A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint one Inspector of Weights and Measures for any Province, County, Borough, or District, or for each of two or more divisions of any Province, County, Borough, or District, the boundaries of which divisions shall be proclaimed from time to time in the *New Zealand Gazette* by the Governor: And whereas it is expedient that Inspectors should be appointed for the divisions of the Province of Auckland, the boundaries whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of such divisions should be proclaimed:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, G.C.M.G., Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that for the purposes of the said Act there shall be within the said Province of Auckland divisions or districts, the boundaries whereof shall be the boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

**THE AUCKLAND WEIGHTS AND MEASURES DISTRICT.**

Bounded towards the North by high watermark of Waitemata Harbour, the waters of Hobson's Bay and Orakei Creek, from the Whau River to the eastern boundary of section No. 16 of the suburbs of Auckland; towards the East and South-east by the eastern boundary of section No. 16 aforesaid, from Orakei Creek to the Tamaki Road; thence by the Tamaki Road aforesaid to the Ellerslie and Epsom Road, and by said last-named road to the Auckland and Onehunga Road; thence by the Auckland and Onehunga Road aforesaid to the northern boundary of the Town of Onehunga; thence by part of the northern and the whole of the western boundary of the Town of Onehunga aforesaid, to the Onehunga or Manukau Harbour; towards the South by high watermark of the Onehunga or Manukau Harbour aforesaid, from the western boundary of the Town of Onehunga to the Whau Portage Road; and towards the West by the Whau Portage Road aforesaid, from the Onehunga

or Manukau Harbour to the Whau River, and by said last-named river to the Waitemata Harbour, the boundary first described.

**THE OTAHURU WEIGHTS AND MEASURES DISTRICT.**

Bounded towards the North by high watermark of the Waitemata Harbour, from the eastern point of Hobson's Bay to the Wairoa River; towards the East by the Wairoa River aforesaid, from Waitemata Harbour to the southern boundary of the Parish of Hunua; towards the South and South-west by the southern boundary of the Parish of Hunua aforesaid, from the Wairoa River to the south-eastern boundary of allotment No. 46 of the Parish of Opaheke; thence by parts of the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of allotment No. 46 aforesaid, the south-eastern boundary of allotment No. 38, and the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of allotment No. 36, both of the Parish of Opaheke aforesaid, to the Hingahia Creek; thence by the waters of the Hingahia and Pahurehure Creeks, and high watermark of the Onehunga or Manukau Harbour, to the western boundary of the Town of Onehunga; and towards the West by the western and part of the northern boundary of the Town of Onehunga aforesaid, to the Auckland and Onehunga Road; thence by said road to the Ellerslie and Epsom Road, and by the Ellerslie and Epsom Road aforesaid to the Tamaki Road, and by said last-named road to the south-eastern angle of the eastern boundary of section No. 16 of the Suburbs of Auckland; thence by the eastern boundary of section No. 16 aforesaid, and Orakei Creek and Hobson's Bay, to the place of commencement on the Waitemata Harbour.

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, G.C.M.G., Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that for the purposes of the said Act the said County of Westland shall be deemed to be a District for the inspection of Weights and Measures under "The Weights and Measures Act, 1868."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereinafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

EDGAR HALL CAREW, Esq.,

to be a Warden of all Wardens' Courts now constituted or hereafter to be constituted within the Gold Fields of the Province of Otago, with power to him to act alone or with assessors, and to exercise all or any of the powers vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.

This appointment to date and take effect from the twenty-fourth day of August instant.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that the Governor may, at the request of the Superintendent of any Province, from time to time make regulations (as therein mentioned) for the conduct of immigration under the said Act into such Province, and for the nomination of Immigrants by persons resident therein, and for the distribution of funds provided by the said Act for immigration purposes, and for the introduction into and settlement in such Province of Immigrants, and for selling as special settlements for any such Immigrants any lands which he may acquire from any Province under the provisions therein contained, or any lands acquired under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," or the Acts amending the same, and for laying out and allotting any lands so acquired amongst any such Immigrants: And whereas James Macandrew, Esq., the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, hath requested me, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, to make regulations under the provisions of the said Act as and in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the 41st section of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, and in compliance with the request of the said Superintendent, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF ASSISTED IMMIGRANTS INTO THE PROVINCE OF OTAGO.

