

(L.S.) G. F. Bowen, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the thirty-ninth section of "The Southland Waste Lands Act, 1865," it is enacted that grants of Waste Lands of the Crown may be made by way of part payment for the crown struction of such works as are therein mentioned, subject, however, to certain regulations in the said section provided; and amongst others, that no greater amount of land than one thousand acres in the aggregate shall in any one year be granted under the provisions of the said section, without the special recommendation of the Provincial Council, confirmed by the Governor in Council by a Proclamation pub-lished in the New Zealand Gazette: And whereas the Provincial Council of Otago did, on the thirtieth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventytwo, by a Resolution, make a recommendation in the words following, that is to say:

"That this Council specially recommends, in terms of the thirty-sixth section of "The Southland Waste Lands Act, 1865," that a grant of land not exceeding ten thousand acres be made for works and other expenses in connection with the completion of the Oreti and Bluff Harbour and Invercargill Railways in that portion of the Province of Otago lately known as the Province of Southland :"

And whereas it is expedient that the said recom-mendation should be confirmed in the manner in the said Act provided :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the said hereinbefore recited power and authority, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby confirm, and proclaim and declare that he confirms, the hereinbefore recited recommendation of the Provincial Council of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is, amongst other things, enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify by Speech or Message to the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same :

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legisla-tive Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, intituled "An Act to enable Provincial Legislatures to make Laws affecting Public Roads and Watercourses," was presented to the Governor of the said Colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon :

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do by this Proclamation signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern that the said

Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that-Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

THE following Report on the chief features of the vegetation and agricultural capabilities of the district between Maketu and Lake Taupo, obtained by the Geological Department, is published for general information.

Report on the Chief Features of the Vegetation of the District between Maketu and Lake Taupo. By THOMAS KIEK, F.L.S., 3rd August, 1872.

The vegetation of the country between the mouth of the Kaituna River and Ohinemutu is for the most part extremely scanty, and, with the exception of the patches of forest on the slopes of the hills, is far from luxuriant. For the first five or six miles from Maketu the district is of recent formation, and extremely sterile; the plants present but little variety, tea-tree, tauhinu (Pomaderris phylicifolia, Ladd.), Pimelea prostrata, Vahl., and dwarf fern, are the most prominent forms; in many places Zoysia pungens, Willd., a littoral grass, is extremely abundant, and occasionally mixed with other kinds of good quality; as Microlæna stipoides, Br., and Danthonia semiannularis, Br., of indigenous origin; the naturalized Doab grass, sweet vernal grass, yellow suckling, and white and red clovers, the last but sparingly. The Doab grass forms extensive patches, and furnishes a large supply of herbage in the driest seasons, so that its spread will prove beneficial. The Zoysia is undoubtedly a grass of considerable value in localities of this kind, as, although its herbage is short, it is highly nutritious, and eagerly devoured by horses and cattle. It is, moreover, of rapid growth, and forms a compact sward, thus preparing soil for the growth of superior kinds.

On ascending the low hills the Zoysia is left behind; the land is generally of better quality, as evidenced by the luxuriant fern and thickets of tutupahi (Coriaria ruscifolia, L.). Grass is however scarce, and, as a general rule, the aridity of the soil prevents the development and spread of new vegetation. In the gullies and ravines the conditions of vegetable life are more favourable.

On the new road, made about four years ago, the first plants to establish themselves are usually *Rumex Acetosella* (sheep's sorrel), *Haloragis alata*, Jacq., *Agrostis cemula*, Br., and *Danthonia semiannularis*; but they rarely flourish until their roots have penetrated a considerable depth into the pumiceous sand. Close to the bare track the undisturbed fern was growing in the greatest luxuriance, but its roots had penetrated to a depth of from five to fifteen feet.

A marked instance of the beneficial results of cultivation is to be seen at the telegraph station, Te Ngae, where the false acacia, elder, hawthorn, poplar, walnut, elm, apple, and other planted trees have attained large dimensions, and are in a remarkably thriving condition. Introduced grasses flourish, and the sweetbriar has become naturalized to such an extent that the old road has become almost impassable; yet much of the indigenous vegetation in the immediate vicinity is extremely depauperated.

