Proclaiming certain Lands to have been taken for purposes of the Railway from Brunner to Greymouth.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted, that whenever it shall become necessary that any land which the Governor or the Minister is by or under the Acts therein mentioned, or any Act authorizing the construction of any rail-way by the Governor or Minister, authorized to purchase or take for such railway, or any portion thereof on or over which a railway authorized by the said Acts, or any Act to be passed in pursuance thereof, has been or may hereafter be constructed, should be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, it shall be lawful for the Governor or the Minister to cause a map of all such lands as may have been taken or purchased under the said Acts, or any Act authorizing the construction of any railway as aforesaid, or any portion of such railway, to be prepared. Such map shall fully and accurately set forth the pieces or parcels of land intended to be taken and permanently used, or which have been purchased or taken, or are required to be vested in Her Majesty for the purposes of any such railway, and shall be authenticated by the signature of the Minister, or by that of some person to be appointed by him for that purpose from time to time. And it is also enacted that the Minister shall cause the map to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of Deeds for the Registration District within which the lands shall be situated; or if the lands set forth on any such map shall extend beyond the boundaries of any one district, then such map shall be prepared in so many parts as shall be requisite to delineate the land within each such district; and the map, or the parts thereof, as aforesaid, shall be deposited in the office of the Registrar of Deeds in each Registration District where the lands shall be situated to which such map relates; but for the purposes of this Act, such map, although consisting of several parts, shall only be deemed to be one map: And whereas by the said Act it is

further enacted that it shall thereupon be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to declare that the lands set forth in such map, or any of them, have been taken or acquired for the purposes of the railway in respect of which the same shall have been taken or acquired under the said Acts, or any Act authorizing the same to be taken or acquired; and in such Proclamation the lands intended to be affected shall be therein described by reference to such map so to be deposited as aforesaid: And whereas, in accordance with the provisions of the said in part recited Act, the Minister for Public Works has caused a map of all such lands as have been taken or purchased for that further portion of the line of railway from Brunner to Greymouth, in the Province of Westland, the description, line, and limits whereof are proclaimed, declared, and defined by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, dated the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, to be prepared as by the said in part recited Act is required; and the said map is authenticated by the signature of the Honorable Edward Richardson, as such Minister for Public Works: And whereas the said Minister, on or about the seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, caused the said map to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of Deeds at Hokitika, in the said Province of Westland aforesaid:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands set forth in the said map so deposited as aforesaid have been taken or acquired for the purposes of the said railway from Brunner to Greymouth, which said railway is, by "The Railways Act, 1871," "The Railways Act, 1872," "The Railways Act, 1873," and "The Railways Act, 1874," authorized to be constructed and maintained under the provisions of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and the several Acts amending the same.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the

said power and authority, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands intended to be affected by this Proclamation are described and delineated in the said map so deposited as aforesaid.

Appointing Annual Meeting of Justices in Tokatoka Petty Sessions District.

NORMANBY, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted, that as soon as conveniently may be after the establishment of a Petty Sessions District, and afterwards from time to time as may be deemed expedient, the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, appoint a meeting of the Justices resident in such district to be yearly held within such district, at some specified time and place, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance. And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the first day of June, the Petty Sessions District named in the Schedule hereto was, from and after the first day of July next, defined and established as in the said Order in Council mentioned:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me, do hereby proclaim and appoint that, for the district named in the Schedule hereto, a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident within such district shall be yearly held at the place whereof the name is in the said Schedule set opposite to the name of such district, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon on the first Friday in the month of July, for the purpose of choosing a chairman and settling a rota of attendance.

Making and confirming Alterations in By-laws, Rules, and Regulations for Canterbury Railways.

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of June, 1875.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS lines of railway mentioned in the VV Schedule hereto have, under the provisions of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and other Acts, been constructed by the Governor in the Province of Canterbury: And whereas an agreement has been made between the Governor and the Superintendent of Canterbury, whereby the Governor has granted the right to work and maintain the said lines of railway to the Superintendent of the said province: And whereas the Superintendent of the said province has, under the Public Seal of the said province, and in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, made the annexed alterations in the by-laws, orders, rules and regulations formerly proclaimed for the working of the said railways:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby make, and doth approve of, allow, and confirm, the said annexed alterations in the by-laws, rules, and regulations now in force with regard to the said lines of railway.

Clause 40 of the Regulations published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 68, of 24th December, 1874, is hereby repealed, and the following is made in lieu

40. All timber, whether the same be the whole or a portion of the quantity contained in a specification, not removed from the railway premises within twelve working hours after the delivery of the specification, or within twelve working hours after the specification be made out, shall be subject to the following charges, viz.,—For the first week, or fraction of a week, one penny per hundred feet superficial; for the second week, or fraction of a week, one penny per hundred feet superficial; for the third week, or Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron week, one penny per hundred feet superficial; for the fourth week, or fraction of a week, one penny per hundred feet superficial; for every succeeding week, or fraction of a week, two pence per hundred feet superficial.

N.B.—Although the Auckland and Hokitika Hospitals are situated outside the boundaries of the respective boroughs, yet the deaths in them have, for the sake of uniformity, been included in this Report.

The population has been estimated by adding the excess of births over deaths since the 1st March, 1874, to the then census ulation. It is impossible to estimate the increase from immigration.

The births were 48 fewer than in April.

The deaths were 41 more in number than the deaths in April.

Of the deaths, males contributed 122; females, 89: 95 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 45.97
per cent. of the whole number; 50 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The deaths of children under 1 year of age were 3 fewer than in April; the number of deaths of those from 1 to 5 was

the same as in April.

There were 12 deaths of persons of 65 and upwards,—2 males respectively of 65 and 75 in Auckland, and 1 female of 78; 5 males of 68, 71, 73, 80, and 82 in Nelson; 1 male of 65 in Wellington; 2 males of 65 and 70 in Christchurch; and 1 male of 74 in Dunedin.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs named, and that were registered, during the month of May, 1875.

The deaths from Zymotic Diseases were 81 in May, against 80 in April. There was however a considerable difference in the causes of death. Measles were still epidemic in some places. The deaths from this cause had decreased in Auckland from 18 to 5, but had increased at the Thames from 4 to 12. This disease also caused 6 deaths in Hokitika.

Typhoid Fever caused 27 deaths in May, against 16 in April. The largest number of deaths from this cause occurred in Christchurch (10); Wellington (6); Auckland (6). There were 3 in Dunedin. Dysentery and Diarrhæa caused 13 deaths in May, against 23 in April.

There was an increase in the deaths from Constitutional Diseases from 16 in April to 25 in May; Cancer having caused 4 deaths in May, against 1 in April; and Tubercular Diseases having caused 21 deaths in May, against 15 in April.

There was a large increase in the deaths from Local Diseases, the numbers having been 73 in May and 45 in April. The principal increase occurred in the following orders:—

Violent Deaths increased from 7 in April to 12 in May. In two cases (one a prostitute and the other an infant, from neglect) the coroner's jury returned a verdict of manslaughter.
