A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Registration Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did amongst others constitute a district in the Province of Canterbury for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Christchurch District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the said districts, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such districts:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations so far as relates to the said District of Christchurch, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such districts shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

ELLESMERE DISTRICT

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury bounded on the North and East by the south bank of the River Selwyn, Lake Ellesmere, and the sea; on the South by the north bank of the River Rakaia; and on the West by the Great South Road.

CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury from the south bank of the Waimakariri to the north

bank of the Rakaia, except Lyttelton, Akaroa, and Ellesmere Districts.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by Proclamations duly made and issued, bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did amongst others constitute a district in the Province of Canterbury for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Christchurch District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamations came into operation and took effect on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the said district, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such district:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations so far as relates to the said District of Christchurch, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such district shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

ELLESMERE DISTRICT

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury bounded on the North and East by the south bank of the River Selwyn, Lake Ellesmere, and the sea; on the South by the north bank of the River Rakaia; and on the West by the Great South Road.

CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury from the south bank of the Waimakariri to the north bank of the Rakaia, except Lyttelton, Akaroa, and Ellesmere Districts.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Wellington, this twenty-third day of June, 1871.

Present:

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Marine Act, 1867," it is among other things enacted that the Governor may fix the various rates of Lighthouse Dues, not exceeding those specified in the said Act, which shall be payable at any port or ports within the Colony in respect of all vessels arriving at and of all vessels leaving such ports, by the Master of every such vessel, and such dues from time to time to alter: And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, among other things, certain rates of Light Dues were fixed for the ports mentioned in the second column of the First Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that in lieu thereof respectively there should be levied the dues specified in the said First Schedule, and which are therein respectively set opposite to the name of the port to which they relate: And whereas no Light Dues are now by law leviable at the several ports mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, and it is expedient that Light Dues should be leviable thereat respectively:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the above recited power and authority vested in him, doth order that on and after the first day of September next, in lieu of the Light Dues leviable under the said recited Order in Council at the

several ports specified in the second column of the First Schedule hereto, there shall be leviable at each of the said ports the Light Dues which are specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule and therein set opposite to the name of the port at which they shall be leviable; and from and after the date aforesaid the Light Dues made leviable at the several ports last aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said recited Order in Council, shall cease and determine. And in further exercise and pursuance of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent, I do order that from and after the said last mentioned date there shall be levied at each of the ports which are specified in the second column of the said Second Schedule the Light Dues which are specified in the fourth column of the said Second Schedule, and therein set opposite to the name of the port at which they shall be leviable; and that any vessel from the Australian Colonies, or from places beyond those colonies, calling at a port where light dues are not charged for such voyage, shall, on arriving at any other port where light dues are chargeable on vessels arriving from such voyages, be charged the same rate as if she had arrived at such port direct.

To His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

PETITION of the undersigned Inhabitant Householders resident within the Town of Wanganui, in the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter more particularly set forth.

SHOWETH—

That the undersigned are Inhabitant Householders resident within the district comprised within the Town of Wanganui, mentioned and described in the First Schedule to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

That the boundaries of the said district and town are towards the North-east in part a portion of country section number nineteen, and in part the River Wanganui; towards the East and towards the South-east the River Wanganui; towards the South-west the country sections numbers seven, eight, nine, and eleven; and towards the North-west the country sections twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, and nineteen, as the same are delineated on the official map or plan of the right bank of the River Wanganui, deposited in the Survey Office, at Wellington.

That the said Town of Wanganui, with regard to the management of the streets, and the sewerage and drainage, and preservation of the health of the inhabitants, and other matters for the order and good government of the said town, is now under the management and control of a Town Board, established by the following Acts of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Wellington, that is to say,—

First.—An Act intituled "An Act to provide for the Management of the Streets, Sewerage, and Drainage in Towns and Populous Places, and the Preservation of the Health of the Inhabitants thereof," made and passed in the second Session of the said Council, and numbered seventeen.

Secondly.—An Act intituled "An Act to authorize the Establishment of Boards of Wardens for the Management of Local Public Works, and other Matters," made and passed in the third Session of the said Council.

Thirdly.—An Act intituled "An Act to vest in a Board of Wardens for the Management of Local Public Works and Matters, the Management of the Streets, Sewerage, and Preservation of the Health of the Inhabitants of the Town of Wanganui," being made and passed in the ninth Session of the said Council, and numbered eight.

That on the ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, by Proclamation of that date, the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington did proclaim and declare that a Board of Wardens for the management of the local public works and matters should be established at and for the said Town of Wanganui, and that the boundaries thereof should be the Town of Wanganui as laid down in the official maps thereof.

That the petitioners are desirous that the Town of Wanganui should be constituted a Borough, under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will constitute the said Town of Wanganui a borough, under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

We the Commissioners appointed by a Commission bearing date the 3rd day of February, 1871, being enjoined to report within four calendar months such particulars as we have been directed to ascertain, do now forward as our final Report for your Excellency's consideration, supplementary Rolls A, B, and C, which contain the names of all applicants for the New Zealand War Medal which have been referred to us by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, and on which we have been able to arrive at any conclusion since the date of our Interim Report.

The Commissioners desire to bring to your Excellency's notice that the Rolls they have prepared do not contain the names of all the officers and men of the Colonial Forces, both European and Maori, who are entitled to the New Zealand War Medal, in order that it may be taken into consideration whether longer time should be allowed and further steps taken to carry out fully the intentions of the Legislature on the subject.
