Colliery Reserve at Westport no longer Crown Lands.

(L.S.) G. F. Bowen, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1868," it is provided that all such Crown lands as have been declared Public Reserves, or set apart or applied for or to any public use or purpose, situate within the Nelson South-West Gold Fields, shall be deemed to have formed part of the Crown lands within the said Gold Fields from the first proclamation of Gold Fields, known as the Nelson South-West Gold Fields, under "The Gold Fields Act, 1862," and "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," respectively, and to have been open for occupation for mining purposes, and for residence and business under miners' rights, mining leases, and business licenses, as the case may be, and to continue to form part of such Crown lands, and to be open for such occupation as aforesaid: Provided that the Governor may at any time, and from time to time, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, declare that the same or any part thereof shall cease to form part of such Crown lands, and thereupon such land or such part thereof shall cease to be deemed to be Crown lands open for such occupation as aforesaid: And whereas the piece or parcel of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto was, on or about the fifteenth day of June, 1863, declared to be a Public Parcent for the second 1863, declared to be a Public Reserve for the purposes of a Public Quay and Colliery Depôt: And whereas it is expedient that a Proclamation should be made in manner and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby declare that the said parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the thirteenth day of December instant, cease to form part of such Crown lands as aforesaid.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order

Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Dunedin, this twenty-sixth day of December, in the year of Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867," it is enacted, that if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful

that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit: And whereas by virtue of a Crown grant bearing date the twenty-second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the parcel of land and hereditaments described in the Schedule hereto became vested in Karaitiana Takamoana, Te Hapuku, Karauria Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Ropata Te Hoakakari, Tupurupura, Paora Nonoi, and Ihaka Kapo, of the District of Napier, in the Province of Hawke's Bay, aboriginal natives of New Zealand: And whereas Karauria Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, one of the persons named in the said Crown grant, died intestate: And whereas at a Native Lands Court held at Napier, in the Province aforesaid, on the nineteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, Arini, a minor, claimed to succeed to the interest of the said Karauria Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, in the said parcel of land described in the said Schedule, and it was ordered by the said Court that the said Arini Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, and Te Roera Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Iraia Hekara Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Te Riu Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Turanga Te Matenga Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Repeka Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, and Pane Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi should succeed to the hereditaments aforesaid: And it is expedient that Edward Lyndon and Tareha Moananui be appointed trustees under the said Act on behalf of the said Arini Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Te Roera Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Iraia Hekara Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Te Riu Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Turanga Te Matenga Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Repeka Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, and Pane Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, during their minority

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby order that the estate or interest of the said Karauria Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi in the said land described in the said Schedule shall be and remain vested in the said Edward Lyndon, merchant, and Tareha Moananui, an aboriginal native of New Zealand, of Napier, in the District of Napier, Province of Hawke's Bay, as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, for the said Arini Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Te Roera Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Iraia Hekara Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Te Riu Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Turanga Te Matenga Tamaiwhakakitea Te Rangi, Repeka Tamai whakakitea Te Rangi, and Pane Tamaiwhakakitea Te

Rangi, during their minority.

Special Settlements in Westland.

#### G. F. Bowen, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this eighteenth day of December, 1872.

#### Present:

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

THEREAS by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," provision is made for the formation of special settlements within the County of Westland, in the unoccupied parts thereof, for colonization, in order to advance the development and prosperity of the said County: And whereas by the seventy-eighth section of the said Act, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon a resolution passed by an absolute majority of the County Council, from time to time to declare, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, that certain blocks of land within the said County, south of the Mikonui River, as prescribed in such Proclamation, are set apart and reserved to establish settlements for colonization upon the terms in the said section specified: And whereas a resolution of the County Council was passed by an absolute majority of such Council on the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, to the effect that the block of land, as recommended by the Report of the Committee on Southern Settlements, be set apart and reserved for the purpose of establishing a special settlement under Part II. of "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870:" And whereas another resolution of the said Council was passed by an absolute majority of such Council on the sixteenth day of August, 1871, to the effect "That in the opinion of this Council it is desirable that Blocks Nos. 2 and 3, south of the Mikonui, be set apart under section seventy-eight, 'Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870,' as special settlements in the County of Westland:" And whereas the blocks of land described in the Schedule hereto are the blocks of land referred to in the said resolution, and it is expedient that the said resolutions should be given effect to:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said in part recited Act, in accordance with the terms of the said resolutions, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby proclaim that the blocks of land described in the Schedule hereto are set apart and reserved to establish settlements for colonization upon the terms

in the said seventy-eighth section mentioned.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### BLOCK I.

Comprising fifty thousand (50,000) acres, and extending from the Haast River to a point two (2) miles south of the Arawata River; bounded on the East by a line three and a quarter  $(3\frac{1}{4})$  miles distant, and generally parallel to the coast; on the South by Smoothwater Bay River.

#### BLOCK II.

Comprising twenty thousand (20,000) acres: bounded on the North-west by the sea coast; on the North-east by the Mikonui River; on the South-east by a line two (2) miles from, and generally parallel to, sea coast; and on the South-west by the Wanganui River. Exclusive of reserves and goldworkings.

BLOCK III. Comprising fifty thousand (50,000) acres; commencing at the mouth of the Saltwater River, following a line due south for seventeen (17) miles; thence due west to the Mapouriki Lake; thence along the banks of the Mapouriki Lake, and along the Okarito River to peg 27 of Okarito River traverse; thence following a line generally parallel to the sea coast to the north of the Saltwater River. Exclusive of reserves and gold-workings.

Regulations under "Public Trust Office Act, 1872."

