*Description, Line, and Limits of Deviation of a portion of the Railway from Mount Rochfort to Westport, in the Province of Nelson.*

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is enacted that the railways to be constructed under the said Act shall be only such railways as shall from time to time be determined by the General Assembly: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions contained therein, the Governor may construct, or cause to be constructed, any lines of railway which shall be prescribed by the General Assembly as railways to be constructed under the said Act, or any part or parts thereof, and acquire the necessary engines, plant, and machinery for working and using the same, or any of them: And it is also thereby enacted that, whenever the Governor shall determine to construct any such railway, or any part thereof, it shall be lawful for him, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare and define the limits and description and line thereof, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of such railway, subject to the provisions of any Act defining such limits and descriptions; and any such Proclamation may refer to maps, plans, or drawings to be deposited in the office of the Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court in the Province in which such railway or part thereof is proposed to be constructed, and any maps, plans, or drawings so referred to shall be deemed to form part of such Proclamation; and upon the publication of such Proclamation, the provisions and regulations contained in the Seventh Part of the said Act shall be applicable to the railway, and to the lands to which the Proclamation shall relate: And it is also thereby enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to make, construct, and maintain any such railway as aforesaid, with proper works, approaches, and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at the place delineated on, and extending along the lines set forth in, and terminating at a point described in the Act or Proclamation proclaiming and defining such railway, or shown in the maps, plans, or drawings referred to in such Act or

Proclamation: And it is also thereby enacted that the Governor may direct that any part of such line of railway may be constructed on and along any part of any public highway, and that any part of any such line of railway may be constructed on or through any public reserves: And it is also thereby enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Part of the said Act and of the Acts incorporated therewith, the Governor may exercise all or any of the powers by that Part of the said Act or the said incorporated Acts conferred upon him for the construction of any such railway, and may enter upon, and cause to be entered upon, all lands within the Colony for the purpose of making such surveys as may be necessary, and may take and hold all the lands required for the railway along the line set forth and described as aforesaid, or within the limits of deviation described in the Proclamation relating thereto, and may temporarily occupy and use such lands as may be necessary on either side of the railway, during the construction thereof:

And whereas by "The Railways Act, 1871," and "The Railways Act, 1872," and "The Railways Act, 1873," it is enacted that the Governor may, under the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly recited Act and of the now reciting Acts, construct and maintain, or cause to be constructed and maintained, the several lines of railway specified therein: And it is also thereby enacted that the line of the railways thereby authorized to be constructed shall be fixed by the Governor, and shall commence and terminate at points to be fixed by the Governor: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is enacted that as to any railway which the Governor has been authorized to construct, and to fix the commencing and termination points and line thereof, it shall be competent for him, if he thinks fit, instead of fixing and proclaiming such points and the whole line at one time, to fix and proclaim portions of such line from time to time, and the commencing and termination points of any such portion or portions, and the limits and description of any such portion or portions, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of any such portion or portions, and to construct any portion or portions so fixed, and to take the lands for the same; and any

such portion so proclaimed shall be deemed to be a railway within the meaning of the said Act and the said amending Act and this Act:

And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is enacted that, at any time after the expiration of twenty-one days from the publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and in a newspaper ordinarily circulating in the district, of a Proclamation under the thirteenth section of the said Act, whether of the whole or a portion or portions of a line of railway, the Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty, may enter upon, take possession of, use and hold, or cause to be entered upon, taken possession of, used and held, so much of the lands defined in such Proclamation as proposed to be taken as shall be required to be taken, purchased, or permanently used for the purposes of such railway, notwithstanding that an agreement shall not have been come to or an award made for the purchase or compensation money to be paid in respect of such lands:

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Act it is also enacted that in any case in which a road or right of road has been or hereafter may be reserved in any Crown grant, and in any case in which, under "The Native Lands Act, 1865," or any law for the time being in force relating to the sale of waste lands of the Crown, or any law whatever, there is a right to take a public road through any lands, it shall be lawful, after such road shall have been surveyed, to construct under the said Acts any railway, or any part of any railway, on the road so surveyed, notwithstanding that such road may not have been made:

