Vaccination Districts Constituted.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act, 1872," it is, among other things, provided that the Governor may from time to time divide New Zealand, or such part thereof as he shall think fit, into convenient districts for affording increased facilities for vaccination, and from time to time to alter the boundaries of any such districts heretofore formed or hereafter to be formed: And whereas it is expedient that the districts hereinafter mentioned should be constituted under the said Act:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Alfred Arney, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me under the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby constitute the several portions of the said Colony which are described in the Schedule hereto, to be districts under the said Act, for affording increased facilities for vaccination; and I do hereby also declare that each such district shall be called and known by the name set forth at the beginning of the description thereof in the said Schedule.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued at Wellington, this eighth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

1. MONGONUI DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North, East, and West by the sea; on the South by a line drawn through the centre of the harbour of Wangape to the mid channel of

River Motukakahai to its source, thence by a straight line to the summit of the mountain Maungataniwha, and thence by a straight line to the south extremity of the southernmost of the Cavallo Islands, including the group of islands known as the "Three Kings," and all the islands on the East Coast as far south as the southernmost of the Cavallo Islands.

2. BAY OF ISLANDS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line drawn from the summit of Maungataniwha to the south extremity of the southernmost of the Cavallo Islands; on the East by the sea; on the South-west by a line drawn from the summit of Maungataniwha to the south-western extremity of Omapere Lake; thence to Ruapekapeka; thence to the source of the Ngunguru River; thence down the mid channel of the Ngunguru to the sea, including all the islands situated on the coast between the south extremity of the southernmost of the Cavallo group and the north of the Ngunguru River.

3. HOKIANGA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line drawn through the centre of the harbour Wangape to the mid channel of the River Motukakahai to its source, thence by a straight line to the summit of the mountain Maungataniwha; on the East by a straight line from the summit of Maungataniwha to the south-western extremity of Omapere Lake, and thence to Ruapekapeka; on the South and the South-east by a straight line from Ruapekapeka to the summit of Tutamoi Range, thence by a straight line to Mangonui Bluff on the West Coast; on the West by the sea.

4. TOKATOKA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by a straight line from Manganui Bluff, on the West Coast, to the summit of Tutamoi Range; towards the West by a straight line running in a northerly direction from the summit of Tutamoi Range aforesaid to the point of its intersection with the southern boundary of the Hokianga County; towards the North-east by a straight line in a south-easterly direction from the point of intersection last named to the confluence of

the Mangakahia and Wairua Rivers; thence in a straight line to the north-western angle of the Maungakaramea Block; thence following the western and part of the southern boundaries of the Maungakaramea Block aforesaid to the Tauraroa River; thence south-westerly by the Tauraroa River aforesaid to its confluence with the Manganui River at the north-eastern boundary of the Okahu Block; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of the Okahu and Omaru Blocks to the Matakoho Block; towards the South-east by the north-western boundary of the Matakoho Block aforesaid and the Awaroa Creek, and by said creek to the Wairoa River; thence by the Wairoa River aforesaid and Kaipara Entrance to the North Head of Kaipara Harbour; and towards the South-west by the sea from the North Head of Kaipara Harbour aforesaid to the Manganui Bluff first mentioned, the place of commencement.

5. WANGAREI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the southern boundaries of the Kawakawa and Ruapekapeka Blocks from the north-eastern angle of the Hokianga District to the south-eastern angle of the Ruapekapeka Block aforesaid; thence by a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the source of the Ngunuru River, and by the channel of that river to the sea; towards the East by the sea from Ngunuru River aforesaid to the Pataua River; towards the South-west by the Pataua River aforesaid, and a straight line in a southerly direction to the southern boundary of the Tamaterau Block, and thence by the southern boundary of the Tamaterau Block aforesaid to the Wangarei Harbour; thence by Wangarei Harbour aforesaid to the Mangapai River, and by said river to the south-eastern boundary of the Maungatapere Block; thence by the southern boundary of the Maungatapere Block last named to the Waionepu River, and thence in a straight line to the confluence of the Wairua and Mangakahia Rivers; towards the South-west by a straight line from the confluence of the rivers last named in a north-westerly direction to the point of its intersection with the southern boundary of the County of Hokianga; and towards the West by part of the eastern boundary of the Hokianga District to the Kawakawa Block first mentioned, the place of commencement; including Limestone Island.

6. MANAIA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern boundary of Tamaterau Block, and a line to the Pataua River, by that river to the sea; on the East by the sea to Bream Head; on the South by Bream Bay to Busby Head; on the West by Wangarei Harbour to the southern boundary of Tamaterau Block.

7. MANGAPAI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the southern boundary of the Maungatapere Block from the Waionepu River to the Mangapai River; towards the East by the Mangapai River aforesaid, and the waters of the Wangarei Harbour to the eastern boundary of the Mahe Block; thence by the eastern boundary of said last-named block, and the eastern and part of the western boundaries of the Mangapai and Waipu Blocks to the northernmost angle of the Piroa Block; towards the South by the southern boundary of the Mareretu Block, and the northern boundaries of the Omaru and Okahu Blocks to the Tauraroa River; and towards the West by the Tauraroa River aforesaid, to the southern boundary of the Maungakaramea Block; thence by the southern and western boundaries of said last-named block, to the southern

boundary of the Maungatapere Block, the place of commencement.

8. WAIPU DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by Wangarei Harbour from eastern boundary of Mahe Block to South Head of Wangarei Harbour aforesaid; towards the East by the sea from South Head of Wangarei Harbour aforesaid to Cape Bream Tail; towards the South-east by the south-eastern boundary of the Waipu Block; and towards the West by the western boundary of the Waipu Block aforesaid, and the eastern boundaries of the Mangapai and Mahe Blocks to Wangarei Harbour, the place of commencement.

9. PAPAROA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the southern boundary of the Mareretu Block from the north-eastern boundary of the Omaru Block to the western boundary of the Waipu Block; towards the East by the western boundary of the Waipu Block aforesaid, and the northern and western boundaries of the land known as Wright's Claim to the Wairau River, and by the said river to the Otamatea River; towards the South-east by the Otamatea River aforesaid, from the Wairau River before named to the Wairoa River; towards the South-west by the Wairoa River aforesaid from the Otamatea River before mentioned to the north-western boundary of the Matakoho Block; and towards the North-west by the north-western boundary of the Matakoho Block aforesaid to the southern boundary of the Mareretu Block, the place of commencement.

