A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is enacted that the railways to be constructed under the said Act shall be only such railways as shall from time to time be determined by the General Assembly: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions contained therein, the Governor may construct, or cause to be constructed, any lines of railway which shall be prescribed by the General Assembly as railways to be constructed under the said Act, or any part or parts thereof, and acquire the necessary engines, plant, and machinery for working and using the same, or any of them: And it is also thereby enacted that, whenever the Governor shall determine to construct any such railway, or any part thereof, it shall be lawful for him, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare and define the limits and description and line thereof, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of such railway, subject to the provisions of any Act defining such limits and descriptions, and any such Proclamation may refer to maps, plans, or drawings to be deposited in the office of the Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court in the Province in which such railway or part thereof is proposed to be constructed, and any maps, plans, or drawings so referred to shall be deemed to form part of such Proclamation; and upon the publication of such Proclamation the provisions and regulations contained in the Seventh Part of the said Act shall be applicable to the railway, and to the lands to which the Proclamation shall relate: And it is also thereby enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to make, construct, and maintain any such railway as aforesaid, with proper works, approaches, and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at the place delineated on, and extending along the lines set forth in, and terminating at a point described in the Act or Proclamation proclaiming and defining such railway, or shown in the maps, plans, or drawings referred to in such Act or Proclamation:

And it is also thereby enacted that the Governor may direct that any part of such line of railway may be constructed on and along any part of any public highway, and that any part of any such line of railway may be constructed on or through any public reserves: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Part of the said Act and of the Acts incorporated therewith, the Governor may exercise all or any of the powers by that Part of the said Act or the said incorporated Acts conferred upon him for the construction of any such railway, and may enter upon, and cause to be entered upon, all lands within the Colony for the purpose of making such surveys as may be necessary, and may take and hold all the lands required for the railway along the line set forth and described as aforesaid, or within the limits of deviation described in the Proclamation relating thereto, and may temporarily occupy and use such lands as may be necessary on either side of the railway, during the construction thereof:

And whereas by "The Railways Act, 1871," it is enacted that the Governor may, under the provisions of the first-mentioned Act and of the now reciting Act, construct and maintain, or cause to be constructed and maintained, the several lines of railway in the Province of Auckland specified in the First Schedule thereto: And it is also thereby enacted that the line of the railways thereby authorized to be constructed shall be fixed by the Governor, and shall commence and terminate at points to be fixed by the Governor: And whereas the Governor has determined to construct and maintain a railway from Auckland to Mercer, with branch to Onehunga, the same being a line of railway specified in the said First Schedule:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the said first-mentioned Act, and in exercise of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and define the limits, description, and line of the said railway to be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and

that the lands specified and described in the Second Schedule hereto are proposed to be taken for the purposes of the said railway; and that the limits of deviation shall be those set forth in the said First Schedule hereto; and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Railways Act, 1871," I do hereby fix the point or commencement of the said railway to be at the ground known as Fort Britomart, in the City of Auckland; and the point of termination thereof to be on the east bank of the Waikato River, within the Township of Mercer. The Onehunga branch commences in the lands formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway, near Penrose, and terminates in the Manukau Harbour, at the Government Wharf, Onehunga.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND AND MERCER RAILWAY.

Limits, Description, Line and Limits of Deviation of the Railway from Auckland to Mercer, with Branch to Onehunga, in the Province of Auckland.

MAIN LINE.

COMMENCING at the ground known as Fort Britomart, Auckland, and passing along, in, through, or into the following districts and parishes:—

In the Parish of Waitemata.

Ground belonging to the Harbour Board, the City of Auckland, Parnell Highway District, the Auckland Domain Board, Remuera Highway District, Mount Wellington Highway District, One Tree Hill Highway District, a portion of the Manukau Harbour called Ann's Creek, another portion of the same called Canal Creek, a portion of land known as Hamlin's Grant, not included in any Highway District.

In the Parish of Manurewa.

The Otahuhu Highway District, Māngere Highway District, Papatoitōi Highway District, and part of Manurewa Highway District.

In the Parish of Papakura.

Part of Manurewa Highway District, Papakura Highway District, and part of Wairoa Highway District.

In the Parish of Opaheke.

Part of Wairoa Highway District, the Hunua Highway District, part of the Karaka Highway District.

In the Parish of Karaka.

Part of the Karaka Highway District.

In the Parish of Pukekohe.

Part of the Pukekohe Highway District.

In the Parish of Tuakau.

Part of the Pukekohe Highway District.

In the Parish of Mangatawhiri.

