Districts under "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858."

(L.S.) JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the thirteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute a district for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Geraldine District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said district, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such district:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the "Geraldine District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such district shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

GERALDINE DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the south-western bank of the River Rangitata, where it is intersected by the

north-west side of the Great South Road; thence following the north-west side of the said road to Section 5961; thence following the northern boundary line of Sections 5961 and 11526, and a line in continuation of the same to the eastern boundary of Section 9031; thence following the eastern and north-western boundaries of the latter section to the Geraldine Road; thence following that road south-easterly to the road running through Section 7319; thence following the latter road by Trig. pole 5, to the River Kakahu; thence westerly and northerly, following that river to its upper fork; thence by an east and west line true to the River Opaha; thence north-westerly following up that river to its most northerly source, and onwards in the same direction to the summit of the Two Thumb range of mountains; thence northerly following the summit of the said range to the boundary of the County of Westland, as determined by "The County of Westland Act, 1867;" thence by an east and west line true to the source of the River Clyde; and from thence returning down that river and the Rangitata before mentioned to the commencing point.

TEMUKA DISTRICT.

Commencing at the mouth of the Rangitata River; thence north-westerly, following the south-western bank of that river to the north-west side of the Great South Road; thence following the north-west side of the said road to Section 5961; thence following the northern boundary line of Sections 5961 and 11526, and a line in continuation of the same to the eastern boundary of Section 9031; thence following the eastern and north-western boundaries of the latter section to the Geraldine Road; thence following that road south-easterly to the road running through Section 7319; thence following the latter road by Trig. pole 5, to the River Kakahu; thence westerly and northerly, following that river to its upper fork; thence by an east and west line true to the River Opaha; thence north-westerly following up that river to its most northerly source, and onwards in the same direction to the summit of the Two Thumb range of mountains; thence southerly following the summit of the said range through Burke's Pass to Mackenzie's Pass; thence by a straight line to the nearest source of the River Tengawai; thence following down the southern bank of that river, and the Opihi to the sea; and from thence returning along the sea coast to the commencing point.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the thirteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute a district for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Geraldine District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said district, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised

within such district:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the "Geraldine District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such district shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

GERALDINE DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the south-western bank of the River Rangitata where it is intersected by the north-west side of the Great South Road; thence following the north-west side of the said road to Section 5961; thence following the northern boundary line of Sections 5961 and 11526, and a line in continuation of the same to the eastern boundary of Section 9031; thence following the eastern and north-western boundaries of the latter section to the

Geraldine Road; thence following that road southeasterly to the road running through Section 7319; thence following the latter road by Trig. pole 5, to the River Kakahu; thence westerly and northerly, following that river to its upper fork; thence by an east and west line true to the River Opaha; thence north-westerly, following up that river to its most northerly source, and onwards in the same direction to the summit of the Two Thumb range of mountains; thence northerly following the summit of the said range to the boundary of the County of Westland, as determined by "The County of Westland Act, 1867;" thence by an east and west line true to the source of the River Clyde; and from thence returning down that river and the Rangitata before mentioned to the commencing point.

TEMUKA DISTRICT.

Commencing at the mouth of the Rangitata River; thence north-westerly, following the south-western bank of that river to the north-west side of the Great South Road; thence following the north-west side of the said road to Section 5961; thence following the northern boundary line of Sections 5961 and 11526, and a line in continuation of the same to the eastern boundary of Section 9031; thence following the eastern and north-western boundaries of the latter section to the Geraldine Road; thence following that road south-easterly to the road running through Section 7319; thence following the latter road by Trig. pole 5 to the River Kakahu; thence westerly and northerly, following that river to its upper fork; thence by an east and west line true to the River Opaha; thence north-westerly following up that river to its most northerly source, and onwards in the same direction to the summit of the Two Thumb range of mountains; thence southerly following the summit of the said range through Burke's Pass to Mackenzie's Pass; thence by a straight line to the nearest source of the River Tengawai; thence following down the southern bank of that river and the Opihi to the sea; and from thence returning along the sea coast to the commencing point.

within such districts:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations so far as relates to the Otepopo and Palmerston Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such districts shall be and is hereby divided, for the purposes of the said Act, into three districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:--

OTEPOPO DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the northern branch of the Kakanui River to its source; thence by a line in a westerly direction to the Kakanui Mountains; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South-east by the Waianakarua River and its southern branch; and towards the South-west by the Kakanui Mountains.

