G. F. Bowen, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted, that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent, as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill; and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein:

And whereas the Ordinance hereinafter specified has been enacted by the Superintendent of Auckland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Ordinance was received by the Governor on the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should be disallowed:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland, namely-

"The Kaipara Railway Act, 1871."

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, may, as to parts within the North Island of New Zealand, define the roads and the boundaries thereof, and the bridges and ferries which shall be and be deemed to be roads, bridges, or ferries, as the case may be, under the provisions of the said Act, and any such Proclamation may include existing roads, but no such roads or parts of roads shall be included if they are, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, roads which should be constructed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province wherein such roads are situated (as well as new road lines); and the Governor from time to time may revoke or alter any such Proclamation: And whereas in the opinion of me, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Governor of New Zealand, and the Executive Council of New Zealand, the road defined in the Schedule hereunto is not a road which should be constructed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Wellington:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the road within the North Island of New Zealand, described, and the boundaries whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereto, and which road is delineated on a plan numbered I., deposited in the office of the Public Works Department, at Wellington, in the Province of Wellington, and thereon coloured red, and which plan is authenticated for the purposes of this Procla-Admiral of the same; and issued under mation by the signature of the Honorable William the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, Gisborne, the Minister for Public Works, shall be

and be deemed to be a road under the provisions of by a public road, by sections 39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49, the said Act.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government Buildings, at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this twenty-fifth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

SCHEDULE.

The road commences in the township of Foxton, Manawatu. at the east bank of the River Manawatu, where the line of road from the township of Palmerston abuts on the river bank of the said river, and goes in an easterly and northerly direction, and is bounded towards the South and East by a public road, by Block V., by sections 170 and 168, by part of Block VIII., by section 167, by part of Block VIII., by a public road, by sections 50 and 51, by a public road, by sections 65 and 66, by a public road, by sections 84, 85, 88, and 466, by a public road, by sections 265, 264, and 478, in the township of Foxton; towards the North and West by a public road, by a Government reserve, by sections 114, 113, 112, 111, 110, 109, 108, 107, and 106, by a public road, by sections 105, 104, 103, 102, 101, 100, 99, 98, by sections 105, 104, 103, 102, 101, 100, 99, 98, by by sections 105, 104, 103, 102, 101, 100, 99, 98, by a public road, by sections 97, 96, and 95, by a public road, by sections 91, 526, 525, 515, by a public road, by sections 89, by a public road, by sections 537 and 477, in the township of Foxton. Thence the road 468, for 1,160 links or thereabouts. deviates from the said public road line and proceeds through the sections Nos. 460 and 461, in the said township of Palmerston, being Crown lands, and thence proceeds through the sections Nos. 462 and 463 in the said township, being the property of one Donald McKonzie which portion of the road through Donald McKenzie, which portion of the road through said sections Nos. 462 and 463 is shown upon a certain plan marked No. 2 and thereon coloured yellow, and deposited in the office of the Public Works Department, Wellington, and which plan, marked No. 2, is authenticated for the purpose of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable William Gisborne, the Minister for Public Works. The road then crosses the River Manawatu and proceeds through Crown lands on the south side of said river to the western entrance of the gorge of the River Manawatu, and proceeds along the south side of the said gorge through Crown lands to the eastern boundary of the Ahuaturanga block of land, and thence along the southern side of said gorge through Native lands to the crossing place, where it joins the road line from Napier. The whole of the said road line, from the commencement to the termination, is delineated by a red line on the plan referred to in the body of this Proclamation and marked No. 1, and the breadth of said road line is marked thereon, the estimated length of the said road being forty miles.

THE HONORABLE WILLIAM FOX, PRIME MINISTER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is by the sixth section of "The Patents Act, 1870," enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such Rules and Regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, as may appear to be necessary and expedient for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it is by the sixteenth section of the said Act enacted that in case any letters patent issued under the said Act shall be lost or destroyed, other letters patent of the like tenor and effect, and sealed and dated as of the same day, may (subject to such regulations as the Governor in Council may direct) be issued under the authority of the warrant in pursuance of which the original letters patent were issued:

And whereas it is by the nineteenth section of the said Act enacted that every specification deposited at the office of the Colonial Secretary as in the said Act is mentioned, and the drawings and models accompanying the same (if any), shall forthwith after the grant of the letters patent, or if no letters patent be granted then immediately on the expiration of six months from the time of such deposit, be kept in such office or place as the Governor in Council shall from time to time appoint for that purpose:

And whereas it is by the twenty-third section of the said Act enacted that the person or persons applying to the Patent Officer for leave to enter a disclaimer of any part of either the title to an invention or specification or a memorandum of any alterations in the title or specification, not being such disclaimer as in the said Act is mentioned, may, by leave of the Patent Officer, as in the said Act is prescribed, enter such disclaimer or memorandum of alteration, and shall deposit a copy thereof in the office therein mentioned; and such disclaimer or memorandum of alteration being filed in such office as the Governor in Council shall from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be deemed and taken to be part of such letters patent or such specification, and subject to the several incidents thereof, in all Courts whatever, and shall be valid and effectual in favour of any person in whom the rights under the said letters patent may then be or thereafter become legally vested:

