WHEREAS by "The Waste Lands Act, 1858,"

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor as aforesaid of the said colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

Sir George Grey, K.C.B.,

as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in me under or by virtue of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight,

Delegation of Governor's Powers under " The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

(L.s.) NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if and whenever he shall have, by lease, agreement, or otherwise, by consent of the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has been extinguished, or the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has not been extinguished, obtained power from such Native or other owners to authorize entry on such lands for mining for gold, by Proclamation issued under the third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to include such land within any gold field, or to proclaim such land a gold field: by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the preceding sections of the said Act (including the above in part recited section), subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as the Governor may think fit, and in like manner to alter and revoke any such powers:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power for that purpose vested in me by the said Act, do hereby delegate to

Sir GEORGE GREY, K.C.B., as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in the Governor by the said in part recited section of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," to be exercised by him within the Province of Auckland, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said province, and no longer: Provided always that no Proclamation affecting any lands shall be made by the said Sir George Grey under the powers hereby delegated to him, unless the Governor shall have obtained power to authorize entry on such lands for mining for gold, in the manner required by the said Act.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Quartz Crushing Machines Regulation and Inspection Act, 1872," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and under the Public Seal of the colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any province all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, and in like manner to revoke or alter any such delegation: Provided, however, that any such Superintendent shall only hold and exercise the powers vested in him by any such delegation within the limits of his province: Provided that all fines, fees, and penalties to be imposed under the said Act shall be declared by the Governor in Council, and also that all regulations made by virtue of such delegation shall be approved by the same authority:

WHEREAS by the one hundred and ninetieth VV section of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Gold Mining Districts Act, 1873," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the colony, from time to time to delegate all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections one hundred and thirty-six and one hundred thirty-seven, and by subsection thirteen of section one hundred and sixty-five thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such delegation: And whereas by the one hundred and ninety-first section it is enacted amongst other things that such delegations may be granted to the Superintendent of any province by the name of his office, and in such case the holder of the said office for the time being may exercise the powers given by the delegation:

Now therefore I, George Augustus Constantine,

1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to order and direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the Act now in recital, within any province or other district of the colony, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such province; and thereupon such functions, powers, duties, and authorities may by such Superintendent be exercised or performed within the province or other district of the colony specified in such order, and in like manner to

alter or revoke any such order:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority enabling me under the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby order that all the powers, functions, duties, authorities, or acts vested in, conferred on, or authorized or required to be done by me as such Governor as aforesaid, within the Province of Auckland, under the fifty-third and seventy-seventh sections of the said Act, shall be exercised, performed, or done by

Sir George Grey, K.C.B.,

the Superintendent of the said province, as and in manner by the said Act required: Provided that this order shall only remain in force so long as the said Sir George Grey shall be and remain such Superintendent as aforesaid, or until other provision in that behalf shall be made by the Governor under the powers aforesaid.

Of the deaths, males contributed 143; females, 108: 154 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 61:35 per cent. of the whole number; 78 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The deaths of children under 1 year of age were 11 fewer than in February; the deaths of all under 5 were 35 more than in February.

There were 2 deaths of persons of 65 and upwards,—1 male of 75 and 1 female of 84, both in Wellington.

The deaths from Zymotic Diseases were 135 in March, against 83 in February. The number was 59 in March of last year. The increase since last month is largely attributed to the number of deaths from Measles, which appears to have been epidemic in Auckland; the number of deaths in the borough from that cause having been 45. Of these, 5 were children under 1 year, 30 children of 1 to 4 years, and 10 persons between 5 and 39 years of age. There was 1 death in Auckland from Typhoid Fever, which caused 11 deaths in Christchurch. The deaths from Zymotic Diseases in Christchurch numbered 20—within 1 of the total number of deaths during February. One death occurred from Measles in Christchurch, and 5 in Wellington. There was not one death from Measles in Dunedin, in which borough the deaths from this cause were rather numerous in the latter months of 1874. There was a small increase in the deaths from Constitutional Diseases, the deaths from Phthisis having increased from 7 to 13. Local Diseases were also more numerous; the deaths from Diseases of the Nervous System havin been more than double what they were in the previous month, and the deaths from Diseases of the Respiratory System having also been on the increase.
