Telegraph Regulations.

(L.S.) JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the New Zealand Gazette, to fix, alter, and abolish the rates of postage at any time payable within the Colony for the transmission of letters by post either between places within New Zealand, or to or from places beyond seas, as therein provided; and by the said Act it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make rules and regulations for the managing of the several Post Offices for the receiving, conveying, or delivery of letters as therein mentioned, and any such rules and regulations at any time in force to alter, vary, or revoke: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, regulations were made permitting telegraphic messages originating in the Colony of Victoria to be transmitted through the Post Office in this Colony without prepayment of postage, as therein mentioned: And whereas it is now expedient that regulations should be made whereby telegraphic messages originating in the Colonies of New South Wales, Tasmania, and Queensland should be transmitted through the Post Office in this Colony, without prepayment of postage, as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of every power and authority enabling me in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby order, proclaim, and declare that the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the tenth day of June, be in force within the Colony of New Zealand for the purposes therein particularly set forth.

1. Telegraphic messages originating in the Colonies of New South Wales, Tasmania, and Queensland may be transmitted by post as letters for delivery in New

Zealand, without any payment for postage; and letters addressed to any officer of the Telegraph Department in charge of the Telegraph Office at any port or place in the Colony of New Zealand, containing any such telegraphic messages for transmission, with no writing other than the necessary directions for transmission, may be transmitted free

of postage.

2. Every such message or letter shall bear on the outside of the cover, above the address, the words "Telegraphic Message only," and shall be posted to its place of destination by the officer in charge of the Telegraph Department by whom it shall be received; and every such officer shall, immediately before posting such letter, subscribe his usual signature across the face of the cover of such letter or telegraphic

message

Delegation of Governor's Powers under "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," to the Superin-tendent of the Province of Nelson.

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall

be lawful for the Governor, if and whenever he shall | Zealand until an order directing the same to be put have, by lease, agreement, or otherwise by consent of the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has been extinguished, or the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has not been extinguished, obtained power from such Native or other owners to authorize entry on such lands for mining for gold, by Proclamation issued under the third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to include such land within any gold field, or to proclaim such land a gold field: And by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the preceding sections of the said Act (including the above-recited sections), subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as the Governor may think

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power for that purpose vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby delegate to

OSWALD CURTIS, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, all the powers vested in the Governor by the said recited section of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," to have, hold, and exercise, within the Province of Nelson, the said powers hereby delegated to the said Oswald Curtis, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that no Proclamation affecting any lands shall be made by the said Oswald Curtis under the powers hereby delegated to him, unless the Governor shall have obtained power to authorize entry on such lands for mining for gold, in the manner required by the said Act.

At Wellington, this fifth day of June, 1874. Present:

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the nineteenth section of "The Public Health Act, 1872," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders from time to time directing that the provisions thereinafter in Second Part of the said Act contained, or any of them, be put in force in New Zealand, or in such parts thereof, or in such places therein, as in such orders respectively may be expressed, and may in like manner revoke or renew any such order; and, subject to revocation or renewal as aforesaid, every such order shall be in force for six calendar months from the publication of such order, or for such shorter period as in such order shall be expressed, and no longer; and every such order shall be published in the General Government Gazette, and such publication shall be conclusive evidence of such order to all intents and purposes; and none of the said provisions shall be in force in any part of New

in force shall have been made and published as aforesaid:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of all power and authority in this behalf in him vested, doth hereby direct that the provisions contained in the sections of the said Act numbered from twenty to forty-five, both inclusive, shall be put in force in the districts in the Province of Auckland mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

DISTRICT OF MOUNT EDEN. Bounded towards the North by a road which forms the southern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 6a, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, and 16 of Section No. 6 of the Suburbs of Auckland to the Epsom Road; towards the East by the Epsom Road aforesaid from the southeastern angle of Allotment No. 16 of section and. suburbs before mentioned to the south-eastern angle of Allotment No. 35 of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid; towards the South by the southern boundary of Allotment No. 35 aforesaid to the road which forms the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 58 of Suburban Section 10 aforesaid, thence crossing said road and following the western side of the same to the south-eastern angle of Allotment No. 57 of section and suburbs aforesaid, thence by the northern side of the road forming the southern boundary of Allotment No. 57 before mentioned to the road which forms the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 79, thence following eastern side of said road to its junction with a road which forms the northern boundary of Allotment 79 aforesaid, thence crossing said road and continuing along the southern side of the same to the road which forms the western boundary of Allotment No. 115 of the section and suburbs last named, thence crossing said road to the north-eastern angle of Allotment No. 125, also of said section and suburbs, and continuing along the northern boundary of said lot to its north-western angle; towards the West by the western boundaries of Allot-ments Nos. 126, 127, 128, 129, and 130, thence crossing a road one hundred links wide, and by the western boundaries of Allotments Nos. 131, 132, 133, 134, 135, and 136 of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid to the north-western angle of Allotment No. 136 last mentioned; and towards the North-west by the northern boundary of Allotment No. 136 aforesaid to the point of its intersection by a line being the production in a southerly direction of the western boundary of Mr. Baker's land, thence northerly by said boundary to a line running parallel to and at a distance of about 235 links from the road which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 11 of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid, and continuing easterly along said line to the Mount Roskill Road, thence northerly by the western side of said road to the north-eastern angle of Allotment No. 11 last named, thence crossing the Mount Roskill Road to its eastern side and continuing southerly along its eastern side to the northern boundary of Allotment No. 2g of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid, thence by the northern and north-eastern boundaries of Allotment No. 2e aforesaid, and the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 2H, also of section and suburbs last named to the south-western angle of Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 10 before mentioned, and thence by the northwestern boundary of Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 10 of Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid to the boundary first described, the place of commencement.