Any person residing in Europe desirous of obtaining an assisted passage to the Province of Otago in vessels under contract to proceed to that Province, may receive assistance as follows:—

1. The Government will grant passages on payment to the Agent-General of the Colony in London, or to the Agent of the Province in Scotland acting under his direction, before embarkation, of the sum of £5 for each adult of twelve years old and upwards; but where the intending Immigrant is unable to pay the £5 above mentioned, the Agent-General, or the Agent of the Province in Scotland, acting under his direction, will have power to commute the cash payment into the giving a promissory note for £7 per adult; preference will, however, always be given to those who can pay the largest portion in cash. The promissory notes will be made payable on demand in the form printed below; but unless the Immigrant dispute the debt or shall attempt to leave the Province, payment will only be required by such instalments as may be requisite to pay off the whole amount within twelve months after arrival.

- Children between one and twelve years, half price. Babies under twelve months, free.
- Assisted passages will be afforded only to persons of the labouring class.
- No person will be allowed any assistance unless he or she shall have been approved by the Agent-General in London, or by the Agent of the Province in Scotland acting under his direction.

5. No person above the age of 50 years, unless a member of a large family, will be allowed assistance.

6. All persons receiving assistance must be of sound mind, good health, and good character.

7. Free passages will be provided for single women accustomed to domestic service who can bring satisfactory proof of good character, and who are between the ages of 15 and 35.

8. In certain other cases, with a view to the introduction of skilled labour in connection with capital for the establishment of woollen, linen, paper, or other manufactures, free passages will be given, of the conditions of which the Agent-General in London will from time to time be advised.

*Regulations for the introduction of Immigrants into the Province of Otago on the nomination of persons resident therein.*

1. Persons residing within the Province may obtain orders for passages from the United Kingdom to Otago for their friends or relatives on payment of £5 per statute adult; children over one year old, £2 10s.; and under one year, free; such payment to be made, accompanied by a written application in the following form, to the Provincial Treasurer, Dunedin; the Receivers of Land Revenue at Invercargill, and of Gold Revenue at Queenstown, Arrowtown, Cromwell, Clyde, Alexandra, Naseby, St. Bathans, Roxburgh, Lawrence, Switzers, Hyde, Macraes; and the Collector of Customs at Oamaru, who will forward the applications from time to time to the Provincial Immigration Office at Dunedin.

2. Form of Application:—

3. In the event of any Immigrant applied for as aforesaid declining to emigrate, whatever money may have been deposited with the Government will be returned, so soon as the Agent-General of the Colony, or the British Agent of the Province, shall have apprised the Government thereof. In the event, however, of any Immigrants applied for as aforesaid accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and failing to present themselves at the time and place appointed for embarkation, the money deposited as aforesaid shall be forfeited.

4. The Agent-General of the Colony or the Agent of the Province in Scotland, acting under his direction, as the case may be, shall have power to refuse passages to any persons nominated as aforesaid, in the event of the physical health or moral character of the person so nominated not being satisfactory to such Agents, in which case the money deposited shall be returned.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that the Governor may, at the request of the Superintendent of any Province, from time to time make regulations (as therein mentioned) for the conduct of immigration under the said Act into such Province, and for the nomination of Immigrants by persons resident therein, and for the distribution of funds provided by the said Act for immigration purposes, and for the introduction into and settlement in such Province of Immigrants, and for selling as special settlements for any such Immigrants any lands which he may acquire from any Province under the provisions therein contained, or any lands acquired under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," or the Acts amending the same, and for laying out and allotting any lands so acquired amongst any such Immigrants: And whereas the Honorable Arthur Penrose Seymour, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, hath requested me, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, to make regulations under the provisions of the said Act as and in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the forty-first section of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, and in compliance with the request of the said Superintendent, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF IMMIGRANTS INTO THE PROVINCE OF MARLBOROUGH, ON THE NOMINATION OF PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. The rate of passage has been fixed, until further notice, at £16 per statute adult—i.e., for each person of twelve years old and upwards.