And whereas it is by the twenty-fourth section of the said Act enacted that copies of all specifications, and the drawings and models accompanying the same (if any), and of all disclaimers and memoranda of alterations respectively deposited under or in pursuance of the said Act, shall be open to the inspection of the public at all reasonable times, as well before as after the grant of letters patent, and whether such letters patent be granted or not, but subject to such regulations as the Governor in Council may from

time to time make in that behalf:

And whereas it is by the twenty-ninth section of the said Act enacted that the Governor may cause indices to all specifications, disclaimers, and memoranda of alterations which may be enrolled or deposited as in the said Act is mentioned, to be prepared in such form as may be thought fit, and such indices shall be open to the inspection of the public at such places as the Governor in Council shall appoint, and subject to the regulations to be

made as therein provided:

And whereas it is by the thirtieth section of the said Act enacted that there shall be kept at the office to be appointed as therein referred to, a book to be called the "Register of Patents" wherein shall be entered and recorded in chronological order all letters patent and letters of registration granted under the said Act or "The Patents Act, 1860;" the deposit and filing of specifications, disclaimers, and memoranda of alterations filed in respect of such letters patent; all amendments in such letters patent and specifications; all confirmations and extensions of such letters patent; the expiry, determination, vacating, or cancelling of such letters patent, with the dates thereof respectively, and all other matters and things affecting the validity of such letters patent as the Governor in Council may direct; and such register or a copy thereof shall be open at all convenient times to the inspection of the public, subject to such regulations as the Governor in Council may make in that behalf:

And whereas it is by the thirty-first section of the said Act enacted that there shall be kept at the same office a book entitled the "Register of Proprietors," wherein shall be entered, in such manner as the Governor in Council shall direct, the assignment of any letters patent or letters of registration or of any share or interest therein, any license under letters patent or letters of registration and the district to which such license relates, with the names of any person having any share or interest in such letters patent or letters of registration or license, the date of his acquiring such letters patent or letters of registration, share or interest, and any other matter or thing relating to or affecting the proprietorship in such letters patent or letters of registration or license: and that such register or a copy thereof shall be open to public inspection, subject to such regulations as the Governor in Council may make:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Fergu-

son Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the before recited powers and authorities, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth by this present Order make the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. There shall be in the Colonial Secretary's Office the Wellington on efficiently shall be the office of

at Wellington an office which shall be the office of the Patent Officer for the purposes of "The Patents"

Act, 1870."

2. The said Patent Office shall be the office or place for the purposes mentioned or referred to in the nineteenth, twenty-third, thirtieth, and thirty-first sections of the said Act.

3. The said Patent Office shall be the place at which the indices mentioned in the twenty-ninth section of

the said Act shall be open to inspection.

4. The said Patent Office shall be open to the public every day from ten o'clock to four o'clock, excepting on such days as the Colonial Secretary's Office shall be closed; and during the time the said Patent Office shall be open as aforesaid, all specifications, drawings, models, disclaimers, memoranda of alterations, indices, register, and other books and papers provided by the said Act to be open for inspection, shall be so open for inspection.

5. The time during which all specifications, drawings, and models deposited in the Colonial Secretary's Office may be inspected shall be between ten o'clock and four o'clock on every day on which the said Colonial Secretary's Office shall be open.

6. Before Letters of Registration shall issue to any person for any invention or discovery for which Letters Patent, or any like protection, shall have issued in Great Britain or any other country or colony, the applicant shall furnish duplicate copies of original Letters Patent or Letters of Registration and Specifications—one copy of the original Letters Patent or Letters of Registration and Specifications being certified to as a true and correct copy by a Notary Public: also a statutory declaration by a person conversant with the laws of Great Britain or of the country or colony in which the said Letters Patent or Letters of Registration have been granted, not the claimant, that he has searched the Registry of Patents in Great Britain or in the country or colony in which the patent has issued; or, if there is no such registry, that such Letters Patent or Letters of Registration are, according to the laws of Great Britain or of the country or colony, still in force, and not assigned or parted with: also a statutory declaration by the applicant that he is the person named in the original Letters Patent or Letters of Registration, and the bonû fide holder thereof; or if claimed under assignment of Letters Patent or Letters of Registration or Grant of Right, certified copies in duplicate of the Deed or Instrument of Assignment or Grant: also a statutory declaration by claimant annexed to one copy of the Deed or Instrument of Assignment or Grant, made before a Notary Public, that he is the person named in the copy Deed annexed, and that it is a true copy of the original Deed.

