WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is enacted that the railways to be constructed under the said Act shall be only such railways as shall from time to time be determined by the General Assembly: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions contained therein, the Governor may construct, or cause to be constructed, any lines of railway which shall be prescribed by the General Assembly as railways to be constructed under the said Act, or any part or parts thereof, and acquire the necessary engines, plant, and machinery for working and using the same, or any of them: And it is also thereby enacted that, whenever the Governor shall determine to construct any such railway, or any part thereof, it shall be lawful for him, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, to declare and define the limits and description and line thereof, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of such railway, subject to the provisions of any Act defining such limits and descriptions, and any such Proclamation may refer to maps, plans, or drawings to be deposited in the office of the Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court in the Province in which such railway or part thereof is proposed to be constructed, and any maps, plans, or drawings so referred to shall be deemed to form part of such Proclamation; and upon the publication of such Proclamation, the provisions and regulations contained in the Seventh Part of the said Act shall be applicable to the railway, and to the lands to which the Proclamation shall relate: And it is also thereby enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to make, construct, and maintain any such railway as aforesaid, with proper works, approaches, and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at the place delineated on, and extending | portion or portions, and the limits and description of

along the lines set forth in, and terminating at a point described in the Act or Proclamation proclaiming and defining such railway, or shown in the maps, plans, or drawings referred to in such Act or Proclamation: And it is also thereby enacted that the Governor may direct that any part of such line of railway may be constructed on and along any part of any public highway, and that any part of any such line of railway may be constructed on or through any public reserves: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Part of the said Act and of the Acts incorporated therewith, the Governor may exercise all or any of the powers by that Part of the said Act or the said incorporated Acts conferred upon him for the construction of any such railway, and may enter upon, and cause to be entered upon, all lands within the Colony for the purpose of making such surveys as may be necessary, and may take and hold all the lands required for the railway along the line set forth and described as aforesaid, or within the limits of deviation described in the Proclamation relating thereto, and may temporarily occupy and use such lands as may be necessary on either side of the railway, during the construction thereof:

And whereas by "The Railways Act, 1871," and The Railways Act, 1872," it is enacted that the Governor may, under the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly recited Act and of the now reciting Acts, construct and maintain, or cause to be constructed and maintained, the several lines of railway specified therein: And it is also thereby enacted that the line of the railways thereby authorized to be constructed shall be fixed by the Governor, and shall commence and terminate at points to be fixed by the Governor: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is enacted that as to any railway which the Governor has been authorized to construct, and to fix the commencing and termination points and line thereof, it shall be competent for him, if he thinks fit, instead of fixing and proclaiming such points and the whole line at one time, to fix and proclaim portions of such line from time to time, and the commencing and termination points of any such

any such portion or portions, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of any such portion or portions, and to construct any portion or portions so fixed, and to take the lands for the same; and any such portion so proclaimed shall be deemed to be a railway within the meaning of the said Act and the said amending Act and this Act:

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Act it is also enacted that, at any time after the expiration of twenty-one days from the publication in the New Zealand Gazette, and in a newspaper ordinarily circulating in the district, of a Proclamation under the thirteenth section of the said Act, whether of the whole or a portion or portions of a line of railway, the Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty, may enter upon, take possession of, use and hold, or cause to be entered upon, taken possession of, used and held, so much of the lands defined in such Proclamation as proposed to be taken as shall be required to be taken, purchased, or permanently used for the purposes of such railway, notwithstanding that an agreement shall not have been come to or an award made for the purchase or compensation money to be paid in respect of such lands:

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Act it is also enacted that in any case in which a road or right of road has been or hereafter may be reserved in any Crown grant, and in any case in which, under "The Native Lands Act, 1865," or any law for the time being in force relating to the sale of waste lands of the Crown, or any law whatever, there is a right to take a public road through any lands, it shall be lawful, after such road shall have been surveyed, to construct under the said Acts any railway or any part of any railway, on the road so surveyed, notwithstanding that such road may not have been made:

And whereas the Governor has determined to construct and maintain a railway from the Winton Station of the Invercargill and Winton Railway to a point situated in Section numbered 258, Hokonui District, being a portion of the railway authorized to be constructed from Winton to Kingston by "The Railways Act, 1871:"

And whereas Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, hath departed thence for the Colony of New South Wales, and Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Chief Justice of the said Colony, under or by virtue of a certain warrant under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, is now the person lawfully administering the Government of the said Colony:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Alfred Arney, Knight, the Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and in exercise of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and define the limits, description, and line of the said railway from the Winton Station of the Invercargill and Winton Railway to a point situated in Section numbered 258, Hokonui District, to be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and that the lands specified and described in the Second Schedule hereto are proposed to be taken for the purposes of the said railway; and that the limits of deviation shall be those set forth in the said First Schedule hereto; and in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities conferred on me in that behalf, I do hereby fix the point of commencement of the said railway, being a portion of the said railway from Winton to Kingston, to be the Winton Station of the Invercargill and Winton Railway, and the point of termination to be a point situated in Section numbered 258, Hokonui District.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Limits, Description, Line, and Limits of Deviation of a portion of Railway from Winton to Kingston, in the Southland District, in the Province of Otago.