And whereas the Governor has determined to construct and maintain a portion of the railway from Mount Rochfort to Westport, authorized to be constructed by "The Railways Act, 1871," and "The Railways Act, 1872," and "The Railways Act, 1873," which said portion is hereinafter described:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and in exercise of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and define the limits, description, and line of the said portion of the said railway, to be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and that the lands specified and described in the Second Schedule hereto are proposed to be taken for the purposes of the said portion of the said railway; and that the limits of deviation shall be those set forth in the said First Schedule hereto; and in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities conferred on me in that behalf, I do hereby fix the point of commencement of the said portion of the said railway to be at or near a point which is situated in the continuation of the centre line of Adderly Street, and about twenty chains, more or less, north of Gladstone Street, in the Town of Westport, in the Province of Nelson, and the point of termination thereof to be at or near a point which is situated in the Buller Local Revenue Board District, in the same province, the said point being in a south-easterly direction, about 150 chains, more or less, distant from the mouth of the River Wariatea.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

*Limits, Description, Line, and Limits of Deviation of a portion of the Railway from Mount Rochfort to Westport, in the Province of Nelson.*

COMMENCING at or near a point which is situated in the continuation of the centre line of Adderly Street, and about twenty chains, more or less, north of Glad-

stone Street, in the Town of Westport, and terminating at or near a point which is situated in the Buller Local Revenue Board District, the said point being in a south-easterly direction, about 150 chains, more or less, distant from the mouth of the River Wariatea, as the limits, description, and line thereof are set forth in the plan, and described in the book of reference referred to on the face of the said plan, and which plan and book are authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Edward Richardson, Minister for Public Works, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Nelson, or within the limits of deviation set forth in the said plan by dotted red lines, being generally not more than 110 yards on either side of the said line, except where otherwise shown on plan, and passing in, through, over, or into the several places, lands, roads, reserves, rivers, watercourses, enumerated or mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE,

##### OR BOOK OF REFERENCE.

*Lands and Roads, &c., proposed to be taken for the purposes of the portion of the Railway from Mount Rochfort to Westport, hereinbefore described.*

So much of the lands and roads hereinafter mentioned as are required for the said portion of the said railway along the line of the said railway hereinbefore defined, or within the limits of deviation aforesaid, as the lands are described and defined in the plan or book of reference aforesaid.

##### TOWN OF WESTPORT.

All that part or parcel of land continuing along the whole length of Palmerston Street, and lying to the westward thereof, bounded towards the North by the South Pacific Ocean, towards the West by the Buller River, towards the South by Daniell Street, and towards the East by Palmerston Street; all that part or parcel of land bounded towards the North by D'Israeli Street, towards the West by Palmerston Street, towards the South by Daniell Street, towards the East by Queen Street; all that part or parcel of land bounded towards the North by Bentham Street, towards the West by Palmerston Street, towards the South by D'Israeli Street, and towards the East by Russell Street; all that part or parcel of land bounded towards the North by D'Israeli Street, towards the West by Queen Street, towards the South by Roebuck Street, and towards the East by Derby Street; Municipal Reserve, suburban section numbered 71; foreshore of South Pacific Ocean, Buller River, and islands therein, and all adjoining and intervening places, lands, streets, roads, streams, and watercourses.

##### BULLER LOCAL REVENUE BOARD DISTRICT.

Rural Sections numbered 19, 20, 24, 25, 28, 245, Native Reserve numbered 47, Westport suburban section, Crown lands, and all adjoining and intervening places, roads, streams, and watercourses.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act, 1872," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by any order notified by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, appoint certain stations within or near any harbour or place within New Zealand for the performance of quarantine, under the Third Part of the said Act, where all vessels liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, shall perform the same: And whereas it is expedient to appoint the place mentioned in the Schedule hereto as the station where vessels arriving at the Port of Picton, liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, shall perform the same:

Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me for that purpose, do, by this Proclamation, order and appoint that the place named and described in the Schedule hereto shall be, and the same is hereby appointed to be, the Station for the performance of Quarantine under the Third Part of the said Act, in the case of vessels liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof, arriving at the Port of Picton.

SCHEDULE.

THE whole of the island known as Somes Island, situate in the Port Nicholson Harbour, and the water frontage around the said island within half a mile from its shore.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following General Rules of the Native Land Court, made by the Judges and Assessors of the Court under the 17th section of "The Native Land Act, 1873."

