

G. F. Bowen, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

7 HEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' Districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished as the case may be: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, His Excellency the Governor in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him, did proclaim and declare the districts described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, including amongst other districts the District of Lyttelton and the District of Akaroa, to be, on and from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, Resident Magistrates' Districts within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and define the boundaries of the respective Districts of Lyttelton and of Akaroa in manner hereafter appearing:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities for this purpose vested in me, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Districts of Lyttelton and Akaroa, as the same are defined and described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the first day of December next, be the boundaries of the Districts of Lyttelton and Akaroa within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867;" and I do hereby, from the date aforesaid, alter and define the boundaries of the said districts accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

Lyttelton District.

This district is bounded towards the North by the

southern shore of Lake Ellesmere; towards the West by the eastern shore of the said lake, by the western bank of the River Halswell, to the western boundary of Section No. 1879; thence by that boundary and the Ahuriri Bush Road to the southern boundary of Section No. 1901, by that boundary and the ridge of hills by Cooper's Knob and Cass Peak; and again towards the North by the ridge of hills north of Lyttelton Harbour to a point where it meets a line drawn due North and South through the easternmost extremity of the boundary of the said Town of Lyttelton as originally laid out by the Canterbury Association; thence by that line to Port Lyttelton, and by Port Lyttelton and the sea to a point on the coast being midway between Port Levy and Pigeon Bay; thence towards the East by a right line to Mount Sinclair, thence Westerly along the Purau Track to the spur leading from the main range from High Bare Peak, thence by the spur and range to High Bare Peak, thence by right lines along the summit of the watershed between Waikoka Creek and Lake Forsyth to the Tramway Reserve, and thence by a right line to the outlet of that lake; and thence towards the South by the sea to the outlet of Lake Ellesmere. Including the adjacent islands.

Akaroa District.

This district is bounded towards the West by the Lyttelton District hereinbefore defined; and towards the North, East, and South by the sea.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of November, 1871.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to divide the Colony into Judicial Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require; and that there shall be held Circuit Courts for the despatch of civil and criminal business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint: And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-eighth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twelfth day of April in the same year, after reciting as is therein recited, the Governor appointed Circuit Courts to be held within the several districts hereinafter mentioned on certain days and at certain places within the said districts, as therein particularly mentioned: And whereas by an Order in Council made the nineteenth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the eighth day of November in the same year, Circuit Courts were appointed to be held at Invercargill, in the Province of Otago, in the Otago and Southland District, on certain days therein particularly mentioned: And whereas it hath been determined that a Circuit Court should be held at the Town of Wanganui, within the Wellington Judicial District, as the same is now defined by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine: And whereas it hath also been determined that a Circuit Court should be held at the Town of Picton, within the Nelson Judicial District, as the same is defined by a Proclamation dated the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine. And whereas it is expedient to revoke the several appointments of the times and places for the holding of the Circuit Courts so made as aforesaid, and to appoint the times and places hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," doth hereby declare that on and after the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventyone, the several appointments mentioned in the hereinbefore in part recited Orders in Council, so far as the same relate to the times and places for holding Circuit Courts, shall be revoked, and with the like advice and consent doth hereby appoint that Circuit Courts of the Supreme Court, for the despatch of civil and criminal business of the Court, shall, after the said twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, be holden at the several times and places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say

In the Northern District, at the Supreme Court House at Auckland, on the first Monday in each of the months of January, April, July,

and October, in each and every year.

In the Wellington District, at the Supreme Court House at Wellington, on the first Monday in each of the months of January, April,

on the second Monday in each of the months of June and December in each and every year, the first sitting to be held there on the second Monday in the month of June one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two; and at Wanganui, at the Resident Magistrate's Court House there, on the fourth Monday in each of the months of April and October in

each and every year.

In the Nelson District, at the Provincial Council Hall at Nelson, on the first Monday in the month of January, and on the third Monday in each of the months of April and August, in each and every year; and at Picton, at the Provincial Council Chamber on the second Monday in each of the months of June and December, in each and every year, the first sitting to be held there on the second Monday in the month of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

In the Westland District, at the Supreme Court House at Hokitika, on the third Monday in the month of March, and the first Monday in the month of September, in each and every

year.

In the Canterbury District, at the Supreme Court House at Christchurch, on the first Monday in each of the months of January, April, July, and October in each and every

year. In the Otago and Southland District, at the Supreme Court House at Dunedin, on the first Monday in each of the months of January, April, July, and October, in each and every year; and at the Provincial Council Chamber at Invercargill, on the third Monday in each of the months of May and November in each

and every year.

Provided that if and whenever any of the days hereby appointed for holding a Circuit Court shall happen to be a holiday at the Supreme Court, then the Circuit Court appointed to be holden on such day shall be holden on the first day thereafter which shall

not be such holiday.

Provided further, that the said revocation of the said recited Orders in Council shall not affect any sitting by adjournment of a Circuit Court of the said Court, the sitting whereof began on a day prior to the said twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

And with the like advice and consent doth hereby proclaim and declare that this Order in Council shall not take effect till the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-