COMMENCING at the Winton Railway Station of the Invercargill and Winton Railway, and passing along, in, through, or into the following districts, viz.:— Township of Winton, East Winton District, Winton District and Hokonui District, and terminating at a point situated in section numbered 258, Hokonui District, as the limits, description, and line thereof are set forth on the plan and described in the book of reference referred to on the face of the said plan, and which plan and book are authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable William Hunter Reynolds, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, or within the limits of deviation set forth in the said plan by dotted red lines, being not more than one hundred and ten yards on either side of the said line, and passing through or over the several sections of Crown and other lands, sections, reserves, roads, streams, watercourses, and rivers, as enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Lands proposed to be taken for the purposes of a portion of the Winton and Kingston Railway.

So much of the lands hereinafter mentioned as are required for the said railway along the line of the said railway hereinbefore defined, or within the limits of deviation aforesaid, as the lands are described and defined in the plan and book of reference aforesaid.

Rehearing Claim of Raika Whakarongotai and Honana Te Ngangai.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS at a sitting of the Native Land VV Court of New Zealand, at Shortland, in the District of Hauraki, Province of Auckland, on the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the claim of Raika Whakarongotai and Honana Te Ngangai, aboriginal natives of New Zealand, residing at Hauraki, to a piece of land called Te Ipuwhakatara, situate at Hauraki, in the district aforesaid, was heard, and a certain order was thereupon made by the Court aforesaid: And whereas it is enacted by "The Native Lands Act, 1865," and "The Native Lands Act, 1867," and "The Native Lands Act, 1870," that the Governor in Council may order a rehearing of any matter judicially heard before the Court aforesaid, and before one or more Judges of the Court, and one or more Assessors, as may be specified in the Order in Council ordering such rehearing, and within such period of time as may be limited in such order, provided that no such order for rehearing shall be made after six months shall have elapsed from the date of the original decision: And whereas it is expedient that the said claim shall be reheard before the said Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the above-recited power and authority, doth hereby order that the aforesaid claim of Raika Whakarongotai and Honana Te Ngangai to the aforesaid piece of land shall be re-heard before one Judge of the said Court and one

Assessor thereof.

And doth order that such rehearing shall take place before the thirtieth day of April next.

Purpose for which "Original Reserve," County of Westland, was made, changed.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of May, 1873.

Present: HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Waste Land Regulations then in force in the Province of Canterbury, Samuel Bealey, Esquire, then being the Superintendent of the said Province, by a notice

dated the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, published in the Government Gazette of the said Province on the twentyfirst day of September in the same year, temporarily made a reserve of a parcel of land at Hokitika, containing fifty-seven acres, more or less (numbered 451 in red), for a public common: And whereas on the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the Provincial Council of the said Province, by a resolution, confirmed and adouted the relating of the said process. adopted the making of the said reserve: And whereas the said reserve is now subject to the provisions of "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," and by the said Act it is among other things enacted that reserves heretofore or thereafter to be made of Waste Lands shall be managed and administered by the Governor in Council: And it is also enacted that the specified purposes for which any such reserves shall be held may be changed, and any such reserves may be leased, mortgaged, or sold, either in whole or in part, by the Governor in Council, as therein provided: And whereas it is expedient that the purposes of such reserve should be changed, and that the same should be otherwise dealt with as herein mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Alfred Arney, the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby order that the purpose for which the said reserve was originally made (hereinafter called the "original reserve' shall be changed, to the intent that the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto shall, under the provisions of the said Act, be made a reserve for the purposes of a Public Cricket Ground, and that the residue of such original reserve shall be sold as hereinafter mentioned: Provided that before such change shall take effect, the Waste Lands Board of the County of Westland shall publish at least two calendar months' notice thereof in the County of

Westland Gazette.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the power and authority aforesaid, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, it is ordered that the residue of the said original reserve remaining after the creation of the so intended reserve for a public cricket ground shall be sold, and that the time, place, and conditions of such sale shall be fixed by the said Waste Lands Board, and shall be published in the County of Westland Gazette at least two calendar months before such sale shall take place.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the County of Westland, containing twenty-six acres, more or less, situate near the Town of Hokitika; bounded on the South by the Hokitika River, and on the West, North, and East by an overflow channel, - for a Cricket Ground.

