Regulations for Settlement on Special Block of Land.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Minister therein mentioned, make regulations for the sale, occupation, and disposal of land taken under the said Act, and all such lands as specified in the 60th section of the said Act, and such regulations may provide specially for the occupation of any of such lands by and for the sale or disposal thereof to immigrants introduced under the provisions of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and the said Act, or otherwise, and prescribe the terms and conditions upon which such lands may be so occupied, sold, or disposed of, and the mode of allotment, and may provide for the occupation and disposal of such lands without payment, or for the sale of such lands upon payment either present or deferred, and prescribe the mode or order of allotment of or application for such lands, the size or acreage of the sections into which the lands shall be divided, and the regulations shall, if any part of the land is intended to be laid off as town or suburban lands, prescribe for the laying off of such lands into town, suburban, and rural sections: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act, bearing even date herewith, the lands therein particularly mentioned were reserved and set apart for the purposes of immigration and to be dealt with under the said Act: And whereas the Minister for Immigration has recommended the Governor to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the sale, occupation, and disposal of the lands so reserved and set apart as aforesaid:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, and on the recommendation of the said Minister, do

hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the sale, occupation, and disposal of the lands so reserved and set apart by the said Proclamation of even date herewith.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

SCHEDULE.

1. In the interpretation of these Regulations, unless there is something in the context repugnant thereto, the following terms and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say,—

"Minister" shall mean the Minister for Immigration for the time being. "Settlement" shall mean the block of country

"Settlement" shall mean the block of country in the Province of Wellington described in the Schedule to a certain Proclamation made under "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," bearing even date herewith. "Settler" means any person authorized to settle on the said block of land in accordance with these Regulations.

2. The lands comprised within the said settlement shall be rural lands, and shall be surveyed by and at the expense of the General Government, in sections as nearly as may be of not less than 40 acres each, and such sections shall be of such depth and with such frontages to roads or roadways as may be best fitted to afford convenient access to the lands. The whole of the lands comprised in the said settlement shall on the publication hereof cease to be subject to the Regulations in force in the Province of Wellington for the sale and disposal of the waste lands of the Crown.

3. Roads and road lines shall be laid off through the said settlement in such directions as may be thought expedient.

4. Within the settlement, the Minister may from time to time make such reserves for the purposes of the Government of the colony, or for railways, bridges, roads, tramways, or other public works, or for schools, and schoolhouses, churches or chapels, or for the purpose of preserving the timber in any part of the settlement, as he may think fit.

5. Such reserves shall be managed in such manner as the Minister shall think fit, and he may allow the same to be occupied, sold, or disposed of under these Regulations on such terms and conditions as he shall prescribe. The purpose for which any such reserve shall have been made may be changed by the Minister, and any such reserve may be by him withdrawn from reservation. Notice of the making of any such reserve, and of any change made in the purposes for which the same shall have been reserved, or of any withdrawal thereof, shall be notified in the New Zealand Gazette. 6. The persons to be located on the said settlement

6. The persons to be located on the said settlement shall be such immigrants as shall from time to time be approved of by the Minister, and the head of each family of such immigrants shall be allowed to select one section of land in the settlement. Such selection shall be made in such order and at such time as the Minister shall prescribe.

7. During the first two years of his occupation, if the settler shall have erected on the land selected a habitable dwelling-house, and shall have improved the land by falling the bush thereon, cropping or laying down in grass, and fencing at least 5 acres thereof, he shall be allowed to continue his holding and to purchase the land at a price of £1 per acre, payable in equal annual instalments of £13 6s. 8d. each ; such instalments to be payable at the end of each year after the expiration of the first two years. The money to be paid in such manner and to such persons as the Minister shall from time to time direct.

8. If at the end of the said two years' occupation the settler shall be in a position to pay for his land at once, he shall be at liberty to do so at the rate aforesaid.