HAMPDEN DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-west by the Waianakarua River and its southern branch; towards the East by the ocean; and towards the South-west by the Horse Range.

PALMERSTON DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-east by the Otepopo and Hampden Registra-tion Districts; towards the South-east by the ocean; towards the South-west by Pleasant River from its outlet to a point due east of Mount Pleasant; towards the South by a straight line extending due east and west from Pleasant River to the north branch of the Waikouaiti River, and passing across Mount Pleasant; and towards the West by the Waikouaiti River, and the Hyde Registration District.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

OTEPOPO DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the northern branch of the Kakanui River Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, to its source; thence by a line in a westerly direction Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's to the Kakanui Mountains; towards the East by the ocean; towards the South-east by the Waianakarua | to say,—Hokitika, Greymouth, Paroa, Arahura, River and its southern branch; and towards the Kanieri, Totara, and Okarito, the boundaries of which South-west by the Kakanui Mountains.

HAMPDEN DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-west by the Waianakarua River and its southern branch; towards the East by the ocean; and towards the South-west by the Horse Range.

PALMERSTON DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the Northeast by the Otepopo and Hampden Registration Districts; towards the South-east by the ocean; towards the South-west by Pleasant River, from its outlet to a point due east of Mount Pleasant; towards the South by a straight line extending due east and west from Pleasant River to the north branch of the Waikouaiti River and passing across Mount Pleasant; and towards the West by the Waikouaiti River and the Hyde Registration District.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Providing for Election of Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Westland.

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor. (L.s.)

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Province of Westland Act, 1873," it is enacted that the Provincial Council of the Province of Westland shall in the first instance consist of such number of Members over and above the Superintendent of the said Province as the Governor shall by Proclamation direct and appoint, not being less in number than fifteen: And it is also enacted that the Governor by Proclamation may constitute within such Province convenient Electoral Districts for the election of Members of the Provincial Council, and may appoint and declare the number of Members to be elected for every such District for such Provincial Council, and to make provision for the formation of the first Electoral Rolls for the election of the Superintendent of such Province, and the election of the Members of the Provincial Council thereof:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim,

direct, appoint, constitute, and provide as follows:—

1. The Provincial Council of the Province of Westland shall consist of fifteen Members.

2. The said Province shall be and the same is hereby divided into seven Electoral Districts, that is

said Districts are described and set forth in the Schedule to this Proclamation, and are delineated on the map or plan thereof deposited in the office at Wellington of the Colonial Secretary, and which map or plan is signed by Gerhard Mueller, Esquire, Chief Surveyor, appointed under "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870."

3. The number of Members to be elected to serve in the Provincial Council for the said several Electoral

Districts shall be as follows, viz.:

For the Electoral District of Hokitika, 3 For the Electoral District of Greymouth, 3 3 Members. ditto. For the Electoral District of Paroa, ditto. For the Electoral District of Arahura, ditto. For the Electoral District of Kanieri, ditto. For the Electoral District of Totara, ditto. For the Electoral District of Okarito, ditto.

4. The first Electoral Rolls for the election of Members of the said Provincial Council shall be prepared by

GERARD GEORGE FITZGERALD, Esq., R.M.,

who, within fifteen days from the date hereof, shall form such Rolls by placing the name of every person who is at this present time registered as an elector entitled to vote in the election of Members of the House of Representatives on account of any tenements or hereditaments comprised within the limits of the said Province, on the Electoral Roll of that one of the said districts within which the tenements and hereditaments in respect whereof he is so registered are situated.

5. The Rolls so to be formed as aforesaid may be partly written and partly printed, or wholly written or wholly printed, as may be most convenient, and shall, within twenty-two days from the date hereof, be severally published by the said Gerard George FitzGerald, by affixing the same to the outer door of the Resident Magistrate's Court in the respective districts to which such Rolls shall relate, or in some other public and conspicuous place within the said

districts.

