*Stations for Quarantine appointed.*

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by any order notified by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, appoint certain stations within or near any harbour or place within New Zealand for the performance of quarantine under the Third Part of the said Act, where all vessels liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, shall perform the same: And whereas it is expedient that the several places hereinafter particularly mentioned should be appointed Quarantine Stations, for the purposes in the said Act mentioned:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me for that purpose, do by this Proclamation order and appoint that the several places named and described in the Schedule hereto shall be, and the same are hereby appointed to be, stations for the performance of quarantine under the Third Part of "The Public Health Act, 1872."

SCHEDULE.  
NELSON.

THE whole of the island situate at the southern end of Blind Bay, in the Province of Nelson, Colony of New Zealand, known as Rabbit Island, containing 2640 acres, more or less, and the water frontage around the said island within half a mile from its shores, except on the southern side, where the boundary is low watermark: Also all that parcel of land in the Province aforesaid, containing by admeasurement two hundred and forty acres more, or less, situated in the District of Astrolabe, Tasman's Bay, being sections numbered 90 on square 9, and 35 on square 10, on the plan of the Province of Nelson. Bounded on the North by Crown land (4500 links);

East by low watermark in Astrolabe Roadstead; and South (4000 links) and West (4900 links and 3100 links) by Crown lands, together with the water frontage within half a mile of the shores of the said Reserves.

*Defining Roads from the Arnould River to the Buller River, and from Ahaura to Amuri, in the Nelson South-West Gold Fields.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, may, as to parts within the North Island of New Zealand, define the roads and the boundaries thereof, and the bridges and ferries which shall be and be deemed to be roads, bridges, or ferries, as the case may be, under the provisions of the said Act, and any such Proclamation may include existing roads, but no such roads or parts of roads shall be included if they are, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, roads which should be constructed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province wherein such roads are situated, as well as new road lines; and the Governor from time to time may

revoke or alter any such Proclamation: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that all the provisions contained in Part I. and Part VI. of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," shall be applicable to the County of Westland and the Nelson South-West Gold Fields, and may be adapted and used with reference to those portions of the Colony, as if such portions had formed part of the North Island: And whereas it is expedient that the roads mentioned and defined in the Schedules hereto should be constructed under the said Acts: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and the Executive Council of New Zealand, the said roads are not roads which should be constructed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the roads within the Nelson South-West Gold Fields, described, and the boundaries whereof are set forth, in the several Schedules hereto, shall respectively be and be deemed to be roads under the provisions of the said Acts; and in further pursuance of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," I do hereby proclaim and declare that I have caused a map and survey plan of the road defined in the First Schedule hereto, describing the course and bearings and the admeasurements required for the same, and through what lands the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners or occupiers thereof, so far as known, to be deposited in the office of the Public Works Department at Westport, in the Province of Nelson; and I have also caused a like map and survey plan of the road defined in the Second Schedule, and containing like particulars, to be deposited in the office of the said Department at Westport aforesaid, which said maps and survey plans are authenticated, for the purposes of this Proclamation, by the signature of the Honorable Edward Richardson, Minister for Public Works.

SCHEDULE No. 1.

*From the Arnould River by way of Grey Valley, Little Grey Valley, and Inangahua Valley, to the Buller River.*

COMMENCING at the bridge over the Arnould River, and proceeding thence in a general N.E. direction to the Ahaura River, about eleven miles, crossing that river and through the Ahaura Township; thence in the same general direction crossing Ohinetakitaki Plain and Ikangatua Plain to the River Grey, about eight miles, crossing that river at a point about three-quarters of a mile above the junction of the Little Grey River; thence up the Little Grey River, partly on the left bank and partly on the right bank, in a general northerly direction, for about ten miles; thence crossing the Little Grey and proceeding by way of Slab Hut Creek in a general N.E. direction, and across the Inangahua River to Reefton Township, a distance of about eight miles; thence through the Township and down the Valley of the Inangahua to Fern Flat, about five miles, in a general northerly direction; thence in a N.N.E. direction, about five miles to and crossing Larry's Creek; thence in a general northerly direction, about seven miles, to the crossing of the Inangahua River at a place known as the "Landing;" thence across the river and down the left bank thereof in a general northerly direction, about five miles, till it meets the

road between Westport and the Lyell near the junction of the Inangahua with the Buller; thence down the Inangahua River to the Buller. The above described roads not to be less than one chain wide.