There can be no doubt that in a few years most of the small valleys in the centre of the Island will be occupied by the sweetbriar. Already it occurs throughout the district, although not so abundantly as at Te Ngae. Horses are said to fatten upon its fruit in the winter season, and are the chief agents in its distribution, as the hairy covering of the seeds prevents the loss of vitality when swallowed. The growth of grasses and other surface-rooting plants is encouraged by the friendly shelter it affords from the parching effects of the summer sun on a pumiceous sandy soil.

In the vicinity of Ohinemutu the vegetation presents a very impoverished appearance, except in the neighbourhood of swamps and on the slopes of the hills. The higher parts of Ngongotaha (2,300 feet) are covered with luxuriant forest, in which Alseuosmia macrophylla, Cunn., grows as luxuriantly as in the extreme North. On the margin of the forest are traces of extensive clearings, indicating the sites of exhausted Native cultivations. In this locality a fresh clearing appears to be made yearly, but the extent is very limited.

To the north of Rotorua much of the land is of superior quality, and the forest district between the lake and Tauranga must be considered amongst the best land in the Colony; its vegetation exhibits a larger number of species than is to be seen in the southern part of the district.

Tobacco is grown to some extent by the Natives at Ohinemutu. The numerous small cultivations, often on the margin of boiling springs, presented a singular appearance, each separate patch being carefully fenced. Several patches did not contain more than ten plants, but the usual number was from twenty to sixty; one large patch contained over four hundred. Great care was usually bestowed upon its cultivation; the greatest neatness was observed, and the leading shoot pinched out on the development of the fourth or fifth leaf. The chief fault lay in overcrowding the plants, which evidently reduced the general yield. The plant grows with the greatest invuriance; and as there is a considerable extent of land peculiarly adapted for its cultivation, might easily be made a source of profit. No marked difference was exhibited between the plants growing amongst boiling springs and those in ordinary situations; but the general temperature of the soil of the whole of this remarkable district must be modified by the boiling springs below the surface.

On approaching Rotokakahi, by way of Whakarewarewa, the quality of the soil again shows an improvement, but is least fertile on the tops of the hills. About Kaitiriria, patches of *Triticium multiflorum*, Bańks and Sol., *Danthonia*, and one or two introduced grasses and clovers, furnish a considerable quantity of rough cattle food. Poa australis var. lævis is abundant in the valleys. Along the edge of the lake and on the hills the fern is remarkably luxuriant, and occasionally intermixed with grassy tufts and patches —Poa anceps, Br., being the most prominent. Passing Tikitapu Lake, the track through the forest at Rauporoa is occasionally dotted with patches of rye-grass and other kinds, and might soon be covered with a permanent sward by simple surface sowing. The forest itself contains some of the finest trees to be found in the district, notwithstanding a remarkable paucity of species.

At the Wairoa, the outlet by which Rotokakahi empties itself into Lake Tarawera, there is a considerable extent of good land; the European ivy and the jessamine flourish in a degree unknown in the northern parts of the Province. The good quality of the soil is attested by the excellent growth of many cultivated plants, some of which have become more or less naturalized; large quantities of wheat were formerly grown here, but its cultivation has been abandoned of late years, and the mill is fast falling into a state of decay. At several Native settlements about Lake Tarawera, tobacco was growing with as great luxuriance as amongst the boiling springs of Ruapeka Bay, but did not appear to receive equal attention, although even a better yield might be expected, as the soil is decidedly superior. Native cultivations are found at various points of the lake, but, as a rule, land situate on the margin of the forest is preferred by them, and, except in a few favoured localities, is rarely cultivated for more than three consecutive seasons, when it is allowed to lie fallow, and speedily becomes covered with a dense growth of piripiri and koromiko; but a lengthened period must elapse before its nutritive capacity is even partially restored.

Tarawera lake is specially remarkable as being the only *inland* locality where the pohutukawa (*Metrosideros tomentosa*, Cunn.) is found in great abundance and of large dimensions. Some parts of the lake called forcibly to mind the land-locked marine bays of the extreme North. I was informed that the tree occurred at intervals along the entire course of the Matata River, from the lake to the sea; and other maritime plants are also found on the margin of the lake.