Additional Regulations under "Patents Act, 1870."

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of May, 1873.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE

GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by the sixth section of "The Patents Act, 1870," it is enacted that it shall be

lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such Rules and Regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, as may appear to be necessary and expedient for the purposes of the said Act:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the above recited power and authority, doth hereby make the following Rules and Regulations for the purposes of the said Act, in addition to the Rules and Regulations made by Order in Council, dated the twentieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one:—

In lieu of numbers 12 and 14 of the said Regulations, the following Regulation is hereby made:

27. All specifications relating to applications for Letters Patent and left at the Patent Office, or afterwards required or allowed to be deposited by the Patent Officer, must be written in a large, legible hand, and shall be in the form contained in the First Schedule to "The Patents Act, 1870," or to the like effect; and after describing the details of the invention with precision, shall contain a distinct claim for the especial novelty thereof, and shall be written bookwise upon both sides of one or more skin or skins of parchment, and every page thereof shall be of the exact size of twenty inches in length by fifteen inches in breadth, leaving a margin of at least one inch and a half on each side of every such page, in order and to the intent that the same may be bound into books for safe custody.

Every copy of any such specification shall be legibly written upon pages of foolscap paper, and upon one side only of each page, leaving a margin of about one inch and a half on the left-hand side of the page.

The drawings (if any) accompanying such specification may be made, if necessary, upon larger sheets of parchment or tracing cloth, leaving a margin of at least one inch and a half on each side of every such sheet. As the copies of such drawings will be photo-lithographed on a greatly reduced scale by the Patent Office, the following directions must be observed in making such copies:—

a. Drawing paper, tracing paper, or tracing cloth may be used; should be as white, clean, and smooth as possible, and should be rolled

up and not folded.

b. The drawings should be made with Indian ink freshly rubbed down, quite black, free from grit and glaze. Pale ink must on no account be used. No colour but black is allowed. All lines, writing, figures, and letters must be clearly and firmly drawn, so as to allow of their being visible when considerably reduced by the process of photo-lithography. All shading must be by black lines sufficiently wide apart for the purpose aforesaid.

28. The directions contained in the foregoing Regulation, as to writing, material, and size of specifications, shall apply to all manuscript documents accompanying applications for Letters of Registration; the directions as to copies of such specifications shall apply to the duplicates required of such documents; and the directions as to drawings and duplicates of drawings shall apply to the drawings and duplicates of drawings (if any) accompanying such documents; but printed documents and drawings of any size and on paper will be received if the duplicates of drawings are capable of being photo-lithographed.

29. Applications for copies of documents or drawings in the Patent Office must be accompanied by a deposit of such sum as the Registrar of Patents shall consider sufficient to cover the cost of copying.

30. Documents in any language other than English, deposited in the Patent Office, must be accompanied by translations into English certified to as correct by some person approved of by the Patent Officer or the Registrar of Patents.

31. No assignment or license of two or more Letters Patent or Letters of Registration shall be registered, and no certificate of assignment or license shall be granted, unless a fee for such registration or certificate be paid in respect of each such Letters Patent or Letters of Registration in respect of which such registration or certificate is desired.

Purchase of Horses by Indian Government.

THE following notification received from the Government of India, in reference to the purchase of remounts for the Bengal Army, is published for general information.

WILLIAM H. REYNOLDS.

NOTICE.

It having been decided by the Government of India to establish a reserve of 1,000 horses for Army use, and for the next few years to purchase a considerable number of remounts for the Bengal Army in the open market, notice is hereby given, that Remount Committees at the several stations noted in the margin,* are prepared to purchase horses suitable for Army purposes to the number of about 1,200, during the current year, and up to the 1st April, 1874.

In 1874-75, 1,000 horses, and 1875-76, 650 horses, more or less, will be bought. The requirements of subsequent years will be made known hereafter.

Horses of all breeds, Cape, Australian, Arab, Persian, Country-bred and Northern, will be accepted if up to the required standard.

Mares as well as horses will be taken; and if the former are of a good stamp, the preference will be given to them.

They must be within the prescribed ages,—four to seven years.

The maximum price for Cavalry and Field Artillery remounts is Rupees 500; for Horse Artillery, Rupees

The following Prizes will also be given for English and Colonial Stock, exhibited at Calcutta in the early part of January, 1874—ages four to seven years:—

Some Prizes will also be given in 1875 and following years, the details of which will be published in due course.

The Government of India will retain a right of pre-emption of any horses exhibited, at a price to be

fixed by the exhibitor before exhibition. No prizes will be given unless the horses exhibited come up to a high standard of excellence.
