A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that, as soon as conveniently may be after the establishment of a Petty Sessions District, and afterwards from time to time as may be deemed expedient, the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, appoint a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident in such district to be yearly held within such district, at some specified time and place, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the Petty Session District of Mangapai was defined and established:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in this behalf vested in me, do hereby proclaim and appoint that, for the District of Mangapai, a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident within such district shall be yearly held at the dwelling-house of Charles Osborne, in the Parish of Maungakaramea, in the District of Mangapai, instead of in the Mangapai Hotel, as appointed by a Proclamation bearing date the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, at twelve o'clock noon, on the first Tuesday in the month of September, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman and settling a rota of attendance.