10. MANGAWAI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the northern boundary of the land known as Wright's Claim, the northern and part of the north-western boundaries of the Pukekarora Block, to the southern boundary of the Waipu Block, and thence by said southern boundary of Waipu Block aforesaid to Cape Bream Tail, on the East Coast; towards the East by the sea from Cape Bream Tail aforesaid to the south-eastern boundary of the Arai Block; towards the South-east by the south-eastern boundary of the Arai Block aforesaid from the sea to the western boundary of the Oruawharo Block; thence northerly by said boundary to the south-eastern angle of Allotment No. 93 of the Parish of Oruawharo; and towards the West by the southern boundary of the lot last named and Te Hana River to the Oruawharo River; thence by said river and the southern and western boundaries of the Te Ikaranganui Block to the Kaiwaka River; thence by the Kaiwaka and Wairau Rivers and by the western boundary of Wright's Claim to the northern boundary of said last-named claim, the place of commencement.

11. ALBERTLAND DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the Kaiwaka River, from its confluence with the Otamatea River to the western boundary of the Te Ikaranganui Block; thence by the western and southern boundaries of said block to the Topuni or Oruawharo River; thence by said river and by the Te Hana River to the southern boundary of Allotment No. 93 of the Parish of Oruawharo; thence by the southern boundary of said last-named lot, by part of the eastern boundary of the Oruawharo Block, and by part of the southern boundary of the Arai Block, to the Huipapa Road; thence by the centre of said road to the Tauhoa or Hoteo River; towards the East and South-east by the Tauhoa or Hoteo River aforesaid, to the Kaipara Harbour; towards the South

and West by the Kaipara Harbour aforesaid to the Otamatea River; and towards the North-west by the river last-named to the Kaiwaka River, the place of commencement.

12. MATAKANA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the sea from the south-eastern boundary of the Arai Block to Point Tawaranui; towards the South-east by the sea aforesaid and the Matakana River, from Point Tawaranui before mentioned to the boundary line dividing the Parishes of Mahurangi and Matakana; towards the South-west by the boundary last named, and by part of the north-western boundary of the Matakana Block, to the dividing boundary between the Parishes of Hoteo and Pakiri; thence by said last-named boundary and the Kaiwhiu River to the Huipapa Road, and by the centre of said road to the south-eastern boundary of the Arai Block; and towards the North-west by the south-eastern boundary of the Arai Block aforesaid to the sea, the place of commencement.

13. MAHURANGI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the centre of the Huipapa Road, from the south-eastern boundary of the Arai Block to the Kaiwhiu River; thence by said river and the dividing boundary between the Parishes of Hoteo and Pakiri to the north-eastern boundary of the Matakana Block; thence South-westerly by said boundary to the dividing boundary between the Parishes of Mahurangi and Matakana, and by said boundary to the Matakana River; towards the East by the Matakana River aforesaid and the sea to the North Head of Mahurangi Harbour; towards the South by the Mahurangi Harbour aforesaid, the Pukapuka River, and the southern boundaries of the Parishes of Mahurangi, Ahuroa, and Komokoriki to the Makarau Creek; thence by said creek and the Te Papa Creek to the Kaipara River; towards the West by the Kaipara River aforesaid; from the Te Papa Creek aforesaid to the Hoteo River; and towards the North-west by the Hoteo River aforesaid to the Huipapa Road, the place of commencement; including the Islands of Kawau, Motukeke, and adjacent islands.

14. HELENSVILLE DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Te Papa Creek and the Makarau River from the Kaipara Harbour to the western boundary of the Parish of Makarau; thence by the western and northern boundaries of said parish to the north-western angle of the Parish of Puhoi; towards the East by the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Makarau and Kaukapakapa, from the north-western angle of the Parish of Puhoi aforesaid to the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 306, of the Parish of Pukeatua; thence by north-eastern boundary of said Lot No. 306 to the road which forms part of its southern boundary; thence southerly by the centre of said road to the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 34 of the Parish of Pukeatua aforesaid; thence by the north-eastern boundary of the lot last named, and by the north-eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 33, 32, 31, and 30, all of the parish aforesaid, to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of the lot last named; thence crossing said road to the north-eastern boundary of the south-western portion of Allotment No. 39; thence by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of said lot, and by the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 38 to the road which forms its southern boundary; thence crossing said road to the south-western boundary of

Allotment No. 37; thence by said boundary to the southern boundary of the Pukeatua Block; thence easterly and southerly by said last-named boundary, and by the eastern boundary of the Parish of Ararimu, and a right line thence to the north-western boundary of the Taupaki Block; towards the South by the Taupaki Block aforesaid to the West Coast; towards the West, by the West Coast aforesaid from north-western boundary of the Taupaki Block aforesaid to the South Head of the Kaipara Harbour; again on the West, by the Kaipara entrance; and again on the East and West, by the waters of the Kaipara Harbour aforesaid to Te Papa Creek, the place of commencement.

15. WAIWERA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the northern boundary of the Parish of Puhoi from the north-eastern angle of the Parish of Makarau to the Pukapuka River; towards the East by the Pukapuka River aforesaid, Mahurangi Harbour, and high watermark of the sea (including the Whangaparoa Peninsula) from the northern boundary of the Puhoi Block aforesaid to the Okura River; towards the South by the Okura River aforesaid and part of the southern boundary of the land known as Dacre's Claim, to the eastern boundary of the Pukeatua Block, thence by the said eastern boundary and by the southern boundary of the same block to the south-western angle of Allotment No. 37 of the Parish of Pukeatua, thence by the western boundary of said Allotment No. 37 to the road at its north-western angle, and crossingsaid road to the western boundary of Allotment No. 41, and continuing along said western boundary to the dividing line between the north-eastern and south-western portions of Allotment No. 39, thence following said dividing line to the road which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 39 last named, thence crossing said road and following the north-eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 30, 31, 32, 33, and 34, all of the Parish of Pukeatua aforesaid, to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 306 of said Parish of Pukeatua, thence continuing along the centre of said road to the south-western angle of Allotment No. 308, thence following the western boundary of Allotment No. 308 to its north-western angle, thence following the southern and part of the eastern boundaries of Allotment No. 306 of the Parish of Pukeatua aforesaid to the Kaukapakapa River; and towards the West by the Kaukapakapa River aforesaid and the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Kaukapakapa and Makarau to the point of commencement, including the Island of Tiritiri Matangi.

16. AUCKLAND DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the sea from the Okura River to the Wairoa River; towards the East by the Wairoa River aforesaid to Hewlin's Line; towards the South by Hewlin's Line aforesaid to the Papakura Creek, thence by said creek and the waters of the Manukau Harbour to the Manukau entrance; towards the West by the sea from the Manukau entrance aforesaid to the north-western boundary of the Taupaki Block; and towards the North-west by the north-western boundary of block last named, and by a right line thence to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Ararimu; thence by said eastern boundary to the southern boundary of the Pukeatua Block; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of said block to the southern boundary of the land known as Dacre's Claim; thence by the southern boundary of said claim to the Okura River, and by said river to the sea, the place of commencement;

including the Great and Little Barrier Islands, as also the Waiheke, Ponui, and adjacent Islands.

