ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of May, 1873.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that reserves heretofore or hereafter to be made of waste lands shall be managed and administered by the Governor in Council: And it is also enacted that the specified purposes for which any reserves shall be held may be changed, and any such reserves may be leased, mortgaged, or sold, either in whole or in part, by the Governor in Council, as therein mentioned: And whereas the several parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto were, on the dates and in the manner therein mentioned, declared to be reserves for the several purposes therein set forth, and such reserves are now subject to the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that such reserves should be sold, and that the proceeds of such sale should form part of the Land Fund of the County:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Alfred Arney, the Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recitéd Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby order that the several parcels of land so reserved as aforesaid, and as the same are described in the Schedule hereto, shall be sold, and that the time, place, and conditions of such sale shall be fixed by the Waste Lands Board of the County of Westland, and shall be published in the County of Westland Gazette at least two calendar months before such sale shall take place; and it is declared that the proceeds of such sale shall form part of and be paid into the Public Account to the credit of and to form part of the Land Fund of the County.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of May, 1873.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is among other things provided that the management of reserves for public gardens or recreation grounds may be vested, by Order of Council, in any Corporation, Commissioner, or other person or persons having corporate succession, under such restrictions and limitations as the Governor in Council shall think sufficient to secure the full maintenance of the purposes for which such reserve may have been made: And whereas the several parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto have been reserved and set apart for the purposes therein mentioned, and such reserves are now subject to the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the management of the said reserves should be vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Greymouth (hereinafter called the "Corporation"), in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of all power and authority in this behalf in him vested, doth hereby order and direct that the management of the several reserves mentioned in the said Schedule shall, from and after the date hereof, be vested in the Corporation, under and subject to the conditions and restrictions hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

1. The Corporation shall have full powers of management and control of such reserves, and for that purpose may from time to time prescribe general regulations, but no such regulations shall have any force or effect until the same shall have received the assent of the Governor.

2. The Corporation shall not have any power to lease or otherwise dispose of any such reserve to any person or body corporate, or otherwise howsoever; but, upon the coming into operation of this Order in Council, they may take possession of any such reserve, and may fence and lay out the same in such manner as they may think fit, in order effectually to carry out the purposes for which the same has been reserved.

Reserves at Greymouth vested in Corporation for Public Purposes.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of May, 1873.

S EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that reserves under the said Act shall vest in and be held by any Corporation, Commissioners, or other person or persons having corporate succession, to be named in the Order, in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified and declared in such Order, in such manner, and with such powers of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease, and of management of such reserves, and of disposing of the rents, issues, profits, and proceeds thereof, and other powers, provisions, and provisoes as shall be expressed and declared in such Order: And whereas the several parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto have been reserved and set apart for the purposes therein mentioned, and such reserves are now subject to the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the said reserves should be vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Greymouth (hereinafter called the "Corporation"), in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of all power and authority in this behalf in him vested, doth hereby order and direct that from and after the date hereof the reserves particularly mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto shall vest in and be held by the Corporation in trust for the public service of the said Borough, with power to dispose of and manage such reserves under and subject to the

following conditions, that is to say :-1. The said reserves shall be vested in the Corporation for the several purposes mentioned in the Schedule, and in cases where the purpose for which such reserve was made shall be specified, the Corporation shall have no power to alter the same, but such reserve shall be held in trust for the particular purpose

2. As to the reserves mentioned in the First Part of the said Schedule, the Corporation shall have power to lease the same, or any of them, to any person or persons, or to any body corporate, for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of such lease, reserving such rent or rents as the Corporation may think fit; and every such lease shall contain all usual and proper covenants on the part of the lessee or

lessees, and shall contain a condition or right of re-entry for breach of any of the provisions of such lease.

3. At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of May, 1873.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that reserves under the said Act shall vest in and be held by any Corporation, Commissioners, or other person or persons having corporate succession, to be named in the Order, in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified and declared in such Order, in such manner, and with such powers of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease, and of management of such reserves, and of disposing of the rents, issues, profits, and proceeds thereof, and other powers, provisions, and provisoes as shall be expressed and declared in such Order: And whereas the several parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto have been reserved and set apart for the purposes therein mentioned, and such reserves are now subject to the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the said reserves should be vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hokitika (hereinafter called the "Corporation"), in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of all power and authority in this behalf in him vested, doth hereby order and direct that, from and after the date hereof, the reserves particularly mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto shall vest in and be held by the Corporation in trust for the public service of the said borough, with power to dispose of and manage such reserves under and subject to the following conditions, that is to say:—

1. The said reserves shall be vested in the Corporation for the several purposes mentioned in the Schedule, and in cases where the purpose for which such reserve was made shall be specified, the Corporation shall have no power to alter the same, but such reserve shall be held in trust for the particular

purpose specified. 2. As to the reserves mentioned in the said Schedule, the Corporation shall have power to lease the same, or any of them, to any person or persons or to any body corporate for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of such lease, reserving such rent or rents as the Corporation may think fit, and every such lease shall contain all usual and proper covenants on the part of the lessee or lessees, and shall contain a condition or right of re-entry for breach of any of the provisions of such lease; but before any lease or disposition thereof shall be made to any person or body corporate, the consent of the Governor shall be obtained prior to the execution of the lease, and such consent, if given, shall be indersed on the intended lease, and the Governor may, if he think fit, refuse to assent to any such lease.

