NORMANBY, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," (hereinafter called "the said Act,") it is enacted, that whenever the Governor shall determine to construct any railway, or any part thereof, it shall be lawful for him, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, to declare and define the limits and define the limit define the limits and description and line thereof, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of such railway, subject to the provisions of any Act defining such limits and descriptions; and upon the publication of such Proclamation, the provisions and regulations contained in the Seventh Part of the said Act shall be applicable to the railway, and to the

And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is enacted that as to any railway which the Governor has been authorized to construct, and to fix the commencing and termination points and line thereof, it shall be competent for him, if he thinks fit, instead of fixing and proclaiming such points and the whole line at one time, to fix and proclaim portions of such line from time to time, and the commencing and termination points of any such portion or portions, and the limits and description of any such portion or portions, and the lands proposed to be taken for the purpose of any such portion or portions, and to construct any portion or portions so fixed, and to take the lands for the same; and any such portion so proclaimed shall be deemed to be a railway within the meaning of the said Act and the said amending Act and this Act:

And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is enacted that, at any time after the expiration of twenty-one days from the publication in the New Zealand Gazette, and in a

Notification of Governor's Assent to Construction of Railway from Anderson's Junction to Portobello, by the Dunedin, Peninsula, and Ocean Beach Railway Company (Limited).

WHEREAS by the seventh subsection of the fourth section of "The Railway Companies Act, 1875," (hereinafter called "the said Act,") it is, amongst other things, enacted that if any such proposed branch railway as is mentioned in the Act Waitaki Railway Station.

is approved of, and such approval is signified as hereinafter provided, then the company may proceed with the construction of such railway in accordance with the said Act: And it is further enacted that whenever the Governor shall approve of any proposed branch railway, he shall, by notice published in the New Zealand Gazette, declare his assent to the construction of the railway, and such notice, when so published, shall be sufficient notice to the company of such approval: And whereas the Dunedin, Peninsula, and Ocean Beach Railway Company (Limited) have deposited plans of a projected railway from Anderson's Bay Junction to Portobello, at the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, and in other respects complied with the terms of the said Act: And whereas one-half of the whole body of the ratepayers resident within the highway districts through which the railway is proposed to be constructed have not objected to the construction of the railway: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and in exercise of every other power enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby notify and declare that he assents to the construction of the said railway from Anderson's Bay Junction to Portobello.

Rules and Regulations under which Waitaki Bridge will be open for Ordinary Traffic.

## NORMANBY, Governor.

In pursuance of all powers and authorities vested in me for that purpose, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following Regulations authorizing traffic on, along, or across the Waitaki Bridge, on the North Otago Railways, in the Province of Otago, and fixing the times or occasions during or on which such traffic shall be allowed, and generally regulating such traffic, that is to say,—

1. All horses crossing the bridge should be driven in harness, or led by bridle or halter; and cattle and sheep, &c., must have a man behind and before

them.

2. Horses or light-wheeled vehicles will not be allowed to enter upon the bridge within fifteen minutes, drays within thirty minutes, and cattle and sheep or pigs within one hour of the advertised time of arrival and departure of any train from the Waitaki Railway Station.

3. Horsemen or wheeled vehicles will not be allowed to travel at a greater rate than six miles an

hour across the bridge.

4. Traction engines, or engines employed in agriculture, or flax-dressing, or any other purpose, will not be permitted on the bridge otherwise than on the goods wagons in use on the Provincial Government

5. No greater weight than two tons gross on any one pair of wheels with tires less than five inches

wide will be permitted to cross the bridge.

6. In the event of a special train, the Provincial Government shall have the power to put in force the same restrictions as described in clause 2 for advertised trains.

- 7. Any damage done to any part of the bridge by the contravention of any of the foregoing rules may be recovered by a summary process; and any person or persons entering upon the bridge within the prohibited hours, or resisting the gatekeepers in the execution of their duties, will be subject to a penalty hereinafter mentioned.
- 8. Any person in a state of intoxication will not be permitted to enter upon the bridge whilst in such condition.
- 9. Any person offending against any of these regulations will be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Additional Regulations under "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1875."

> NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twentieth day of June, 1876.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1875," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to make regulations for fixing and determining the fees, rates, or dues to be demanded and received for the transmission of any despatch, message, or communication by means of any telegraph line, and for the delivery thereof, respectively; and that such regulations shall have the force of law when published in the Government Gazette of the colony:

Now, therefore, His Excellency George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the hereinbefore recited Act, doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, make the additional regulations contained in the Schedule hereto: And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His said Excellency doth hereby order and declare that such regulations shall take effect from and after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and that they shall be read with and form part of the regulations now in force.