17. COROMANDEL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the South by the Waikawau River and by a straight line running in an easterly direction from its source to the mouth of the Oyster River of Mercury Bay; on the West, North, and East by the sea, including the Great Mercury Island and all the adjacent islands on the coast.

18. SHORTLAND DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Waikawau River from the sea to its source, thence by a straight line extending in an easterly direction to the mouth of the Oyster River of Mercury Bay; on the North-east by Mercury Bay; on the East by the sea; on the South-east by the Wangamata Harbour and by a straight line extending from the South Head of Wangamata Harbour to the summit of Te Aroha, and thence by a straight line to Matamata; on the South by a straight line from Matamata to the junction of the Waitaruru Creek with the Piako River; on the West by the Piako River; and on the North-west by the Frith of the Thames.

19. DEURY DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the waters of the Manukau Harbour from Karaka Creek to Papakura Creek; by the centre of Papakura Creek, by the northern and eastern boundaries of the village of Papakura; by Hewling's line to the Wairoa River, and crossing the Wairoa River by that river to the sea; on the East by the Gulf of the Thames, and by the Piako River to the junction of the Tahumatapu Creek; thence on the South by a straight line to Puketakauri, on the Waikato River; thence across that river in a straight line to the south shore of Wangape Lake; and thence in a straight line running west-south-west to the West Coast; on the West by the sea from the last-mentioned point to Waikato Heads; thence, again on the North, by the Waikato River to the eastern boundary line of Puni Parish, near to Cameron Town; and thence, again on the West, by the boundary of Awitu District, to Karaka Creek, the point of commencement.

20. AWITU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the waters of the Manukau Harbour from Manukau Heads to Karaka Creek; on the East, from the centre of Karaka Creek, by the line dividing Karaka and Waiau Parishes, by an extension of that straight line through Puni to the eastern boundary of Puni Parish, near to Cameron Town, on the Waikato River, and thence by that boundary to the Waikato; on the South by the Waikato River to the West Coast; and on the West by the sea to the Manukau Heads, the point of commencement.

21. RAGLAN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern shore of the Wangape Lake and by a straight line running west-south-west from the western angle of the Wangape Lake to the West Coast; on the West by the sea southward to the Mokau River; on the South by the Mokau River, from the mouth to the source; and on the East by a straight line from the source of the Mokau River to the summit of Pirongia, and by a straight line from the summit of Pirongia to the Wangape Lake, at the point of commencement.

22. ALEXANDRA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line from the southern shore of the Wangape Lake to the Waikato River at Puketakauri, by the Waikato River to Puketa; on the East by a line from Puketa to Kihikihi and a line from Kihikihi to the most western point of the shore of Taupo Lake, thence by the western shore of Taupo Lake and Upper Waikato River to the southern boundary of the Province; on the South by the boundary of the Province; on the West by the western boundary of the Province from the Wanganui River to the source of the Mokau River, thence by a straight line to the summit of Pirongia, and thence by a straight line to the Wangape Lake, at the point of commencement.

23. CAMBRIDGE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a straight line from Puketakauri, on the Waikato River, to the junction of the Tahumatapu Creek with the Piako River; on the East by the Piako River southward to the Waitakururu Creek, thence by a straight line to the junction of the Orakeikorako Stream with the Waikato River, and by the Waikato southward to Taupo Lake; on the South by the northern shore of Taupo Lake; and on the West by a straight line from the most westerly point of the Taupo Lake to Kihikihi, and thence by a straight line to Puketa on the Waikato River, and thence by the Waikato River to Puketakauri, the point of commencement.

24. TAURANGA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the sea from the South Head of Whangamata River to the Whakatane River; towards the East by the Whakatane River aforesaid and the Ohiwa or Waikare River to Lake Waikare-Moana; towards the South-west by the northern margin of Lake Waikare-Moana aforesaid, and by a straight line thence to the confluence of the Orakeikorako Stream with the Upper Waikato River; towards the South-west by a right line from the Orakeikorako Stream aforesaid to the confluence of the Waitakururu Creek with the Piako River; and towards the North-west by a right line from the Waitakururu Creek last named, to the summit of Te Aroha; and from Te Aroha aforesaid by a right line to the South Head of Whangamata River, the place of commencement.

25. OPOTIKI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the West and North-west by high watermark of the sea from the mouth of the Whakatane River to Lottin Point; towards the East by a right line southerly from Lottin Point aforesaid to the Pukemaru Range, thence by the said range to the summit of the Raukumaru Mountain, thence in a straight line to the summit of Maungawaru, thence in a straight line to the summit of Huiarau; towards the South by a straight line bearing due west from the summit of Huiarau aforesaid to the Waikari River; and towards the West by the Waikari and Whakatane Rivers aforesaid to the mouth of the last-mentioned river, the point of commencement.

26. WAIAPU DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and East by high watermark of the sea from Lottin Point to Mawai Point; towards the South by a straight line bearing due west from Mawai Point aforesaid to the eastern boundary of the Opotiki District; and towards the West by the eastern boundary of the Opotiki District before mentioned to Lottin Point, the place of commencement.

27. TURANGA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the southern boundary of the Waipuu District; towards the East by high watermark of the sea from Mawai Point to latitude 38° 57' South; towards the South by a straight line from the point last mentioned to the summit of the Whakapunake Mountain; and towards the West by a straight line from the summit of the Whakapunake Mountain aforesaid, in a north-westerly direction, to the eastern boundary of the Opotiki District, and by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned district to the point of commencement.

PROVINCE OF HAWKE'S BAY.

28. MOHAKA AND WAIROA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by part of the south-western boundary of the Tauranga District, and the southern boundary of the Opotiki District; towards the North-east by the western and southern boundaries of the Turanga District, and by high watermark of the sea to Table Cape; towards the South by high watermark of the sea from Table Cape aforesaid to the Waikare River; thence by said river to its source, and by a right line thence to the north-western angle of the Province of Hawke's Bay; thence by the southern boundary of the Province of Auckland to the Upper Waikato River; and towards the West by the Upper Waikato River aforesaid to the southern margin of Lake Taupo; thence by part of the southern and the whole of the eastern margins of Lake Taupo and the Upper Waikato River aforesaid, to the south-western boundary of the Tauranga District, herein first mentioned.

29. NAPIER DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern boundary of the Mohaka and Wairoa District; on the East along the sea coast to the mouth of the Manauarakau Stream; South following that stream to the southern boundary of the Waimarama Native Block to the Makara Stream, following it to its junction with the Tukituki River, down that river to the south-western boundary of the Te Mata Block, and following the Ngaruroro to its source; and on the West by the Ruahine Ranges.