The vicinity of Rotomahana appears sterile in the extreme; the low hills are almost devoid of grasses, and the scrub presents an extremely depauperated appearance.

Approaching the Paeora Range by the Waihorepa Approaching the Paeora Range by the Waihorepa Valley, the general quality of the land becomes much poorer, until the Waikato Valley is reached: the only exceptions are the wooded slopes of the hills and the margin of swamps. The prevailing grass is *Poa australis* var. *lævis*, but *Microlana stipoides* and *Sporobolus elongatus* are far from uncommon, and are evidently spreading; isolated patches of white and red clovers are occasionally found, but, with the exception of the Poa, grass is decidedly scarce. The hilly ground is usually of better quality than the plains, even when not clothed with bush.

Between Orakeikorako, on the left bank of the Waikato, and Oruanui, much of the land is of good quality. In one or two localities, the forest is extensive, and consists largely of totara, which often attains unusual dimensions; the miro, matai, and rimu are also abundant, and less frequently the rata (*Metrosideros robusta*, Sin.). After passing Oruanui, there appears a marked deterioration in the character of the soil, and timber becomes extremely scarce. *Zoysia pungens* often occurs in extensive patches, but is so depauperated that its spikes are reduced to a solitary floret. In the valleys the Poa is abundant, its peculiar rigid tufts presenting a singular appear-

ance, almost mimicking in habit the dwarf bushes of Dracophyllum subulatum, Hook., the characteristic plant of the Taupo country. A few small ligneous plants of the ladge country. It low small light due plants, with procumbent stems, occur amongst the tea-tree, and in many places the cotton grass (*Celmisia longifolia*, Cass.) is abundant, and, notwith-standing the innutritious character of the plant, is Toeaten by horses in the absence of better food. wards Tapuehararu, the manuka is occasionally less stunted, although grass is rarely found except in the valleys. Crossing the Waikato at its outlet from Lake Taupo, and proceeding along the eastern shore of the lake, the country for about eight miles exhibits a more uninviting appearance; but at Opepe the summits of the low rounded hills are capped with forest, in which the totara, miro, matai, and rimu are the prevalent forms. The more recent beds of pumice have been removed from the summits of the hills by denudation, which has exposed the older and partially decomposed deposits, thus affording far more favourable conditions for vegetable life than are to be found on the plains. The restricted area of these denuded portions imparts to the scenery the character of an immense park. Numerous ravines on the lower land owe their origin to the same agency, and allow a plentiful growth of Danthonia, with one or two other native grasses, and are occasionally adorned with a luxuriant growth of small shrubs, which are scarcely able to maintain a depauperated existence on

the plains. The occurrence of maritime plants at Rotorua, Lake Tarawera, Orakeikorako, and various parts of Lake Taupo, is of great interest in a geological and phyto-geographical point of view, as affording direct evidence of the submarine origin of the earliest puniceous deposits. Below the surface of the most recent beds, occasionally at a considerable depth, carbonized trunks of trees, often with the branches still attached, occur in abundance in some parts of the district, proving that a lengthened period must have elapsed between the eruption of latest deposits and those next preceding.

With few exceptions, the Native cultivations throughout the district are situate on the margin of forest land, and at the date of my visit (February and March) presented in most places a miserable appearance from the effects of the protracted drought, while they were often swarming with crickets to such an extent that entire patches of potatoes exhibited nothing but bare green stalks without a single leaf, the tubers being scarcely larger than marbles. In some localities, I was informed that fresh ground was broken up yearly, in others every two years; in very few instances was the same patch cultivated for several seasons consecutively. Still, with anything like systematic culture, most of these patches would readily produce a continuous succession of crops.

About the deserted mission stations, excellent grass of old standing is frequently to be found. In the majority of cases this has been sown on ploughed or dug land; but I was informed that good grass had been established in one or two localities, as at Omanui, by simple surface sowing after burning off the tea-tree, native grass, &c., and that it had stood for three years.

At the base of many of the telegraph poles between Opepe and Te Ngae, the dug soil has been thinly sown with grass seed, usually *Solium perenne*, which in the majority of cases appears to flourish, although its permanence may be doubted. It is to be regretted that the common meadow grass (*Poa pratensis*) was not selected for the experiment.

