"The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1874," brought into operation in Province of Nelson.

## (L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1874," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, on the request of the Superintendent of any province, to bring this Act into operation in any such province or any part thereof to be defined as a district under the powers hereinafter contained; and upon a Proclamation being made by the Governor in the New Zealand Gazette to that effect, this Act shall be in force within such province or part thereof to be defined as aforesaid, as the case may be: And by the said Act it is also enacted that upon any such request as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, from time to time to define and describe one or more districts within any such province, with such boundaries as the Superintendent may think convenient; and the Governor may from time to time alter the boundaries of districts formed or hereafter to be formed under this Act; and in and by any such Proclamation he may assign to any such district a name by which it shall be called or known for the purposes of this Act:

And whereas the Superintendent of the province mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto has requested that the said Act should be brought into operation within the province for which he is such Superintendent, and also that the said province should be divided into districts as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and in compliance with the request of the said Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1874," shall be and the same is hereby brought into

operation within the province mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule: And in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and in compliance with such request as aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the several territories comprised within the boundaries of the said province referred to in the second column of the said Schedule shall be and the same are hereby defined and described as districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act; and I do also hereby assign to each such district the name set forth in the third column of the said Schedule opposite to the description of each such district in the said second column.

The population has been estimated by adding the excess of births over deaths since the 1st March, 1874, to the then census population. It is impossible to estimate the increase from immigration.

The births were 16 fewer than in January.

The deaths were 18 more in number than the deaths in January, and exceeded by 38 the deaths in any month of 1874; or if the deaths in the two above-mentioned hospitals (the deaths in which were not included in the reports in 1874) be excluded, this excess will be reduced to 33.

Of the deaths, males contributed 102; females, 76: 119 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 66:85 of the whole number; 89 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The deaths of children under 1 year of age were 16 more than in January; the deaths of all under 5 were 29 more than in January.

There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 and upwards,—4 males in Auckland of 65, 68, 80, and 85, and 1 female of 70; also 2 females in Wellington of 67 and 75 years of age.

The deaths from Zymotic Diseases were 83 in February, against 55 in January, and 40 in December, the deaths from Dysentery and Diarrhea alone having increased from 29 in January to 53 in February. These deaths occurred as follows:—In Dunedin, 15; Auckland, 12; Wellington, 9; Nelson, 7; Thames, 5; Christchurch, 4; and Hokitika, 1; 48 of these deaths were of children under two years of age, the majority being under one year. There is a slight increase in the number of deaths from Typhoid Fever. The largest number of these deaths occurred in Christchurch (4); two deaths from this cause occurred in Dunedin. Constitutional and Local Diseases were somewhat less numerous than in January, but Developmental Diseases were slightly on the increase. There were three cases in which the causes of death were attributed to chronic alcoholism: one a publican, who died of congestion of the brain; his wife, who died of diseased liver (cirrhosis); and a male who died of diseased liver.
