SECTIONS ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Indorsements or Dispositions of Policies for benefit of Wife or Children may be validated in certain cases.

28. Whereas it has heretofore happened that in many cases persons have entered into contracts for life insurance with the Commissioner under the said repealed Acts, and at the time intended to avail themselves of the eighth section of the repealed Act, "The New Zealand Government Insurance and Annuities Act, 1870," by effecting such insurance for the benefit of the wife or the wife and children of such persons, or otherwise as in the said section mentioned: And whereas, after making such contracts, many such persons have in good faith, and in pursuance of certain regulations made by the Governor in Council under the repealed Acts, by deed or writing indorsed on their policies or otherwise referring thereto, declared their intention that the insurances aforesaid should be for the benefit of their wives, or their wives and children, or otherwise as aforesaid: And whereas doubts have been raised whether such regulations were valid : And whereas the said regulations were not acted upon after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and it is expedient that such deeds or writings made on or before the said date should be validated as hereinafter provided :

Be it enacted, whenever any person, on or before the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, has entered into a contract under the said last-mentioned Act for the insurance of his own life for the whole term thereof, and has in good faith on or before that date executed a deed or writing indorsed on or referring to the policy issued in respect of such contract, stating that such insurance was intended to be for the benefit of his wife or his wife and children, or otherwise, as in the eighth section of the said last-mentioned Act provided, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner, upon the production to him of the said policy, and of such deed or writing made or executed as aforesaid, together with such evidence as the Commissioner may reasonably require, that such deed or writing was in good faith made or executed on or before the said date, to certify upon the said policy that it appears to him that the said insurance was in good faith intended to be made for the person or persons, or class of persons, and in the manner in such deed or writing particularly mentioned.

Commissioner to be sole judge of good faith of application.

29. The Commissioner shall be the sole judge of the good faith of any person desiring to avail him-self of the provisions of the last preceding section, and may refuse to allow any application made to him thereunder.

Effect of Certificate.

30. Upon the granting of any such certificate as hereinbefore provided, the policy in respect of which the same shall be granted, and the insurance thereby effected, shall enure for the benefit of the person or persons, or class of persons named or referred to in any such deed or writing as aforesaid, as fully and effectually as if such insurance had been made for his, her, or their benefit, in the manner required by the eighth section of the said last-mentioned Act.

Limit of time within which application may be made.

31. All proceedings taken to obtain the Commissioner's certificate under the twenty-eighth section of this Act shall be taken within twelve calendar months after the passing hereof, and not afterwards; and the Commissioner shall as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of this Act cause the pur-port of the provisions of the three preceding sections of this Act to be publicly notified in such manner as he may think fit.

The persons on board ships are not included in the numbers of the population. The births were 292 in September, against 316 in August, while the deaths were 13 more in number than the deaths in August.

August. Of the deaths, males contributed 60; females, 61: 61 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 50.41 of the whole number; 34 of these were of children under 1 year of age. The deaths of children under 5 years of age exceeded those in August by 8. Five females died aged respectively 66 (2), 70, 79, and 81 years; 4 males died between the ages of 65 and upwards, the

oldest being 78. Five of the above 9 deaths occurred in Wellington, 2 in Dunedin, 1 in Christchurch, and 1 in Auckland.

The deaths from Zymotic Diseases are, by 9, more numerous than in August. The increase is chiefly occasioned by the number of deaths from Influenza during September. 12 deaths occurred from this cause in September, none in August. Of those 12 deaths, 11 occurred in Wellington. The deaths from Constitutional Diseases exceeded those in August by 1. The deaths from Local Diseases were 8 more in number in September than in August. Heart Disease caused 6 deaths in September, against 2 in August. There was only a difference of one in the number of deaths from diseases of the Respiratory System. Of the 24 deaths from these diseases, 15 were caused by bronchitis : of these 15, 7, or nearly one-half, occurred in Christchurch. Several of the cases, however, in which the deaths are recorded as having been caused by Influenza, had also Bronchitis and Presumonia as accompanying complaints. Pneumonia as accompanying complaints.

The weather still retained its exceptional character during the month, the rainfall having been, at all the stations south of Auckland, very far in excess of the average for previous years.

 Auckland.—Squally, wet, and unpleasant weather; if requently stormy, wind changeable; on 3rd stormy from N.W. to W., with rain all day, barometer down to 29:05°, rose shortly, wind shifting South; heavy rainfall recorded on 31st, 1:65 inch in a few hours; thunder on 3rd, 27th, and 31st; hail on 9th; fog on 19th. Maximum temperature, 63:3°; minimum, 38°.
