powers conferred on Judges of District Courts in and by the twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, and twenty-seventh sections of "The District Courts Act, 1858," shall be exercised only within such districts as shall from time to time be named by the Governor, by Order in Council published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, as districts within which such powers may be exercised:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him in that behalf, name and declare

THE WESTLAND NORTH DISTRICT, and
 THE COUNTY OF WESTLAND DISTRICT,

as defined in and by a certain Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of June last, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the thirtieth day of June last, to be districts within which the powers conferred by the twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, and twenty-seventh sections of "The District Courts Act, 1858," may be exercised.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The New Zealand Settlements Acts Amendment Act, 1866," power is given to the Governor to reserve portions of any of the land taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," for the several purposes for which

reserves may be made under the twelfth section of "The Waste Lands Act, 1858," and may make grants thereof under "The Public Reserves Act, 1854," or otherwise, as the case may require: And whereas the purposes for which such reserves may be made under the said twelfth section of the said "Waste Lands Act, 1858," are for the construction of trunk lines of road, or as sites for public buildings for the use of the General Government, or for other purposes of public utility or convenience: And whereas the piece of land described in the Schedule hereunder written has been taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and it is expedient that it should be reserved for the purpose herein set forth:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in me, do hereby except from sale and reserve to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, the piece of land described in the Schedule hereunder written, as a Ferry Reserve, or for other purposes of the General Government.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF TARANAKI.

All that parcel of land, containing five (5) acres two (2) roods and thirty-five (35) perches, more or less, situated on the eastern bank of the Patea River, opposite Blocks XXI. and XXVI., Township of Carlyle, bounded towards the North-east and East by a creek; and towards the West by the Patea River and a road about two hundred (200) links and one thousand (1,000) links.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Auckland, this sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME,
GREETING:

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1870," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, from time to time to appoint polling places for each Electoral District, within one mile of the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the principal polling place for the district, and all or any of such polling places from time to time to abolish, and, if he think fit, to appoint other polling places in lieu of those abolished, and that every such Warrant shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*: Provided always that no polling place shall be appointed by the Governor under the said Act unless he shall be first satisfied that the place to be appointed is more convenient than any other for twenty Electors to record their votes thereat:

And whereas by Warrant under the hand of the Governor, bearing date the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the School House, North Dunedin, was appointed a polling place for the District of City of Dunedin, for the election of Superintendents and Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the same:

Now know ye that I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby abolish the above-named polling place for the District of City of Dunedin, for the election of Superintendents and Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued at Wellington, this fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

WHEREAS by the twenty-ninth section of "The Native Lands Act, 1867," it is enacted that "There shall be payable to the Valuers appointed by the Registrar of Deeds, under the fifty-fifth section of the said Act, by the person or persons who by the said Act are liable to pay the duties, such fees for making any such valuation as therein is mentioned as shall be fixed by regulations to be made by the Governor:" And whereas it is expedient that such regulation should be made:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of New Zealand, do hereby fix such fees as aforesaid by the Regulation following, that is to say—For making the valuation referred to in the fifty-fifth section of "The Native Lands Act, 1865," there shall be paid to each Valuer appointed by any Registrar of Deeds under the said section of said last-named Act, by the person or persons who by the said last-named Act are liable to pay the duties, the following fees, that is to say—

TENDERS will be received at this Office until the tenth day of December, 1870, from persons willing to supply the New Zealand Government with Stationery, to be delivered free of expense in this Colony, at such Port as the Government may indicate, for the Twelve Months commencing on the 1st June, 1871.

1. The value of all necessary packages, whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices demanded, and the net weight or quantity only will be paid for.

2. A bond for the sum of £1,000, the Contractor in the sum of £500 and two approved sureties of £250 each, for the due performance of the contract, will be required to be entered into within a month of the acceptance of the contract.

3. The Tenderers will be required to forward samples of the articles marked with an asterisk.

Each sample must be indorsed with the number given to it in the Schedule. The samples forwarded by parties whose tenders are not accepted will be returned.

4. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.

5. In the case of different makers' goods, the Contractors will be required to supply the kind ordered.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution.

7. The Contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantity of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates.

8. The acceptance of the supplies will be subject to the approval of the officers in the various Provinces appointed by the Government. The Contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must without delay give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the Contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the Contractor's account.

10. It will be competent either for the Contractor on his own behalf, or for the Colonial Secretary on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract by giving notice in writing of three months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

11. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the Contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportional allowance, by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

12. A separate tender having been invited for certain descriptions of Printing Paper, Envelopes, &c., the acceptance of any tender for the same articles enumerated herein will be only for such quantities as may be required during the year in addition to the quantities contracted for by such separate tender.