JAMES FERGUSSON, GOVERNOR.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Native Land Act, 1873," that the Judges of the Native Land Court, with the Assessors, shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing thereof, make such General Rules touching the sittings of the Court and the practice and procedure thereof in all matters as they may deem advisable: Provided always that all Rules to be so made shall be submitted to the Governor in Council for his approval:

Now therefore, we, the Judges of the said Court, with the Assessors thereof, do hereby, in pursuance of the said power, make the rules following, that is to say,—

I. Sittings of the Court shall be held at such times and places as shall be fixed by the Chief Judge, of which notice shall be duly given; and no matter shall be judicially heard except at a Court so fixed, and unless notice thereof shall have been given.

II. The Chief Judge shall give due notice to any Judge that he is required to preside at such Court, and he shall preside accordingly.

III. If any unforeseen event renders necessary the postponement of any Court, the Chief Judge or the Judge to preside may postpone the same by notice in writing, circulated in the most extensive manner possible.

IV. The Judge's Clerk, under section 11 of the Act, may, on the written request of the Judge, adjourn any Court.

V. Any case may be from time to time adjourned sine die.

VI. The decision of the Court ordering a memorial of ownership shall be in the following form, or as near thereto as circumstances will admit:—

WIDE BAY BAR.

In consequence of the decrease in the width and depth of water in the North Channel over Wide Bay Bar, the leading Beacons have been removed and shifted to the Middle Channel. These leading Beacons are square, are painted white, and now lead through the centre of the Middle Channel, on a due west bearing, in 2½ fathoms low water springs.

On Inskip Point, two Beacons, triangular and white (not visible from outside the Bar), lead in clear of the Spit off Hook Point, on a S.W. by W. bearing.

*Report on the Waitara Harbour.*

THE following report on the entrance to the Waitara River is published for general information.

WILLIAM H. REYNOLDS.

Marine Department, 11th August, 1874.

SIR,—Agreeably with your instructions I examined the River Waitara as to its capabilities for trade, and after taking the opinion of the Chief Harbour Master of the province, the Harbour Master at the Waitara, and masters of ships who have frequented the place, I have now the honor to submit the following report:—

The bar at the entrance to the river projects but little seaward outside of the line of coast at low water, and is much sheltered from the prevailing S.W. swell by a reef, but is open to the N.W., from which quarter at times heavy sea sets in. During winter and spring the river is subject to heavy freshes, which generally come down about twelve (12) hours after rain has fallen inland. In the months of February, March, and April little rain falls, and the water immediately inside of the bar occasionally becomes very low, where sandbanks are formed, and remain there until a fresh comes down that washes them away, which usually happens about the middle of May. From the above circumstances great and sudden changes often occur in the channel over the bar, as well as in the entrance to the river, both as to the direction of the channel and as to the depth of water in it. After a long dry season as little as five (5) feet six (6) inches of water in neaps, and six (6) feet six (6) inches in spring tides at high water has been known; while often after a heavy fresh as much as thirteen (13) feet has been found with a straight channel seaward. Inside the bar the river is navigable as far up as the bridge, a distance of about three-quarters of a mile, and near Messrs. Webster's wharf strong moorings are laid to secure vessels to, without which, during heavy freshes, they would be liable to be driven out to sea or on the bar.

Occasionally, no doubt, ships drawing 10 feet of water could enter the river with safety. I am however of opinion that vessels drawing over seven (7) feet are unsuitable for the trade, and for want of sufficient water would often be liable to detention inside the river, as well as outside of the bar.

Compared with similar rivers, the Waitara is neither dangerous nor difficult to enter, except during heavy freshes, and then it should never be attempted.

In order to give greater safety and facility to vessels, I am of opinion that the following suggestions should be carried out, viz.—

- 1st. That the signal man should reside at the Signal Station.

- 2nd. That strong posts, firmly fixed in the ground on each side of river, should be provided, in order to make fast to.
- 3rd. That a five or six inch warp, of at least 100 fathoms long, should be provided in case of accident.
- 4th. That additional signals be provided, to ask and to answer how much water a vessel draws.