# G. F. Bowen, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twentieth day of December, 1872.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," if is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council make, and from time to time revoke or alter, regulations for the conduct of the business in the Public Trust Office, and for determining the duties of the officers and servants employed therein, and for the custody of the property placed therein, and for fixing scales of charges upon such property, for the cost of managing the same, and for the receipt and payment of moneys belonging to or accruing from such property, and for keeping, rendering, and auditing accounts of such moneys, and for directing in what bank the same shall be kept, and for determining what part of, and in what securities, such moneys shall be invested, and for the safe custody of such securities: Provided that no such regulation shall be repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Act; and also that all moneys being part of, or accruing out of, property placed in the Office of Public Trust, and all moneys received by the Public Trustee or any other person on account of the said office, shall be paid, on the same day on which the same is received, into such bank as the Governor in Council directs: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of all power and authority enabling him in this behalf, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby make the regulations and directions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

Where used in these Regulations, the terms following shall have the meaning hereby attached to them:—

"The Act" means "The Public Trust Office

Act, 1872."
"The Board" means the Board mentioned in the 18th section of the Act.

the 18th section of the Act.
"The Office" means the Public Trust Office within the meaning of the Act.

within the meaning of the Act.

The Public Trustee" means the Public Trustee
for the time being appointed under the said
Act.

"Trust property" means any property as defined by the Act placed in the Office.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Office shall be at the Government Buildings, Molesworth Street, Wellington.

2. Such Office shall be kept open from the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily, except Sundays and Saturdays, and on Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

3. As to the mode of keeping the accounts of the Office and the conduct of the business of the Office, the Public Trustee shall (except so far as the matter is regulated by the Act) comply with such directions as he shall receive from the Board.

4. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business on Tuesday in each week, at 11 o'clock a.m., at the Office, and at such other days and times as the Board shall be called together by the Public Trustee.

5. The Board may from time to time make such rules as it may think fit for the conduct of business by the Board, and for appointing the person to preside at its meeting.

6. The Seal of the Office referred to in the Act shall be circular, of the diameter of two inches, having the Boyal Arms in the centre, and around the same the words "Public Trust Office, New Zealand," in Roman letters of one-eighth of an inch in length.

7. When any person, company, or other body desires that the execution of any trust created or to be created by deed or will shall be undertaken by the Public Trustee, such person, company, or other body shall make application to the Public Trustee in the form provided by the Office. The particulars of the proposed trust must be transmitted with the application, and the applicant may at the same time transmit the several deeds or documents relating to the trust property. No trust can be accepted in which any other person is joined with the Public Trustee. Forms of application, to be approved of by the Board, shall be provided by the Public Trustee and be obtainable at the Public Trust Office, or at any Money Order Office within the Colony.

8. When any will is received for safe custody it shall be distinguished by a number and recorded in the books of the Office, and during the life of the testator such will shall be deliverable up to him only, or to an agent who, to the satisfaction of the Public Trustee, is duly authorized to receive it. After the death of the testator the will shall be delivered up to the person named therein as executor or executrix, unless the same be indorsed as delivered for acceptance or rejection in accordance with section 20 of the said Act.

9. The Public Trustee, under direction of the Board, may employ such local agents as may be required for the management of the several estates placed in the Public Trust Office.

10. A list of all deeds or other instruments relating to property placed in the Public Trust Office, and of all securities on which any moneys, being portions or the produce of such property, shall be entered in a book to be kept in the Office of the Public Trustee for the purpose, and such list shall be compared with the instruments and securities described therein by the Commissioners of Audit once in each quarter of a year, on a day to be fixed by the Commissioners of Audit, and at such other times as the Commissioners of Audit may think fit.

11. The bank in which the Public Account is kept shall be the bank in which "The Public Trustee's Account" shall be kept.

12. All deeds, wills, securities, and other documents connected with property placed in the Public Trust Office shall be kept in a fireproof safe in the Public Trust Office, which safe shall be secured by three locks, the keys of such locks to be held—one by the Colonial Treasurer, or Minister acting for the Colonial Treasurer, one by the Commissioners of Audit, and one by the Public Trustee.

13. All moneys received by local agents on account of properties placed in the Public Trust Office shall be paid to the nearest branch of the bank, to the

credit of "The Public Trustee's Account" in Wellington

14. All payments out of "The Public Trustee's Account" shall be made by cheques payable at that branch of the bank which may be nearest to the residence of the payee.

15. The fees following shall be payable or retainable, as the case may require, in respect of business done with the office, or property placed therein.

Property to be dealt with by Public Trustee.

Public Trust Office,

Wellington, 30th December, 1872. N pursuance of the powers given by the seventeenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first sections of "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," any person, company, association, or public body, within or without the Colony of New Zealand, may place any property belonging to them in charge of the Public Trustee, upon trust, for such uses as may be defined in the deed creating the uses as may be defined in the deed creating the trust.

Also, that any Building, Land, or Friendly Society may by its rules provide that property belonging to it may be placed in the Public Trust Office, for such trusts and uses, and with such powers as may be defined in or by the said rules.

Also, that any person may, by will, place his property in the Public Trust Office, or may deposit

his will therein for safe custody only.

Applications to place property in the Public Trust Office will now be received. Such applications must be made on a form prepared for that purpose, which can be obtained at the Public Trust Office in Wellington, or at any Money Order Post Office within the Colony. The application must describe the nature of the trust intended to be created; but deeds and other documents relating to the property need not be sent until the acceptance of the trust

has been considered by the Board.

Local agents will be appointed to manage the legal and other business connected with estates, the preference being given (subject to the approval of the Public Trustee) to Solicitors or Agents who have previously had the management of the property, or who are nominated by the person placing the property in the office, or the parties principally interested therein.
