*Land withdrawn from the Nelson South-West Gold Field.*

(L.S.) JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.  
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time subsequent to the proclamation of a gold field, to withdraw by Proclamation therefrom any Crown lands which he may deem it necessary to withdraw, and that such lands shall henceforth be dealt with, sold, occupied, and disposed of under any law or laws for the time being in force regulating the sale, occupation, or disposal, or in any way affecting or relating to the management or dealing with the Crown lands within the Province in which such gold field is situate, in like manner in every respect as though such lands had never been comprised in any proclaimed gold field:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose vested in me, do hereby withdraw from the Nelson South-West Gold Field, proclaimed on the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, so much of the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto as is included within the said gold field.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece of land comprised within the following boundaries, namely, on the Northwards partly by the Municipal Reserve, Westport, and partly by the surveyed Sections 7A, 8, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 44, 43, 42, 41, 40, 39, 38, 37, 20, and 25; to the south-eastern corner of 28; thence by a line bearing 36° East of North for a distance of four thousand links to a point on the Buller River; and on the Southward and Westward by the Buller River to a point from which this description commenced at the south-west corner of 7A; comprising about four thousand acres, more or less, excepting all lands

within these boundaries at present held or applied for under the Gold Fields Agricultural Leasing Acts.

*Districts of Mangonui and Kaipara withdrawn from the operation of "The Outlying Districts Sale of Spirits Act, 1870."*

(L.S.) JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.  
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Outlying Districts Sale of Spirits Act, 1870," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in that behalf, from time to time define districts and bring the same under the operation of the said Act, and may at any time, and from time to time thereafter, alter the boundaries of such districts, or withdraw any district, or any part of any district, from the operation of the said Act; and also that no part of any town or city shall be brought under the operation of the said Act, and also that no district shall be defined or brought under the operation of the said Act, unless at least two-thirds of the inhabitants of such districts are persons of the Native race: And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the Governor in Council, in pursuance and exercise of the said recited power and authority, did define the Districts of Mangonui, Bay of Islands, and Kaipara,

hereinafter mentioned (with other districts), as the said districts were described in the Schedule thereto, and did bring the same under the operation of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to withdraw the said districts of Mangonui, Bay of Islands, and Kaipara from the operation of the said Act, and to define other districts in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby withdraw the said Districts of Mangonui, Bay of Islands, and Kaipara from the operation of the said Act: And in further exercise and pursuance of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the districts defined in the Schedule hereto shall be districts under and for the purposes of the said Act, and that the said districts shall be, and the same are, hereby brought under the operation of the said Act, excepting any towns or parts of towns included in the said districts.

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SCHEDULE.

MANGONUI.

ALL that portion of the Province of Auckland which lies northward of a line drawn from Herekino (False Hokianga) to the summit of Maungataniwha; and thence by a line to the westernmost point of the Omapere Lake; and thence by a line to Flat Island, including said island and all adjacent islands.

HOKIANGA.

ALL that portion of land, bounded by a line from Herekino (False Hokianga) to summit of Maungataniwha; thence by a line to the westernmost part of Omapere Lake; thence by a line to Maunganui Bluff; and on the West by the sea.

BAY OF ISLANDS.

ALL that portion of land, bounded on the North-west by the Mangonui and Hokianga districts hereinbefore defined; towards the North and East by the sea; towards the South by the southern boundaries of the Counties of Bedford and Hokianga.

*Special Sitting of the Westland Waste Lands Board.*

WHEREAS on the twenty-eighth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," certain days were appointed to be the days on which the Waste Lands Board of the County of Westland should sit at the principal Land Office of the said

County, in the Town of Hokitika: And whereas by the said recited Act it is among other things enacted that the principal Land Office of the said County shall be kept at the Town of Hokitika, and the Waste Lands Board shall sit there, and at certain stated times, to be determined from time to time by the Governor as therein mentioned, and shall also sit for special purposes at such places and at such times as the Governor shall from time to time direct: And whereas it is expedient to appoint a special day for the sitting of the said Board:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," do hereby fix and determine that a special sitting of the Waste Lands Board for the County of Westland shall be held in the Resident Magistrate's Court, at Greymouth, on Thursday, the thirtieth day of October next, at noon, for the purpose of the sale by auction of suburban land in the Grey District.

