ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this 19th day of February, 1872.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**W**HEREAS by "The Wellington Special Settlements Act, 1871," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, to set aside out of the waste lands within the Province of Wellington, the Native title of which has been extinguished, or any block or blocks, for the purpose of special settlement, not exceeding in the whole one hundred thousand acres, on such terms as may be sanctioned by the Governor in Council, anything in the existing regulations for the management or disposal of the waste lands in the Province to the contrary notwithstanding: And whereas the said Superintendent, with the advice of his Executive Council as aforesaid, hath proposed to set aside a certain block of land at Sandon, in the said Province, containing five thousand and eight acres two roods and thirty-two perches, or thereabouts, as a special settlement under the said Act for the members of an Association known as the

"Hutt Small Farm Association," upon the terms hereinafter mentioned: And whereas the said Superintendent, with the advice of his Executive Council as aforesaid, hath requested the Governor to sanction the said terms:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act; and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby sanction the terms set forth in the Schedule hereto as the terms under which the said proposed special settlement shall be made under the said Act.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the Occupation and Purchase of the Block of Land proposed to be set aside for Special Settlement as aforesaid.

##### Interpretation.

1. In the construction of these terms and conditions, unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—"Association" shall mean the "Hutt Small Farm Association." "Land" shall mean the block of land described in the foregoing Proclamation. "Purchaser" shall mean any members of the Association, or the Trustees thereof, who may purchase any of the land hereby set aside. "The said Act," "The Wellington Special Settlements Act, 1871."

To whom Purchase Money to be Paid.—Limitation of Time.

2. All moneys required to be paid by any purchaser of the said land under these terms and conditions, shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue, at Wellington, and receipts given by him shall be sufficient evidence of such payments as may be therein expressed.

The payment of purchase money, under these terms and conditions, shall not extend beyond a period of three years from the date of the foregoing Proclamation.

Rules of Association so far Applicable.

3. Subject to the foregoing terms and conditions, the Rules of the Association hereinafter set forth shall, so far as applicable, be deemed to regulate the terms on which the special settlement shall be made and occupied under the said Act.

##### RULES.

1. The object of the Association shall be the establishment of a Small Farm Settlement and Township in the District of Manawatu, in the Province of Wellington.

2. The business of the Association shall be managed by a Committee of seven persons, including Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected by the Shareholders annually, whose duty it shall be to carry out the objects of the Association.

3. No question of vital importance to the Association shall be decided by the Committee, so as to bind the members, unless resolved upon at a general meeting of members, due notice of which shall be given, and all questions carried and decided upon by a majority of the members then present shall be binding upon the Association, unless contrary to the rules and law under which the Association shall be formed.

4. The members of the Association shall be males

not under eighteen years of age, who shall hold at least one share, and shall undertake to occupy and pay for the land in conformity with these Regulations.

5. Occupation shall be the enclosing of at least five acres of land with a good and substantial fence, and the erection of a tenement the value of which shall be ten pounds, before the end of the second year, and the actual residence of a member himself, or a son of not less than seventeen years of age, during the whole of the third and last year for which the reserve is proclaimed.

6. The settlement shall be divided into allotments of from forty to two hundred acres, according to requirements of shareholders, with a quarter-acre town allotment for each and every forty acres of rural land, together with reserves for public purposes, which will be laid aside by the Government.

7. Each share shall represent forty acres of rural land and a quarter-acre town allotment, and no member shall be allowed to subscribe for or occupy more than five such allotments.

8. The town shall be laid off in such manner as a majority of the shareholders may decide at a meeting called for business purposes, and no member shall be allowed to draw for more than three town allotments fronting the main road, the same to be fixed according to the following scale, that is to say:—A member holding 200 acres of rural land may have three town sections fronting the main road; holding 160 acres may have two sections on main road; holding 120 acres may have two sections on main road; holding 80 acres may have one on main road; but any member having only one forty acre allotment may choose his town section on either of the main roads; the remaining allotments that members are entitled to may be taken on any of the other streets in the town. The surplus town allotments shall be disposed of in such a manner as a majority of the members may think best.

9. Rural sections shall be chosen by ballot, and any member who may have the last order of choice of farm sections shall have first choice in each series for town allotments that he may be entitled to.

10. The price of each 40 acres shall be £40, payable every three months, at the rate of one pound for each share per month, until the members shall have paid £40 for each and every share he may hold, but every member will be at liberty to pay larger instalments or the whole purchase money in one payment, should it suit his convenience so to do. The price of each quarter-acre town allotment shall be one pound, payable on the day of drawing.

