Winton and Invercargill Districts under "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute a district for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Invercargill District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said district, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such district:

Now therefore I, Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the Invercargill District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such district shall be and is hereby divided, for the

purposes of the said Act, into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

WINTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura River from its source to the north boundary of Run 329; thence by a line due west to the Oreti River; thence by said river and the east boundary of Run 146, the Oripiri Stream, and the east boundary of the Winton Hundred; on the South by the south boundaries of the Winton and Oreti Hundreds to the Waimatuku River; thence by said river to its source; thence by a right line north-west to cut the Aparima; on the West by the Aparima to its junction with the Hamilton Burn; thence by a right line north to the Oreti; thence by the Oreti to its junction with the Windley River; and on the North-west by the north-west boundary of the late Province of Southland.

INVERCARGILL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura; on the South by the Campbelltown District and the ocean; on the West by the Waimatuku River to the southwest corner of the Oreti Hundred; and on the North and West by the Winton District, before described.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Winton and Invercargill Districts under "The Registration Act, 1858."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Registration Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to

time he may think requisite:
And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute a district for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Invercargill District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said district, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such district:

Now therefore I, Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the Invercargill District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such district shall be and is hereby divided, for the purposes of the said Act, into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

WINTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura River from its source to the north boundary of Run 329; thence by a line due west to the Oreti River; thence by said river and the east boundary of Run 146, the Oripiri Stream, and the east boundary of the Winton Hundred; on the South by the south boundaries of the Winton and Oreti Hundreds to the Waimatuku River; thence by said river to its source; thence by a right line north-west to cut the Aparima; on the West by the Aparima to its junction with the Hamilton Burn; thence by a right line north to the Oreti; thence by the Oreti to its junction with the Windley River; and on the North-west by the north-west boundary of the late Province of South-

INVERCARGILL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura; on the South by the Campbelltown District and the ocean; on the West by the Waimatuku River to the south-west corner of the Oreti Hundred; and on the North and West by the Winton District, before described.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-

WHEREAS by the thirty-second section of "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is enacted that the sites of towns shall from time to time be determined by the Governor upon the recommendation of the County Council, and shall be notified by Proclamation in the County of Westland Gazette: And whereas the said County Council has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be a site for a town, within the meaning of the said section of the Act:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby determine and fix the land described in the Schedule hereto to be a site for a town, within the meaning of the thirty-second section of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

GREENSTONE.

SITUATED in the Grey District, opposite the old Greenstone Township, containing eleven (11) acres, more or less, and bounded on the North-east by a line bearing 155° 36′ magnetic through road traverse peg No. 42; on the South-east and South by lines 270 links distant and parallel to road traverse lines 4241 and 4140; on the South-east by a line 275 links east of road traverse peg No. 40, and bearing 172° 2' magnetic; and on the North and North-west by the Hohonu River.

Limits and Description of Railway from a point on the South Bank of the Grey River, opposite the Brunner Coal Mine, to Greymouth, in the County of Westland, being a portion of the Line from Brunner to Greymouth.

> G. A. ARNEY, (L.S.) Officer Administering the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is enacted that the rail-George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Officer Administering the Government in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New only such railways as shall from time to time be

determined by the General Assembly: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions contained therein, the Governor may construct, or cause to be constructed, any lines of railway which shall be prescribed by the General Assembly as railways to be constructed under the said Act, or any part or parts thereof, and acquire the necessary engines, plant, and machinery for working and using the same, or any of them: And it is also thereby enacted that, whenever the Governor shall determine to construct any such railway, or any part thereof, it shall be lawful for him, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, to declare and define the limits and description and line thereof, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of such railway, subject to the provisions of any Act defining such limits and descriptions, and any such Proclamation may refer to maps, plans, or drawings to be deposited in the office of the Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court in the Province in which such railway or part thereof is proposed to be constructed, and any maps, plans, or drawings so referred to shall be deemed to form part of such Proclamation; and upon the pub-lication of such Proclamation, the provisions and regulations contained in the Seventh Part of the said Act shall be applicable to the railway, and to the lands to which the Proclamation shall relate: And it is also thereby enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to make, construct, and maintain any such railway as aforesaid, with proper works, approaches, and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at the place delineated on, and extending along the lines set forth in, and terminating at a point described in the Act or Proclamation proclaiming and defining such railway, or shown in the maps, plans, or drawings referred to in such Act or Proclamation: And it is also thereby enacted that the Governor may direct that any part of such line of railway may be constructed on and along any part of any public highway, and that any part of any such line of railway may be constructed on or through any public reserves: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Part of the said Act and of the Acts incorporated therewith, the Governor may exercise all or any of the powers by that Part of the said Act or the said incorporated Acts conferred upon him for the construction of any such railway, and may enter upon, and cause to be entered upon, all lands within the Colony for the purpose of making such surveys as may be necessary, and may take and hold all the lands required for the railway along the line set forth and described as aforesaid, or within the limits of deviation described in the Proclamation relating thereto, and may temporarily occupy and use such lands as may be necessary on either side of the railway, during the construction thereof:

