Lands declared to be Waste Lands of the Crown.

James Fergusson, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," the Governor was empowered, from time to time, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to purchase or in any way acquire any land in the North Island of New Zealand, or any interests therein which the owners might be willing to sell, convey, or surrender, as therein mentioned: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1873," it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums of two hundred thousand (200,000) pounds and five hundred thousand (500,000) pounds therein mentioned, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall by Proclamation declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as hereafter provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws for the time being in force in the Province in which such land is, regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown within such Province; and thereupon such lands so proclaimed shall become subject to such provisions: And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto have been purchased out of the sum of two hundred thousand (200,000) pounds declared to be applicable for the purchase of lands in (IV.) of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870:" And whereas it is expedient. the North Island under the provisions of Part Four And whereas it is expedient that the said lands should be declared to be waste lands as hereinafter set forth: Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pur-

subject (except as by the said Act is provided) to be sold and dealt with according to the provision of the laws for the time being in force in the Province of Auckland regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown within such Province.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Auckland, this ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-

Ramos Island, Indispensable Straits. THE following remarks by Navigating Lieut. John Browne, which have been furnished by Commander Challis, of H.M.S. "Rosario," are published

for general information :-

Ramos Island is about 2 miles long in a N.W. by N. and S.E. by S. direction, 200 feet high, having off its N.W. point an islet about 100 feet high, with two smaller ones between, and several pinnacle rocks.

The distance between the N.W. islet and Ramos

Island is about $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

Making Ramos Island from the northward, it has the appearance of a saddle, with two small islets off

its western side.

Passing to the eastward of these islands, sounded in $12\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, and observed shoal water extending from the island to the eastward as far as could be observed from the mast-head; Ramos Island bearing N.W. by W. distant 3 miles. Shoal is about 4 miles across, north and south.

A heavy swell was running at the time, but no

breakers were observed.

The channel to the west of the island appeared clear.

"Conflict," reports having sounded in 7 fathoms, 4 miles east of Ramos Island.
