Justice of the Peace appointed under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and thirty-third section of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of every borough, as soon as conveniently may be after every election of a Mayor for such borough, to give notice to the Colonial Secretary for the time being of such election, and of the person elected; and it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit, and if such person shall not then be a Justice of the Peace, by Warrant under his hand, published in the New Zealand Gazette, to appoint such person to be a Justice of the Peace for the colony; and it is also thereby enacted that in every such appointment it shall be expressed that it is made under the one hundred and thirty-third section of the said Act; and it is further declared that such appointment shall continue in force only during the Mayoralty of such person, and the person so appointed shall not, by virtue of such appointment, be authorized to sit or act as a Justice of the Peace elsewhere than within the borough:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby appoint

GEORGE SCARBROUGH, Esq.,

the person elected to be the Mayor of the Borough of Akaroa, to be a Justice of the Peace under the one hundred and thirty-third section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the

Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; at the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

FREEMAN'S CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

As in the Middle Channel, during strong easterly and south-easterly winds, a short breaking sea runs. which, from the present direction of the channel, is at times nearly abeam and liable to break on board vessels while entering; two red buoys, which are to be passed on the starboard hand at about a ship's length, are again laid down in Freeman's Channel.

There is not less than 10 feet in this channel at low-water springs, so that most of the coasting steamers can make use of it in safety in bad weather, when the other channels into Moreton Bay are more or less dangerous.

The depth in this channel at low water will be kept posted up at the Port Office, and any change will be duly notified.

LIGHTSHIP AT NO. VI., CLAREMONT ISLAND, INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAITS.

On and after this date, a Light will be exhibited from a Lightship moored in 12 fathoms, the Beacon on the centre of Heath Rocks bearing W. by N. 1/3 N., distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The Light, which is dioptric, is at an elevation of 35 feet above the water, and will be visible from the deck of a small craft about 10 miles.

LIGHTS AT LITTLE SEA HILL, KEPPEL BAY.

Two small lights, which, when in line, cut the position of the Timandra Bank Buoy, are now exhibited at Little Sea Hill, for the purpose of assisting vessels in rounding the Timandra Bank, and reaching the anchorage under Sea Hill Point at night.

Directions.—After passing the Keppel Rocks on a West course, as at present directed, be careful not to bring the two lights at the Pilot Station in line before crossing the line of lights at Little Sea Hill. When both these lines of lights are crossed, which should be done within a short distance of the point of intersection, the Timandra Bank Buoy will be passed; then steer S.S.W. for the Lightship, and if intending to anchor under Sca Hill Point, haul up when the upper light is eclipsed on a S.E. by S. bearing, and steer S. by E. ½ E. While standing in, this light will again be visible, and when it bears N.E., anchorage will be found in 5 fathoms at low

It must be borne in mind that between Sea Hill Point and the Timandra Bank Buoy both flood and ebb tides set strongly across the line of lights at Little Sea Hill.
