Places and times appointed for Vaccination.

James Fergusson, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor shall from time to time appoint a convenient place or places, in each district constituted as therein shall from time to time appoint a convenient place or places, in each district constituted as therein mentioned, for the performance of vaccination therein, and shall take the most effectual means for giving from time to time, to all persons resident within such district, due notice of the days and hours at which a Public Vaccinator will attend at such place to vaccinate all persons not already successfully vaccinated, who may then appear there, and also of the days and hours at which such Public Vaccinator will attend at such place to inspect the progress of such vaccination in persons so vaccinated: And whereas certain districts have been appointed under the said Act for the purpose of affording facilities for vaccination therein, and certain persons have been appointed Public Vaccinators in such districts, and it is expedient that places should be appointed for the performance of vaccination, and that notice of the days and hours at which the Public Vaccinator will attend for the nurposes aforesaid should be given: at which the Public Vaccinator will attend for the purposes aforesaid should be given:

NORTH ISLAND, WEST COAST—MANUKAU HEADS LIGHT.

Notice is hereby given, that on and after the 1st September next, a Fixed White Light, of the third order dioptric, will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise from a tower erected on brow of the Bluff forming the south side of the entrance to Manukau Harbour, bearing from Paratutai E. 11° 15′ S., distant $1\frac{1}{3}$ of a mile, and in lat. 37° 3′ 30″ S., and long. 174° 33′ 30″ E., as measured on the Admiralty Chart.

The tower is 20 feet high, and the light will be 385 feet above the sea level; and allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye, it will be visible from seaward in clear weather at a distance of $26\frac{1}{3}$ nautic miles between the bearings of N. 13° W. or N. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. nearly, and S. 74° E. or E. by S. $\frac{1}{3}$ S. A very narrow arc of light will be, however, obscured by top of Paratutai when the light bears E.S.E.

Note.—Masters of vessels should be cautious in approaching the Manukau in thick or foggy weather, for although the light, from its power and altitude, should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 26 miles, it will only be visible in thick weather at a con-

siderably less distance. Bearings are magnetic and from seaward.