The Mangatawhiri Highway District, the Pokeno Highway District.

In the Parish of Koheroa.

Lands belonging to the Crown, and town allotments within the Township of Mercer, and terminating on the east bank of the Waikato River, within the said township.

BRANCH TO ONEHUNGA.

Commencing in the lands formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway near Penrose, and passing along, in, through, or into the following Districts and Parish:—

In the Parish of Waitemata.

One Tree Hill Highway District, Onehunga Highway District.

The limits, description, and lines of this Railway and Branch are set forth in the plans, and described more particularly in the Second Schedule hereto, and which plans are authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable John Davies Ormond, Minister for Public Works, and are deposited in the Office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland; or within the limits of deviation set forth in the said plan by dotted red lines, being not more than 220 yards on either side of the said railway lines, and passing through or over the several sections of land and reserves enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto, and all intervening roads, rivers, places, and water-courses.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

LANDS PROPOSED TO BE TAKEN FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE AUCKLAND AND MERCER RAILWAY.

So much of the lands hereinafter mentioned as are required for the said railway along the line of the said railway hereinbefore defined, or within the limits of deviation aforesaid, as the said lands are described in the plan aforesaid and in this Schedule.

The Harbour Board of Auckland.

Fort Britomart: Lands between high and low watermark, extending from Fort Britomart to the Strand, in the City of Auckland.

The City of Auckland.

The Strand and that portion of the lands formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying within the said City.

The Parnell Highway District.

That portion of the land formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein.

The Auckland Domain Board.

That portion of the land formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein.

The Remuera Highway District.

That portion of the land formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein.

The Mount Wellington Highway District.

That portion of the land formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein.

The One Tree Hill Highway District.

That portion of the land formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein: The Government Reserve at Ann's Creek.

The Manukau Harbour.

That portion of Ann's Creek lying west of the Great South Road, and the creek known as the Canal Creek.

Unproclaimed in any Highway District.

That portion of land known as Hamlin's Grant, lying west of the Great South Road.

The Otahuhu and Māngere Highway Districts.

Parish of Manurewa: Lands known as Fairburn's Grant, and section 55.

The Papatoitōi Highway District.

Parish of Manurewa: Sections 54, 48, 44.

The Manurewa Highway District.

Parish of Manurewa: Lands known as Clendon's Grant. In Parish of Papakura: Sections 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, and confiscated Native land.

The Wairoa Highway District.

Parish of Papakura: Lands formerly Native Reserve, sections 33, 40, 41. Parish of Karaka: Section 1.

In Papakura Village: Section 45.

The Hunua Highway District.

Parish of Opaheke: Railway Reserve in the confiscated lands of Kirikiri, and sections 52, 17, 28, 23, 34, 33.

The Karaka Highway District.

Parish of Opaheke: Sections 33, 36, 38, 41. Parish of Karaka: Sections 57, 83, 71, 69, 78, 72, 73, 76, 79.

The Pukekohe Highway District.

Parish of Pukekohe: Section 4, Railway Reserve, Sections 17, 12, 11, 16, 39, 24, 9, 36, 35, 34. Parish of Tuakau: Sections 10, 11, 2, 4, 12, 13, 14, 18, 15, 16, 17, 19, 21, 36.

The Mangatawhiri Highway District.

Parish of Mangatawhiri: Sections 10, 16, 15, 17.

The Pokeno Highway District.

Parish of Mangatawhiri: Section 15, lands belonging to the Crown.

The Parish of Koheroa.

Lands belonging to the Crown, section 63, and town allotments of Mercer, Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 of section I., Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 of section III., No. 1 of section II.

BRANCH TO ONEHUNGA.

So much of the lands hereinafter mentioned as are required for the said railway along the line of said railway hereinbefore defined or within the limits of deviation aforesaid, as the said lands are described in the plan aforesaid and in this Schedule.

The One Tree Hill Highway District.

That portion of the lands formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein.

The Onehunga Highway District.

That portion of the land formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway lying therein: The Mount Smart Reserve, the public road leading from Princes Street to the new Government Wharf, that portion of the Manukau Harbour between high and low watermark, extending from the lands formerly acquired for the Auckland and Drury Railway at the junction of Queen Street and Princes Street to and beyond the new Government Wharf aforesaid. Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, lying in the angle between Princes Street and Queen Street. Sections 8, 9, 10, 11, 1, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, all lying south of Princes Street, and east and south of Queen Street.

This Schedule includes all places, rivers, streams, and roads, lying between the sections and lands enumerated in each of the above-mentioned districts.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:
