*Appointing place for Licensing Court.*

NORMANBY,  
Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act 1873 Amendment Act, 1874," it is enacted that every Licensing Court shall hold its meetings in the Court House used as a Court House by the Resident Magistrate or Court of Petty Sessions in the Licensing District, or if there be no such Court House in such district; then the Court shall hold its meetings at such place as may from time to time be appointed by the Governor: And whereas there is no Court House in the District of Grey: And whereas by a warrant dated the thirtieth October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the same date, the Resident Magistrate's Court House, Cobden, was appointed to be the place at which the Licensing Court for the said Licensing District of Grey should hold its meetings: And whereas it is expedient to appoint some other place in lieu thereof:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint

The Resident Magistrate's Court House, Ahaura, to be the place at which the Licensing Court for the said

Licensing District of Grey shall hold its meetings, instead of the said Resident Magistrate's Court House, Cobden.

POTTERY WARE.

BONUS OF £300.

For the manufacture in works permanently established in the colony of the first £2,000 worth of Pottery Ware suitable for household purposes.

LINSEED OIL.  
BONUS OF £500.

For the production by machinery permanently established in the Colony of 10,000 gallons of Linseed Oil of good marketable quality, and from linseed grown in the colony.

*Conditions.*

1. Notice of intention to claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1875.

2. The bonus must be claimed before the 30th June, 1876.

3. The oil in respect of which the bonus is claimed will be examined by an officer appointed by the Government for the purpose, who may, if he thinks fit, require the production of *bond fide* account sales, showing that the whole or a sufficient portion of the oil has been sold at a fair market price.

IRON AND STEEL.

The time for claiming the bonus for the production of Iron and Steel, as fixed by the former advertisements, above quoted, is extended to the 30th June, 1876, the conditions in both cases remaining the same as previously advertised.

PAPER.

The bonus offered for the manufacture of paper not having been claimed, a sum of £1,500 is hereby offered as a bonus for the production of the first 50 tons of Gray or Wrapping Paper; and a further bonus of £1,000 is also hereby offered for the production of the first 50 tons of Printing Paper.

BY virtue of the powers vested in us by law, it is ordered by us, the Judges of the said Court, that the following Rules shall come into and be in force, on and after the twenty-first day of January, 1875:—

1. When the defendant resides within a Judicial District which does not include the Chief Town of the Province within which he resides, the place to be named in the writ of summons for the delivery of the defendant's pleadings shall be some place in the

town in which the nearest Supreme Court Office for the District is situate. If the writ be taken out by a Solicitor, then it shall be at the office of such Solicitor, or his agent in such town. If taken out by the plaintiff in person, then at the residence of the plaintiff, if his residence be not more than three miles from the said Supreme Court Office; but if beyond that distance, then at some other place, to be called his "Address for service," which shall not be more than three miles from such office.

2. When the defendant shall reside within any such Judicial District as aforesaid, and shall appear or plead in person, his address for service shall be some convenient place not more than three miles from the nearest Supreme Court Office for the District.

The births were 267 in December, against 292 in November; the deaths were 22 more in number than the deaths in November.

Of the deaths, males contributed 69; females, 61: 63 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 48.46 of the whole number; 45 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age were 10 more than those in November.

There was 1 death of a person of 65 years of age or upwards, viz. 1 male of 80 at Wellington.

The deaths from Zymotic Diseases were 1 less than in November. While deaths from Measles have fallen from 15 to 7 (all of which were still in Dunedin), the deaths from Diarrhoea have increased from 5 to 12; these last cases occurred only in Auckland and Wellington. Constitutional Diseases have increased from 12 to 21; this is chiefly attributable to the number of deaths (7) from Hydrocephalus (or Tubercular Meningitis). The deaths from Phthisis were slightly on the increase. In the three cases of such deaths registered in Nelson, 2 were those of persons recently arrived, in a diseased state; no history is given with the majority of these cases. Local and Developmental Diseases were slightly on the increase last month.
