Prisoners undergoing hard labour sentences may be permitted to write and receive one letter monthly through the Gaoler, who will inspect all letters, and exercise his own judgment as to their delivery. well conducted, these prisoners will be permitted to see their friends on the first Saturday in each month between the hours of 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. The number of persons admitted to see a prisoner at any one time, and the duration of each visit, will be regulated by the Gaoler. At no other time must any stranger be allowed to visit prisoners of this class, except by written order signed by one of the Visiting

Justices. Prisoners detained for imprisonment in default of bail, or in default of payment of fine, may be permitted to write and receive letters daily in connection with their cases, subject to the inspection of the Gaoler; they may be allowed to see and speak with their friends on the subject of their detention twice during the week, between the hours of 10 o'clock and 12 o'clock a.m., and 2 o'clock and 4 o'clock p.m.; such

visits to be made in the presence of an officer.

No stranger will be allowed to visit the gaol at any other times than provided for by these regulations, except by written order signed by one of the Visiting Justices. A copy of clause 3 of "The Gaolers and Prisoners Act, 1869," shall be posted up in some conspicuous place in the visitors' room or ward, and the Goaler or Warder admitting them should especially draw their attention to the said clause, the provisions of which will be desired. clause, the provisions of which will be strictly
