 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," provision is made for constituting, by Proclamation, boroughs in districts not comprised within the limits of any of the cities, towns, or places therein particularly mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to constitute the Town of Westport a borough in manner hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Alfred Arney, the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby constitute and proclaim the district comprised within

THE TOWN OF WESTPORT,
 as the boundaries thereof are defined in the Schedule hereto, to be a Borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," aforesaid.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.
