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*Formation of a new District for Tokomairiro, and alteration of the Western Otago District, under "The Debtors and Creditors Act, 1875."*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the eighth section of "The Debtors and Creditors Act, 1875," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, as he thinks fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, constitute any part of New Zealand into a district under the said Act, and such districts may be coterminous with a district under "The District Courts Act, 1858," or not; and may abolish any such district or alter the boundaries thereof, and declare by what local name each such district shall be called:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, the districts of "Tokomairiro" and of "Western Otago" were proclaimed and constituted districts under the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to constitute a new district in lieu of the Tokomairiro District, and to alter the boundaries of the Western Otago District:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the said colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me for this purpose by the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and constitute the Districts of Tokomairiro and Clutha and of Western Otago, as hereinafter described, to be respectively districts under the said Debtors and Creditors Act, 1875, under the respective local names of the "Tokomairiro and Clutha District" and "Western Otago District."

TOKOMAIBIRO AND CLUTHA DISTRICT.

All that land bounded towards the North and North-east by the Otago Gold Fields and the Dunedin District Court Districts from Black Umbrella to the mouth of the Taieri River; towards the South-east and South by the sea; and towards the West and again towards the South by the Western Otago District hereinafter defined, to the south-eastern corner of Run No. 193; and again towards the West by the Otago Gold Fields District to Black Umbrella.

WESTERN OTAGO DISTRICT.

All that land bounded towards the North and North-east by the Otago Gold Fields District Court District, as defined in the Schedule to the Proclamation dated 10th July, 1875, from Milford Sound to the south-eastern corner of Run No. 193, and thence by a right line due east to the western branch of the Waikaka River; thence towards the East by that branch and the Waikaka River to its junction with the Pukerau River, by a right line to the north-eastern corner of the Tuturau Hundred, and by the eastern boundaries of the Tuturau, Mokoreta, and Toitoe's Hundred to the sea; and towards the South and West by the sea to Milford Sound.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; at the Government House at Wellington, this twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

*Boundaries of District Courts Districts of Western Otago and Tokomairiro and Clutha altered.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be within the colony Courts of Record, possessing civil and criminal jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he

shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter, and also to declare by what local name each such Court shall be designated:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the Districts of "Western Otago" and "Tokomairiro and Clutha" were appointed districts within which District Courts should be respectively held under the said Act, under the respective designations of "the District Court of Western Otago" and the "District Court of Tokomairiro and Clutha:"

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the above-mentioned districts:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the said colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby constitute and proclaim the districts herein-after described to be the districts within which the "District Court of Western Otago" and the "District Court of Tokomairiro and Clutha" shall be respectively held under the said Act and any Act amending the same.

#### WESTERN OTAGO DISTRICT.

All that land bounded towards the North and North-east by the Otago Gold Fields District Court District, as defined in the Schedule to the Proclamation dated 10th July, 1875, from Milford Sound to the south-eastern corner of Run No. 193, and thence by a right line due east to the western branch of the Waikaka River; thence towards the East by that branch and the Waikaka River to its junction with the Pukerau River, by a right line to the north-eastern corner of the Tukurau Hundred, and by the eastern boundaries of the Tukurau, Mokoreta, and Toitoes Hundreds to the sea; and towards the South and West by the sea to Milford Sound.

#### TOKOMAIRO AND CLUTHA DISTRICT.

All that land bounded towards the North and North-east by the Otago Gold Fields and the Dunedin District Court Districts from Black Umbrella to the mouth of the Taieri River; towards the South-east and South by the sea; and towards the West and again towards the South by the Western Otago District hereinbefore defined, to the south-eastern corner of Run No. 193; and again towards the West by the Otago Gold Fields District to Black Umbrella.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House at Wellington, this twelfth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

*District under "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875."*

#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the seventh section of "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the colony for the purposes of the said Act into such and so many districts as he shall think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District: And it is provided that the districts existing at the time of the coming into operation of the said Act under any of the Acts repealed thereby shall, until altered, be deemed to be districts proclaimed under the said Act:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the then Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him, did, amongst others, constitute a district called the "Cambelltown" District, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the then Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him, did constitute the Island of Ruapeke a separate and distinct district, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on and from the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relate to the said districts, and to proclaim anew the territory comprised within such districts as one district:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations, so far as they relate to the "Cambelltown" and "Ruapuke" Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within the said districts shall be comprised in one district, the name and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

#### CAMPBELLTOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Mataura River; on the South by the ocean; on the West by the estuary of the New River; and on the North by the Mokomoko Inlet, and a right line from the south-east corner thereof, drawn east to cut the Mataura. Including also Dog Island and the Island of Ruapuke.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-

in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

*Districts under "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858."*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the then Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute a district for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Cambelltown" District, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the then Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him, did, amongst others, constitute the Island of Ruapuke as a district for the purposes of the said Act, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on and from the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the said districts, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such districts as one district:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the said colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations so far as they relate to the Cambelltown and Ruapuke Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within the said districts shall be comprised in one district, the name and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

CAMBELLTOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Matura River; on the South by the Ocean; on the West by the estuary of the New River; and on the North by the Moko-moko Inlet, and a right line from the south-east corner thereof, drawn east to cut the Matura. Including also Dog Island and the Island of Ruapuke.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall

come into operation and take effect on the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House at Wellington, this thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

*Delegating Powers under the 7th and 10th Sections of "The Marine Act, 1867," to the Otago Harbour Board.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of January, 1876.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the ninth section of "The Harbour Boards Act, 1870," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time delegate to any Harbour Board constituted thereunder all or any of the powers and authorities vested in him by the provisions contained in the seventh and tenth sections of "The Marine Act, 1867," subject to any regulations, restrictions, or stipulations that may be specified in such order:

And whereas it is expedient that certain powers should be delegated to the Otago Harbour Board as in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby delegate unto the

OTAGO HARBOUR BOARD

the several powers and authorities mentioned and set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, such powers and authorities to be exercised within the limits of the Port of Dunedin, as therein also mentioned, subject, however, to such restrictions as in the said Schedule set forth:

And in further pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore in part recited power, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, I do hereby delegate unto the said Otago Harbour Board all the powers vested in the Governor in Council by the tenth section of "The Marine Act, 1867:" Provided that the delegation lastly hereinbefore contained shall be limited to the said Port of Dunedin.

SCHEDULE.

SUCH of the powers vested in the Governor by the

seventh section of "The Marine Act, 1867," as enable him to erect, superintend, and maintain harbour marks, buoys, lights, and beacons within the limits of the Port of Dunedin or the approaches thereto: Subject, however, to such directions as may from time to time be issued by the Commissioner of Customs as to the size, position, and colour of such harbour marks, buoys, and, beacons, and, in the case of lights, to the approval first obtained of the said Commissioner of Customs: Also such of the powers vested in the Governor by the said seventh section as enables him to suspend Port or Harbour Masters, and to appoint, suspend, or remove other officers of any port or harbour: Provided that this delegation shall be limited to the Port of Dunedin.

The Port of Dunedin referred to in the foregoing Order in Council is defined in a Warrant bearing date the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of April in the same year.

*Revocation of certain Powers delegated to the Superintendent of Otago under "The Marine Act, 1867."*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of January, 1876.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Marine Act, 1867," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time delegate all or any of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act as therein mentioned, and every such delegation from time to time alter or revoke: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-third of January in the same year, His Excellency the then Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, did delegate unto the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and his successors in such office, certain powers vested in him by sections seven, twelve, thirteen, and forty-two of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the delegation so made as aforesaid, so far as concerns the Port of Dunedin:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf, revoke so much of the said Order in Council, of the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, as delegated to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and his successors in such office, the powers therein specified under the seventh section of "The Marine Act, 1867," and the powers under the twelfth, thirteenth, and forty-second sections of the said Act; but such revocation shall operate and extend with respect to the Port of Dunedin only, as such port is defined in a Warrant bearing date the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of April in the same year.

*Delegating Powers under the 12th, 13th, and 42nd sections of "The Marine Act, 1867," to the Otago Harbour Board.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of January, 1876.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Marine Act, 1867," hereinafter called "the said Act," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers vested in him by the said Act, subject to any restrictions or stipulations which may be specified in such order; and whereas by an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, the Governor did, amongst other things, revoke so much of an Order in Council bearing date the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, as delegated to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and his successors in such office, certain powers under the twelfth section of the said Act; but in the Order in Council now in recital it was provided that such revocation should operate and extend with respect to the Port of Dunedin only: And whereas and by virtue of "The Harbour Boards Act, 1870," two Ordinances have been passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled respectively "The Otago Harbour Board Ordinance, 1874," and "The Otago Harbour Board Ordinance 1874 Amendment Ordinance, 1875," whereby a Harbour Board for the Port of Dunedin has been constituted under the name of "The Otago Harbour Board:" And whereas it is expedient that the powers conferred upon the Governor by the twelfth, thirteenth, and forty-second sections of the said Act should be delegated to the said Board as hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited power and authority, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby delegate unto the Otago Harbour Board the powers vested in me by the twelfth, thirteenth, and forty-second sections of the said Act: Provided, however, that this delegation shall extend and operate as far as regards the Port of Dunedin only; and that the powers so delegated shall only be exercised by the said Board within the limits of the said port, as the same is defined in a Warrant bearing date the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of April in the same year.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the

administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

EDWARD SHAW, Esq.,

to be a Warden of all Wardens' Courts now constituted, or hereafter to be constituted, within the Nelson South-West Gold Fields, with power to him to act alone or with assessors, and to exercise all or any of the powers vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.

