At the Government House, at Wellington, this
twenty-eighth day of March, 1872.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Public Debts Sinking Funds Act, 1868," it is provided that notwithstanding anything in the Acts or Ordinances specified in the Second Schedule thereto to the contrary, the Commissioners shall invest the moneys received by them under the said Act, and the interest or other profits accruing on any securities transferred, delivered, or vested in them under or by virtue of the said Act, only in such bonds or debentures or other securities as the Governor in Council shall from time to time prescribe as securities in which investments may be made by the Commissioners:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Commissioners should be authorized to invest such moneys in the debentures authorized to be made and issued under the twenty-ninth section of "The Canterbury Rivers Act, 1870:"

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of all powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby prescribe the debentures authorized to be made and issued under the twenty-ninth section of "The Canterbury Rivers Act, 1870," to be (in addition to other securities heretofore authorized) securities on which the said Commissioners may invest all such moneys as are referred to in the said recited section of the said Act, or otherwise received by them under the said "Public Debts Sinking Funds Act, 1868," and any Act amending the same.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1869," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time to order and direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or Governor in Council, by the said Act, within any Province or District of the Colony within which the said Act shall have been brought into operation, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such Province, or by any other person the Governor may think fit, subject however to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, as in the said Act mentioned: And whereas by a Proclamation made by the Governor under the provisions of the said Act, on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the District in the Province of Canterbury therein described and defined was declared to be subject to the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the Governor should delegate to the Superintendent of the said Province the powers, functions, duties, and authorities hereinafter mentioned, to be exercised by him within the said district:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby order and direct that

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME,
GREETING:

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1870," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint Polling Places for each Electoral District within or within one mile of the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the Principal Polling Place for the District, and all or any of such Polling Places from time to time to abolish, and to appoint other Polling Places in lieu of those abolished, and that every such Warrant shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*: Provided always that no Polling Place shall be appointed by the Governor under the said Act unless he shall be first satisfied that the place to be appointed is more convenient than any other for at least twenty electors to record their votes thereat: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that every election of the Superintendent or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province shall be conducted in the manner prescribed therein for the election of Members of the House of Representatives, and that the Governor shall have the same powers of appointing and altering Polling Places and Principal Polling Places for Electoral Districts for the election of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils as, under the provisions thereinbefore contained, he has for Electoral Districts for election of Members of the House of Representatives:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby appoint the following place to be an additional Polling Place for the District of the Lakes for the election of Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, namely,—

The School House, Shotover Bridge.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington, this third day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