6. Every such Roll so affixed as aforesaid shall be signed by the said Gerard George FitzGerald, and from and after the day of such publication the said several Rolls shall be the Electoral Rolls to be used respectively for the said districts for the election of Members of the said Provincial Council until new Electoral Rolls shall be made for the same under the provisions of the law in force for the time being for the registration of electors.
7. The first Electoral Roll for the election of the

Superintendent of the said Province shall be prepared by the said Gerard George FitzGerald, who, within fifteen days from the date hereof, shall form the same by placing thereon the name of every person who is at this present time registered as an elector entitled to vote in the election of Members of the House of Representatives on account of any tenements or hereditaments comprised within the limits of the said Province, so as that the whole of such names shall appear on one Roll to be formed under the authority hereof.

8. The provisions contained in the fifth and sixth clauses hereof shall be applicable to the formation of the said Roll for the election of the said Superintendent, except that it shall only be necessary to publish the same by affixing copies thereof signed by the said Gerard George FitzGerard to the outer doors of the Resident Magistrate's Courts at Hokitika

and Greymouth respectively.

From and after the day of such publication the said Roll shall be the Electoral Roll to be used for the election of the Superintendent of the said Province until a new Electoral Roll shall be made for the same in accordance with law.

SCHEDULE.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF HOKITIKA.

COMPRISING the Town of Hokitika, being all that parcel of land containing six hundred and forty acres, more or less, situate on the Hokitika River, com-mencing at a point on the high bank of the old bed of the aforesaid river, the said point being forty chains forty links west of Trigonometrical Station No. 31; thence following a line bearing north twenty degrees fourteen minutes east (magnetic) a distance of sixty-two chains sixty-five links; thence westerly at a right angle a distance of eighty-five chains forty links to the sea beach, following the said beach southerly to the mouth of the Hokitika River; and from thence returning along the northern bank thereof and the high bank of the old river bed above mentioned to the commencing point; and also all that parcel of land containing six hundred and forty acres, more or less, situate on the Hokitika River. Bounded—on the Northward by Reserve No. 271 (in red); on the Westward by the sea; on the East by Section No. 8238 and a line in continuation of the western boundary thereof; and on the Southward by a line at right angles to the last-described boundary, and about one hundred and thirty chains distant on the average from the reserve above mentioned.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF GREYMOUTH.

Comprising the Town of Greymouth, being all that parcel of land commencing at the South Spit at the mouth of the River Grey. Bounded on the West by a line of one hundred and sixty chains and eighty links, extending along the beach from the South Spit aforesaid; thence along the South Town Belt, one hundred and fifteen chains and fifty links; thence along the East Town Belt, one hundred and twenty chains and ninety links; thence along the Native Reserve No. 31, for a distance of forty-one chains and thirty links, to the River Grey; and thence along the River Grey to the sea.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF PAROA.

Commencing at a point on the sea coast one hundred and sixty chains and eighty links to the southward of the South Spit at the mouth of the River Grey; thence easterly along the southern boundary of the Greymouth District hereinbefore defined, one hundred and fifteen chains and fifty links; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the last-named district to the River Grey; thence casterly along that river to the junction with it of the Arnold River; thence up the Arnold River to Lake Brunner, and along the boundary of the Province of Nelson to the source of the Teremakau; thence following down the northern

bank of the Teremakau to the coast, and along the coast to the commencing point.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF ARAHURA.

Commencing at the mouth of the Teremakau up that river to its source, then southerly along the dividing range to the source of the Arahura River; thence following down the southern bank of that river to the sea coast, and northwards along the coast to the commencing point.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF KANIERI.

Commencing at the mouth of the Arahura River up the southern bank of that river to its source; thence southerly along the dividing range to the source of the Kokatahi; thence down the southern bank of that river to its junction with the Hokitika River; thence southerly up the western bank of Hokitika River to line HO; thence westerly down line HO to Mahinapua Lake and by a line touching the northern bank of the said lake to the sea coast, and northerly along the coast to the commencing point excepting the Town of Hokitika.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF TOTARA.

Commencing at the source of the Kokatahi River; thence down the southern bank of that river to its junction with the Hokitika River; thence southerly up the western bank of Hokitika River to line HO; thence westerly down line HO to Mahinapua Lake, and by a line touching the northern bank of the said lake to the sea coast; thence southerly along the coast to the Wanganui River; thence up the said river to its source, and northerly along the dividing range to the commencing point.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF OKARITO.