11. Each member shall pay or cause to be paid his instalments from time to time to the Treasurer, whose receipt shall be a sufficient voucher for such payment. Payment shall be made on the first Friday in September, on the first Friday in December, on the first Friday in March, and on the first Friday in June in each year.

12. Any surplus money arising out of the sale of town allotments, fines, or entrance fees, shall be applied by the Committee to the payment of preliminary expenses which have and will be incurred by the Committee in establishing the Association, and to any other purpose which a majority of the members shall decide at a general meeting.

13. All moneys paid to the Treasurer on account of the Association shall be placed in the Bank of New Zealand to the credit of the Association, and all moneys drawn from the Bank shall be by cheque signed by the Treasurer and counter-signed by two of the Committee.

14. Any member who shall fail to pay his quarterly instalments on or before the day appointed, shall pay to the Committee, for the benefit of the Association, a fine of one shilling per share for the first

omission, doubling the fine each quarter that a member neglects or fails to make payment.

15. In the event of the death of a member before being put in possession of his land, his interest in the allotment or allotments will revert to his heirs or executors, who may dispose of it to a *bonâ fide* settler: Provided always that no member shall be allowed to hold in all more than 200 acres; but should the deceased leave a widow or children, they shall be at liberty to occupy, irrespective of age or sex.

16. Should any member be necessarily compelled to leave the district previous to his being entitled to his Crown Grant, and before completing the requisite term of occupation, it shall be competent for the Committee to permit such member to transfer his right, title, and interest in the Association to another *bonâ fide* settler: Provided always that no member shall be allowed to hold more than 200 acres.

17. Any member of the Association who may be found to have taken shares for speculative purposes, and not with a view to *bonâ fide* settlement, shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of a majority of the members, forfeit his interest in the Association, and the Committee shall re-allot his shares to a *bonâ fide* settler; and these Rules shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture and re-allotment.

18. Should any member of the Association fail to comply with Rule 14, or any part thereof, he shall forfeit his interest in the Association, and the Committee shall have power to dispose of his shares to a *bonâ fide* settler.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-ninth day of February, 1872.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Native Reserves Amendment Act, 1862," it is, amongst other things, provided that where, under the provisions of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants is required to bringing land under the operation of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare such assent to have been ascertained, and thereupon the title of the aboriginal inhabitants in the land to which the same shall relate shall be deemed to be extinguished, and the land shall, from the date of such Order in Council, vest in Her Majesty for the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," as altered by the recited Act, and that as effectually as if the same had been ceded and conveyed by such aboriginal inhabitants to Her Majesty:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants to the bringing the piece of land described in the Schedule hereunder written, under the operation of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," has been ascertained.

#### SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land containing by admeasurement forty-eight (48) acres two (2) roods and thirty-

seven (37) perches, more or less, being parts of Rural Allotments Nos. 18 and 23 in the Fitzroy District. Bounded towards the North by Rural Allotment No. 92, eight hundred and forty-eight (848) links, and by the Devon Road and a road one thousand six hundred and eighty-four (1684) links; towards the East by part of Rural Allotment No. 23, one thousand and two (1002) links, and by the Waiwaka River; towards the South by Rural Allotment No. 89, one thousand seven hundred and twenty-four (1724) links; and towards the West by part of Rural Allotment No. 18, seven hundred and seventy-eight (778) links, and Rural Allotment No. 92, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two (1942) links. Excepting and reserving the Devon Road, of the clear width of one chain through the same.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Juries Act, 1868," it is enacted that in case any Circuit Court, or sittings of the Supreme Court for trial of civil or criminal cases, or District Court, or Court of Sessions of the Peace, shall thereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which Courts are now holden, the Clerk of the Resident Magistrate's Court there, if there be one, or a Jury Officer to be appointed for the jury district of such town in manner in the said Act mentioned, shall act as Jury Officer for the jury district of such town, and such Jury Officer, and all Justices of the Peace, and the Registrars, Clerks, or other officers of Courts, constables and officers of police, and Sheriffs, shall within such time as the Governor shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things, in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve on juries, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required ordinarily to be done at a different time or period, and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the Sheriff, and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions hereinbefore contained: And whereas sittings of the District Court have been lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at Tokomairiro, in the Province of Otago, being a town other than one at which Courts were then holden: Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise of all powers and authorities in this behalf vested in me by the said Act, do hereby order that the Jury Officer for the jury district of Tokomairiro aforesaid, and all Justices of the Peace, and the Registrars, Clerks, or other officers of Courts, constables and officers of police, and Sheriffs, shall, before the first day of April next, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things, in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve on juries, and making out the jury books for the jury district of Tokomairiro aforesaid, as are thereinbefore in the said Act ordinarily required to be done at a different time or period.