And whereas by "The Railways Act, 1871," and "The Railways Act, 1872," it is enacted that the Governor may, under the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly recited Act and of the now reciting Acts, construct and maintain, or cause to be constructed and maintained, the several lines of railway specified therein: And it is also thereby enacted that the line of the railways thereby authorized to be constructed shall be fixed by the Governor, and shall commence and terminate at points to be fixed by the Governor: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is enacted that as to any railway which the Governor has been authorized to construct, and to fix the commencing and termina-tion points and line thereof, it shall be competent for him, if he thinks fit, instead of fixing and proclaiming

portion or portions, and the limits and description of any such portion or portions, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of any such portion or portions, and to construct any portion or portions so fixed, and to take the lands for the same; and any such portion so proclaimed shall be deemed to be a railway within the meaning of the said Act and the said amending Act and this Act:

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Act it is also enacted that, at any time after the expiration of twenty-one days from the publication in the New Zealand Gazette, and in a newspaper ordinarily circulating in the district, of a Proclamation under the thirteenth section of the said Act, whether of the whole or a portion or portions of a line of railway, the Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty, may enter upon, take possession of, use and hold, or cause to be entered upon, taken possession of, used and held, so much of the lands defined in such Proclamation as proposed to be taken as shall be required to be taken, purchased, or permanently used for the purposes of such railway, notwithstanding that an agreement shall not have been come to or an award made for the purchase or compensation money to be paid in respect of such lands:

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Act it is also enacted that in any case in which a road or right of road has been or hereafter may be reserved in any Crown grant, and in any case in which, under "The Native Lands Act, 1865," or any law for the time being in force relating to the sale of waste lands of the Crown, or any law whatever, there is a right to take a public road through any lands, it shall be lawful, after such road shall have been surveyed, to construct under the said Acts any railway or any part of any railway, on the road so surveyed, notwithstanding that such road may not have been made:

And whereas the Governor has determined to construct and maintain a railway from a point on the south bank of the Grey River, opposite the Brunner Coal Mine, to Greymouth, being a portion of the railway authorized to be constructed from Brunner to Greymouth by "The Railways Act,

And whereas Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, hath departed thence for the Colony of New South Wales, and Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Chief Justice of the said Colony, under or by virtue of a certain warrant under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, is now the person lawfully administering the Government of the said Colony:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and in exercise of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and define the limits, description, and line of the said railway from a point on the south bank of the Grey River, opposite to the Brunner Coal Mine, to Greymouth, to be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and that the lands specified and described in the Second Schedule hereto are proposed to be taken for the purposes of the said railway; and that the limits of deviation shall be those set forth in the said First Schedule hereto; and in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities conferred on me in that behalf, I do hereby fix the point of commencement of the said railway, being a portion of the said railway from Brunner to Greymouth, to be at a point on the south bank of the Grey River, opposite the Brunner Coal Mine, and the point of such points and the whole line at one time, to fix and proclaim portions of such line from time to time, and the mination points of any such with Werita Street, Greymouth.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Limits, Description, Line, and Limits of Deviation of a portion of the Railway from Brunner to Grey-mouth, being that portion lying between a point on the South Bank of the Grey River, opposite the Brunner Coal Mine, to Greymouth, in the County of Westland.

Commencing at a point on Mawhera Quay, Greymouth; thence through Native Reserve No. 31; thence through Reserve No. 4 (in red) and Rural Block I., Grey District; thence through Native Reserve No. 33; thence through Coal Reserve No. 274 (in red) as the limits, description, and line thereof are set forth on the plan and described in the book of reference referred to on the face of the said plan, and which plan and book are authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable William Hunter Reynolds, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Hokitika, or within the limits of deviation set forth in the said plan by dotted red lines, being not more than one hundred and ten yards on either side of the said line, and passing through or over the several sections of Crown and other lands, sections, reserves, roads, watercourses, rivers, and beaches, as enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto.

SECOND SCHEDULE. OR BOOK OF REFERENCE.

Lands and Roads proposed to be taken for the purposes of the Railway from a point on the South Bank of the Grey River, opposite the Brunner Coal Mine, to Greymouth.

So much of the lands and roads hereinafter mentioned as are required for the said railway along the line of the said railway hereinbefore defined, or within the limits of deviation aforesaid, as the lands are described and defined in the plan or book of reference aforesaid.

SCHEDULE. 1. The lands intended to be affected by these Regulations are those described in the Fourth and 2. Out of the said lands the Minister for Public Works for the time being may select and set apart such portions thereof as he may deem necessary, as reserves for purposes of public utility or convenience: Provided that the area and situation of every such intended reserve, together with a statement of the purpose for which it is intended to be used, shall be transmitted by the said Minister to the Governor for his approval, and without such approval no such reserve shall be made.

3. Upon the approval of the Governor being signified to the said Minister, he shall cause a notification of the fact of such reserve having been made, stating therein the purposes for which it is intended to be used, and that the Governor has approved thereof, to be published in the New Zealand Gazette; and thereupon such reserve shall be and be deemed so effectually made for the purposes in such notification mentioned.

THE following Regulations of the New Zealand Tuniversity, approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Council, are applied of for appeal in the Council, and the Council, and the Council of are published for general information.

1. There shall be a yearly prize, to be called the Bowen Prize (of the value of not less than five pounds (£5) to be given for the best Essay, as hereinafter provided. The prize, if a medal, shall be impressed with the arms of the University, and with the words "Bowen Prize" on the obverse side of the medal; and if of books, each volume shall be impressed with the arms of the University.

2. The prize shall be open to all matriculated the University who shall not have taken

students of the University who shall not have taken

their degree.

3. The Examiners shall be the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, and one other person to be appointed by

the Council of the University in each year.

4.