30. WAIPUKURAU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern boundary of the Napier District; towards the East by the sea coast to the southern boundary of the Hapuku Block; on the South following that line to the Huatokitoki River, thence up that river to its junction with the Turaekaetai Stream, following that stream and the Monga-angaanga to the Purimu Lake, thence by a straight line to the Forty-Mile Bush, along the edge of the bush to the Ruahine Ranges; and on the West by the boundary of the Province.

31. PORANGAHAU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern boundary of the Waipukurau District; East by the sea coast to Waimata; on the South by the southern boundary of the Province; West by the Ruahine Ranges.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

32. CASTLE POINT DISTRICT.

The boundary commences at the mouth of the Waimata River; thence along the sea coast to the

mouth of the Whareama River; thence on a line bearing west to the Taueru River; thence up said river until it intersects a line bearing east and west through Rangitimu Hill; thence along said line to the Ruamahanga River; thence up said river until it crosses the track through the Forty-Mile Bush; thence along said track to the boundary of the Province of Hawke's Bay; thence along said boundary to the starting point.

33. MASTERTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by a portion of the Palmerston North District; on the East by the Castle Point District; on the South by a portion of the Greytown District; and on the West by the Foxton District.

34. GREYTOWN DISTRICT.

The boundary commences at the mouth of the Whareama River; thence along the sea coast to Cape Palliser, and continued to Taourakira Head; thence along the Rimutaka and Tararua Ranges until it intersects a line drawn west from the source of the Waignawa River; thence along said line and along the Waignawa River to its junction with the Ruamahanga River; thence on a line east to the Taueru River; thence along the southern boundary of the Castle Point District to the starting point.

35. WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the River Waikanae, from Cook Strait to the Tararua Ranges; on the South by Cook Strait; on the East by the Rimutaka and Tararua Ranges; on the West by Cook Strait.

36. FOXTON DISTRICT.

The boundary commences at the Gorge of the Manawatu; thence along the Tararua Ranges until it meets a line drawn east from the source of the Waikanae River; thence along said line and down the Waikanae River to the sea coast; thence up the coast to the mouth of the Rangitikei River; thence up said river to "Bull's," Middle Rangitikei; thence by the southern boundary of the Palmerston North District to the starting point.

37. PALMERSTON NORTH DISTRICT.

The boundary commences at the Gorge of the Manawatu; thence down the Manawatu River to the Oroua River; thence up the Oroua River to Awahuri, where the main road line from Rangitikei to Palmerston intersects it; thence along said main road line to the Rangitikei River; thence up the Rangitikei River to Waitapa; thence on a line east to the Tararua Ranges; thence along the said ranges to the starting point.

38. RANGITIKEI DISTRICT.

Commencing at the mouth of the Rangitikei River, and following its course to the boundary of the Rangitikei (Land) District; thence along the northern boundary of the Rangitikei (Land) District, and by a continuation of the line to the Wangaehu River; thence by the Wangaehu River to the sea; and thence along the sea coast to the mouth of the Rangitikei River.

39. WANGANUI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the northern boundary of the Province, from a point where it intersects the confiscated lands in the Patea District, to the Ruahine Ranges; on the South by the

Wangaehu River to a point in continuation of the northern boundary of the Rangitikei (Land) District, thence along that boundary to the Rangitikei River, and thence by a line due east to the Ruahine Ranges; on the East by the Ruahine Ranges; and on the West by Cook Strait, by the Waitotara River, and by the boundary of confiscated lands lying between the Waitotara River and the boundary of the Province.

PROVINCE OF TARANAKI.

40. PATEA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-west by the River Taungatara from the sea to its source, thence by a direct line to the summit of Mount Egmont; on the North-east by the boundary of the confiscated lands to where it strikes the Waitotara River; on the South-east by that river; and on the South-west by the sea to the commencing point.

41. NEW PLYMOUTH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the River Mokau to its source; on the East by a right line running from the source of the River Mokau to the point where the Ngahuinga or Tuhua, the principal tributary of the Wanganui River, is intersected by the thirty-ninth parallel of South latitude, thence by the River Wanganui to the point where it is met by the Taumatamahoe Path leading from the River Waitara, thence by a right line running from the above-described point on the Wanganui River in the direction of the mouth of the River Patea until it intersects the north-east boundary of the confiscated lands; on the South-west by the boundary of confiscated lands from the above-described point of intersection to the summit of Mount Egmont, and by the sea coast from the mouth of the River Taungatara to the mouth of the River Mokau; on the South-east by a line from the summit of Mount Egmont to the source of the River Taungatara, and by the said river to the sea coast; and on the West and North-west by the sea coast, from the mouth of the River Taungatara to the mouth of the River Mokau.

PROVINCE OF MARLBOROUGH.

42. PICTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and East by the coast line from Alligator Head between Guard's and Waitui Bays, to the east end of the range of hills dividing White's Bay from Robin Hood's Bay, including Arapawa Island, and all other islands in Queen Charlotte Sound, Port Underwood, &c.; thence on the South by a right line to a point in the Tua Marina Valley, five miles due north from the mouth of the Tua Marina River; thence along a right line (for about five miles) bearing to a point in the Kaituna Valley seven miles from the Wairau River; thence towards the West by a right line bearing nearly due north to the summit of the range dividing Queen Charlotte and Pelorus Sounds, the said line being a continuation of the dividing line between Sections 34, 35, 36, 37, and 39, 13, 12, 51, on the plan of the District of Matiatipawa; thence by the summit of the last-mentioned range to Alligator Head.

43. WAIRAU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern boundary of Picton District from the range of hills dividing

White's Bay from Robin Hood's Bay to Mount Richmond, thence by a line running northerly to the Red Hills, thence by the eastern boundary of the Nelson District to the Wairau Gorge, thence to the summit of the watershed between the Gorge and Barefell's Pass, thence to the upper gorge of the Clarence, thence in a south-easterly direction to the summit of the Gorge, thence along the range by the summits to Mounts Freya and Thor, thence to the junction of the first branch of the Clarence, thence down the Clarence to its mouth, thence following the sea coast to the aforesaid range of hills dividing White's Bay from Robin Hood's Bay.

44. KAIKOURAS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern boundary of Wairau District from Barefell's Pass to the mouth of the Clarence, thence following the sea coast to the mouth of the River Tutaiputupu or Conway, thence following that river to its source, thence running in a straight line to the confluence of the Rivers Acheron and Clarence, thence by the Acheron to the confluence of the Guide, and by that stream to Barefell's Pass.