2. Each applicant will be required to pay one-half of the above amount at the time of making the application. Children between the ages of one and twelve years will be berthed and provisioned as equal to half an adult, but only one-half of the payment for an adult will be charged, or £4 each. Infants in arms, under one year, free. This rate being from London to Marlborough only, the cost of reaching London and proceeding up the country after arrival in Marlborough will have to be defrayed by the Immigrants themselves.

3. As a rule, no unmarried females can be provided with passages under these Regulations, except they accompany and are under the care of some specified relative or friend. Passages for unmarried females not so accompanied can only be granted subject to the Agent-General in London being able to make suitable provision for oversight during the voyage.

4. In the event of any Immigrants applied for declining to immigrate, whatever money may have been deposited with the Government will be returned so soon as the Agent-General in London shall have apprised the Government thereof; but in the event of any Immigrants applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and so, by failing to present themselves for embarkation at the time and place appointed by the Agent-General in London for the sailing of such ship, be left behind, the passage money and passages will be forfeited.

5. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the "Passenger Act."

6. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Agent-General in England will have power to refuse passages where the intending Immigrants are in ill health or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.

WHEREAS on the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in pursuance of the powers then vested in the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand by the regulations contained in the Schedule to a certain Proclamation made by him, and dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, certain days were appointed to be the days on which the Waste Lands Board of the County of Westland should sit at the principal Land Office of the said County in the Town of Hokitika: And whereas by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that the principal Land Office of the said County shall be kept at the Town of Hokitika, and the Waste Lands Board shall sit there, and at certain stated times to be determined from time to time by the Governor, as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to appoint other days for the sitting of the said Board in lieu of those so appointed as aforesaid.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the Governor of New Zealand having, under the powers in him vested by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," deemed it expedient to open and make a new line of road from Kai Iwi to Waingongoro, which road is in the opinion of the Governor and the Executive Council of the Colony not a road to be constructed by the Superintendents and Provincial Councils of the Provinces of Wellington and Taranaki, and the course and bearings of which said road, the admeasurements required for the same, and the lands through which the same passes, together with the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, are respectively shown and delineated on certain plans marked Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, and which said road is also described in a certain Proclamation made under the said Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 43, of 5th August, 1871.

WHEREAS by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he may think fit: And whereas by the fourth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor may, by any Order in Council, from time to time annul, make void, or alter or vary or make anew, any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations made and published by the Governor under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," or by the Superintendent of any Province under or in pursuance of any powers delegated under the powers of delegation contained in "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865:" And whereas by the fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the power of annulling, making void, or altering or varying and making anew, any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations, vested in the Governor by "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," may from time to time be delegated by the Governor in Council, by Warrant under his hand, to the Superintendent of any Province: And whereas the said Governor hath, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to William Rolleston, Esquire, the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, within the said Province, so long as he shall remain Superintendent of the Province, the several powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of "The Diseased Cattle Act 1861," aforesaid, and all the powers which by the fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," the Governor in Council is authorized so to delegate:

And whereas I, William Rolleston, by a Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, did proclaim and declare that after the date of the publication of the said Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, all that district of the Province of Marlborough lying between the Clarence River, the Conway River, the seaward Kaikoura Range and the sea; the Province of Otago; and the County of Westland, in the Middle Island of New Zealand, should be deemed infected districts within the meaning of the said Acts:

And whereas it has been made to appear to me that the Province of Otago is free from the disease called pleuro-pneumonia:

Now therefore, I, William Rolleston, do hereby rescind, annul, and make void the said Proclamation, in so far as the same relates to the said Province of Otago.

This Proclamation to take effect from and after the day following the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

It is accessible to coasting craft and small steamers, and navigable for vessels drawing six feet for fifteen or twenty miles. Since May, 1870, when the greater part of the town and all but one of the suburban sections were disposed of, Carlyle has greatly increased in size and importance, and is the centre of a considerable trade with the surrounding districts.