## SCHEDULE.

THE tariff rates at present in force, limiting the receipt of telegrams by evening papers, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on week-days, to two

hundred (200) words at evening rates, shall, during the present Session of Parliament, be extended to five hundred (500) words between the same hours.

Cruising round north end of Ovalau, Fiji, we discovered a sunken rock, least water 15 feet, and 7 fathoms close to and around.

The marks for it are centre of Tumuna Peak, S.S.E. North Point, E. by N.

"Barracouta:" Extract from Remark Book of Navigating Lieutenant A. R. Wonham, LEVUKA HARBOUR, FIJI.

A coral head, with  $3\frac{3}{4}$  fathoms on it at low-water spring, lies S.  $41^{\circ}$  E.  $6\frac{3}{5}$  of a cable from Observation Point.

This appears to be identical with the 4-fathom patch shown on the survey of Levuka Harbour, by Navigating Lieutenant W. Tooker, H.M.S. "Dido," Captain W. C. Chapman, 1874.

Clearing Mark: The beacon erected on Half Tide

Clearing Mark: The beacon erected on Half Tide Rock in line with the right extreme of Ovalau, N.N.W. ½ W., clears the Horse's Heads and patches which are off Nasooa. The buoys in the north entrance are not to be depended on.

The chequered buoy has been washed away; the red buoy has been drifted from  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a cable to

the southward.

The chequered buoy which was placed on a patch, having 10 ft. of water over it at low water, S.E. by E.,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cables from Observation Spot, has been removed. The rock has been blown up.

Up to the 1st December, 1875, nothing had been done to replace the buoys in the north entrance.

## NGALOU HARBOUR, KANDAVAU.

The following additional buoys and beacons have been placed in the passages and harbour. (Corrected 28th November, 1875.)

Entrance.—One red buoy on the south edge of Esk Reef; one red buoy on the north edge of Macgregor Patch; one black buoy on the north edge of Pearl Reef; one red buoy with a black and red perch on the south edge of Macgregor Patch.

In the Harbour.—One beacon iron, with a triangle, coloured red and white, in horizontal bands, on the east edge of Wood Shoal; one red buoy on the west edge of Wood Shoal; one red buoy on the  $1\frac{3}{4}$ -fathom patch, which lies W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., nearly 5 cables from the outer beacon, Ngalou Island. The buoy which was formerly moored off the outer beacon point has been removed.

At night hand lamps are placed on shelves in the beacons, but at present they give but a dim light, rendering it doubtful whether they could be seen farther out than the main channel. New lamps have been ordered.

Tonga or Friendly Islands.

(Chart No. 2421.)

Tonga.—A rock 27 ft. high was seen by the Dutch

ship "Metis," January, 1875, in lat. 19° 21" S., long 174° 51" W. This is probably identical with the rock reported by Her Majesty's ship "Blanche," Hydrographical notice No. 21, of September, 1871. (See notices, Pacific Ocean, 1873, page 78.)

## HAPAI GROUP.

The shoal marked 6 fathoms, lying S.W. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. from Loohooga Island, extends 2 miles farther to the S.S.W. Soundings were obtained in  $4\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms with the island bearing N.  $20^{\circ}$  E.

The positions of the islands in this group cannot

be depended on to give correct bearings.

## TONGATABU.

Breakers were seen on the north-west side of this island, in lat. 20° 54" S., long. 175° 28" W.

#### LEFUKA ANCHORAGE.

In the plan of this anchorage (upper corner of Chart No. 2421), Lefuka Point and the point S.W. of it are not correctly laid down. The bearings do not agree.

The unsounded ground north of the tongue-like shoal on the S.W. side of the plan is full of detached

shoals.

The information about the Tonga group was given by the German frigate "Gazelle."

Mongonui.—Unsettled weather, with prevailing S.E. winds, frequently strong; showery generally, the maximum fall recorded on 2nd, 180 in. Maximum temperature in shade, 82°; minimum, 47°.

Auckland.—First part generally fine, latter part showery, though total rain below the average, the maximum fall recorded on 2nd, 620 in.; prevailing winds E. to N.E. and W. to S.W., and moderate, except on 1st and 22nd, when it blew hard; hail on 24th. Maximum temperature in shade, 80° 5; minimum, 46° 9.

Taranaki.—Showery from 17th to 25th, otherwise fine weather; strong gale on 22nd from N.W., and also on 30th from S.E.; prevailing winds from N.E., S.E., and S.W. Maximum temperature in shade, 83°; minimum, 41°.

Napier.—Fine weather, occasional showers, small total fall, the maximum recorded on 5th, 15 in.; S.W. gale on night of 20th; prevailing westerly winds, and generally moderate. Maximum temperature in shade, 84°; minimum, 44°.