*Appointing additional Gazettes under "The Debtors and Creditors Act, 1875."*

WHEREAS by the fifth section of "The Debtors and Creditors Act, 1875," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the term "Gazette" in the said Act shall mean any newspaper or newspapers to be from time to time appointed by the Governor for each district: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, the districts named in the Schedule hereto were, amongst others, constituted districts under the said Act: And whereas by a notice also dated the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, certain newspapers were appointed Gazettes for such districts respectively; and whereas it is expedient to appoint other newspapers Gazettes in addition to those appointed as aforesaid: Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me, do hereby appoint that, for the districts named in the Schedule hereto, the newspapers the names whereof are in the said Schedule set opposite to the names of such districts shall be the Gazettes for such districts respectively under the said Act, in addition to the newspapers appointed by the said notice of the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

*Diseased Cattle Importation.*

THE following Proclamations relating to the importation of diseased cattle, and the prohibition of the importation of carcasses of cattle, sheep, and pigs, issued by the Government of Tasmania, are published for general information.

DISEASED CATTLE IMPORTATION.

By His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by my Proclamation dated the fifth day of April last past, I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me (25 Victoria, No. 4), did restrict the importation into any part of Tasmania of cattle imported for any purpose other than slaughter from any part of the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, and Western Australia: And whereas by my Proclamation dated the twelfth day of April aforesaid, I, the said Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, did, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, make further provision in respect of the importation of cattle for any purpose other than slaughter from the Colony of New South Wales: And whereas it is expedient to annul the lastly hereinbefore recited Proclamation, and to make other provision in lieu thereof: Now therefore, I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and by virtue of the power conferred on me (25 Victoria, No. 4), do hereby annul the said Proclamation dated the twelfth day of April aforesaid, and further do, by this Proclamation, prohibit the importation into any part of Tasmania of all cattle imported for any purpose other than slaughter from any part of the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, and New Zealand, under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore recited Proclamation, unless the owner of such cattle shall produce to the Inspecting Officer appointed by the Governor in Council, at the port in Tasmania where the same shall arrive, a certificate in writing, signed by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, to the effect that such cattle were inspected and examined by him immediately before shipment, and that they were at the time they were so inspected and examined by him free from any contagious or infectious disease whatever which would be likely to propagate amongst men or animals any such contagious or infectious disease, or any other disease.

## CARCASSES OF CATTLE, SHEEP, AND PIGS IMPORTATION PROHIBITION.

By His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS with a view to prevent any infectious or contagious distempers or disease amongst cattle, sheep, and pigs, it is expedient to prohibit the importation into Tasmania of the carcasses of any such animals exported from the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, or New Zealand: Now therefore, I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, by virtue of section twenty-three of the the Customs Act (25 Victoria, No. 3), and with the advice of the Executive Council, do, with a view to prevent infectious and contagious distempers or disease among cattle, sheep, and pigs, hereby prohibit the importation into Tasmania of the carcasses of any cattle, sheep, or pigs which have been exported from the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, or New Zealand, or any of them.

N.B.—Although the Auckland and Hokitika Hospitals are situated outside the boundaries of the respective boroughs, yet the deaths in them have, for the sake of uniformity, been included in this Report.

The population has been estimated by adding the excess of births over deaths since the 1st March, 1874, to the then census population. It is impossible to estimate the increase from immigration.

The births were 8 less than in November.

The deaths were 10 more in number than the deaths in November.

Of the deaths, males contributed 72; females, 52: 53 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 42.74 per cent. of the whole number; 41 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

There were 10 deaths of persons of 65 years of age and over—namely, 5 males and 5 females. Of the males, three were aged 78, 75, and 70 respectively; 1 died at Nelson, 2 at Dunedin. One of the females was 76 years of age; she died at Wellington.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs named, and that were registered, during the Month of December, 1875.

The deaths in December were 124, against 114 in November. Zymotic diseases caused 29 deaths in December, against 25 in November. Of those diseases in December, typhoid fever caused 9 deaths (5 of which occurred in Christchurch), and dysentery and diarrhoea 9 deaths.

The number of deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs was 18 in December, against 19 in November.

The violent deaths were 6 in December; of which two were from injuries received in birth.

In December, 1874, the deaths for the 7 boroughs amounted to 130. There were then 40 deaths from zymotic diseases against 29 in December, 1875. The deaths from measles and diarrhoea largely augmented the number of deaths from zymotic diseases in December, 1874.