And I do order that, for the purposes aforesaid, the words in the sections of the said Juries Act, 1868, specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto, shall respectively be construed and read as if the words in the second column of the said Schedule were inserted in lieu of such words in the said sections respectively.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is, among other things, enacted that the Court Fees to be paid in respect of the inquiries therein mentioned (and the purposes of which inquiries are set forth in Part VI. of the said Act), shall be fixed by the Governor by Regulations to be by him from time to time made: And whereas it is expedient to fix a Scale of Court Fees to be paid in respect of the inquiries in the said Act mentioned:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act for that purpose, and subject to the provisions thereof, do, by the Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, fix the Court Fees to be paid in respect of the inquiries in the said Act mentioned.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. Upon proceedings taken under Part VI. of "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," where the amount claimed by the owner does not exceed £100, and a sum less than that claimed is offered by the Minister, or where a sum less than £100 shall be offered by the Minister and refused by the owner, then the Court Fees to be paid, whether in a District Court or in a Resident Magistrate's Court, shall be those set forth in the second column of this Schedule.

2. In cases in like circumstances to those set forth in the preceding regulation, but where the amount offered or refused, as the case may be, exceeds £100,

then the Court Fees to be paid in the said Courts shall be those set forth in the third column of the said Schedule.

3. In enforcing payment of costs under section 37 of the said Act, the like Court Fees shall be charged on process thereon as in civil proceedings in a District Court or a Resident Magistrate's Court, as the case may be, and in accordance with the scale for the time being in force in those Courts in like cases.

4. In the construction of these Regulations the word "Owner" shall mean the person claiming or to whom compensation shall be offered, whatever may be his estate or interest; and the word "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Public Works for the time being, or any person acting for him under the said Act.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may, at the request of the Superintendent of any Province, from time to time make Regulations (as therein mentioned) for the conduct of immigration under the said Act into such Province, and for the nomination of Immigrants by persons resident therein, and for the distribution of funds provided by the said Act for immigration purposes, and for the introduction into and settlement in such Province of Immigrants, and for selling as special settlements for any such Immigrants any lands which he may acquire from any Province under the provisions therein contained, or any lands acquired under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," or the Acts amending the same, and for laying out and allotting any lands so acquired amongst any such Immigrants: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is, among other things, enacted that so much of the thirty-ninth and forty-first sections of the said Act as provide that any acts, matters, or things are to or may be done by the Governor at the request of the Superintendent of a Province, is thereby repealed; and it is thereby enacted that the Governor may exercise all the powers, and do and perform all the acts, matters, and things in the said sections mentioned, without any request from any Superintendent of any Province or any other person or authority:

And whereas, in pursuance of the power and authority contained in the said first-mentioned Act, the Governor, at the request of certain Superintendents of Provinces, did make certain Regulations for the introduction of Immigrants from Europe into those Provinces respectively, on the nomination of persons resident therein: And whereas it hath been determined to make other Regulations in lieu of those so made as aforesaid:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the hereinbefore in part-recited Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf; do hereby make the Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the introduction of Immigrants from Europe into the Colony of New Zealand, on the nomination of persons resident therein.

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SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF IMMIGRANTS INTO NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. The Immigration Regulations and Forms of Application may be obtained at any Post Office or Immigration Office in the Colony; but applications and payments for passages are only to be made to *Money Order* Post Offices or to the Immigration Officer at the capital town of each Province or County.

2. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by paying at any *Money Order* Post Office or to the Immigration Officers aforesaid the sum of £5 for each adult (except single women) under 50 years of age, and £2 10s. for each child under 12 years of age. Infants under one year, free. In certain cases, bills will be taken in lieu of cash payments, and passages will be provided for persons over fifty years of age. (See clause 6, secs. 1 and 3.)

Widows with families are, as a rule, not eligible, and applications for passages in their behalf are only to be made to the Immigration Officers aforesaid. (See clause 6, sec. 4.)

3. Free passages will be granted to girls of 12 years of age and upwards accompanying their parents, and to single women between the ages of 16 and 35 provided they are able to produce proof of good character to the satisfaction of the Agent-General in London.