45. PELORUS DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the East by the western boundary of the Picton District from Alligator Head to the south-west corner of the same district; thence by a right line to a point in the Kaituna Valley seven miles from the Wairau River; thence up a line to the summit of the range of hills dividing the Pelorus and Wairau Rivers; thence by a line along the said summit to Mount Richmond; thence towards the West and North-west by a right line to the Red Hills; and thence by the north-western boundary of the Province of Marlborough to Tennyson's Inlet.

PROVINCE OF NELSON.

46. MOTUEKA DISTRICT.

Commencing at the south headland of Bark Bay, following a leading spur to Mount Richards; thence along the watershed line between the Motueka, Takaka, and Riwaka Valleys, to the summit of Mount Arthur; thence by the watershed line, which includes all the drainage area of the River Pearse, to the junction of the Rivers Motueka and Dove; thence by the River Dove to the main road leading from the Village of Thorpe to the Moutere; thence along the said road to the Educational Reserve, Section 38, Square III.; thence by a line in the same direction to the road on the ridge between Sections 37 and 38, Square III.; thence along the said road by the Red Hill to the Village of Bronti (and including that village); thence by the sea coast to the south headland of Bark Bay.

47. NELSON DISTRICT.

Commencing at the eastern point of the road by the Red Hill to the Village of Bronti, at that village, and following the southern boundary of the Motueka District to the junction of the Rivers Dove and Motueka; thence Southward by the Motueka River to the division line between Sections 83 and 85, Square VI.; thence along that line and continuation to Stanley Brook; thence along Stanley Brook to the track leading from Wangapeka to Pigeon Valley; thence along the track and road through Pigeon Valley to the River Wai-iti; thence along the River Wai-iti to its junction with the River Wairoa; thence

up the Wairoa to its junction with the River Roding; thence by the River Roding to its junction with the River Lee; thence by the River Lee to a point due north magnetic from the summit of Mount Rintoul; thence to the summit of Mount Rintoul; thence by the boundary line between the Provinces of Nelson and Marlborough to Point Dickens; thence by the sea coast to the Village of Bronti, including all the islands adjacent.

48. WAIMEA SOUTH DISTRICT.

Commencing at the bank of the Motueka River at the section line between Sections 83 and 85, Square VI.; thence along that line and continuation to Stanley Brook; thence along Stanley Brook to the track leading from Wangapeka towards Pigeon Valley; thence along that track, and along the road through Pigeon Valley to the River Wai-iti; thence along the Wai-iti to its junction with the River Wairoa; thence up the Wairoa to its junction with the River Roding; thence up the River Roding to its junction with the River Lee; thence up the River Lee to a point due north from the summit of Mount Rintoul; thence by a line to the summit of Mount Rintoul; thence southward by the boundary of the Province of Marlborough to the Top House; thence by the said boundary line of the Province of Marlborough to the River Acheron; thence by the River Acheron and River Severn to the junction of the Severn and Alma; thence by a spur to the watershed named Alma Heights; thence following the said watershed, to include all the southern and eastern drainage area of the River Wairau and its tributaries to the Spencer Range; thence by the watershed to include all the drainage area of the River Sabine to Lake Rotorua; thence by the western shore of Lake Rotorua to its junction with the River Gowan; thence by the River Gowan to its junction with the River Buller; thence by the watershed between the Rivers Hope and Owen to the line of the watershed between the Buller and its tributaries, and the Motueka and its tributaries; thence westerly and northerly by the said watershed to the summit of Mount Arthur, so as to include all the drainage area of the Motueka River and its tributaries; thence by the southern boundary of the Motueka District to the Motueka River at its junction with the River Dove; thence along the Motueka River to the division line between Sections 83 and 85, Square VI.

49. AMURI DISTRICT.

Commencing at the saddle between the Rivers Hurunui and Teremakau; thence following the south-eastern boundaries of the Cobden and Buller Districts to the south-western boundary of the Waimea South District; thence along the southern boundary of the Waimea South District to the point on the River Acheron which cuts the boundary line between the Provinces of Nelson and Marlborough; thence along the said boundary of the Province of Marlborough to the mouth of the River Conway; thence by the sea coast to the mouth of the River Hurunui; thence by the boundary of the Province of Canterbury to the saddle between the Hurunui and Teremakau Rivers.

50. REEFTON DISTRICT.

Commencing at the north-east angle of Charleston District; thence by a line to the junction of Orikaka River with the Buller; thence by the watershed between the Buller and Mokihinui Rivers to the western boundary of Waimea South District; thence by the western boundary of Waimea South District to the Spencer Range; thence along the

Spencer Range, continuing along the watershed line so as to leave the Waiauua and its tributaries and the Grey and its tributaries on the southern side, and the Buller and its tributaries on the northern side, to the saddle between the Mawhera-iti and Inangahua Rivers; thence in a straight line to the north-east angle of Charleston District, the commencing point.

51. COBDEN DISTRICT.

Commencing at the south headland of the Porarari River, following the southern and eastern boundaries of the Charleston District to the straight line which is part of the south-west boundary of the Buller District; thence along that line to the saddle between the Mawhera-iti and Mangahua Rivers; thence along the watershed which forms the remainder of the south-west boundary of the Buller District to the range which forms the watershed between the River Waiauua and its tributaries, and the River Grey and its tributaries; thence along that range to the saddle between the Rivers Hurunui and Teremakau; thence along the boundary of the Canterbury Province to the mouth of the River Grey; thence along the sea coast to the south head of the Porarari River.

52. CHARLESTON DISTRICT.

Commencing at the south headland of the Porarari River; thence along the watershed line, which includes all the drainage area of the Porarari River, to the Paparoha Range; thence along the summit of the Paparoha Range to the line which is part of the south-western boundary of the Buller District; thence along that line to the mouth of the River Totara; thence by the sea coast to the south headland of the Porarari River.

53. BULLER DISTRICT.

Commencing at the mouth of the River Heaphy, and following the southern boundaries of the Aorere and Takaka Districts to the summit of Mount Arthur; thence by the western boundary of Waimea South District to the north-west angle of Reefton District; thence by the watershed between the Buller and Mokihinui Rivers to the junction of Orikaka River with the Buller; thence by a line to the north-east angle of Charleston District; thence in a straight line to the mouth of the Totara River; thence by the sea coast to the mouth of the River Heaphy.

54. AORERE DISTRICT.

Commencing at the mouth of the River Heaphy; thence along the sea coast to Rangiheta Head, Golden Bay; thence by the watershed line, which includes all the streams between Rangiheta Head and the mouth of the Aorere, the River Aorere and its tributaries, and the Heaphy and its tributaries, to the mouth of the said River Heaphy.

