Land reserved as a Site for a Telegraph and Post Office.

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor. (L.s.)A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Buildings Reserves Act, 1867," it is enacted that whenever any land not included in any Crown grant, in any province, shall have been or shall be reserved for any public purpose whatever by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of any province, and shall have been or shall be appropriated, set apart, or used as the site of any Post Office, Custom House, Magistrate's site of any Post Office, Custom Posts of the Posts of t Court, Gaol, Telegraph Office, or any other public building for the use of the General Government or any department thereof, or for any purpose of public utility or convenience connected with the General Government administration, it shall be lawful for the Governor after he shall have received a resolution agreed to by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of such province for the time being, to declare, by a Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, that such land shall thenceforth cease to be a reserve for the public purpose for which the same shall have been originally reserved, and the same shall be a reserve for such public purpose as the Governor shall declare in and by such Proclamation; and thereupon such land shall thenceforth be deemed to be land reserved under the twelfth section of "The Waste Lands Act, 1858," and subject to be dealt

And whereas the Provincial Council of Canterbury did, on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, pass a resolution recom-mending that the reserve described in the Schedule hereto should be set apart as a reserve as a site for a Telegraph and Post Office, and the Superintendent of the said Province of Canterbury did signify his assent

Now therefore, know ye that I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Act aforesaid and by "The Waste Lands Act, 1858," do hereby declare that the land described in the said Schedule hereto shall henceforth be a reserve as a site for a Telegraph and Post Office.

Station for Quarantine appointed.

(L.S.) JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act, 1872," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by any order notified by Proclamation in the Gazette, appoint certain stations within or near any harbour or place within New Zealand for the performance of Quarantine, under the Third Part of the said Act, where all vessels liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, shall perform the same: And whereas by Proclamation under my hand, bearing date the fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the sixth November, one thousand eight hundred and seventythree, number sixty-five, the place mentioned and described in the Schedule thereto was appointed and ordered to be a station for the performance of quaran-ALL that parcel of land in the Province of Canter- | tine, under the Third Part of the said Act, by vessels

liable to quarantine arriving at the Bluff Harbour: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation, and to appoint the place mentioned in the Schedule hereto as the station where vessels arriving at the Bluff Harbour, liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, shall

perform the same:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me for that purpose, do hereby cancel and revoke the said hereinbefore in part recited Proclamation of the fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three; and further, by this Proclamation do order and appoint that the place named and described in the Schedule hereto shall be, and the same is hereby appointed to be, the Station for the performance of Quarantine under the Third Part of the said Act, in the case of vessels liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, arriving at the Bluff Harbour.

QUARANTINE GROUND, BLUFF HARBOUR.

All that piece or parcel of land in the Province of Otago, situated in the Campbelltown Hundred, and containing about three hundred (300) acres, more or less, above high watermark. Fixing Annual Meeting for the Mahurangi District under Petty Sessions Act.

(L.S.) James Fergusson, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that as soon as conveniently may

be after the establishment of a Petty Sessions District, and afterwards from time to time as may be deemed expedient, the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, appoint a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident in such district to be yearly held within such district, at some specified time and place, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the Petty Sessions District (amongst others) of Mahurangi was defined and established:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the Public Hall in the township of Warkworth was appointed to be the place, and the first Monday in the month of July the time, at which a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident within such district should be yearly held, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance: And whereas no meeting was held at the place appointed on the first.

Monday of July last:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority in that behalf vested in me, do hereby proclaim and appoint that for the said Mahurangi District a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident within such district shall be yearly held at the Public Hall in the township of Warkworth, at twelve o'clock noon on the first Monday in the month of September, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance.