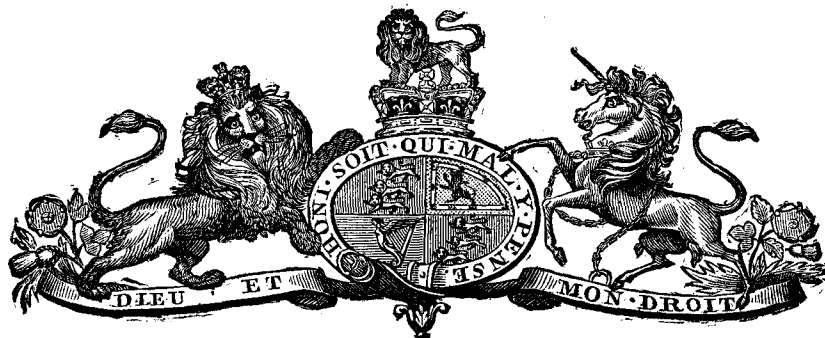

*Conditions of Policies under the New Zealand Government Insurance and Annuities Acts.*

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventeenth day of September, 1873.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**W**HEREAS by the New Zealand Government Insurance and Annuities Acts, 1869 and 1870, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make any regulations for carrying the said Acts into effect, and any such regulations to alter, amend, or revoke; and also to regulate the mode and form of making contracts under the said Acts as therein respectively mentioned: And whereas by an Order in Council made under the said Acts, bearing date the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the sixth day of June aforesaid, after reciting as therein is particularly recited, the Regulations therein mentioned were made and ordained: And whereas it is expedient that the conditions which attach to policies of life insurance mentioned and set forth in the twenty-first of the said Regulations should be altered, and that other conditions should be made as hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said Acts, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby order and declare that the conditions set forth in the said twenty-first Regulation shall be and the same are hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof that the conditions hereinafter set forth shall be and be deemed to be the conditions to which life insurance policies shall be subject, as provided by the said Regulation, that is to say:—

CONDITIONS OF POLICIES.

Policies shall become void if the statements of the proposer, as set forth in the proposal, or of the

person or persons examined by the Medical Examiner, as set forth in the medical examination, or any of such statements respectively, be untrue; or if any other paper or statement furnished by the proposer, or at his instance, on the faith of which the policy may have been issued, shall at any time be found to contain any wilfully untrue statement; or if there shall at any time be or have been any fraudulent concealment from the Commissioner of any important particular.

Policies shall become void if payment of the annual or other premium be not made within thirty days from the date stipulated in the policy; but such policies may be revived at any period not exceeding twelve calendar months after their expiration, on satisfactory proof being given of the unimpaired health of the person whose life is assured, and on payment of the premiums then in arrear, together with a fine not exceeding one-half per centum on the sum assured:

Provided that no policy which shall have been in force for twelve calendar months shall be forfeited by reason of such non-payment of premium until the expiration of a term of temporary insurance, to be calculated upon the surrender-value of the policy at the date of such non-payment of premium, in accordance with and to be subject to the provisions of Regulation No. 27 of the 4th June, 1873:

Provided also that no policy which shall have been in force for three years shall be wholly forfeited by such non-payment of premium, if the assured shall, within three months after such policy has lapsed, make application for a paid-up policy; and upon such application the Commissioner shall issue a paid-up policy equivalent to the surrender-value of the original policy at the date of such non-payment of premium: Provided further that such paid-up policy, when issued, shall be subject to all the terms, conditions, and liabilities of the original policy.

The sum assured under any policy will be paid in case of the death of the person whose life is assured during the days of grace (thirty days), notwithstanding the non-payment of the premium; but the amount so remaining unpaid shall be deducted from the sum assured at settlement.

Policies shall become void if the person whose life is assured shall proceed to any part of the globe within the twenty-fifth parallels of North and South latitude, except in passing or repassing through the same by sea, without having obtained the written consent of the Commissioner to visit or reside within the said parallels of latitude. Policies shall become void if the person whose life is assured shall die by suicide, whether sane or insane, within twelve months from the date of the policy. But policies shall not become void by any of the acts mentioned in this paragraph, so far as regards the interest therein of any person other than the life assured, if the life assured shall have done any such act as aforesaid without the knowledge of such other person, and if the person or one of the persons beneficially interested therein shall give notice to the Commissioner of such act as soon as it comes to his knowledge, and shall pay the additional premiums that could have been required for his consent to such act.

Policies (provided the age of the life assured shall have been admitted by the Commissioner) shall, upon the expiration of five years from the date of the policy, and upon the life assured having attained the age of thirty years, be exempt from forfeiture in all cases except fraud and non-payment of premium, unless previously to the expiration of such five years any misstatement, error, mistake, omission, or suppression shall be ascertained by the Commissioner, and notified in writing to the person in whose name such policy shall have been granted.

On claims being made, reasonable proof of the time of birth shall be required, unless age shall already have been admitted by the Commissioner.

On the death of any person whose life is assured, notice in writing of such death shall be immediately given to the Commissioner, and the amount assured shall not be payable until the expiration of fourteen days from the time that the proofs of identity and death of the person or persons upon whose life or lives the assurance has been effected shall have been supplied to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, and until the policy, duly discharged, shall have been delivered to the Commissioner or other duly appointed officer.