55. TAKAKA DISTRICT.

Commencing at Rangiheta Head, Golden Bay; thence westward and southward along the boundary of the Aorere District to the summit of the range dividing the Takaka and Karamea Valleys; thence following the watershed line, which includes the drainage area of the River Takaka and its tributaries, to Mount Arthur; thence along the main range between the Takaka and Motueka and Riwaka Valleys to Mount Richards; thence by a leading spur to the south headland of Bark Bay; thence along the coast to Rangiheta Head, including all the islands adjacent.

COUNTY OF WESTLAND.

56. GREYMOUTH DISTRICT.

Commencing at the mouth of the River Grey, thence up the southern bank of that river to its junction with the Arnold, thence up the Arnold to the northernmost point of Lake Brunner, thence in a straight line to the saddle between the sources of the Hurunui and Teremakau Rivers, thence down the River Teremakau to the sea coast.

57. WAIMEA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by the Teremakau River; on the South-east by the main range; on the South and South-west by the northern boundary of the Hokitika District; and on the North-west by the ocean beach.

58. HOKITIKA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by the Arahura River; on the south-east following the dividing range to the southern branch of the Hokitika River; thence along the said river to a point distant four miles from its junction with the Kokatahi River; and from thence in a line touching the south-western extremity of Mahinapua Lake to the ocean beach; and from thence along the ocean beach to the Arahura River.

59. ROSS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by the southern boundary of Hokitika District; on the South-east by the dividing range; on the South-west by the Wanganui River; and on the North-west by the ocean.

60. OKARITA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by the Wanganui River; on the South-east by the dividing range; on the South-west by the southern boundary of the County; and on the North-west by the ocean.

PROVINCE OF CANTERBURY.

61. WAIPARA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Province of Nelson; on the East by the sea; on the South by the southern bank of the River Waipara and the southern branch of that river to its source; thence by a straight line to the summit of Block Hill, and a line from thence passing over Ashley and Esk Head and Snowy Peak to the Teremakau Saddle.

62. MOUNT GREY DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern bank of the River Waipara and the southern branch of that river to its source; thence by a straight line to the summit of Block Hill; thence by a straight line to the source of the River Ashley; on the West and South by the northern bank of the Ashley; and on the East by the sea.

63. OXFORD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward by the southern bank of the Ashley; on the Eastward by a north and south line through Trigonometrical station C. 29; and on the Southward by the southern bank of the Waimakiriri.

64. RANGIORA DISTRICT.

Commencing on the south bank of the River Ashley where crossed by the North Road, following along the road southerly to its junction with the Rangiora Road near Woodend, thence south-westerly in a direct line to Trigonometrical station M. 17, thence westerly in a direct line through Trigonometrical station M. 40 till it meets a north and south line through Trigonometrical station C. 29, thence northerly along the said line to the southern bank of the Ashley, and thence easterly along the southern bank of the Ashley to the commencing point.

65. KAIAPOI DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward and Westward by the Rangiora and Oxford Districts; on the Eastward by the sea; and on the Southward by the Christchurch District (southern bank of Waimakiriri).

66. CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT.

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury from the south bank of the Waimakiriri to the north bank of the Rakaia, except the Lyttelton, Akaroa, and Ellesmere Districts.

67. LYTTELTON DISTRICT.

From the Old Ferry over the Heathcote at the end of the ferry road, thence along the south bank of the estuary of the Avon and Heathcote, and the sea coast (including the islands in Port Victoria), to a point half-way between the eastern headland of Port Levy and the western headland of Pigeon Bay, thence to the north branch of the Little River, thence down the course of that river and Lake Forsyth to the sea, thence along the east edge of Lake Ellesmere to the River Hulswell, Cooper's Knobs, thence along the highest ridge of the hills to the Flagstaff on Mount Pleasant, thence in a right line to the starting point.

68. AKAROA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that portion of the Province lying to the eastward of the Lyttelton District.

69. ELLESMERE DISTRICT.

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury bounded on the North and East by the south bank of the River Selwyn, Lake Ellesmere, and the sea; on the South by the north bank of the River Rakaia; and on the West by the Great South Road.

70. ASHBURTON DISTRICT.

Comprises that portion of the Province of Canterbury from the north bank of the Rakaia, including the islands, to the north bank of the Rangitata.

71. GERALDINE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the south bank of the Rangitata; on the West by the County of Westland and the summit of the Two Thumb Range through Burke's Pass to McKenzie's Pass; on the South by the south bank of the Tengawai and Ophi; and on the East by the sea.

72. TIMARU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the south bank of the Ophi, and the south bank of the Tengawai from the sea to McKenzie's Pass, and by the summit of the range through Burke's Pass; thence along the Two Thumb Range to the Westland boundary; on

the West by the County of Westland; on the South by the Province of Otago to the Hakateramea, and by the Waimate District to the sea; and on the East by the sea coast.

73. WAIMATE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Makikihi, from the sea to the source of its middle branch; thence by a straight line to Mount Two Peaks; thence following the Hunter's Hill Range to Mount Nimrod; thence by the stream forming the boundary between Runs 163 and 213 to the Hakateramea; on the West by the Hakateramea; on the South by the Waitangi; and on the East by the sea.

PROVINCE OF OTAGO.

74. OAMARU DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded on the North and North-east by the Province of Canterbury; on the East by the ocean; on the South by the northern branch of the Kakanui River to its source, and thence by a line in a westerly direction to the Kakanui Mountains; towards the West by the Kakanui Mountains, the Hawkdun Mountains, and the Dunstan Mountains, from Mount St. Bathans to the Province of Canterbury.

75. HAMILTON DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from Lammerlaw, along the western watershed of the Upper Taieri River, to South Roughridge Hill; thence to North Roughridge Hill; thence to Mount Ida; thence along the ranges to Kyeburn Hill; thence to Kakanui Peak; thence along the northern and western boundary of the Hyde District to Sutton's Stream; thence along Sutton's Stream to its source; and thence to Lammerlaw, the starting point.

76. HYDE DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Taieri River and Run 203, from Sowburn to Kakanui Peak; thence along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Run 255 to Deep Dell Creek, at its junction with the Waihemo River; thence due south to a point due east of the north-eastern corner of Run 307; thence westerly to Run 307; thence along the south-eastern boundary of the said Run 307 and Sutton's Stream to the Rock and Pillar Ranges; thence along the western boundaries of Runs 213 and 214 to the Taieri River, at the junction of Sowburn, the starting point.

77. OTEPOPO DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the northern branch of the Kakanui River to its source, and thence by a line in a westerly direction to the Kakanui Mountains; towards the East by the ocean; and towards the South-west by the Horse Range and the Kakanui Mountains.

78. PALMERSTON DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-east by the Otepopo District; towards the South-east by the ocean; towards the South-west by Pleasant River from its outlet to a point due east of Mount Pleasant; towards the South by a straight line extending due east and west from Pleasant River to the north branch of the Waikouaiti River and passing across Mount Pleasant; and towards the West by the Waikouaiti River and the Hyde District.

79. WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-west by the Hyde District; towards the North-east by the Palmerston District; towards the South-east by the ocean; and towards the South and South-west by the Dunedin, North Taieri, and West Taieri Districts.

80. PORT CHALMERS DISTRICT.

All that area comprising the Town of Port Chalmers, the Lower Harbour West Survey District, the Sawyer's Bay Survey District, sections numbered 88 to 115 inclusive, North-east Valley Survey District, and Blocks 4, 5, 6, and part of 7, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District. Bounded from the north-west corner of Block 4, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, in a southerly direction, by the western boundary line of the said Block IV. to the northern boundary line of Block VI., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence by the said northern boundary line of the said Block VI., and the northern boundary line of Block VII., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, to the Main North Road; thence by the Main North Road to the northern boundary line of the North-east Valley Survey District; thence in a westerly direction by the said northern boundary line of the North-east Valley Survey District to a road line between Sections 87 and 89 of the said district; thence by the said road line continued between Sections 86 and 88, North-east Valley Survey District, to the northern boundary line of Block IX., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence in an easterly direction by the said northern boundary line of the said Block IX., to the north-west corner of Section 33, Sawyer's Bay Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction by the boundary line of the said Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Otago Harbour; and thence by high watermark to the starting point.

81. DUNEDIN DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded on the North by the Waihemo Creek, Blueskin Bay, and the ocean; on the East and South by the Port Chalmers District and by the ocean; and on the West by Kaikorai and Abbott's Creeks; thence by the watershed of the Kaikorai Flagstaff and Swampy Hill Ranges to the source of the Waihemo Creek.

82. NORTH TAIERI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Waikouaiti District; towards the East by the Dunedin District to the south-eastern corner of Block IV., Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; towards the South by a line round the southern boundary of the said block to the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 1 and 7, Block XIII., East Taieri Survey District; thence along that boundary line and its continuation in the same direction to the road line between Block VIII. and Irregular Block; thence along that road line to another road line between Block XIX. and Irregular Block; thence along that road line and its continuation to the Taieri River; and towards the West by the Taieri River.

83. WEST TAIERI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Lammermoor Ranges and Sutton's Stream; towards the East by the Waikouaiti, North Taieri, and East Taieri Districts; towards the South by Tokomairiro District; and towards the South-west by Waipori District.

84. EAST TAIERI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North

by the North Taieri District; towards the East by the Dunedin District; towards the South by the ocean; and towards the West by the Taieri River.

85. WAIPORI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from Maungatua Hill by the north-eastern watershed of the Waipori River to the Lammerlaw; thence by the south-western watershed of the said Waipori River to Waitahuna Hill; thence in a direct line to Maungatua Hill, the starting point.

86. GABRIEL'S DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding in a northerly direction twenty chains distant from and parallel to the Clutha River from a point opposite Crookburn to a point opposite Beaumont Burn; thence to and along Beaumont Burn to its source; thence to the Lammerlaw; thence by the south-western boundary of the Waipori District to the north-west boundary of the Waitahuna District; thence along the north-western boundaries of the Waitahuna District, and across the Clutha River to the starting point; excepting therefrom the area contained in the Blue Spur District.

87. BLUE SPUR DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line commencing at a point in the road line along the north-western watershed of Monro's Gully, bearing due east from Trigonometrical Station E, Tuapeka East Survey District, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction to the road line along the south-eastern watershed of the said Monro's Gully; thence in a south-westerly direction along the said road line to the south boundary of Block XVIII., Tuapeka East Survey District aforesaid; thence in a westerly direction along the said boundary to a point due south of Trigonometrical Station E aforesaid; thence in a northerly direction to the road line first above mentioned; thence in a North-easterly direction along the said road line to the starting point.

88. WAITAHUNA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North and East by Gabriel's and Waipori Districts; towards the South by the Tokomairiro District; and towards the West by the Clutha River.

89. TOKOMAIRO DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded from the Clutha River by the northern boundary of the North Tokomairiro and West Taieri Hundreds to the Waipori River; thence by the Waipori River and Lake, and the Taieri River, to the ocean; thence by the ocean to the Wangaloa Creek; thence along Wangaloa Creek and the leading ridge to Two Stone Creek; thence along Two Stone Creek and the eastern shore of the Tuakitoto Lake to Stony Creek; thence along Stony Creek to the eastern boundary of Block VI., Hillend Survey District; thence along the eastern boundary of Block VI., the northern boundary of Block I., and the eastern and northern boundaries of Block II., Hillend Survey District aforesaid, to the Clutha River, and along the Clutha River in a northerly direction to the starting point.

90. NORTH MOLYNEUX DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded on the North by a line proceeding from the Clutha River along the southern and eastern boundaries of Block I., and the eastern boundary of Block VI., Hillend Survey District, and Stony Creek, to the Tuakitoto Lake; thence along the eastern shore of the Tuakitoto Lake

to the Two Stone Creek; thence by Two Stone Creek and the leading ridge to Wangaloa Creek; thence by Wangaloa Creek to the ocean; thence, bounded towards the South by the ocean, to the Clutha River; and thence towards the West by the Clutha River and its Koau branch to the starting point.

91. BALCLUTHA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the Clutha River along the northern and eastern boundaries of Block II., Hillend Survey District, to the northern boundary of Block I., same district; thence along the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the said Block I. to the Clutha River; thence across the said river, and along its Koau branch to the road line forming the south-western boundary of Blocks XXXIII., XXXIV., and XLI., Clutha Survey District; thence north-westerly along the said road line to the road line forming the north-western boundary of Blocks XLI., XLII., and XLIII. of the said Clutha Survey District; thence north-easterly along the said road line to the Clutha River, and across the Clutha River to the starting point.

92. KATHIKU DISTRICT.

Comprises the whole of the area contained within the West Clutha Hundred, bounded towards the North-west by the Popotuna District; towards the North-east by the Clutha River; towards the South-east by the East Clutha Hundred; and towards the South-west by the Popotuna District.

93. CLUTHA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-west by the West Clutha Hundred; towards the North-east by Blocks XXXIII., XXXIV., and XLI., Clutha Survey District; towards the East by the Clutha River and its Koau branch; towards the South by the ocean; and towards the West by the western boundary of Catlin's Hundred.

