A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is enacted that the railways to be constructed under the said Act shall be only such railways as shall from time to time be determined by the General Assembly: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions contained therein, the Governor may construct, or cause to be constructed, any lines of railway which shall be prescribed by the General Assembly as railways to be constructed under the said Act, or any part or parts thereof, and acquire the necessary engines, plant and machinery for working and using the same, or any of them: And it is also thereby enacted that, whenever the Governor shall determine to construct any such railway, or any part thereof, it shall be lawful for him, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare and define the limits and description and line thereof, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of such railway, subject to the provisions of any Act defining such limits and descriptions, and any such Proclamation may refer to maps, plans, or drawings to be deposited in the office of the Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court in the Province in which such railway or part thereof is proposed to be constructed, and any maps, plans, or drawings so referred to shall be deemed to form part of such Proclamation; and upon the publication of such Proclamation the provisions and regulations contained in the Seventh Part of the said Act shall be applicable to the railway, and to the lands to which the Proclamation shall relate: And it is also thereby enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to make, construct, and maintain any such railway as aforesaid, with proper works, approaches, and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at the place delineated on, and extending along the lines set forth in, and terminating at a point described in the Act or Proclamation proclaiming and defining such railway, or shown in the maps, plans, or drawings referred to in such Act or Proclamation: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Part of the said Act and of the Acts incorporated herewith, the Governor may exercise all

or any of the powers by that Part of the said Act or the said incorporated Acts conferred upon him for the construction of any such railway, and may enter upon, and cause to be entered upon, all lands within the Colony for the purpose of making such surveys as may be necessary, and may take and hold all the lands required for the railway along the line set forth and described as aforesaid, or within the limits of deviation described in the Proclamation relating thereto, and may temporarily occupy and use such lands as may be necessary on either side of the railway, during the construction thereof:

And whereas by "The Railways Act, 1870," it is enacted that the Governor may, under the provisions of the first-mentioned Act, contract for the construction of a railway from Dunedin, in the Province of Otago, to Clutha, in the said Province, being a portion of the Otago Southern Trunk Railway, commencing from and terminating at a point to be determined by the Governor in Council: And whereas by Order in Council dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, it was ordered that the commencement point of the said Dunedin and Clutha Railway should be at a point at or near the southern side of High Street, in the City of Dunedin, in the Province of Otago, about seven chains eastward from the Custom House in the said City of Dunedin, and that the point of termination thereof should be at a point situated in the line of the southern side of Hasborough Place and eastern side of Cromer Street, in the Township of Balclutha, the said point being about four chains northward from the jetty on the north side of the Clutha River: And whereas I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, have determined to construct the said Dunedin and Clutha Railway:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the said first-mentioned Act in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and define the limits, description, and line of the said railway to be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and that the lands specified and described in the Second Schedule hereto are proposed to be taken for the

purposes of the said railway; and that the limits of deviation shall be those set forth in the said First Schedule.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Limits, Description, Line, and Limits of Deviation of Dunedin and Clutha Railway.

Commencing at a point at or near the southern side of High Street, in the City of Dunedin, about seven chains eastward from the Custom House, in the said City of Dunedin, and passing from, in, through, or into the following city, townships, and territorial divisions of the said Province, viz. :—

The City of Dunedin, the Town District, the Lower Kaikorai District, the Dunedin and East Taieri District, the Taieri District, the Township of Greytown, the Maungatua District, the Waihola District, the Township of Waihola, the Tokomairiro District, the North Tuakitoto District, the South Tuakitoto District, the Hill End District, and the North Molyneux District, and terminating at a point situated in the line of the southern side of Hasborough Place and eastern side of Cromer Street, in the Township of Balclutha, the said point being about four chains northward from the jetty on the north side of the Clutha River, as the limits, description, and line thereof are set forth in the plans and described in the book of reference referred to on the face of the said plans, and which plans and book are authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable William Gisborne, the Minister for Public Works, and are deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, or within the limits of deviation set forth on the said plans, being a distance of one hundred yards on either side of the said line, and passing through, over, or under the several sections of land, streets, roads, and places enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Otago Hundreds Regulation Act, 1869," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions in the said Act contained, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute into a Hundred any portion of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Province of Otago, not forming part of any Hundred for the time being existing, notwithstanding that such lands or any part thereof shall be comprised within any pastoral lease or license heretofore or hereafter to be granted by the Crown under any law regulating the occupation or disposal of Waste Lands of the Crown, and whether or not the same shall have been included within the boundaries of any proclaimed gold field: And whereas by "The Otago Hundreds Regulation Act 1869 Amendment Act, 1870," it is enacted that no Hundred shall thereafter be proclaimed in the Province of Otago unless one third part at least of the area thereof shall be determined under the provisions of the said "Otago Hundreds Regulation Act, 1869," to be land available for agricultural purposes, and that no Hundred shall exceed twenty thousand acres in extent, and that, in determining the boundaries of all Hundreds thereafter proclaimed, due regard shall be paid to the natural features of the country over which any such Hundred is to be proclaimed:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities in me vested, do hereby constitute and proclaim that district or portion of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Province of Otago, not forming part of any existing Hundred, particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Hundred under and subject to the provisions of the said Acts.

