At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of September, 1873.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867," it is enacted, that if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit: And whereas by virtue of a certificate of title bearing date the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, the parcel of land and hereditaments described in the Schedule hereto became vested in Parematau Ngamoko: And whereas the said Parematau Ngamoko is an infant under the age of twenty-one years :

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby order that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be and remain vested in

TARETE TE PARI,

as Trustee within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land at Putiki, in the District of Whanganui, in the Province of Wellington, and called or known by the name of Ngongohau No. 5, containing by admeasurement 3 acres and 27 perches, be the same more or less; bounded towards the North-east by the Ngongohau No. 4

Fixing Annual Rate to be charged for Sluice-heads of Water, under "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of September, 1873.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that

the Waste Lands Board or District Land Officer appointed for that purpose may, subject to the provisions of any Act regulating the gold fields, and to the regulations that now or hereafter may be in force relating to gold fields, authorize the holder of a miner's right to construct and use water races and sludge channels, dams, or reservoirs for mining purposes, and may also authorize any person to construct and use water races, dams, and reservoirs, for the purpose of irrigation, manufactures, or other industrial purposes, through or over Crown or private lands, whether in a proclaimed gold field or not, and to divert and use for such purposes any water which Her Majesty may lawfully divert and use; and to occupy for the purpose of depositing matter removed from such water races, sludge channels, dams, or reservoirs, the land immediately adjoining such water races and sludge channels, dams, or reservoirs, as therein mentioned: And whereas by the seventy-first section of the said Act it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and revoke regulations for imposing on the holders of licenses granted under this or any preceding Act, or under any rules and regulations that formerly have been, now are, or hereafter may be in force, empowering such holders to cut, construct, and use water races, sludge channels, dams, and reservoirs, such periodical rents, fees, or other payments, as he may think fit: Provided always that no less rate than two shillings and sixpence, nor more than twenty shillings per sluice-head per annum, shall be imposed upon or demanded on account of any water race lawfully held, occupied, and used by virtue of a license at the date of the passing of this Act: And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made imposing an annual rent on the holders of licenses for water races as hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Ferguson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. From and after the making of these Regulations there shall be imposed on the holders of licenses for water races, as hereinafter mentioned, an annual rent of two shillings and sixpence for every sluice-head of water.

2. These Regulations shall apply and extend to licenses for water races lawfully held, occupied, and used at the date of the passing of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," or which may have been issued subsequently thereto, and are now in force respectively; and shall also extend to such licenses as may hereafter be issued under the said Act.

LIGHTSHIPS, PORT PHILLIP AND CORTO BAY.

MASTERS of vessels, pilots, and others are hereby informed that during the repairs to the Lightship, West Channel, the lights will be shown from the Geelong lightship, which has been temporarily moored in the west channel, but owing to the height of the masts not being so great, the lights will not be visible so far, and the lower light will be shown from abaft instead of forward.

During the temporary removal of the Geelong Ship Channel Lightship the light will be exhibited from the spare lightship "Empire."

On or about the 19th proximo the revolving light on board the Gellibrand's Point Lightship will be replaced by a fixed bright light during the temporary removal of the lightship for repairs.

MIDDLE ISLAND (WEST COAST).

These lights are NOT to be used for crossing the OUTER Bar.

AFTER the 4th September, 1873, two lights, coloured red, will be shown for the guidance of vessels over the inner bar, from two skeleton beacons, erected in the western portion of the Town of Greymouth. The south-eastern or high light is twenty feet, and the north-western or lower light fifteen feet above high water during ordinary spring tides. The lights in one lead through the deepest water, over the shallow at the lower part of the Cross Channel, after passing the flagstaff inwards.

Mariners are cautioned that those lights are in no way to interfere with the lights at the flagstaff, and are only to be used for the navigation of that portion of the river extending from the flagstaff to the foot of Arney Street.