DISTRICT OF MOUNT ALBERT. Bounded towards the North by the northern

boundary of Section No. 5 of the Suburbs of Auckland, from the north-western angle of Allotment No. 35 to the north-eastern angle of Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 5 aforesaid, and by the northern boundary of Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 7 to the road which forms its eastern boundary; towards the East by the road which forms the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 7 aforesaid, and also the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 2 of Section No. 10 to the northernmost point of Allotment No. 1 of said section, thence by the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid, the north-eastern boundaries of Allotments No. 2H and 2G, and the northern boundary of Allotment No. 2G last named to the eastern side of the Mount Roskill Road, and continuing northerly along its eastern side to the north-western angle of Allotment No. 2r of said Section No. 10, thence westerly crossing the Mount Roskill Road to its western side, and continuing southerly along said road to a line parallel to and at a distance of about 235 links from the road which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 11 of Section No. 10 aforesaid, thence by said line westerly to the north-western angle of Mr. Baker's land, and continuing southerly along the western boundary of said land and by the same boundary produced in a southerly direction to the northern boundary of Allotment No. 136, also of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland before mentioned, thence westerly by the northern boundary of Allotment No. 136 aforesaid to the north-eastern angle of Allotment No. 137 of Section No. 10 aforesaid, thence by the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 137 aforesaid, and the eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 138, 139, 140, 141, 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, and 178 of Section No. 10 aforesaid, as also the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 46 of the Parish of Titirangi, to its south-eastern angle; to-wards the South by the centre of the road which forms the south-western boundary of Allotment No. 46 aforesaid, and the south-west boundaries of Allotments Nos. 45 and 44, and part of the south-western boundary of Allotment No. 43 to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 50, thence by the centre of said road to a point being in continuation of the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 51, thence crossing the beforementioned road and by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Allotment No. 51 aforesaid to the road which forms its south-western boundary, thence crossing said road and by the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 52 to the rivulet, thence westerly along said rivulet to the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 65; towards the West by the rivulet aforesaid from the north-eastern angle of said Lot No. 65 to a line running parallel to and at a distance of three chains from the southern side of the New North Road, thence by said line to the road which forms the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 64, thence northerly by the centre of the said road to the southern boundary of Allotment No. 62, thence easterly by said boundary to Oakley's Stream, and by said stream to the south-western angle of Allotment No. 32; and towards the North-west by the southern boundary of Allotment No. 32 aforesaid to the road which forms its eastern boundary, thence crossing said road and by the southern and eastern boundaries of Allotment No. 35 and the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 29, all of the Parish of Titirangi aforesaid, to the Meola Stream, thence by the said stream eastward to the south-western point of Allotment No. 172 of Section No. 10 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid, thence by the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of said Allotment No. 172 to the road which forms its eastern boundary,

thence northerly along the centre of said road to its junction with the road which forms the northeastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 176 and 177 of said Section No. 10, and continuing along the centre of said road to the south-western angle of Allotment No. 37 of Section No. 5 of the Suburbs of Auckland aforesaid, thence by the western boundary of said Allotment No. 37 and the western boundary of said Allotments Nos. 36 and 35 of Section No. 5 aforesaid to the point of commencement.

The numbers of the population must not be taken as absolutely correct, as the compilation from the schedules may cause a slight alteration. The numbers given do not include the persons on board ship.

The number of births registered was less in May than previously during the year. The highest number was 292 in February. The smallest previous number was 238 in March.

Of the total deaths, males contributed 47; females, 46: 35 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 37:35 of the whole number; 30 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

There is a noticeable reduction in the number of deaths of children under 5 years within the last two months. They were, in January, 66; in February, 77; in March, 73; in April, 47 (including 2 Nelson deaths); in May, 35.

There were 6 cases of death of persons over 65 years of age, viz., 5 females in Auckland (aged respectively 66 years and 73 years; 2, 80 years; and 1, 89 years); and 1 male in Dunedin, 67 years of age.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the proportions per cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs named, and that were registered, during the month of May, 1874.