94. POPOTUNA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the Waikaka Stream with the River Mataura; proceeding thence along the said stream to the junction of the Pukerau, or Taylor's Creek; thence along the Pukerau to a point due west of the junction of the Waipahi Stream with the Pomahaka River; thence due east to the said Pomahaka River; thence by the Tapanui Ranges to the summit; thence due east to a point twenty chains west of the Clutha River; thence southwards, parallel to the Clutha River, to a point opposite the junction of the Crookburn; thence easterly to the Clutha River; thence along the Clutha River to the northern angle of the West Clutha Hundred; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of the said Hundred and the western boundary of Catlin's Hundred to the ocean; thence westerly along the ocean beach to Run 61; thence northerly, along the eastern boundaries of Runs 61, 62, 177, 161, 251, and 132, and the southern boundary of Run 131, to the Mataura River; and along the Mataura River to the junction of the Waikaka Stream, the starting point.

95. TAPANUI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the West by the Waikaka Stream, from the Pukerau Junction to the source of its eastern branch; thence by a line to the Leithen Burn, and by the Leithen Burn to the Pomahaka River; thence by the Pomahaka River to the junction of Spylaw Burn; thence

towards the North by Spylaw Burn to Spylaw Hill; thence by the Mount Benger District and the Clutha River to a point due east of the summit; thence west to the summit; thence by the Tapanui Ranges to the Pomahaka River at the Waipaki Junction; and thence towards the South by a line due west to the Pukerau Stream, and by the Pukerau Stream to the Waikaka Stream, the starting point.

96. LOWER MATAURA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the Mataura River, along the southern boundary of Run 131, to the Waipahi River; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundaries of Runs numbered respectively 132, 251, and 161, to Run 177; thence along the Tautuku bush boundaries of Runs 177, 62, and 61, to the ocean; thence in a westerly direction by the ocean beach to the Mataura River; and thence in a northerly direction along the Mataura River to the starting point.

97. WINTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura River from its source to the north boundary of Run 329; thence by a line due west to the Oreti River; thence by said river and the east boundary of Run 146, the Oripiri Stream, and the east boundary of the Winton Hundred; on the South by the south boundaries of the Winton and Oreti Hundreds to the Waimatuku River; thence by said river to its source; thence by a right line north-west to cut the Aparima; on the West by the Aparima to its junction with the Hamilton Burn; thence by a right line north to the Oreti; thence by the Oreti to its junction with the Windley River; and on the North-west by the north-west boundary of the late Province of Southland.

98. INVERCARGILL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura; on the South by the Campbelltown District and the ocean; on the West by the Waimatuku River to the south-west corner of the Oreti Hundred; and on the North and West by the Winton District.

99. CAMPBELLTOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura; on the South by the ocean; on the West by the estuary of the New River; and on the North by the Mokomoko Inlet and a right line from the south-east corner thereof drawn east to cut the Mataura.

100. STEWART'S ISLAND DISTRICT.

Comprises Stewart's Island, Sclanders' Island, Ruapuke Island, and the other islands adjacent thereto.

101. RIVERTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Invercargill District; on the South by the ocean; on the West by the Waiau; and on the North by the north boundary of the Province.

102. WAKATIPU DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Province of Canterbury; towards the East by the Cromwell, Arrow, Dunstan, and the Nokomai and Switzers Districts; towards the South by the Province of Southland and the ocean; and towards the West by the ocean.

103. ARROW DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North and East by the Cromwell and Dunstan Districts; towards the South by the Kawarau River; and on the West by the watershed of the Shotover and Arrow Rivers.

104. DUNSTAN DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the north-western boundary of the Manuherikia District, along Chatto Burn, to the Dunstan Mountains; thence along the Dunstan Mountains south-westerly to the Clutha River; across the Clutha River and over Cairnmuir Hill to the Carrick Ranges, and by the Carrick Ranges to the Kawarau River; thence by the Kawarau River to a point due north of Ben Nevis; thence by the range to Lorn Peak; thence by the Nokomai and Switzers and the Manuherikia Districts to the starting point.

105. NOKOMAI AND SWITZERS DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line from Lorn Peak, near the southern extremity of Lake Wakatipu, westwards to a point in the boundary of the late Province of Southland two miles above the junction of the Allanburn with the River Mataura, which forms the said Provincial boundary; thence southwards along the Mataura River to the junction of the Waikaka Stream; thence northwards along the Waikaka to the source of its eastern branch; thence to the Leithen Stream, and by the Leithen Stream to the Pomahaka River, and by the Pomahaka River to the junction of Spylaw Burn; thence straight to Wart Hill; thence by the Umbrella Mountains to a point due west of Jordan Creek, at its junction with the Clutha River; thence by the ranges to Rocky Mountain; thence direct to Lorn Peak, the starting point.

106. MOUNT BENDER DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the north-west corner of Gabriel's District in a northerly direction, and parallel to the Clutha River, to Spylaw Burn at its source; thence by Spylaw to the Pomahaka River; thence to Wart Hill; thence to White Coomb; thence by the Umbrella Mountains to a point due west of Jordan Creek; thence to Jordan Creek at its junction with the Clutha River; thence to South Roughridge Hill; thence along the western boundary of Hamilton District to the Lammerlaw; and thence in a south-westerly direction by the boundary line of Gabriel's District to the starting point.

107. MANUHERIKIA DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding in a westerly direction from White Coomb to the Wakaia River; thence by the Wakaia River to the White Coomb Creek; thence by the Ranges to Rocky Mount; thence to the Obelisk; thence in a northerly direction to a point due west of Earnscleugh Burn; thence to Earnscleugh Burn at its junction with the Clutha River; thence parallel to the Manuherikia River to Spottis Burn; thence in a southerly direction to the Raggedy Range, and by the watershed of Manor Burn to South Roughridge Hill; thence in a westerly direction by the boundary of Mount Benger District.

108. BLACKS DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the Dunstan Mountains in a south-easterly direction to and along Lauder Creek to the Manuherikia River, and along the Manuherikia River to the junction of Ida Burn; thence along Ida Burn to the junction of Pool Burn; thence in a direct line south-easterly to Roughridge; thence southerly to South Roughridge Hill; thence along the north-eastern boundary of Manuherikia District to Chatto Burn; thence north-westerly along Chatto Burn to its source; thence in a direct line to Leaning Rock Hill; and thence north-easterly along the Dunstan Mountains to the starting point.

109. BLACKSTONE DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding due east from Mount St. Bathans to the Hawkdun Mountains; thence south-easterly along the Hawkdun Mountains to Mount Ida; thence south-westerly along Roughridge to the north-eastern boundary of Blacks District; thence north-westerly along the said boundary to the Dunstan Mountains; and thence north-easterly along the Dunstan Mountains to Mount St. Bathans, the starting point.

110. CROMWELL DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Province of Canterbury; towards the East by Oamaru and Blackstone Districts; towards the South by the Dunstan and Blacks Districts; and towards the West by the Dunstan, Arrow, and Wakatipu Districts.

111. CHATHAM ISLANDS DISTRICT.

Comprises the group known as "The Chatham Islands."