SCHEDULE No. 2.

*From Ahaura to Amuri.*

COMMENCING at the Ahaura Township, and proceeding thence across the Ahaura Plain in an easterly direction about four miles; thence following generally the course of the Ahaura River to the saddle between it and the River Wai-au-ua; thence across the saddle and down a branch of the Wai-au-ua.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this twentieth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

*Notice of the intention of the Governor to make a Road from Ahaura to Amuri.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Governor of New Zealand having, under the powers in him vested by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and the Acts amending the same, deemed it expedient to open and make a line of road from Ahaura to Amuri, which road is, in the opinion of the Governor and the Executive Council of the Colony, not a road to be constructed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, and the course and bearings of which said road, the admeasurements required for the same, and the land through which the same passes, together with the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, are respectively shown and delineated on a certain plan marked A. No. 2, and which said road is also described in a certain Proclamation made under the said Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 51, dated 21st August, 1873, and reprinted in same *Gazette* as that in which this notice appears:

A copy of the said plan, marked A. No. 2, is deposited and may be seen and inspected at the office of the Public Works Department at Westport.

And notice is hereby further given, that all or any person or persons affected by the making of the said line of road from Ahaura to Amuri are required to set forth in writing, addressed to the Governor, and left at the office of the said Public Works Department at Westport, within forty days from the first publication hereof, any well-grounded objection he or they may have to the said line of road.

To His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

The Petition of the undersigned Inhabitant Householders of the District, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter more particularly set forth,

HUMBLY SHOWETH,—

The district, the boundaries of which are hereinafter more particularly set forth, comprises all that block of land commencing at a point bearing from Trig. Station F 282 degrees 36 minutes 31 seconds, distant 11681½ links; thence due east to Rocky Point, 80 chains; thence bearing 126 degrees 52 minutes, distant 4250 links, to Trig. Station (F); thence by straight line to Trig. Station No. 5, Kuranui Hill; thence by straight line to Trig. Station No. 1, Waiotahi Spur; thence by a straight line to the centre of the Karaka Road, opposite centre of Sandes Street; thence by centre of Karaka Road to the centre of Rolleston Street; thence by centre of Rolleston Street to the centre of the Hape Creek; thence by the centre of Hape Creek to its confluence

with the Kauwaeranga River; thence due westward 80 chains; thence by a straight line to the point of commencement, a distance of 286 chains or thereabouts—all bearings being on the true meridian. The boundaries of the said district are—towards the North by the sea and the gold fields; towards the East by the Thames Gold Field, and an irregular boundary described by the centre of the Karaka Road and Rolleston Street; towards the South by the centre of the Hape Creek, the mouth of the Kauwaeranga River, and the sea; and towards the West by the sea. The said district lies wholly within one and the same Province—to wit, the Province of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand. The said district is not wholly or in any part comprised within the limits of any city, town, or place specified in the first column of the First Schedule of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867." The said district is not wholly or in part comprised within the limits of any city, town, or place before the passing of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," incorporated or reputed to have been incorporated under any of the Acts or Ordinances specified in the fourth column of the First Schedule to the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1867." The said district does not exceed in area nine square miles, and has no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point in the said district. The said district contains a population of not less than two hundred and fifty of inhabitant householders. Your Petitioners are desirous that the said district may be constituted a Borough, under and by virtue of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to constitute the said district a Borough under the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."
