*Regulations for the Nomination of Immigrants.*

NORMANBY, Governor.  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of August, 1875.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in him for that purpose by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," the Governor did, on or about the fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, make certain Regulations for the introduction of immigrants from Europe into the Colony of New Zealand on the nomination of persons resident therein: And whereas by the said first-mentioned Act it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations for the conduct of immigration to New Zealand, and for the nomination of immigrants by persons residing therein, as in the said Act mentioned, and no action shall be taken upon any such Regulation until the same has been laid before Parliament: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," so much of the 40th section of the said first-mentioned Act as provides that no action is to be taken under the Regulations made under the said section until such Regulations have been laid before Parliament, is thereby repealed: And whereas it is expedient that other Regulations should be made in addition to those so made by the Governor as aforesaid:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for that purpose by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby make the Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, for the conduct of immigration to New Zealand, and for the nomination of immigrants by persons resident therein: Such Regulations shall be in addition to those already in force, and shall take

effect from and after the thirty-first day of August instant: Provided, however, that nothing herein contained, or in the Regulations hereby made, shall prejudice or affect anything lawfully done or any right acquired or duty imposed by or under the said Regulations of the fifteenth day of October aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF IMMIGRATION TO NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS BY PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Except as hereinafter provided, nominations of the following classes only will be accepted, viz.,—

Agricultural labourers, such as farm servants, navvies, shepherds, carpenters, country mechanics, &c., and

Single women suitable for domestic service, such as cooks, housemaids, general servants, dairy maids, &c.

2. Married men must be under 45 years of age, single men under 40 years of age, and single women between 15 and 35 years of age.

3. Free passages will not be granted to more than 3 children under 12 years of age in one family; but the number in excess may be paid for at the current rate of passage.

4. Immigration Officers may provisionally accept nominations of persons not eligible under the foregoing Regulations if satisfied as to the prospect of employment upon arrival, &c.; but such nominations will be subject to the approval of the Minister for Immigration.

5. The Minister for Immigration may authorize payment in cash of such an amount as he may think fit to be taken for the passage of persons, who under the foregoing Regulations or in his opinion are ineligible for free passages; and nominators may also deposit with Immigration Officers any sums they may desire the Agent-General to advance to their friends for outfit or other embarkation expenses.

6. Persons wishing to obtain labour of a particular class may send instructions to their friends or agents at home through an Immigration Officer, and such

agents will be accredited to the Agent-General, who will provide the persons selected by them with passages, should he deem them suitable.

*Polling Places for Paroa Road Board appointed.*

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by the thirty-ninth section of "The County of Westland Act, 1868," it is, amongst other things, enacted that in and for each road district, within fifteen days after the commencement of the now reciting Act, the Governor shall, and at any time afterwards when occasion shall require, the Governor from time to time, if it shall seem fit, on the application of the Road Board, may appoint a sufficient number of Polling Places for such road district at which the poll shall be taken at all elections held for the same, and may from time to time, on the like application, alter and vary the same: And whereas the Board of the Paroa Road District have applied to have certain Polling Places appointed in lieu of those hitherto appointed in the said Paroa Road District:

Court House, Dunganville;  
Court House, Pounamu;  
Court House, Maori Gully.

*Green Island Light.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Light will be exhibited on Green Island on and after 1st July next.

The illuminating apparatus is fixed Dioptric of the Fourth Order, showing a red light on the following bearings, which are magnetic and taken from seaward:—

1. From N. 16° E. to S. 18° E. (146°).

And showing a green light—

1. From N. 16° E. to N. 44° W. (60°).

2. From S. 18° E. to S. 25° W. (43°).

The remaining portion of the whole circle is obscured by the island itself.

The focal plane of the light is 95 feet above mean sea level, and in clear weather it should be seen at a distance of 14 miles.

PACIFIC OCEAN.

NOTICE No. 31.—SOUTH-WESTERN PART, FIJI ISLANDS.

THE following information relating to the Fiji Islands has been received from Lieutenant Rendell, R.N., commanding H.M.S. "Beagle," 1874.\*

All bearings are magnetic. Variation 9° 45' East-erly in 1875.

NANUKU PASSAGE.

*Taviuni* is the largest island on the western side of Nanuku Passage: from Vuna Point, the south-west extreme of Taviuni Island, a reef, on which the sea always breaks, extends 1½ miles in a westerly direction; the south point of the island is steep-to, and may be approached within 2 cables.

From the south point, the east side of Taviuni Island trends about N.E. ½ N. 13 miles to a point off which a reef extends about 7 or 8 cables, thence the shore to the northward recedes, forming a deep bay fringed by a reef; the coast between the south point of the island and the point off which the reef extends is precipitous, and steep-to except abreast of *Salia Jevu*, which is 5 miles from the south point of the island, and where there is a small reef close in shore.

*Vuna Point Anchorage*.—Anchorage can be obtained off Vuna Point, in 10 fathoms, sandy bottom, with Hamilton Store (a prominent zinc building on the beach), in line with a small house on the hill behind it.

*Tasman Strait* is formed by Taviuni Island on the west, and Quamea Island on the east. Vuro-Vuro Bay on the north side of a small promontory, which is situated on the west side of the southern entrance to Tasman Strait, affords good anchorage in 15 fathoms, sandy bottom, and protected from nearly all winds; good water can be obtained from a stream in the south-west part of the bay.

