A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted, that the Fifth Part of the said Act, including sections thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, and thirty-nine, and that section fifty-two, shall have no force or effect upon any Gold Field until after the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, have proclaimed and extended the operation of the said part and sections to the Province wherein such Gold Field shall be situate: And further that such Proclamation shall only be made upon the application of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of a Province, and the said part and sections of this Act shall thereafter be of force and effect within such Province only:

And whereas application has been made by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Marlborough that the operation of the said part and sections of the said Act be extended to the Pelorus Gold Field, in the said Province:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and extend the operation of the Fifth Part of the said Act, including sections thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, and thirty-nine, and of section fifty-two of the said Act, to the Pelorus Gold Field, in the said Province of Marlborough.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, may, as to parts within the North Island of New Zealand, define the roads and the boundaries thereof, and the bridges and ferries, which shall be and be deemed to be roads, bridges, or ferries, as the case may be, under the provisions of the said Act, and any such Proclamation may include existing roads, but no such roads or parts of roads shall be included if they are, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, roads which should be constructed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province wherein such roads are situated (as well as new road lines); and the Governor from time to time may revoke or alter any such Proclamation: And whereas in the opinion of me, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Governor of New Zealand, and the Executive Council of New Zealand, the road defined in the Schedule hereunto is not a road which should be constructed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the road within the North Island of New Zealand described, and the boundaries whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereto, and which road is delineated on a plan numbered L., deposited in the Office of the Public Works Department at Wellington, in the Province of Wellington, and thereon coloured red, and which plan is authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable William Gisborne, the Minister for Public Works, shall be and be deemed to be a road under the provisions of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward by the south bank of the Hurunui River; on the Westward by the County of Westland; on the Southward by the north bank of the Rangitata River from the sea to the source of its tributary the Clyde River; and on the Eastward by the sea, save and except the District of Akaroa, hereinafter defined.

AKAROA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward by the summit of the range running by Mount Herbert and Mount Herbert Peak, and also by the sea; on the Eastward and Southward by the sea; on the Westward by Lake Ellesmere from its outlet to the sea to the mouth of the River Halswell, by that river to the western boundary of Section 1,879, thence by that boundary and the Ahuriri Bush Road south to the southern boundary of Section 1,901, by that boundary and also by the ridge of hills by Cooper's Knobs.

TIMARU DISTRICT.

SCHEDULE.

THE WAKATIPU WEIGHTS AND MEASURES DISTRICT.

Wakatipu Division comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Province of Canterbury; towards the East by Hawksbury, Mount Ida, and Tokomairiro Divisions; towards the South by the Tuapeka Division, by the late Province of Southland, and the ocean; and towards the West by the ocean.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that the Governor may, at the request of the Superintendent of any Province, from time to time make regulations (as therein mentioned) for the conduct of Immigration under the said Act into such Province, and for the nomination of Immigrants by persons resident therein, and for the distribution of funds provided by the said Act for Immigration purposes, and for the introduction into and settlement in such Province of Immigrants, and for selling as special

settlements for any such Immigrants any lands which he may acquire from any Province under the provisions therein contained, or any lands acquired under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," or the Acts amending the same, and for laying out and allotting any lands so acquired amongst any such Immigrants: And whereas Thomas Bannatyne Gillies, Esq., the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, hath requested me, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, to make regulations under the provisions of the said Act as and in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the forty-first section of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, and in compliance with the request of the said Superintendent, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF ASSISTED IMMIGRANTS INTO THE PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

ANY person residing in Europe desirous of obtaining an assisted passage to the Province of Auckland in vessels under contract to proceed to any port of that Province, may receive assistance on the following terms:—

1. The Government will afford to small farmers and agricultural labourers assistance equal in amount to one-half the passage money.

2. Assisted passages will be granted to such persons only as shall be approved by the Agent-General of the Colony in England, acting under instructions from the Colonial Government.

3. No single man above the age of 50 years, and no person above 60 years of age, shall under any circumstances receive an assisted passage.

4. All persons desirous of obtaining assisted passages must satisfy the Agent-General that they are in good health and bear good characters.

5. Free passages will be provided for single women between the ages of 15 and 35, accustomed to domestic service, who shall produce satisfactory proof of good character.

6. In certain other cases free passages may be granted upon conditions, of which the Agent-General in England will from time to time be advised.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF IMMIGRANTS INTO THE PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND UPON THE NOMINATION OF PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Any person resident in the Province of Auckland desirous of nominating friends in Europe for passages to that Province, may do so on payment at the time of making such application of £7 10s. in respect of each adult male, of £5 in respect of each adult female, and of £3 for each child between the ages of 1 and 12 years. These rates include the passage from the port of embarkation to Auckland only; the cost of reaching such port must be defrayed by the immigrants themselves.

2. Free passages may be granted upon application by friends in the Province to single women between the ages of 15 and 35, accustomed to domestic service, and able to produce satisfactory proof of good character to the Agent-General in London.

3. In the event of any immigrants applied for declining to immigrate whatever money may have been deposited on their account with the Government will be returned so soon as the Agent-General shall have apprised the Government of such refusal. But in the event of any immigrants applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and failing to embark at the time and place appointed

by the Agent-General in England for the sailing of such ship, or inform him in good time of their inability to do so, their passage money will be forfeited.

4. All the ships employed in this service shall be under the provisions of the Passenger Act.

5. In all cases the Agent-General shall have the power to refuse passages where the intending immigrants are in ill health, or unfitted, in his judgment, to undertake the voyage, provided that in such cases all deposits shall be repaid.

PROGRESS REPORT OF THE WAR MEDAL
COMMISSIONERS.

To His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN,

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,—

We, the undersigned Commissioners appointed on the 1st day of July, 1871, under the hand of your Excellency and the Seal of the Colony, to examine and report on all claims for the New Zealand War Medal which shall from time to time be referred to us by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, do now submit the following Rolls, which contain the names of those applicants whose claims we have been able to determine.

Roll A contains the names of those officers and men of the Colonial Forces who are entitled to receive the Medal for services performed during the various military operations in New Zealand in the years 1845, 1846, and 1847, and from the year 1860 to the year 1866, inclusive.

Roll B, the names of those who have established their claims to the Medal for services performed subsequent to the 31st December, 1866.

Roll C, the names of such Friendly Natives as have been referred to us and are entitled to receive the Medal.

Roll D contains the names of those applicants whose claims we have rejected; and in each case we have specified the reason for such rejection.

We further transmit a Roll, marked E, containing the names, rank, and corps; &c., of the officers and men of the Colonial Forces who have been killed in action, or have died from wounds received in action prior to the 11th July, 1868—a list of all such

casualties as occurred subsequent to that date having been furnished by the late Commissioners.

We also attach lists of officers and men who were awarded Medals by the late Commissioners, but whose names appear in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 31st May, 1871, as having been granted Medals by the Imperial Government for services performed whilst in the Imperial Commissariat Transport Corps.

And we respectfully submit this as a Progress Report for your Excellency's consideration.
