Regulations under Public Revenues Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government House, at Wellington, this eighth day of January, 1875.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

THEREAS by "The Public Revenues Act, 1867," VV it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to make regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, directing the manner in which, and the times at which, and the Bank or Banks into which, all moneys shall be paid into the Public Account, and for the return of full and sufficient accounts relating to all such moneys, and for the guidance of all per-sons in the Public Service concerned in the receipt, custody, and expenditure thereof; and all such regulations shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette, and shall come into force upon a day to be named therein: And whereas by "The Public Revenues Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to alter or rescind any regulations made under the authority of "The Public Revenues Act, 1867," or of the now reciting Act, and to make other regulations not inconsistent with "The Public Revenues Act, 1867," in the place thereof, and that all such regulations shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette, and shall come into force upon a day to be named therein : And whereas it is expedient that a portion of one of the regulations which were made under the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Acts, by Order in Council dated the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, should be rescinded : Now therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand,

Now therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, or one of them, doth hereby rescind that portion of the regulation numbered 37, and contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council hereinafter set forth, that is to say,—"Such accounts must also be authenticated by the signature (opposite to the total) of the person making the claim, and in no case are they to be so signed by an agent except under a power of attorney, to be produced either in the original or else by a properly certified copy, and the date of such deed is to be noted on the account:"

And lastly, in further pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities vested in him for that purpose under the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, his said Excellency doth hereby order that this present Order in Council shall come into force upon the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

CHAPTER 96.

NACT for further promoting the Revision of the Statute Law, by repealing certain Enactments which have ceased to be in force and the second to be in the sec AN ACT for further promoting the Revision of the have ceased to be in force or have become un-[7th August, 1874. necessary.

WHEREAS, with a view to the revision of the Statute Law, and particularly to the preparation of the Revised Edition of the Statutes now in progress, it is expedient that certain enactments (mentioned in the Schedule to this Act) which may be regarded as spent, or have ceased to be in force otherwise than by express and specific repeal by Parliament, or have, by lapse of time and change of circumstances, become unnecessary, should be expressly and specifically repealed :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and con-sent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and

this Act are hereby repealed, subject to the exceptions and qualifications in the Schedule mentioned :

Provided, that where any enactment not comprised in the Schedule has been repealed, confirmed, revived, or perpetuated by any enactment hereby repealed, such repeal, confirmation, revivor, or perpetuation shall not be affected by the repeal effected by this Act:

and the repeal by this Act of any enactment shall not affect any enactment in which such enactment has been applied, incorporated, or referred to;

nor shall such repeal of any enactment affect any right to any hereditary revenues of the Crown, or affect any charges thereupon, or prevent any such enactment from being put in force for the collection of any such revenues, or otherwise in relation thereto;

and this Act shall not affect the validity, invalidity, effect, or consequences of anything already done or suffered,—or any existing status or capacity,—or any right or title already acquired or accrued, or any remedy or proceeding in respect thereof,—or any release or discharge of or from any debt, penalty, claim, or demand,—or any indemnity,—or the proof of any past act or thing; nor shall this Act affect any principle or rule of

nor shall this Act affect any principle or rule of law or equity, or established jurisdiction, form or course of pleading, practice, or procedure, or existing usage, franchise, liberty, custom, privilege, restric-tion, exemption, office, appointment, payment, allowance, or emolument, notwithstanding that the same respectively may have been in any manner affirmed, recognized, or derived by, in, or from any enactment hereby repealed;

nor shall this Act revive or restore any jurisdiction, office, duty, drawback, fee, payment, franchise, liberty, custom, right, title, privilege, restriction, exemption, usage, practice, procedure, or other matter or thing not now existing or in force;

and this Act shall not extend to repeal any enactment so far as the same may be in force in any part of Her Majesty's Dominions out of the United Kingdom, except where otherwise expressed in the

said Schedule. 2. "The Statute Law Revision Act, 1874," shall be read and construed as if in the entry in the Schedule to that Act relating to the Act passed in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, chapter eighty-eight, intituled "An Act to amend certain Acts relating to the crime of Piracy," the words "Section Six" and "Section Seven" had been substituted for the words

"Section Four" and "Section Five" respectively. 3. This Act may be cited as "The Statute Law Revision Act, 1874 (No. 2)."

SUPREME COURT OF NEW ZEALAND.