From the north point of Vuro-Vuro Bay a reef extends towards Quamea Island, contracting Tasman Strait in this part to less than one mile. The out-lying reefs in the strait are easily distinguished on a clear day.

The tides in Tasman Strait run strong, the ebb setting to the northward, and flood to the southward; therefore vessels should not attempt to pass through the strait under sail without a commanding breeze.

*Quamea Island (Qamea)* is thickly wooded, and the coast indented with deep bays; on the east side of Quamea Island there is a narrow passage separating it from Laucala Island, passable only by boats; to the south-eastward of Quamea and Laucala Islands, and distant from 1 mile to 1½ miles, lies a reef, which partially surrounds the islands; between the reef and the south sides of the islands good anchorage can be obtained in nearly all parts; the only passages leading into the anchorage are formed by two detached patches at the south-western extremity of the reef.

*Thane Reef*, on which the sea breaks heavily, is

about half a mile in diameter, and lies N.E. by E.  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the south point of Laucaia Island.

*Nanuku Islets* lie about 24 miles E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. from the north point of Taviuni Island; they consist of two small coral islets, distant about a quarter of a mile from each other in a N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. direction. Nanuku Islets are situated on the south end of a long reef about three-quarters of a mile within the extremity; from the islets the reef extends 3 miles in a N.N.E. direction, thence N.E. 6 miles, where it trends abruptly to the W.N.W.; anchorage could not be obtained in the vicinity of the islets, the reef being steep-to on both sides; several detached patches were seen from the mast-head of the "Beagle," extending a long distance to the westward of the reef.

*Nukubasaga Islets.*—About 38 miles N.E. from the north point of Taviuni Island, lies a coral reef  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles in length in a N.E. by N. and S.W. by S. direction, and one mile in breadth, on which the two small Nukubasaga Islets are situated; the larger is near the N.E. edge of the reef, and the smaller near the S.W. edge, distant from each other half a mile.

On the west side of the reef there is a passage used by small vessels, but it cannot be recommended on account of the numerous coral patches that exist in the entrance; detached patches of coral reef also extend to the south-westward in the direction of Nukusemanu Island.

*Anchorage.*—H.M.S. "Beagle" obtained anchorage on the north side of the reef surrounding Nukubasaga Islets, in 10 fathoms, coral bottom, but it was not considered safe on account of the strong tides in the vicinity.

*Na-gali Island, Nuku Levu or Qele Levu*, known also as Nuku Balanu, is the largest of the eastern Bingsgold Isles, and lies N. by E. about 14 miles from the larger Nukubasaga Islet. Na-gali Island is of coral formation, about 3 miles in circumference, about 80 feet high in some parts, and covered with coconut trees; the east side of the island is steep-to, but there are several small rocks and islets lying off the west end.

Fresh water could not be obtained on the island.

*Anchorage.*—On the west side of Na-gali Island, and formed by the coral reef extending from it, is a lagoon,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles in length from east to west, and 5 miles in breadth at its broadest part; no dangers were found in the lagoon, and good anchorage may be obtained in any part of it in 10 to 13 fathoms. There are several openings into the lagoon at the west end of the reef; the best entrance lies 8 miles W.S.W. from Na-gali Island.

*Vatava Island (Korotuna)*, situated about 14 miles west of Na-gali Island, is about three-quarters of a mile in length from N.E. to S.W., and surrounded by a fringing reef extending about three-quarters of a mile from the shore.

*Weilagitala Islands (Wailagilala)* consist of two small coral islands joined by a sand spit, situated at the north-east part of a reef forming a lagoon, the entrance of which lies about 20 miles east of Nanuku Islets. The islands are low, and covered with tropical vegetation, but fresh water could not be obtained; they are not inhabited, but are visited periodically by natives of the larger islands, for the purpose of collecting cocoa-nuts.

*Anchorage.*—On the south-west side of Weilagitala Islands is a lagoon formed by the reef extending from them; the lagoon is 3 miles long in a N. by W. and S. by E. direction, and  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles in breadth; it appeared free from dangers, and affords good anchorage in 15 to 18 fathoms, bottom sand and coral.

The entrance to the lagoon is on the west side of the reef, bearing S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. from Weilagitala Islands;

the entrance is half a cable broad, having a depth of 7 fathoms.

*Dangerous Rock.*—This rock, supposed to exist near the middle of Nanuku Passage, was searched for in H.M.S. "Beagle," but could not be found.

*Naitauba Island (Naitaba)*, lying about 44 miles E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. from the south point of Taviuni Island, is a high basaltic island, occupying a triangular space, with the apex to the south-eastward, on which is a remarkable peak. Naitauba Island is surrounded by a reef, having deep water inside, and a boat passage, the entrance to which is sometimes rendered impassable by the heavy swell.

*Yeata or Cap Island (Yacata)*, lying S.W. by S. 17 miles from Naitauba Island, is surrounded by a reef. Yeata Island is unapproachable except in smooth water.

*Nukatobe Reef (Nuga-tobe)* has three small islets on it, and lies 5 miles W.S.W. from the west point of Yeata Island.

*Tidal Streams* are very strong between the islands situated to the northward of Nanuku Passage; the general direction of the flood tide is to the southward, and that of the ebb to the northward, but they are much affected by the islands, reefs, and prevailing winds.

H.M.S. "Beagle" experienced a strong westerly set when north of Weilagitala Island, after a continuance of strong trade winds.