The bottoms of the valleys frequently contain mixed patches of native and introduced grasses and clovers, apparently induced by the favourable nature of the thin layer of surface soil, which is chiefly of vegetable origin, and has been washed from the slopes; these patches are small, and do not appear to spread, although sometimes they exhibit great luxuriance.

At Tapuachararu a large paddock has been laid down in excellent grass by the Armed Constabulary stationed there, and at the date of my visit promised well for permanance, although somewhat overstocked. At Opepe a paddock of about 40 acres has been laid down, chiefly on cleared forest land, with the best results.

The innutritious character of the common indigenous grass of the district, *Poa australis* var. *lævis*, when not mixed with other kinds, was demonstrated by the total failure of the recent attempts to establish sheep stations; yet I have no doubt that a limited amount of surface sowing in favourable situations the season before the sheep were introduced, with yearly additions, would have insured successful results, as the Poa would have been eaten with greater zest, and would have proved more beneficial, if other kinds could have been mixed with it, or rendered accessible at short intervals.

The stations of the Armed Constabulary offer centres from which experiments in grass culture might readily be carried out, and the results recorded. A judicious selection of suitable kinds would allow of much being done towards providing a permanent supply of herbage at a trivial cost. The following kinds appear to be well adapted for the district :---

Cynoden Dactylon, the Doab grass of India, is capable of resisting drought to a greater extent than any other grass yet introduced: during the protracted drought of last season it furnished a large supply of green food when other kinds were dried up. The seed of this plant should not be sown until the spring is sufficiently advanced for the ground to have become warm. A ready method of propagation would be to chop the rhizomes into small pieces, and scatter them. over the surface in rainy weather. The same remarks apply with equal force to the buffalo grass (Stenotaphrum glabrum), which produces an immense yield of succulent and nutritious herbage.

The common meadow grass (*Poa pratensis*) would prove of the greatest value, and speedily form a sward in all but the driest localities; the red sheep's fescue (*Festuca rubra*), seems specially adapted for ravines and gullies.

Prairie grass (Bromus unioloides) would spread with rapidity in the valleys.

A small Australian grass, *Æragrostis Brownii*; which produces a large yield of fine herbage, is spreading fast amongst the tea-tree in various localities north of the Waitemata, and is of sufficient promise to merit an experimental sowing in the district. It would probably flourish in the ravines which intersect the country in all directions.

The indigenous *Poa breviglumis* would prove almost as valuable as the common meadow grass. I have already recorded the occurrence of the native kinds, *Sporobolus elongatus* and *Microlana stipoides*, in many localities in the district; the latter affords good food, the former is coarse and tough. At present they are confined to the vicinity of roads and tracks, but are evidently spreading. *Isachne australis*, an excellent grass, occurs in the swamps, but is not nearly so abundant as in the northern part of the Province. *Glyceria aquatica* would flourish in the swamps,

Glyceria aquatica would flourish in the swamps, and produce a vast supply of herbage. G. fluitans might be easily established in all moist situations, on the margin of lakes, by the sides of streams, &c., &c., and would speedily make an addition to the cattle food of the district.

It is of the greatest importance that no indiscriminate clearing of the limited extent of forest land in the district should be permitted. Not only would this prove injurious to the district itself, but the

injury would extend to the lower portion of the Waikato Valley, and exhibit its effects in disastrous floods. These results should be steadily borne in mind, as settlers will always be tempted to avail themselves of the superior quality of the timbered land for cultivation. The partial thinnings necessary to procure a supply of telegraph posts have already caused the destruction of much valuable timber, from the fact that wherever a gap is made in the forest, the adjacent trees are unable to resist the force of a violent storm, unless in a well-sheltered position. A striking instance of this occurred during my stay in the district, when, in a single night, fine trees were blown down in the forest at Opepe to such an extent that it was almost impossible to force one's way through.

Although most of the land is at present in the hands of Natives, it would be good policy to hold out inducements for the formation of forest plantations, as there can be no doubt that a larger extent of timbered land in the district would have a favourable effect on its climate, and consequently upon its agricultural capabilities at large.