SCHEDULE.

Strath Taieri Hundred comprises all that area in the Province of Otago, being parts of Runs 213A and 213B, containing by estimation ten thousand two hundred (10,200) acres, bounded by a line proceeding in a westerly direction from the Taieri River to and along the northern boundaries of sections 55 and 71, Block IX., Strath Taieri Survey District, and through part of section 32, same block, to the road line intersecting the said section; thence along the said road in a north-westerly direction, and again in a westerly direction along the road line forming the northern boundary of section 7, same block and district, and thence by the Gorge to the north-western boundary

of Run 213A; thence in a south-westerly direction along the north-western boundaries of Runs 213A and 213B to the head of a gorge situate about one mile north from Trigonometrical Station F; thence in a south-easterly direction along the said gorge to the road line forming the boundary between sections 34 and 35, Block IV., Sutton Survey District, and along the said road line to the boundary line between sections 11 and 12, same block; thence due South to the south boundary of Blair-Taieri Township Reserve; thence due East to the Taieri River; and thence in a northerly direction along the west bank of the Taieri River to the starting point.

WHEREAS the Regulations relating to Criminal Prosecutions, published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, March 3, 1864, and December 21, 1867, so far as the same provide for the conduct of prosecutions by the Crown Solicitors, were not intended and ought not to apply to cases the responsibility of prosecuting which ought to remain with the person instituting the prosecution. It is therefore notified that the said Regulations, so far as aforesaid, do not, unless the prosecution is instituted by or by the direction of some Department of the General Government, or by or by the direction of a Judicial Officer or Superior Officer of Police, apply to other than the following misdemeanours :—

Conspiring to charge any person with any felony, or to indict any person of any felony.

Conspiring to commit any felony.

Neglect and breach of duty as a Peace Officer.

Misdemeanours under "The Larceny Act, 1867."

Misdemeanours under "The Offences against the Person Act, 1867."

Misdemeanours under "The Malicious Injuries to Property Act, 1867."

Misdemeanours under "The Forgery Act, 1867."

Misdemeanours under "The Coinage Act, 1867."

2. In cases to which the said Regulations are declared not to apply, the committing Justices should be careful to inform prosecutors to that effect.

3. In cases to which the Regulations do apply, a strict compliance with the third and fourth of the Regulations first above mentioned is enjoined on all Justices of the Peace.

4. If the Attorney-General or Crown Solicitor is of opinion that any prosecution instituted by a private prosecutor, whether for felony or misdemeanour, and to which the said Regulations would otherwise apply, is such that it ought not to be conducted by the Crown Solicitor, notice thereof shall, as soon as possible, be given to the prosecutor; and if such notice shall be given to the prosecutor not later than seven days in country cases, and not later than three days in town cases, before the first day of the sittings at which the trial is to be had, or if

the committal shall have taken place within the said periods, then, if such notice be given with all reasonable despatch, in all such cases the Crown Solicitor shall not conduct the prosecution under the said Regulations, and the said Regulations shall not be deemed to apply to such case.

By a "country case" is meant one in which the committing Justices shall have sat at a distance of more than ten miles from the place at which the trial is to be had. Other cases are included in the term "town cases."

The alteration of the said Regulations shall apply to cases in which Justices shall commit or hold to bail after the 1st July next; and if the alteration shall be made known to any Justice before that date, it shall apply to all cases in which any such Justice shall commit or hold to bail after the alteration is made known to him.