9. Any failure to make the said payments or to perform and fulfil the conditions above prescribed will occasion a forfeiture of the land selected, and of all claim thereto or interest therein.

10. Upon full payment of the purchase money at the rates aforesaid, and upon the performance of the terms of these Regulations, the settler shall be entitled to a Crown grant of his land free of any further expense, except the usual Crown grant fees. 11. No settler shall be at liberty to part with, sell,

11. No settler shall be at liberty to part with, sell, assign, charge, or encumber his estate or interest in any land selected by him under these Regulations until he shall have paid his said purchase money, and otherwise complied with these Regulations: Provided that the Minister may in any case, if he think

fit, by writing under his hand, consent to any such sale, assignment, or charge upon the land selected as aforesaid.

Lands set apart for Immigration Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixty-first section of "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amend-ment Act, 1871," it is enacted that in any Province in which there are not at any time, in the opinion of the Governor, waste lands of the Crown set apart or taken under the provisions of the said "Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," or any other Act, for the purpose of furnishing means for defraying the costs of railways or other like purposes connected with railways, sufficient in quantity and suitable in quality and in situation for settling immigrants, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, reserve and set apart any waste lands of the Crown within such province for the purposes of immigration, and to be dealt with under the said Act: And whereas there are not now, in the opinion of me, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, waste lands of the Crown in the Province of Wellington set apart or taken under the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act, for the purpose of furnishing means for defraying the costs of railways, or other like purposes connected with railways, suffi-cient in quantity and suitable in quality and situation for settling immigrants :

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said section of the said Act, and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, and on the recommendation of the Minister for Immigration, do, by this Proclamation, reserve and set apart the land described in the Schedule hereto, being waste lands within the Province of Wellington, for the purposes of immigration, and to be dealt with under the said Act.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Arr that parcel of land in the Forty Mile Bush District, containing by estimation 6,000 acres, and known by the name of the Manawatu-Wairarapa No. 1 Block; bounded towards the North-east by the Manawatu-Wairarapa No. 2 Block; towards the East by the Ngatapu No. 1 Block; towards the South-west by the Manawatu Block; and towards the Northwest by the Makakahi River. Excepting the Native Reserve of 1,000 acres in the said block.

Assent of Natives to bringing certain Lands under "The Native Reserves Act, 1856."

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifth day of October, 1875.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOB IN COUNCIL. **THEREAS** by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Native Reserves Amendment Act, 1862," it is, amongst other things, provided that where, under the provisions of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants is required to bringing land under the operation of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare such assent to have been ascertained; and thereupon the title of the aboriginal inhabitants in the land to which the same shall relate shall be deemed to be extinguished, and the lands shall, from the date of such Order in Council, vest in Her Majesty for the purposes and subject to the provi-sions of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," as altered by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and that as effectually as if the same had been ceded and conveyed by such aboriginal inhabitants to Her Majesty: And whereas it hath been certified and reported to the Governor by Alexander Mackay, Esq., a person duly appointed in that behalf, that the aboriginal inhabitants entitled to the several pieces or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto have assented that the said several pieces or parcels of land shall be subject to the provisions of "The New Zealand Native Reserves Act, 1856:"

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants entitled to the several pieces or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereunder written, that the said pieces or parcels of land shall be subject to the provisions of "The New Zealand Native Reserves Act, 1856," has been ascertained.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece of land situate at the Parapara, in the Province of Nelson, containing by admeasure-ment one hundred and fifty acres, more or less, and known as Section 192 on the plan of the district; bounded towards the North, one thousand seven hundred (1700) links and one thousand (1000) links respectively, partly by the Parapara mudflat, and partly by Section 104; towards the East, three thou-sand six hundred (3600) links, by Sections 71, 72, 75, and 77 of Milnthorpe Suburban; towards the South, three thousand six hundred (3600) links, by Crown lands; and towards the West, three thousand six hundred (3600) links partly by Section 96, and partly by Subsection 1 of Section 193.