Commencing at the mouth of the Wanganui River; thence up the said river to its source; thence along the dividing range to the boundary of the Province of Otago, following the said boundary to the coast, and northerly along the coast to the commencing point.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Waste Lands Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time and from time to time, to except from sale, and either reserve to Her Majesty or dispose of in such other manner as for the public interest may seem best, such of the waste lands of the Crown in any of the Provinces of the Colony as may be required for the purposes of military defence, or for the construction of trunk lines of road, or as sites for public buildings for the use of the General Government, or for other purposes of public utility or convenience:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in that behalf vested in him, doth hereby except from sale and reserve to Her Majesty the parcel of the waste lands of the Crown particularly specified and described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule mentioned and set opposite the description

of the said parcel of land.

Sir,—I transmit, for your information and guidance, two copies of an Act passed during the recent Session

of Parliament, entitled "An Act to amend 'The Extradition Act of 1870."

The Officer Administering the Government of New Zealand,

CHAPTER LX.

An Act to amend "The Extradition Act, 1870." [5th August, 1873.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act shall be construed as one with "The Extradition Act, 1870," (in this Act referred to as the principal Act); and the principal Act and this Act may be cited together as "The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873," and this Act may be cited alone as "The Extradition Act, 1873."

2. Whereas by section six of the principal Act it is enacted as follows:—

"Where this Act applies in the case of any foreign State, every fugitive criminal of that State who is in or suspected of being in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, or that part which is specified in the order applying this Act (as the case may be), shall be liable to be apprehended and surrendered in manner provided by this Act, whether the crime in respect of which the surrender is sought was committed before or after the date of the order, and whether there is or is not any concurrent jurisdiction in any Court of Her Majesty's dominions over that crime."

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the application of the said section to crimes committed before the passing of the principal Act, and it is expedient to remove such doubts, it is therefore hereby declared, that

A crime committed before the date of the order includes in the said section a crime committed before the passing of the principal Act; and the principal Act and this Act shall be construed accordingly.

3. Whereas a person who is accessory before or after the fact, or counsels, procures, commands, aids, or abets the commission of any indictable offence, is by English law liable to be tried and punished as if he were the principal offender, but doubts have arisen whether such person as well as the principal offender can be surrendered under the principal Act, and it is expedient to remove such doubts; it is therefore hereby declared, that

Every person who is accused or convicted of having counselled, procured, commanded, aided, or abetted the commission of any extradition crime, or of being accessory before or after the fact to any extradition crime, shall be deemed for the purposes of the principal Act and this Act to be accused or convicted of having committed such crime, and shall be liable to be apprehended and surrendered accordingly.

4. Be it declared, that the provisions of the principal Act relating to depositions and statements on oath taken in a foreign State, and copies of such original depositions and statements, do and shall extend to affirmations taken in a foreign State, and copies of such affirmations.

5. A Secretary of State may, by order under his hand and seal, require a Police Magistrate or a Justice of the Peace to take evidence for the pur-

poses of any criminal matter pending in any Court or tribunal in any foreign State; and the Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, upon the receipt of such order, shall take the evidence of every witness appearing before him for the purpose, in like manner as if such witness appeared on a charge against some defendant for an indictable offence, and shall certify at the foot of the depositions so taken that such evidence was taken before him, and shall transmit the same to the Secretary of State; such evidence may be taken in the presence or absence of the person charged, if any, and the fact of such presence or absence shall be stated in such deposition.

Any person may, after payment or tender to him of a reasonable sum for his costs and expenses in this behalf, be compelled, for the purposes of this section to attend and give evidence and answer questions and produce documents, in like manner and subject to the like conditions as he may in the case of a charge

preferred for an indictable offence.

Every person who wilfully gives false evidence before a Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace under this section shall be guilty of perjury.

Provided that nothing in this section shall apply in the case of any criminal matter of a political

character.

6. The jurisdiction conferred by section sixteen of the principal Act on a Stipendiary Magistrate, and a Sheriff or Sheriff-Substitute, shall be deemed to be in addition to, and not in derogation or exclusion of,

the jurisdiction of the Police Magistrate.

7. For the purposes of the principal Act and this Act, a diplomatic representative of a foreign State shall be deemed to include any person recognized by the Secretary of State as a Consul-General of that State; and a Consul or Vice-Consul shall be deemed to include any person recognized by the Governor of a British possession as a Consular Officer of a foreign State.

8. The principal Act shall be construed as if there were included in the First Schedule to that Act the list of crimes contained in the Schedule to this Act.