WHEREAS by "The Imprisonment for Debt Abolition Act, 1874," (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act,") it is enacted that in the said Act the term "prescribed" means, as respects the Supreme Court, prescribed by General Rules or Orders to be made in pursuance of "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," or any Acts altering or amending the same:

And whereas by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Judges of the Supreme Court, amongst other things, from time to time to make such additional rules touching the practice, pleading, and procedure of the Court in all matters, both civil and criminal, as the Judges may deem advisable:

Now therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in us by the said Act and by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is ordered by us, the Judges of the said Court, that the following General Rules shall come into and be in force on and after the fifteenth day of January, 1875.

COMMITTAL TO PRISON, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF "THE IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT ABOLI-TION ACT, 1874."

1. All applications to commit to prison under sections five, six, and seven of the said Act shall, in the first instance, be made by summons before a Judge, which shall specify the date and other particulars of the judgment or order for non-payment of which the application is made, together with the amount due, and be indorsed with the name and place of abode or office of business of the solicitor actually applying for the summons; and when such solicitor shall apply for the same as agent for any other solicitor, the name and place of abode of such other solicitor shall also be indorsed on the summons; and in case no solicitor shall be employed to apply for the summons, then it shall be indorsed and control of the Court, or a Judge.

with a memorandum expressing that the same has been applied for by the plaintiff or defendant in person, as the case may be, mentioning or describing also the place of abode of such plaintiff or defendant.

2. The service of the summons, wherever it may be practicable, shall be personal; but if it appear to the Judge that reasonable efforts have been made to effect personal service, and either that the summons has come to the knowledge of the debtor, or that he wilfully evades service, an order may be made as if personal service had been effected, upon such terms as to the Judge may seem fit.

3. Proof of the means of the debtor, or other matters specified in the subsections of section six of the said Act shall, whenever practicable, be given by affidavit; but if it appear to the Judge, either before or at the hearing, that a vivá voce examination, either of the debtor or of any other person, or the produc-tion of any document, is necessary or expedient, an order may be made commanding the attendance of any such person before the Judge, at a time and place to be therein mentioned, for the purpose of being examined on oath touching the matter in question, and (where the production of any document is necessary or expedient) for the production of any such document, subject to such terms and conditions as to the Judge may seem fit.

4. The order of committal (which may be in the form A in the Schedule, or to the like effect) shall, before delivery to the Sheriff, be indorsed with the particulars required by Rule 1 of these Rules.

Concurrent orders may be issued for execution in ferent Sheriff's districts. The Shcriff and officer different Sheriff's districts. shall be entitled to the same fees in respect thereof as are now payable upon a capias ad satisfaciendum.

5. Upon payment of the sum or sums mentioned in the order (including the Sheriff's fees in like manner as upon a capias ad satisfaciendum), the debtor shall be entitled to a certificate in the form B in the Schedule, or to the like effect, signed by the solicitor in the cause of the creditor, or signed by the creditor, and attested by a solicitor on his behalf, or a Justice of the Peace.

6. Orders to arrest under the fifteenth section of the said Act (which may be in the form C in the Schedule, or to the like effect) shall be made upon affidavit and ex parte; but the defendant shall be at liberty, at any time after the arrest, to apply to rescind or vary the order, or to be discharged from custody, or for such other relief as may be just; such orders shall, before delivery to the Sheriff, be indorsed with the particulars required by Rule 1 of these Rules. Concurrent orders may be issued for arrest in different Sheriff's districts. The Sheriff and officer shall be entitled to the same fees in respect thereof as are now payable upon a *capias*.

7. The security to be given by the defendant may be a deposit in Court of the amount mentioned in the order, or a bond to the plaintiff by the defendant and two sufficient sureties (or, with leave of a Judge, more than two), or with the plaintiff's consent, any other form of security. The plaintiff may, within four days after receiving particulars of the names and addresses of the proposed sureties, and the form of the proposed bond, give notice that he objects thereto, stating therein in what particulars; and in case of his so doing, the sufficiency of the security shall be determined by the Registrar, who shall have power to award the costs of such reference to either party. It shall be the plaintiff's duty to obtain an appointment for that purpose; and unless he does so within four days after giving notice of objection, the security shall be deemed sufficient.

8. The money deposited, and the security, and all proceedings thereon, shall be subject to the order

9. Unless otherwise ordered, the costs of and | consequent on an order to arrest, shall be costs in the cause.

10. Upon payment into Court of the amount mentioned in the order, a receipt shall be given by the proper officer; and upon receiving the bond or other security, a certificate to that effect shall be given, signed or attested by the plaintiff's solicitor; and the delivery of such receipt or certificate to the Sheriff shall entitle the defendant to be discharged out of custody.

11. The Sheriff or other officer named either in an order of committal or an order to arrest under the fifteenth section shall, within two days after the arrest, indorse on the order the true date of such arrest.