All that piece of land situate at Tauaro, West Whanganui, containing by admeasurement one hundred and fifty-five acres, more or less; bounded towards the North by high watermark of the Pacific

South by high watermark of West Whanganui Inlet; and towards the West, six thousand eight hundred and twenty (6820) links, by Crown land. All those pieces of land situate at the Croixelles,

in the Province of Nelson, containing in the aggregate by estimation one thousand acres, more or less, and known as the Whangarae and Okiwi Native Reserves, bounded severally on one side by high watermark of Croixelles Harbour, and on other sides respectively by Crown land.

. Tairua Licensing District Regulations.

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifth day of October, 1875.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOB IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by the thirty-ninth section of "The Licensing Act 1873 Amendment Act, 1874, it is, among other things, enacted that, in order to make provision for the granting of licenses on gold fields and in outlying districts, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to proclaim any district in any province of the colony, the boundaries whereof shall be defined in such Proclamation, to be a special licensing district, and the boundaries of such district from time to time to alter, and to abolish any such district:

Provided that it shall be lawful for the Legislature of any province in which any such districts may be proclaimed to provide and declare what fees shall be payable for any such license; to attach conditions to the exercise and duration of any such license, and to impose upon the licensee such duties, liabilities, and obligations as shall be thought fit; and, subject to the said Act, to prescribe the forms, time, and mode of granting any such licenses:

Provided further, that until any such Legislature shall have passed any such Ordinance as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to make. any regulations for all or any of the purposes for which any such Ordinance may or can be passed under or by virtue of the now reciting section, and all such regulations shall be made with the consent of the Superintendent of the province in which they are to take effect, and shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette, and in the Gazette of the province in which they are so to take effect:

And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, a special licensing district, to be called "The Tairua Special Licensing District," has been constituted within the Province of Auckland:

And whereas the Legislature of the said province has not passed any Ordinance for the purposes in the hereinbefore recited section mentioned, and it is expedient that regulations should be made for such purposes :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him in this behalf, and with the consent of the Superintendent of the said province, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes aforesaid.

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses may be issued for the sale of alcoholic towards the North by high watermark of the Pacific Ocean; towards the East, four thousand nine hundred and fifty (4950) links, by Crown lands; towards the 2. All such licenses shall be made to expire on the 31st day of December next following the date of granting the same.

3. The house and premises in respect of which any such license may be granted shall not be opened before six o'clock in the morning, and shall be closed at ten o'clock at night: Provided that upon payment at the time of issue of license of an extra fee of five pounds, permission may be given to keep open the licensed premises until twelve o'clock p.m.; but the restrictions in this regulation contained shall not apply to the supply of refreshments to bond fide travellers.

4. No such licensed house or premises shall be opened for the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays, except in the case of *bond fide* travellers as aforesaid.

5. The accommodation to be provided in respect of any house or premises for which a license shall be applied for hereunder shall be such as shall be approved of by the person empowered to grant such license.

6. Applications for licenses must be in writing, addressed to the person empowered to grant the same, and must specify the locality for which the license is asked, and the accommodation provided or intended to be provided for the public, and the hours during which it is proposed such house and premises shall be open.

7. Except in so far as they may be inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of section 39 of "The Licensing Act 1873 Amendment Act, 1874," and of these regulations, the whole of the laws now in force within the Province of Auckland for the regulation of the sale of alcoholic liquors shall be applicable to all licenses granted hereunder; and excepting as aforesaid, any such licensee shall be deemed to have imposed upon him all the duties, liabilities, and obligations which are imposed upon the holders of publicans' licenses under the said laws.

Every license granted hereunder shall be subject to be forfeited if in the opinion of the person empowered to grant licenses hereunder it shall be necessary or desirable to do so; and such forfeiture shall be deemed to be complete when notice thereof under his hand shall have been delivered to the licensee or affixed to the licensed premises.