. No Letters Patent of the like tenor and effect, and sealed and dated as of the same day as any Letters Patent lost or destroyed, shall be issued unless and until evidence of such loss or destruction be produced to the satisfaction of the said Patent Officer. There shall be paid the fee of ten shillings on making every application, and the fee of two pounds on obtaining any new Letters Patent.

8. The indices of all specifications, disclaimers, and memoranda of alterations provided to be kept by the twenty-ninth section of the said Act shall respectively be in the forms contained in the First Schedule hereto. 9. The Register of Patents referred to in the thirtieth section of the said Act shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto.

10. The Register of Proprietors provided to be kept in the thirty-first section of the said Act shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule

nereto.

11. No assignment or license executed in New Zealand shall be registered unless and until a statutory declaration be furnished by one of the attesting witnesses to the said assignment or license of the due execution of the said assignment or license; and unless and until an attested copy or attested copies of the assignment or assignments, license or licenses, and all instruments or documents of title,

be deposited in the said Patent Office.

12. No assignment or license executed out of New Zealand shall be registered unless and until a declaration be furnished by one of the attesting witnesses to the said assignment or license of the due execution of the same assignment or license, such declaration being certified by a Notary; and unless and until an examined copy or examined copies of the assignment or assignments, or license or licenses, and all instruments or documents of title, certified by a Notary to be correct, be deposited in the said Patent Office; and also unless and until a declaration (annexed to the assignment or license) be furnished by the applicant that he is the person named in the copy deed annexed, and that it is a true copy of the original deed, such declaration being certified by a Notary Public: Provided always that if it be proved to the satisfaction of the said Patent Officer that the attesting witness to any such assignment or license is dead or cannot be found, the execution of the same assignment or license may be proved by a declaration of any other person capable of declaring to same, such declaration being certified by a Notary.

At Wellington, this thirteenth day of March, 1871.

Present:

THE HONORABLE WILLIAM FOX, PRIME MINISTER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make rules and regulations for the management of the several Post Offices of the said Colony; for the receiving, despatching, conveying, and delivering of letters; for the detaining, opening, and return or other disposal of irregularly posted letters, or such as from any cause whatever cannot be delivered or forwarded, and the contents thereof respectively, and for the publication of the lists of the same; and for the conduct of Post officers; and any such rules and regulations at any time in force to alter, vary, or revoke; and for the purpose of giving effect to the rules and regulations so to be made, further power is given to the Governor in Council by the said Act to impose any penalty not exceeding ten pounds for any one offence against such rules and regulations: And whereas it is expedient to prevent the transmission through the Post of any letter, newspaper, or packet bearing on the outside thereof any profane, obscene, or libellous words, figures, drawings, paintings, or other matter:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, and by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation:—

No letter, newspaper, parcel, or packet bearing on the outside thereof any profane, obscene, or libellous words, figures, drawings, paintings, or other matter, shall be received into the Post Office for transmission, and if tendered shall be refused. If such a letter, newspaper, parcel, or packet be posted, it shall not be forwarded, but the Postmaster or other officer in charge of the Post Office where the same shall be posted or be found shall transmit without delay to the Postmaster-General any such letter, newspaper, packet, or parcel so posted; and the Postmaster-General is hereby authorized to open such letter, newspaper, packet, or parcel, and to cause the same, and also its contents, to be destroyed—unless the Postmaster-General shall direct the same to be forfeited to the Crown or returned to the writer or sender.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Juries Act, 1868," it is enacted that in case any District Court shall thereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which Courts were then holden, the Clerk of the Resident Magistrate's Court there, if there be one, or a Jury Officer to be appointed for the jury district of such town in manner in the said Act mentioned, shall act as Jury Officer for the jury district of such town; and such Jury Officer, and all Justices of the Peace, and the Registrars, Clerks, or other officers of Courts, constables and officers of Police, and Sheriffs, shall within such time as the Governor shall order for that occasion only do and perform all such acts, matters, and

things, in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve on juries, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required ordinarily to be done at a different time or period, and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve, immediately after the same shall have been made out by the Sheriff, and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas sittings of the District Court have been lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at Grahamstown, in the Province of Auckland, being a town other than one at which Courts were at the time of the passing of the said Act appointed to be holden:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise of all powers and authorities in this behalf vested in me by the said Act, do hereby order that the Jury Officer for the Jury District of the said Town, and all Justices of the Peace, and the Registrars, Clerks, or other officers of Courts, constables and officers of Police, and Sheriffs, shall before the first day of July next do and perform all such acts, matters, and things, in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve on juries, and making out the jury books for the Jury District of the said Town as are in the said Act ordinarily required to be done at a different time

or period.
And I do order that, for the purposes aforesaid, the words in the sections of the said "Juries Act, 1868," specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto, shall respectively be construed and read as if the words in the second column of the said Schedule were inserted in lieu of such words in the said sec-

tions respectively.
