Application for Registration of Trade Marks.

Each packet contains a bottle, on which are blown the words "Barry's Safe Hair Dye, New York;" and on the label of each bottle is a facsimile of the proprietor's signature, "Prof. Alexander Barry." The words "Tinte Secure de Barry" are also blown or raised on each bottle; and the packet, a quadrilateral cardboard box or case, coloured light blue, bears on one side a device or engraving of a palm-tree and tropical fruits, with an emblem of Commerce represented by a railway train and ship; and on the other, a vignette of a lady.

Nature of the Article to which it is proposed such Trade Mark shall apply.

A Hair Dye called "Barry's Safe Hair Dye."

Description of Trade Mark on Barry's Tricopherous.

On each bottle are blown or raised the words "Barry's Tricopherous for the Skin and Hair, New York. Directions on the Pamphlet." The Tricopherous is enclosed in the pamphlet containing necessary directions, and a facsimile of the proprietor's signature, "A. C. Barry," is written on the outside wrapper, on which is imprinted a female figure in a niche or shrine dressing her hair, and in the background the emblems of Commerce, a ship and railway train; and to the right and left, bird and mate in nest, feeding.

Nature of the Article to which it is proposed such Trade Mark shall apply.

A preparation for the Hair called "Barry's Tricopherous."

Description of Trade Mark on Barry's Black Hair Dye.

The bottles are contained in a cardboard box or case, like in construction to the box containing the Safe Hair Dye; but the cardboard is of a white colour, and with similar imprint and devices. The Black Hair Dye is contained in two bottles, No. 1 and No. 2, on which are blown or raised the words,

A Hair Dye called “ Barry's Black Hair Dye.”

Description of Trade Mark on Barry's Pearl Cream.

The Pearl Cream is contained in a porcelain bottle or jar, white, octagonal in shape, on which are raised or blown the words in English,

“ Barry's Pearl Cream;”
and in Spanish,
“ Crema De Perlas,
De Barry.”

And the label contains a vignette of a lady with flowing hair, and also a label with printed directions, and a facsimile of the signature, “Prof. Alexander Barry.”

Nature of the Article to which it is proposed such Trade Mark shall apply.

A preparation for the Skin called “ Barry's Pearl Cream.”

Description of Trade Mark on Barry's Marfilina, or Ivory Tooth Powder.

The Powder is contained in a small glass jar or bottle, on the shoulder or close to the neck of which are raised or blown the words “ Barry's Marfilina.” Around the bottle is a label, on which are printed the directions for use, and a facsimile of the proprietor's signature, “Prof. Alexander Barry;” and the label is illustrated with the bust engraving of a lady with flowing hair; and round each bottle is a pamphlet instructive on the treatment of teeth, &c., and bearing the proprietor's signature facsimile.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The population has been estimated by adding the excess of births over deaths since the 1st March, 1874, to the then census population. It is impossible to estimate the increase from immigration.

The births were 37 fewer than in August.

The deaths were 4 fewer in number than the deaths in August.

Of the deaths, males contributed 56; females, 37: 39 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 41.94 per cent. of the whole number; 24 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

There were 10 deaths of persons of 65 years of age and over: 6 of these persons were males and 4 females: of these, 1 male aged 85, and 2 females aged 73 and 88, died at Auckland; 1 female aged 65 at the Thames; 2 males aged 65 and 75, and 1 female aged 69, at Wellington; 1 male aged 84 at Nelson; 1 male aged 82 at Christchurch; and 1 male aged 75 at Dunedin.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs named, and that were registered, during the Month of September, 1876.

The total of deaths in September was 93, or a decrease in the number for August of 4. The number of deaths from Zymotic disease was 16, against 25 in August. The deaths from Scarlatina decreased from 11 in August to 7 last month; and there were no deaths in September from Dysentery or Diarrhoea, while in August there were 3 cases. Of Diphtheria, there was 1 case in September, as in August; and 1 case of Typhus, against 2 of Typhoid Fever in August. The deaths in September from Scarlatina occurred as follows:—Wellington, 2 cases; Christchurch, 1 case; and Dunedin, 4 cases. During August there were 4 cases of Scarlatina at Christchurch, and 7 at Dunedin; so that for these two towns, and for the seven boroughs as a whole, the mortality for September from this complaint has been on the decrease.

The deaths from diseases of the Respiratory System were 20 in September, against 12 in August. There were 5 cases in Auckland, 4 in Wellington, 1 in Nelson, 2 in Christchurch, 7 in Dunedin, and 1 in Hokitika.

The violent deaths amounted to 7 for September. A child of 4 years was accidentally burned on the legs, and died in consequence; another of 14 months was accidentally run over by a railway truck; and a mariner was accidentally killed at Nelson by the breakage of a steamer's towing gear. This gives a total of 3 accidental deaths. There were 3 Suicides, all during temporary insanity. A man was "found drowned" in the River Avon, at Christchurch.

In September, 1875, there were 126 deaths in the towns, or 33 more than last month. The deaths from Zymotic diseases were 25 in September, 1875, against 16 in September, 1876. The deaths from Constitutional diseases in September, 1876, were only one-half the number that occurred in September, 1875, having been 24 in the earlier year; and those from Local diseases were 43, against 56 in September, 1875. The deaths from diseases of the Respiratory Organs belonging to this last-mentioned class were 22 in September, 1875, being very slightly in excess of the number for last month. The violent deaths were the same for September of each year.
