(L.S.) **NORMANBY, Governor.**
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act 1873 Amendment Act, 1874," it is, amongst other things, provided that, in order to make provision for the granting of licenses on gold fields and in outlying districts, it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to proclaim any district in any province of the colony, the boundaries whereof shall be defined in such Proclamation, to be a special licensing district, and the boundaries of such district from time to time to alter, and to abolish any such district:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, the district the boundaries whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereto, shall be a special licensing district, to be called "The Tairua Special Licensing District."

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at Te Papiri on the East Coast, the north-eastern boundary of the Ohinemuri Special Licensing District, as defined in a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, thence along the East Coast to the south side of Mercury Bay, thence by the south side of Mercury Bay to the Waiwara River, thence to the dividing range to the source of the Waikauranga River, thence along the Waikauranga south bank to the intersecting line of the Hauraki Gold Field, thence along the gold fields boundary to the Hikutaia River, thence by the south bank of the Hikutaia River to the Thames River, thence by the Thames River to Te Iranga-o-piropore, thence by the northern boundary of the said Ohinemuri Special Licensing District to Te Papiri, the point of commencement.

Regulations under the New Zealand Settlements Acts for Sale of Land to R. T. Blake.

NORMANBY, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this third day of August, 1875.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," it is enacted that the order and manner in which land taken under the authority of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," should be laid out for sale and sold, should be at the discretion of the Governor, who shall have power to cause such land, or any part thereof, to be laid out for sale and sold from time to time in such manner, for such consideration, and in such allotments as he shall think fit, and subject to such regulations as he shall, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time prescribe:

And whereas by "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment Act, 1866," it is provided that the said lands shall be sold for such consideration, or at such price, and whether for cash or otherwise,

as the Governor shall from time to time prescribe; and that all lands taken under authority of the said "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," or either of them, and sold or disposed of under the authority of the said first-recited Act, shall be sold or disposed of under regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, which regulations shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*:

And whereas it is expedient that the lands mentioned in the Regulations hereunder following should be sold to the person therein named, as by the said Regulations is provided:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of all powers and authorities vested in him in that behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, make the following Regulations for the sale and disposal of the lands mentioned therein, and which said lands have been taken under the said Acts, or some or one of them.

REGULATIONS.

1. It shall be lawful for the Officer in Charge of Confiscated Lands at Patea, to sell to Richard Thomas Blake, of Patea, at the upset price of two (2) pounds per acre, all those parcels of land in the Province of Taranaki, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement one hundred and sixty-one (161) acres and thirty-three (33) perches, more or less, situated in the Patea District, and being Sections numbered five hundred and sixty-one (561) and five hundred and sixty-four (564) on the map of the said district.

Section numbered five hundred and sixty-one is bounded towards the North-east by Section numbered five hundred and sixty-two, three thousand eight hundred and sixty-five (3865) links; towards the South-east by a public road, three thousand one hundred and twenty (3120) links; towards the South-west by Section numbered five hundred and sixty, four thousand one hundred (4100) links; and towards the North-west by a public road, two thousand seven hundred and eighty-two (2782) links, four hundred and forty (440) links, and one hundred and thirteen (113) links. Excepting and reserving the road and railway reserve which runs through the said allotments, and for which reserve allowance has been made in the acreage.

Section numbered five hundred and sixty-four (564) is bounded towards the North-east by Section numbered five hundred and sixty-three, two thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight (2828) links; towards the East by the Tawhiti Stream; towards the South-east by a public road, five hundred and thirty (530) links; towards the South-west by Section numbered five hundred and sixty-two, four thousand and ninety (4090) links; and towards the North-west by a public road, eleven thousand and forty-five (1145) links. Such sale shall be made by private contract, and the purchase money shall be paid by the said Richard Thomas Blake to the said Officer in Charge of Confiscated Lands.

2. The sale hereby authorized to be made within one calendar month from the publication of these Regulations in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and the purchase money shall be paid within the like period. Upon payment of the purchase money a Crown grant shall be issued to the purchaser in like manner, and subject to the same terms and conditions, as if the said land had been purchased by the said purchaser at auction under the General Regulations now in force for the sale and disposal of lands taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and the several Acts amending the same.

It is hereby notified, with reference to the advertisement of the 8th June, 1874, that the Government of India are prepared to purchase about 1,000 horses, suitable for army purposes, during the year 1875-76.

The purchases will be made by Remount Agents or Committees, as in previous years, at the stations named in the margin.*

The purchases will, except under any special circumstances, be made only between the 1st October and 1st April.

The requirements of 1876-77 will be 600 horses, more or less.

Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, and they must be within the prescribed age—four to seven years.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rupees 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

SHOAL OFF MONKHOUSE POINT, INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAITS.

ON the edge of the 3-fathom line off Monkhouse Point, as shown on the chart, a Shoal Patch exists, with not more than 9 feet upon it at ordinary low water springs. The Pilot at the Endeavour River places it in the following position, viz.,—

Mount Cook (Summit), W. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S.
Grassy Hill (Lookout House), N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.
Rocky Islet, S.E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. southerly.

The water for some distance in-shore is from 3 to 6 feet deeper than on the shoal, and to the eastward, the bank extends from it about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables, carrying from 15 to 18 feet of water, which then deepens to 4, 6, and 7 fathoms, as shown on the chart.

Vessels will be clear of this danger and of the edge of the bank while keeping Rocky Islet open of Walker Point, and of the rocky point to the southward.

UNIVERSITY OF NEW ZEALAND.

As regards the candidates for Scholarships, 1875, and holders of Scholarships, 1874, the subjects of examination are distributed into four groups, viz.,—1. Classics; 2. Mathematics; 3. Physical Science (any of the following branches:—Natural Philosophy, Chemistry, Physical Geography, Zoology, Botany, Geology); 4. Modern Languages other than English, History, and English Literature.

The maximum of marks in each group of subjects is as follows:—Group No. 1, 1,000; Group No. 2, 1,000; Group No. 3, 500 (in any of the specified branches); Group No. 4, 1,500. No Scholarship is awarded to any candidate who fails to obtain one-half at least of the above maximum of marks in any subject, and no holder of a Scholarship is entitled to hold his Scholarship who fails to obtain at least one-half of the total number of marks allotted to all subjects, viz. 2,000.

As regards the undergraduates of the first and second year, 500 marks has been fixed as the maximum for each group of subjects.

Every undergraduate is required to take up at least three subjects in different groups, and, in order to pass, must obtain at least one-third of the maximum in each.

The names in each table hereto appended are arranged in alphabetical order, and the numbers set opposite to them denote the order of merit in the respective subjects.
