Now the condition of the above-written obligation is such that if the said _____ from time to time, so long as he shall continue and be employed in the said office, shall duly perform the duties of the said office under the said Act and under "The Mining Companies Limited Liability Act Amendment Act, 1869," and duly account for and pay over all moneys which shall come to the possession or be under the control of himself or his agents, by reason of or by virtue of the said office or employment; and shall from time to time observe and keep all such orders and instructions as he shall receive from the Governor of New Zealand for the time being touching the due performance and execution of the said office; and shall from time to time, and at all times hereafter, so long as he shall hold the said office, well and truly, faithfully and honestly, to the best of his skill and ability, exercise, obey, discharge, and perform all the duties thereof, and also all the powers, directions, duties, and obligations given to, conferred upon, or to be performed and discharged by him under any law for the time being relating to the said office; and shall, when thereunto required, deliver up all books, deeds, orders and decrees of the Judges of the District Court or of the Supreme Court, vouchers and other papers relating to the said office, and also such commission, warrant, or authority as he hath received or shall receive from the Governor, to such person as the Governor shall direct and appoint to receive the same; and shall obey all orders of any Judge of the District Court, or of the Supreme Court, duly made in relation to any books, accounts, papers, and documents, of or belonging to any Company; and

WHEREAS by "The Mining Companies Limited Liability Act Amendment Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to appoint one or more persons, to be called Official Auditors, to audit the accounts of all Official Agents heretofore appointed or hereafter to be appointed under "The Mining Companies Limited Liability Act, 1865:"

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the above recited Act, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth appoint the under-mentioned persons to be Official Auditors of the accounts of the Official Agents in and for the places or Mining Districts set opposite their respective names, subject to the provisions contained in the above recited Acts:—

WHEREAS by notification under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, dated the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of March in the same year, sessions of the District Court of Auckland were appointed to be held at Shortland, in the Province of Auckland, at intervals of not less than thirteen days, nor more than twenty-one days, between the first day of each sitting of such Court, as therein mentioned: And whereas by a like notification dated the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred

and seventy, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, of the twelfth day of the same month, sessions of the said Court were appointed to be held within such intervals as are mentioned in the said hereinbefore in part recited notification, at Grahamstown, in the said Province, instead of at Shortland:

And whereas it is expedient to fix other intervals for the holding of the said Court:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do fix and appoint that from and after the next sitting of the District Court of Auckland at Grahamstown, instead of the intervals hereinbefore appointed, sessions of the said Court shall be held there at intervals of not less than fifteen days, nor more than thirty days from each sitting thereof.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations, and do direct that the same shall be in force within the Gaol at New Plymouth, from and after the date of their publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued at Wellington, this seventeenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

Prisoners undergoing hard labour sentences may be permitted to write and receive one letter monthly through the Gaoler, who will inspect all letters, and exercise his own judgment as to their delivery. If well conducted, these prisoners will be permitted to see their friends on the first Saturday in each month between the hours of 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. The number of persons admitted to see a prisoner at any one time, and the duration of each visit, will be regulated by the Gaoler. At no other time must any stranger be allowed to visit prisoners of this class, except by written order signed by one of the Visiting Justices.

Prisoners detained for imprisonment in default of bail, or in default of payment of fine, may be permitted to write and receive letters daily in connection with their cases, subject to the inspection of the Gaoler; they may be allowed to see and speak with their friends on the subject of their detention twice during the week, between the hours of 10 o'clock and 12 o'clock a.m., and 2 o'clock and 4 o'clock p.m.; such visits to be made in the presence of an officer.

No stranger will be allowed to visit the gaol at any other times than provided for by these regulations, except by written order signed by one of the Visiting Justices. A copy of clause 3 of "The Gaolers and Prisoners Act, 1869," shall be posted up in some conspicuous place in the visitors' room or ward, and the Gaoler or Warder admitting them should especially draw their attention to the said clause, the provisions of which will be strictly enforced.

the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, all such powers as are vested in me by the third, fourth, and fifth sections of the said Act, so far as concerns the Waste Lands of the Crown within the said Province, to be exercised within the limits of the said Province, without any limitation or restriction whatever.

ALL persons late of the Colonial Forces or otherwise, not belonging to the British Army or Navy, who have been awarded the New Zealand War Medal for service under the Imperial Authorities, and whose names are published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 31st May, 1871, No. 31, in the Rolls numbered 1 to 9, appended to the Letter from the Crown Agents dated 16th March, 1871, and published in the same *Gazette*, are hereby informed that the Medals have been received from England, and are ready for issue; and they are requested to send in their names and addresses to the Officer Commanding the Militia and Volunteers at the chief town of the Province in which they live. Claimants living without the Colony should forward

to this Office a full address to which their Medal could be sent, accompanied by a declaration before a Justice of the Peace that they are the persons referred to in the Rolls above named, and that they did serve under the Imperial Authorities as therein stated.

It must be distinctly understood that persons receiving the New Zealand War Medal from the Imperial Government for services performed under command of Imperial officers are not entitled to a second Medal for services performed under the Colonial Government.

All applications for Medals awarded by the Imperial Government to persons whose names appear in the lists above referred to must be received at this Office *within two years* from the date of this Notice, or the applications will be rejected.