4. Every single woman will be required, before embarkation, to pay to the Agent-General 25s., and every other adult 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

5. In the event of any emigrant applied for declining to emigrate, whatever money or bills may have been deposited with the Government will be returned to the applicant so soon as the Agent-General shall have apprised the Government thereof; but in the event of any emigrant applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and so, by failing to present himself for embarkation at the time and port appointed by the Agent-General for the sailing of such ship, be left behind, the passage money will be forfeited.

6. The Immigration Officer at the capital town in each Province or County (and he only) will receive applications as under:—

1. From persons who may wish to give bills for the passage money of their relatives or friends, instead of paying cash, as provided for in clause 1. The amount of the bills to be taken will be 50 per cent. over the amount above fixed to be paid in cash, and the bills will become due 30 days after the arrival of the immigrants sent for.
2. From persons who desire to leave to their agents in Europe the nomination of emigrants of any particular class. The terms will be the same as if nominated in the Colony.

3. From persons whose friends are over 50 years of age.

4. From persons whose friends are widows with children.

7. The above rates being only for the passage from the port of embarkation to the Colony, the cost of conveyance to such port and to the residence of their friends after arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

8. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the Passenger Act.

9. It is to be distinctly understood that, notwithstanding applications may have been granted at *Money Order* Post Offices, the Immigration Officers aforesaid are empowered to object to any of the emigrants so nominated being sent out, either from unsuitability of occupation or from any other cause; and the Agent-General in London will have power to refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Minister for Public Works may receive applications from the owners or lessees of works for the supply of water on Gold Fields, for mining and other purposes, or from other persons interested in such works about to be constructed, for advances of money to aid in the construction, extension, or improvement of such works; and by the said Act it is further enacted that the said Minister may make Regulations prescribing the mode of making and the form of such application, and for proceeding on such application, as in the said Act mentioned: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations should be made for the purposes in the said Act mentioned:

Now therefore, I, the Honorable John Davies Ormond, the Minister for Public Works, in pursuance and exercise of the authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby make the Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, prescribing the mode of making and the form of application for advances of money to aid in the construction of works for the supply of water on Gold Fields, and for proceeding on such application.

SCHEDULE.

1. Persons desirous of obtaining advances of money for the purposes specified, shall make application in writing to the Warden of the District or the Agent duly appointed in that behalf for the Province or District in which the intended works are to be constructed, and such application shall state—

- (1.) The names and descriptions of the applicants, or if they be a Company registered under any Act of the General Assembly, then the registered particulars thereof.
- (2.) The names of the Engineer and Manager of the enterprise.

- (3.) The general description of the water race or races, dams, reservoirs, or other works proposed to be constructed, together with duly attested copies of the certificate or certificates of title to the water or ground; the quantity of water intended to be conveyed or stored; the length of the race or races; size of reservoirs or dams; the maximum rate proposed to be charged for the water; the nature and extent of the auriferous ground proposed to be supplied with water.
- (4.) The estimated cost of the enterprise.
- (5.) The proposed capital.
- (6.) The interests, if any, affected by the diversion or storage of the water to be dealt with.
- (7.) The amount of money proposed to be borrowed, which must not exceed one-third of the estimated cost of the construction of the works.

2. With the application the applicant shall forward to the Warden or Agent a receipt from the Receiver of Land Revenue of the District for the amount of 2½ per cent. upon the money proposed to be borrowed.

3. Immediately after any application shall have been finally decided upon, the deposit thereon will be repaid, except so much as may be retained under authority of the Minister for covering the cost of the inquiry made in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

4. The projectors of any enterprise to which money may be advanced shall, before the issue of any loan to them, give to the Minister a valid lien or mortgage to cover the amount of loan over the works and property proposed to be constructed; and such lien or mortgage shall be registered in the Warden's Court of the district, and shall be prepared at the expense of the projectors.

5. No money shall be paid towards the construction of any water race, dam, or reservoir unless the projectors of the same shall have duly registered themselves under the Mining Companies Limited Liability Act or the Joint Stock Companies Act.

6. The rate of interest to be paid by the projectors of any enterprise coming under these Regulations shall be seven (7) pounds per centum per annum, payable quarterly from the date of the advance.

7. The capital sum to be repaid out of the profits of the enterprise in the same proportion as the amount of money advanced by the Government bears to the paid-up capital of the Company.