3. It shall be lawful for the Governor to require that any such lease shall contain such additional

covenants or conditions on the lessee's part as he may think fit and adapted to secure the effectual

management of any such reserve.

4. The rents, issues, and profits to be received or derived from the leasing of any of the reserves mentioned in the said Schedule shall be vested in the Corporation, and by them received and appropriated to the Borough Fund, and may be applied thereout in such manner as the ordinary revenue of the Corporation may be applied.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," it is provided that after setting apart sufficient land for all persons who shall be entitled thereto under the contracts therein referred to, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause towns to be surveyed and laid out, and also suburban and rural allotments; and that all such town, suburban, and rural lands shall be sold, occupied, and disposed of for such prices, in such manner, and for such purposes, upon such terms and subject to such regulations, as the Governor in Council shall from time to time prescribe for that purpose:

from time to time prescribe for that purpose:

And whereas by "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," it is enacted that the order and manner in which land taken under the authority of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," should be laid out for sale and sold should be at the discretion of the Governor, who shall have power to cause such land or any part thereof to be laid out for sale and sold from time to time, in such manner, for such consideration, and in such allotments as he shall think fit, and subject to such regulations as he shall, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time prescribe: And whereas by "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment Act, 1866," it is provided that the said lands shall be sold for such consideration or at such price, and whether for cash or otherwise, as the Governor shall from time to time prescribe, and that all lands taken under the authority of the said "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements

Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," or either of them, and sold or disposed of under the authority of the said first-recited Act, shall be sold or disposed of under regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, which regulations shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette:

And whereas under the hereinbefore in part recited powers the Governor in Council did, on the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, make and issue certain regulations for the sale and disposal of confiscated lands as therein provided: And whereas the said regulations provide for the making of reserves of such lands for the purposes therein specified, and it is provided that the purposes for which any reserves have been made may be changed, or the reservation of the same withdrawn by the Government, but so that no change or withdrawal shall be made except after notice of three months in the New Zealand Gazette, and by special order of the Governor in Council: And whereas the several parcels of land hereinafter particularly mentioned have been reserved and set apart under the said regulations, and it is expedient that they should cease to be such reserves: And whereas it is further expedient that the formalities required by the hereinbefore in part recited regulation should be dispensed with, and that regulations should be made for the purpose of enabling the said parcels of land to be sold or disposed of:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities vested in him in that behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, make the following regulations for the sale and disposal of the parcels of land mentioned in the Schedule to such regulations.

Regulations.

1. Upon the publication of this Order in Council in the New Zealand Gazette, the 5th, 6th, 7th, 26th, and 27th of the hereinbefore in part recited regulations shall be and the same are hereby repealed in so far as respects the several reserves or parcels of land mentioned and set forth in the Schedule hereto, and such lands shall thereafter cease to be reserves

Regulations under "The Militia Act, 1870."

THEREAS by the thirty-ninth section of "The W Militia Act, 1870," it is enacted that all fines paid under the preceding section of the said Act shall be paid to the Officer Commanding the Battalion or independent Company to which the offender belongs, and shall be accounted for, dealt with, and be applied towards the encouragement of target practice in such Battalion or independent Company in such manner as shall be prescribed by regulations to be made from time to time by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient that such regulations

should be made:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes aforesaid :-

REGULATIONS.

1. All fines imposed on Militiamen for breaches of the provisions of the 38th section of "The Militia Act, 1870," shall be collected by the Officer Commanding the Battalion or independent Company, and

paid into the Public Account.

2. When the fines so collected in any Battalion or independent Company shall amount to the sum of two pounds sterling or upwards, the Officer Commanding such Battalion or independent Company will offer the same as rifle prizes, to be fired for under such regulations and conditions as he may from time to time fix; but no prizes shall be offered for competition unless the minimum sum of two

available for such purpose.

3. The Officer Commanding the Battalion or independent Company will send to the Acting Under-Secretary for Defence a return of the amount of fines collected by him during the quarter, and a statement showing the manner in which he proposes to offer the money for competition.
